### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have won seven of their last 12 games and 11 of their last 18...have spent each of the last 18 days in third place and 22 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) titles...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have a 2.47 ERA (46 er in 167.2 ip) this season overall, which ranks first in the Major Leagues among starting pitchers...have allowed three earned runs or less in 20 of their 26 games this season, including seven games in which they did not allow an earned run...are fourth in the majors in innings pitched (167.2) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (129)...have allowed eight home runs this season, which are the fewest in the majors.

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers have compiled a 2.59 ERA (67 er in 232.2 ip), which is the best in the majors...also rank first in opponents slugging percentage (.330) and tied for sixth in opponents batting average (.237) and on-base percentage (.299)...have recorded 188 strikeouts, which ranks fourth in the American League, and have allowed 77 walks, second fewest in the AL.

**ON THE BASES:** A's pitchers lead the majors with eight pickoffs (Anderson 4, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 13 of 21 (61.9%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors...the A's, meanwhile, have been successful in 20 of their 26 (76.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the sixth best percentage in the American League...the 20 steals are the sixth most in the AL...stole 156 bases last season, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .237 (208 for 879) on the season, which is tied for the seventh lowest average in the Major Leagues...are batting .202 (48 for 238) with runners in scoring position, the second lowest average in the majors...their 88 runs this season are the third fewest in the majors...are 8-2 when scoring four runs or more and 5-11 when scoring less than four...have been shut out four times this season...their 11 home runs are tied for the fewest in the majors, but their 50 doubles are the fourth most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 24 errors this season, which are the second most in the majors...have committed at least one error in 11 of their last 16 games (15 total over that span) since going a season-high six games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** The A's are 7-2 (.778) in day games and 6-11 (.353) at night...the day record is tied for second best in the majors and the night record is sixth worst...have a 1.76 ERA (16 er in 82.0 ip) during the day, which is the best in the majors, compared to a 3.05 ERA (51 er in 150.2 ip) at night, which ranks seventh...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record in day games and went 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (1-0) and Cleveland (three games)...went 3-4 on their last road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (1-2), which concluded Wednesday...are now 5-5 at home and 8-8 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 4-4 in one-run games this year...have had 12 of their 26 games this season decided by two runs or less and are 6-6 in those games...are 3-3 in extra-inning games.

**STARTING LINEUPS:** The A's have used 19 different lineups through their first 26 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used seven times.

**LOCKED UP:** Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (106)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have four (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) after reinstating Wuertz April 25...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's are 1-0 against the Rangers this season following last night's win...lost the season series to the Rangers 9-10 last season...went 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Texas...have now lost the season series four times in the past five seasons...are 46-50 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...the A's are 287-294 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 153-138 in Oakland and 134-157 in Texas...have an all-time record of 384-376 against the Rangers/Senators.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Daric Barton** played the 385<sup>th</sup> game of his career at first base last night, which tied Gene Tenace for fifth most in Oakland history.

**David DeJesus** has a 263-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on September 15, 2008.

**Mark Ellis** has recorded 200 career doubles and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for eighth most in Oakland history.

**Hideki Matsui** has scored a combined 1,499 runs between the United States and Japan, leaving him one away from the 1,500<sup>th</sup> of his career.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Rick Monday's third inning grand slam at California gives him at least one RBI in a club record 10 consecutive games...he finishes with five RBI on the day and drives in 18 runs during the streak...in 2000 Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run...in 2005 Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup> inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 in his starting assignments this year and are 25-29 (.463) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in four of his five starts this year, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked one batter or fewer five times.

**DON'T WALK:** Has allowed only four walks through his first five starts, which is tied for the seventh fewest walks allowed in the American League among starting pitchers...has now walked one batter or less in 34 of his 54 career starts, including 11 starts in which he has not walked a batter.

**ON THE BASES:** Opponents have been successful in only two of seven attempts (28.6 percent) this season, which is the ninth lowest percentage in the American League...has also recorded four pickoffs, which are the most in the Major Leagues...last season, he finished tied for eighth in the AL with four pickoffs and he now has 12 in his three seasons.

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Has allowed six earned runs in 34.2 innings through his first five starts for a 1.56 ERA, which is third lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the Major Leagues among starting pitchers...is now 17-11 with a 2.70 ERA (76 er in 253.1 ip) in 41 starts since June 29, 2009, which is tied for the sixth lowest ERA in the majors over that span (minimum 162.0 ip).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .240 (31 for 129) this year...that includes .169 (13 for 77) by right-handed hitters, which is tied for the 11<sup>th</sup> lowest average in the American League, and .346 (18 for 52) against left-handers...righties were .243 (80 for 329) and left-handers were .299 (32 for 107) last season and his career splits are now .239 (216 for 903) and .314 (107 for 341) against righties and lefties, respectively.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning after throwing 108 pitches...left with the score tied at 1-1.

**SECOND START:** Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles...he threw 75 of his 109 pitches for strikes.

**THIRD START:** Had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win in Chicago April 13...allowed three runs, two earned, on nine hits in 5.2 innings...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run...was replaced by Breslow following a Pierre single, who then stranded both runners by getting Beckham to pop out to short.

**FOURTH START:** Earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston April 19...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth after throwing 109 pitches.

**LAST START:** Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory over Seattle Sunday...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...threw 69 of 106 pitches for strikes before being replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning.

**ANDERSON vs. TEXAS:** Is 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA (24.1 ip, 29 h, 18 r, 14 er, 10 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in five career starts...is 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (3 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (11 er in 11.0 ip) in three starts in Texas...faced the Rangers once last season and took the looks in an A's 7-3 defeat at Texas August 27... left the game after two innings with a mild hyper extension of his right knee...the 2.0 innings pitched matched his career low (June 3, 2010 at Boston)...allowed a Guerrero RBI single and a Murphy two-run double in the first and a Andrus RBI single in the second...was 1-1 with a 4.03 ERA (10 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts in 2009...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Texas on April 28...had a 3-1 lead entering the bottom of the sixth inning but Byrd reached on a Cabrera error and Young walked...had a 2-0 count on Jones when he left the game with a blister on his finger...was relieved by Bailey who allowed both runs to score plus a run of his own for the blown save...took the loss in a 14-1 decision at Texas on May 30...allowed three runs in the third and three more in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win August 3 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings before allowing single runs in the fifth and eighth...picked up the win in a 12-3 decision in Oakland on September 24...allowed three runs in 5.2 innings, but only one was earned...Kinsler scored after errors by Kennedy and Pennington in the first and Blalock scored after an Ellis error in the sixth...also allowed a RBI single to Murphy in the third.

**2010 RECAP:** Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...allowed all six of his home runs to righties last year...five came at home, five were hit in night games and five were with the bases empty...his opponents batting average dropped to .225 with runners in scoring position after yielding a .314 average with RISP in 2009.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353).

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Gio Gonzalez (2-2, 2.70 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season... has allowed nine runs, eight earned, in 11.0 innings over his past two starts to raise his ERA from 0.47 to 2.70...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 defeat in Los Angeles Monday...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings, his shortest start of the year...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston April 20...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one, a season low...however, also allowed season highs in hits (9) and runs (4) over six innings...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...is 3-1 with a 2.09 ERA (38.2 ip, 33 h, 9 r, 9 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in eight career appearances against Texas, six starts...is 2-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in four games against the Rangers in Oakland.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**3-6, 2.91 ERA (65.0 ip, 47 h, 32 r, 21 er, 33 bb, 59 so, 6 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 8/12 (66.7%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in each of its past 11 games and has a 1.59 ERA (5 er in 28.1 ip) over that span...ranks second in the American League and eighth in the majors with a 2.91 ERA (21 er in 65.0 ip) overall this season...has been charged with six of the team's 13 losses, which are tied for the second most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted eight of 12 (66.7%) save opportunities, which is tied for the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the four blown saves are tied for third most in the AL...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.330), second in on-base percentage (.299) and are tied for second in opponents batting average (.237)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities in 2010, which was third best in the AL.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Is 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA in 18 career appearances against Texas (22.1 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 6 er, 14 bb, 28 so).
- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.
