WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 4-game series in Oakland tonight, the 1st stop on their inaugural West Coast trip of 2011 that also includes 3 games in Seattle...Texas lost 3 of 4 to Toronto to complete a 5-5 homestand with the Angels (1-2), Royals (3-0), and Blue Jays...team has won 4 of 7 but has dropped 9 of last 15 games after a 9-1 start...Texas' 15 wins are 2nd most in the A.L., one behind Cleveland and the club's .600 winning pct. is 3rd-best in A.L. and 6th highest in the major leagues...the 15-10 mark is the team's best after 25 games since 2004 (16-9) and tied for 4th best ever after 25 games...Rangers' 9-1 start matched the best 10-game record in club history (also 1989).

LIFE AT THE TOP: Texas enters today's play with a 1.0-game lead in the A.L. West, the 7th straight day to be in sole possession of first place...Rangers, who dropped a half game to the idle Angels on Thursday, have gained or lost ground in the A.L. West for 13 consecutive days since having a 2.0-game lead for 3 straight days April 13-15...Rangers have had at least a share of the division lead for 26 days in 2011, while Angels have held top spot the other 3 days...Texas has been in first place in the A.L. West for 144 of 147 days over 2 seasons beginning June 8, 2010.

APRIL TALLY: With 2 games remaining on the schedule this month, the Rangers' 15 wins are the 4th-most in club history in April...the list of most April wins by the Rangers: 1998 (18), 1989 (17), 1996 (16), and 2011 (15).

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers embark on this West Coast trip after playing 16 of their 1st 25 games in 2011 at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington...Texas' 9 away games are 4th fewest in the majors behind 7 for the Yankees and 8 each for the Marlins and Orioles...Texas was 4-5 on the season's 1st trip to Baltimore (2-1), Detroit (1-2), and New York (1-2). --Despite Thursday's defeat, Texas is 11-5 (.688) in Arlington, the 2nd best home winning percentage in the majors behind Cleveland's .833 (10-2) mark...the Rangers have the most home victories of any major league club.

BACK TO THE BAY: The Rangers make their 1st visit to the Bay Area in 2011 after a pair of very memorable trips last September and October...Texas clinched its 1st A.L. West Division championship since 1999 here in Oakland with a 4-3 victory on September 25...just over a month later, the Rangers returned to the Bay Area for their 1st ever World Series appearance against San Francisco, dropping Games 1 and 2 of the fall classic on Oct. 27-28 at AT&T Park.

VERSUS THE A'S: Texas and Oakland meet for the 1st time in 2011...the Rangers won the final 3 games a year ago to take the season's series, 10-9...club also won 6 of the last 9 meetings after starting 1-3...Texas has captured the season's series in 4 of the last 5 years vs. the A's, holding a 50-45 advantage in that span...the 3 straight wins for Texas to close the 2010 series all came in Oakland, where the clubs split 10 games overall last year and are 20-20 since 2008...the Rangers lead the all-time series, 294-286 with the A's having a 152-138 advantage here in Oakland. --the Rangers' 3-game winning streak here is their longest at the Coliseum since 3 victories in a row, Sept. 16, 2007-May 3, 2008...Texas' has not won more than 3 straight here since 4 wins in a row, April 13-June 2, 2001. --the Rangers are 4-2 vs. the A.L. West, all in Arlington.

OGANDO'S MONTH: Despite a no decision on Thursday, Alexi Ogando completed his 1st month as a major league starter at 3-0, 2.30 in 5 starts...since 1990, only 4 Texas starters with 30.0 more IP have posted a lower ERA in March-April:

--Ogando has held the opponents to a .171 batting average for the month, **3rd lowest in club history for March-April** (30.0+ IP) behind .158 by Nolan Ryan in 1989 and .159 by Jose Guzman in 1988.

PRODUCING IN THE CLUTCH: Michael Young leads the American League with a .542 (13-24) average with runners in scoring position, 3rd best in the majors behind Atlanta's Brian McCann at .688 (11-18) and Arizona's Ryan Roberts at .571 (8-14)...Young's sacrifice fly on Thursday produced his 14th RBI with RISP, T5th in the A.L...it was his 16th overall RBI in April, matching his career best for March-April (2005)...it was his 57th career sac fly, 4th in club history, 3 behind Juan Gonzalez.

REVOLVING RELIEF: While the Rangers have used just 6 starters in 2011 (5 regulars plus Dave Bush spot start on April 13), the bullpen has been a different story...of the 8 pitchers who opened the year in the bullpen, only Bush, Darren Oliver, Arthur Rhodes, and Pedro Strop remain...Nefali Feliz, Darren O'Day, and Mason Tobin are all on the DL and Mark Lowe is at AAA Round Rock...the club has used a total of 16 pitchers in a game, one shy of the club record for March-April done 3 times (2002-03-08)...RHP Ryan Tucker is currently on the roster but has yet to appear in a game.

MEDICAL REPORT: The update on injured Rangers: **NEFTALI FELIZ** (right shoulder inflammation): is on this trip and has started playing long toss as part of rehab.

SCOTT FELDMAN (right knee surgery): threw 39 pitches in 3.0 innings in an extended spring game on Thursday...is scheduled to throw 4.0 innings in game next Tuesday in Surprise.

JOSH HAMILTON (fracture right humerus bone): remained in Arlington to continue rehab as he increases his baseball activity.

TOMMY HUNTER (right groin strain): is scheduled to pitch 2-3 innings in extended spring game on Saturday.

DARREN O'DAY (labrum tear in left hip): underwent surgery on Thursday to clean up the labrum tear in his hip, performed by Dr. Tom Byrd in Nashville...will begin rehab immediately and be on crutches for 5-7 days.

MASON TOBIN (right UCL ligament inflammation): remained in Arlington to continue rehab.

BRANDON WEBB (right shoulder surgery): is scheduled to pitch 3 innings in extended spring game on Saturday.

ELVIS ON THE BASEPATHS: Elvis Andrus recorded 3 stolen bases on Thursday, his most in a game since April 20, 2010 at Boston (3) and his 4th career game with 3+ SB...Andrus has been successful on all 7 of his steal attempts this season, the most SBs without being caught of any A.L. player and 4th in the majors to 9-9 for Houston's Michael Bourn and 8-8 for Washington's Ian Desmond and San Diego's Orlando Hudson.

RADIO UPDATE: Due to the Mavericks-Lakers playoff series, the following Rangers games will be carried by 660 AM KSKY: Wednesday, May 4 at Seattle and Friday, May 6 and Sunday, May 8 against New York.

SHORTS: Tonight's A's starter Trevor Cahill is one of 3 pitchers to defeat the Rangers 6 times since the start of 2009, joining the Mariners' Felix Hernandez and the Angels Jered Weaver...Rangers batters lead the majors with 92 extra base hits and have the fewest strikeouts at 128...Texas' 5 stolen bases on Thursday were the team's most since a club record 9 on April 20, 2010 at Boston...Darren Oliver's error on Thursday was the 5th by a Texas pitcher in 2011, tying Detroit and Oakland for the most in the A.L....**Ron Washington is 59 today**...he is 0-3 as Rangers manager on this date, losing to TOR in 2007, KC in 2008, and CWS in 2010...club did not play in 2009 on April 29.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#36 C.J. Wilson, LHP
(3-0, 3.51)

TONIGHT: The 30-year-old left-hander is scheduled to toe the rubber in his 6th start and appearance of the season tonight in the opener of a 4-game series here in Oakland...will be working on regular 4-days' rest, as he earned his 3rd victory on Sunday afternoon in a 8-7 Texas win over the Royals...will be making just his 2nd road start, as 4 of his first 5 outings have come on the road...club is 4-1 in his 5 starts this season with the lone loss coming in a 5-4 loss on April 12 at Detroit....Rangers Opening Day starter was on a Texas season-opening roster for the 5th consecutive campaign, as this was the 2nd time for him to be named to a season-opening starting rotation after starting Rangers' 3rd game of 2010.

LAST START: Earned his 3rd victory on Sunday afternoon in a 8-7 Texas win over the Royals (7.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 10 SO, 111 pitches/68 strikes)...matched a season high with 7.0 innings (3rd time), while also posting a season-high 10 K's, his 3rd career 10-strikeout game, most ever in Arlington...the 10 K's were most by a Texas pitcher this season, most for a Ranger in Arlington since Cliff Lee had 11 K's on Aug. 11, 2010 vs. NYY...Mike Napoli (solo) and Adrian Beltre (solo), and Andres Blanco all homered in support, as the 2 clubs combined for 6 home runs in the game.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 2-3 with a 4.39 ERA (20 ER/41.0 IP) and 5 saves in 31 career G/2 starts vs. Oakland, including 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (4 ER/12.2 IP) in 2 starts last season...did not factor in the decision in a 2-1, 12-inning Texas victory on May 13...delivered his club record 7th consecutive quality start to open a season in that outing...was also called for a pair of balks in that contest by home plate umpire Bob Davidson, the 2nd of which led to the ejection of catcher Matt Treanor...became the first member of the Texas staff to reach 10 victories last season, as he was the starter and winning pitcher in a 7-4 victory vs. Oakland on July 29...that start also secured Wilson's spot as the only pitcher in Texas history with both a 10-win campaign as a starter and 20-save season (2008).

ROAD LESS TRAVELED: Has made just one start on the road this season (4/12 at Detroit), as 4 of his first 5 starts have come at Rangers Ballpark...went 4-5 with a 2.91 ERA (29 ER/89.2 IP) in 14 starts away from Arlington last season, compared to 11-3, 3.70 (47 ER/114.1 IP) at home...Texas batters supported him with 2.31 runs per game in road starts last season, while averaging 5.83 runs in home contests...has never started at the Coliseum, but is 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 ER/11.0 IP) and 2 saves in 13 career relief appearances at the facility.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Club is 4-1 in his 5 starts this season with the lone loss coming in a 5-4 loss on April 12 at Detroit...Texas has won 28 of Wilson's last 36 starts, dating back to April 22, 2010 and 16 of his last 20 starts beginning July 18, 2010.

RARE NIGHT OUT: Will be starting a night game for just the 2nd time this season, with 4 of his first 5 outings thus far in the afternoon...earned the victory in his lone night start on April 18 vs. LA of Anaheim...went 12-4 with a 3.32 ERA in 22 night starts last season, compared to 3-4 with a 3.42 ERA (27 ER/71.0 IP) in 11 day starts...his 3.48 career ERA in night games (209 games/25 starts) is over a full run lower than his 4.64 career ERA in day games (87 games/19 starts).

2011 NOTES: Made first career Opening Day start 4/1 vs. BOS, but did not factor into the decision and fell one out shy of a quality start (5.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R-2 ER, 2 BB, 6 SO, 109 pitches/70 strikes)...was charged with a pair of unearned runs following Borbon's fielding error in the first inning...also allowed Adrian Gonzalez's 2-out, 2-run single in the Red Sox 3rd (3 hits, one walk) before going on to retire 9 of the final 11 batters he faced...became just the 4th left-hander in club history to start a season-opener for Texas, joining Jon Matlack (1978, 1980-81), Craig Lefferts (1993), and Kenny Rogers (1995, 2000, 2004)...Wilson also became just the 6th pitcher signed and developed by Texas to make an Opening Day start for the club...earned the 7-3 win on 4/6 vs. SEA (7.0 IP, 3 R-2 ER) opposite M's ace Felix Hernandez...Mitch Moreland broke a 3-3 tie in the 7th with a one-out RBI-double down the right-field line...took ND 4/12 at DET (6.2 IP, 4 R-ER) in 5-4 walk-off loss on a Miguel Cabrera bases loaded 9th-inning single...allowed single runs in first and 4th innings, and gave up a pair of runs in the 6th after Texas had taken a 3-2 lead in the top half of that frame...logged a season-high 116 pitches, surrendering only Howie Kendrick's 2-out, RBI-single in the 7th on April 17 in a 7-1 Texas win vs. LA of Anaheim.

SPRING TRAINING: Made 5 'A' starts/appearances in Cactus League play this spring, going 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (9 ER/16.0 IP)...left his final spring start on March 26 vs. ChC after 2.0 IP with tightness in his left hamstring.

2010: In his 1st full season as a starter, led the club in ERA (3.35), starts (33), wins (15), complete games (3), and innings (204.0), and was 2nd in strikeouts (170)...finished among A.L. leaders in opponents average (2nd, .217), starts (T4th), ERA (10th), wins (T10th), and winning percentage (12th, .652)...his strikeout total was 8th-highest by any A.L. left-hander...held opposing left-handers to a .176 slugging pct. lowest in the majors and a club record (Mike Venafro, .219 in 1999), while .144 (22-153) batting average vs. LHB was 3rd-lowest in A.L. and 4th in majors...224 on-base pct. vs. lefties was also 3rd-lowest in both A.L. and majors...allowed just 5 extra-base hits (all doubles) and 12 walks to LH batters in 169 plate appearances...led the A.L. in walks (93) and tied for 6th in hit batters (10)...Texas went 24-9 in his 33 starts.

2010 POSTSEASON: Was 1-2, 3.70 (10 ER/24.1 IP) in 4 starts in the playoffs...was 3rd on staff in innings and strikeouts (17)...worked 6.1 shutout innings, allowing 2 hits with 7 strikeouts to defeat Tampa Bay in Game 2 of ALDS, combining with Darren O'Day (0.1 IP) and Darren Oliver (2.1 IP) on 2-hit shutout...started Game 1 of ALCS, taking a 5-1 lead into the 8th against New York...issued a pair of hits to lead off that inning before leaving...both runs scored as part of 5-run inning in Yankees' 6-5 win...was the starter and loser in Game 5 at Yankee Stadium, permitting 6 hits and 6 runs/5 er in 5.0 innings...lost only start in World Series in Game 2 at San Francisco, permitting 3 hits and 2 runs in 6.0 innings.

CAREER: Wilson made a successful conversion from the bullpen to the starting rotation in 2010 and earned the Rangers Pitcher of the Year Award...led the staff with 15 victories and a 3.35 ERA after entering the year with an 0-5 mark in 6 career ML starts...the 30-year-old left-hander was a valuable member of the Texas bullpen from 2006-09, working both in a set-up role and as the closer.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER: RHP Colby Lewis (1-3, 6.95 ERA in 4 games/starts)

The 31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 5th start and appearance of the season on Saturday afternoon in the 2nd of 4 games here at the Oakland Coliseum...will be starting on regular 4 days' rest for the first time in 2011, as his last outing came on Monday in a 6-4 loss to Toronto at Rangers Ballpark (5.0 IP, 7 H, 6 R-ER, 3 HR, 4 BB, 3 SO, 95 pitches/60 strikes)...the Jays plated all 6 runs in the 5th inning by way of 3 home runs from Corey Patterson (3-run), Jose Bautista (solo) and Juan Rivera (2-run)...Lewis had faced the minimum through 3.0 and held Toronto scoreless over his first 4.0 frames on 3 hits and a pair of walks...allowed 3 HR in just one start last season (June 3 at Chicago-AL)...has lost 3 consecutive starts, going 0-3 with a 7.88 ERA (14 ER/16.0 IP) in that span, after posting a victory and quality start in his first tilt of 2011 on April 2 vs. Boston (6.0 IP, 3 R-ER)...has surrendered 7 home runs during current 3-game slide and 8 overall this season, 2nd-most in A.L. and T3rd-most in majors...the Bakersfield native and resident is 3-3 with a 3.36 ERA (23 ER/61.2 IP) in 12 career appearances against the A's, including 3-3, 3.57 (23 ER/58.0 IP) in 10 starts - went 1-3, 3.35 (14 ER/37.2 IP) in 6 starts against Oakland in 2010 despite tossing quality starts in 5 of those 6 outings...is 3-2, 2.92 (17 ER/52.1 IP) in 20 career appearances at the Oakland Coliseum, including 3-1, 2.60 (10 ER/34.2 IP) in 6 starts...has gone 6-10, 4.05 (54 ER/120.0 IP) in 19 road starts over the past 2 seasons despite holding opponents to a .219 avg...despite a 2.90 ERA .207 opponents avg., has a 3-6 record in 12 starts vs. A.L. West opponents in last 2 years.
