ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost five of their past eight games...however, have won six of their last 11 and 10 of their last 17...have spent each of the last 17 days in third place and 21 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) titles...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have combined for a 3.88 ERA (21 er in 48.2 ip) over their past eight games after posting a 0.27 ERA (1 er in 33.2 ip) in their previous five games...have a 2.58 ERA (46 er in 160.2 ip) this season overall, which **ranks first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers...have allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of their 25 games this season, including six games in which they did not allow an earned run...are fourth in the majors in innings pitched (160.2) and eighth in strikeouts (125)...have allowed eight home runs this season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.66 ERA (66 er in 223.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...also rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.331), sixth in on-base percentage (.296) and tied for sixth in opponents batting average (.234)...have recorded 182 strikeouts, which ranks fourth in the American League, and have allowed 73 walks, third fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers lead the majors with eight pickoffs (Anderson 4, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 13 of 21 (61.9%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the A's have been successful in 20 of their 26 (76.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...the 20 steals are the sixth most in the AL...stole 156 bases last season, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (200 for 847) on the season, which is the sixth lowest average in the Major Leagues...are hitting .204 (46 for 225) with runners in scoring position, the second lowest average in the majors...their 85 runs this season are the fourth fewest in the American League...are 8-2 when scoring four runs or more and 4-11 when scoring less than four...have been shut out four times this season...their 11 home runs are the second fewest in the American League and the majors, but their 47 doubles are tied for fifth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 11 of their last 15 games and have a total of 15 over that span...their 24 errors total are the second most in the majors...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-4 in one-run games this year...have had 11 of their 25 games this season decided by two runs or less and are 5-6 in those games...are 3-3 in extra-inning games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's open a seven-game homestand today against Texas (four games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 3-4 on their last road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (1-2), which concluded Wednesday...are now 4-5 at home and 8-8 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in day games and 5-11 (.313) at night...the day record is tied for second best in the majors and the night record is fourth worst...have a 1.76 ERA (16 er in 82.0 ip) during the day, which is the best in the majors, compared to a 3.18 ERA (50 er in 141.2 ip) at night, which ranks eighth...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record in day games and went 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used 18 different lineups through their first 25 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used seven times.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (106)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have four (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) after reinstating Wuertz on Monday...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lost the season series to the Rangers 9-10 last season...went 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Texas...have now lost the season series four times in the past five seasons...are 45-50 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...the A's are 286-294 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 152-138 in Oakland and 134-157 in Texas...have an all-time record of 383-376 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 262-game errorless streak, which is the **longest active streak among all Major League outfielders**...his last error came on September 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis has recorded 200 career doubles and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for **eighth most in Oakland history**.

Brian Fuentes has six saves this season, which is tied for **sixth most in the Major Leagues**.

Hideki Matsui has scored a combined 1,499 runs between the United States and Japan, leaving him one away from the 1,500th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 in his starting assignments this year and are 40-27 (.597) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in three of his five starts this year, allowed one run or fewer four times and has walked one batter or fewer three times.

THREE WINS: Is tied for eighth in the American League with three wins this season...has now won 21 games since May 1, 2010, which is tied for the most wins in the Major Leagues over that span...has won 31 games in his career, which are the second most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (Blue, 42).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Is holding opponents to a .202 (24 for 119) batting average this season, which ranks 10th lowest in the American League...that includes .175 (10 for 57) against right-handed hitters and .226 (14 for 62) against left-handers.

STRIKEOUTS: Has recorded 29 strikeouts in 31.1 innings this season, which is an average of 8.33 strikeouts per nine innings...in comparison, he averaged 5.40 strikeouts per nine innings last season.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings (Ted Lilly, 9 so in 4.2 ip on July 2, 2003 vs. Seattle and Tim Conroy, 9 so in 4.2 ip on June 17, 1984 vs. Chicago)...walked Suzuki to start the game but then retired each of the next eight batters he faced...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning to make the score 2-1 and was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save.

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory over Toronto April 7, allowing one run on three hits in eight innings...he had seven strikeouts and walked none, the seventh time in his career he has not walked a batter...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arencibia doubled to start the sixth...Arencibia later scored on a Nix single...was replaced by Fuentes to start the ninth after throwing 68 of 105 pitches for strikes.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Chicago April 12...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...Ramirez hit a three-run home run, then Konerko later drove in Pierre by grounding into a force out...retired the side in order in the third and fourth innings before allowing a single to Dunn to lead off the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with two outs after Rios reached on an error...Breslow then got Pierzynski to fly out to left to end the inning.

FOURTH START: Earned the win in a 5-1 win over Detroit April 23 in Oakland...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter for the eighth time in his career...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...was replaced by Ross to start the ninth inning after throwing 80 of his 112 pitches for strikes.

LAST START: Earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory over Seattle on Saturday...allowed a run in the second inning when Wilson had an RBI single and then held the Mariners scoreless over the next four innings...allowed seven hits, walked one and struck out two in six innings before he was relieved by Ziegler after throwing 100 pitches.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 6-2 with a 2.56 ERA (56.1 ip, 49 h, 19 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 33 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts...is 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA (2 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts in Texas and 4-2 with a 3.53 ERA (14 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts in Oakland...went 3-1 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts last year...his first win this year came in a 4-1 victory on May 5 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on four hits and three walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead entering the sixth when he allowed his only run...then had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 13-inning win in Texas on May 11...allowed a RBI single to Young in the third and a solo home run to Murphy in the fourth and left with the score tied at 2-2...picked up the win in the A's 3-1 victory at Texas July 28...tossed 8.0 innings and did not allow a run...yielded just two hits, a two out single by Cruz in the second and a two-out single by Hamilton in the fourth...also won in the A's 3-2 win in Oakland on August 8...blanked the Rangers on three hits over the first five before allowing two unearned runs in the sixth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-9 loss to Texas September 26 in Oakland...allowed seven runs on a career high 12 hits in just 4.0 innings...allowed at least one run in all four innings...the Rangers scored once in the first on a Francouer RBI single, twice in the second, three times in the third highlighted by a two-run home run by Moreland, and once in the fourth on a Francouer home run.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts against AL West competition this season...is 12-6 with a 2.34 ERA (37 er in 142.1 ip) in 22 career starts against the West, 19-15 with a 4.36 ERA (128 er in 264.1 ip) against everyone else.

OPENING DAY STARTERS: Made his first career Opening Day start against Seattle...became the sixth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last six years (Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger - Vida Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968.

2010 RECAP: Began the season on the disabled list and was optioned to Sacramento before returning to Oakland April 30 to lead the A's with 18 wins...posted an 18-8 record in 30 starts with a team-leading 2.97 ERA...his wins were the most by an Athletic over the last eight years...all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...the last Athletics pitcher to win as many as 18 games without winning one in April was Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for the Philadelphia A's in 1951...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA over his first four starts, 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25 and 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA over his last seven starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (2-1, 1.56 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed only four walks through his first five starts, which is tied for the eighth fewest walks allowed in the American League...has a 1.56 ERA, which is third lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the Major Leagues among starting pitchers...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory over Seattle Sunday...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston April 19...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts... had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win in Chicago April 13 as he allowed three runs, two earned, on nine hits in 5.2 innings...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...he had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland when he allowed one run in six innings...is 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA (24.1 ip, 29 h, 18 r, 14 er, 10 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in five career starts against Texas...is 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (3 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (11 er in 11.0 ip) in three starts in Texas.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

3-6, 2.86 ERA (63.0 ip, 43 h, 31 r, 20 er, 33 bb, 57 so, 6 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 7/11 (63.6%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in each of its past 10 games and has a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) over that span...ranks third in the American League with a 2.86 ERA (20 er in 63.0 ip) overall this season...has been charged with six of the team's 13 losses, which are tied for the second most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted seven of 11 (63.6%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the four blown saves are tied for third most in the AL...rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.195) and slugging (.309) and third in on-base percentage (.296)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities in 2010, which was third best in the AL.

40 RHP ANDREW BAILEY

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

50 RHP GRANT BALFOUR

- Has not allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this season (3 er in 9.0 ip, 3.00 ERA).
- Is 2-0 with a 2.53 ERA in 17 career appearances against Texas (21.1 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 14 bb, 26 so).
- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

13 LHP JERRY BLEVINS

- Has allowed a run in three of his past four appearances (3 er in 3.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) after allowing no runs in four of his first six appearances (2 er in 7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA).
- Has a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in six appearances with one day of rest or less and a 9.00 ERA (3 er in 3.0 ip) in four appearances with two days rest or more.
- Has allowed six of eight (75.0%) inherited runners to score this season, which is the third highest percentage in the American League.
- Is holding opponents to a .188 (6 for 32) batting average this season.
- Had a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in six games against the Rangers last year and has a 1.88 ERA in 15 career appearances against the team (14.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 16 so)...the 16 strikeouts are his most against any team.
- Is in his fifth Major League season, all with Oakland, and was on his third consecutive Opening Day roster.
- The 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but the first where he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings after yielding five in 64.2 innings over his first three years.

- Has not allowed a run over his last seven appearances (6.0 ip) after allowing five runs, four earned runs, over his first three outings of the season (2.0 ip)...has a 4.50 ERA (4 er in 8.0 ip) this season overall.
