WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers have lost 2 straight and 4 of their last 5 games beginning April 25...Texas has split its last 8 games but has dropped 10 of last 16 after a 9-1 start...Texas' 15 wins are 2nd most in the A.L., 2 behind Cleveland and the club's .577 winning pct. is T3rd-best in A.L. behind the Indians (.680) and Yankees (.609)...the 15-11 mark is the team's best after 26 games since 2004 (17-9)...Rangers' 9-1 start matched the best 10-game record in club history (also 1989)...since that time, beginning April 12, the Rangers .375 (6-10) winning percentage matches the Twins for the 3rd lowest in the American League behind the White Sox at .235 (4-13) and the Orioles at .333 (5-10).

THE STANDINGS: Texas had been in sole possession of 1st place for 7 straight days before dropping into a tie with the Angels for the A.L. West Division lead on Friday...this is the 1st time team has not had outright possession oif the top spot since it was 2nd on April 21 and is the 5th day club has been in 1st place tie in 2011...the Rangers have gained or lost ground in the A.L. West for 14 consecutive days since having a 2.0-game lead for 3 straight days April 13-15...Rangers have had at least a share of the division lead for 27 days in 2011, while Angels have held top spot the other 3 days...Texas has been in first place in the A.L. West for 145 of 148 days over 2 seasons beginning June 8, 2010...the Rangers have not trailed by more than a half game in the A.L. West since having a 1.5 game deficit on april 29, 2010.

APRIL FINALE: As the 1st month of the season concludes this afternoon, the Rangers' 15 wins are the 4th-most in club history in April...the list of most April wins by the Rangers: 1998 (18), 1989 (17), 1996 (16), and 2011 (15)...this will mark the 1st time that the club has had a winning record in April since 2006 (13-12) with most victories since 1998. --Texas enters today with a 3.97 team ERA...that figure would represent

the team's 4th lowest ERA for the opening month of a season in the last 20 years (beginning 1991) behind: 3.13-1993; 3.69--2010; and 3.80--1997...staff's current opponents batting average of .246 would be the lowest for any March-April since 1991 (.227).

--Texas begins the day with a .266 team batting average after hitting .240 last April and 269 in 2009. club's 33 homers are the 4th most in team history for any March-April behind: 50 in 2003 and 41 in both 2001 and 2009.

VERSUS THE A'S: The Rangers' 3-game winning streak against Oakland ended last night with 1st defeat since Sept. 23, 2010, also here at the Coliseum...club has won 6 of the last 10 meetings after starting last year at 1-3...Texas has captured the season's series in 4 of the last 5 years vs. the A's, holding a 50-46 advantage in that span...Texas is 9-12 here in Oakalnd since the start of 2009...the Rangers lead the all-time series, 294-287 with the A's having a 153-138 advantage here in Oakland.

THE ROAD AND THE WEST: The Rangers have lost 3 straight and 5 of their last 6 games away from home after beginning the year with a 3-1 road mark...last road victory was a 5-3 win in New York on April 15..of the 5 losses in this 1-5 span, 4 have been by one (3) or 2 (1) runs...Matt Harrison owns 2 of the club's 4 road wins this season.

--Texas has posted a 2.96 ERA (28 ER/85.0 IP) on the road this season, 2nd lowest in the American League to Oakland (2.86) and 4th in the majors behind Philadelphia (2.66) and San Diego (2.83).

--the Rangers are 4-3 vs. the A.L. West and have lost their last 3 contests after beginning 2011 at 4-0 in the division.

MANY HITS/FEW RUNS: The Rangers produced 11 hits but only one run in the loss to the A's on Friday night...it was Texas' highest hit total in a game in which it scored one or fewer runs since June 12, 2003, when the club had 11 hits in an 11-0 loss to the New York Mets.

--All 11 hits on Friday were singles, the Rangers most hits in a game without an extra base hit since May 20, 2008, when the team posted 11 singles in an 11-4 defeat at Minnesota.

MICHAEL'S MONTH: Michael Young ranks 2nd in the A.L. with 36 hits, matching the 6th most ever by a Ranger in March-April

--his 12 doubles tie the club record for March-April with Ivan Rodriguez (1996 and 1998) and Rusty Greer (1999 and 2001)

-Young leads the American League with a .538 (14-26) average with runners in scoring position, 3rd best in the majors behind Atlanta's Brian McCann at .688 (11-18) and Arizona's Ryan Roberts at .571 (8-14).

MORE YOUNG: Michael leads all A.L. qualifiers in batting average with runners in scoring position at .538 (14-26)...of his 17 total RBI, 15 have come with runners at 2nd and 3rd, tied for 4th most in the league ... Young also has the A.L.'s best average on the road at .425 (17-40) and has hit safely in his last 9 road contests at .472 (17-36) after going 0-for-4 in his 1st away game of the year on April 9 (Game 1) at Baltimore.

WELCOME: Ryan Tucker made his Rangers debut on Friday and fanned all 3 batters he faced, the most consecutive strikeouts to begin a Texas career since Michael Kirkman struck out the 1st 3 in his major league debut on August 21, 2010 at Baltimore ... it was Tucker's 1st major league outing since July 23, 2008 vs. Atlanta as a member of the Florida Marlins.

--Tucker became the 17th pitcher to appear in a game for the Rangers this season, tying the team record for hurlers used in March-April with the 2002, 2003, and 2008 clubs...Tucker was the 12th Ranger to see action in relief in the season's 1st 26 games.

THIS IN FROM ARIZONA: Tommy Hunter (right groin strain): is scheduled to pitch 2-3 innings in extended spring game today in Surprise vs. the Mariners...it will be Hunter's 1st game action since sustaining the injury in his spring training start on March 24 vs. Cincinnati...Brandon Webb (right shoulder surgery): is also scheduled to pitch 3 innings in that extended spring game vs. the Royals on Saturday...it will be Webb's 2nd start in extended spring since going to Arizona last week.

RANGERS SIGN JUSTIN MILLER: Texas signed RHP Justin Miller to a minor league contract on Friday and he'll report to Round Rock (AAA) on Monday...Miller, 33, requested and received his release from the Seattle organization in April 25 after posting a 1.04 ERA (1 ER/8.2 IP) in 6 games at Tacoma (AAA)...he is 24-14, 4.82 in 216 ML games/33 starts with the Blue Jays ('02-'05), Marlins ('07-'08), Giants ('09), and Dodgers ('10).

SHORTS: Trevor Cahill has 7 wins vs. Texas since the start of 2009, most of any pitcher...Rangers are 6-4 in day games in 2011, 2-3 on the road...club will face 4 lefthanded starters in the next 6 games beginning this afternoon...Texas is 5-2 in games started by lefthanders, 5-0 at home but 0-2 on the road...in a scoring change from last night, Daric Barton receives a double in the 3rd inning with an error taken away from Julio Borbon...C.J. Wilson thus allowed 9 hits and 2 earned runs and his ERA is 3.35 for the year...of the last 6 runs allowed by Texas beginning in the 9th inning on Thursday, 3 are unearned.

TODAY'S TILT: The 31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 5th start and appearance of the season this afternoon in the 2nd of 4 games here at the Oakland Coliseum...will be starting on regular 4 days' rest for the first time in 2011, as his last outing came on Monday in a 6-4 loss to Toronto at Rangers Ballpark...has lost 3 consecutive starts, going 0-3 with a 7.88 ERA (14 ER/16.0 IP) in that span, after posting a victory and quality start in his first tilt of 2011 on April 2 vs. Boston...has received one-or-zero runs of support 3 times in 4 starts this year and 14 times in 36 starts over the past 2 seasons...will be making his first afternoon start this season after each of his previous 3 outings were night games: 3-4, 5.50 ERA (32 ER/52.1 IP) in 9 day starts last season...despite a 2.90 ERA (27 ER/83.2 IP) and .207 opponents avg., has a 3-6 record in 12 starts vs. A.L. West opponents over past 2 seasons...pitched for Oakland in 2007, his final major league season before spending 2 years in Japan.

2011: Club's no. 2 starter to open the season ... Texas is 1-3 in his 4 starts ... has pitched at least 5.0 innings in all 4 games...lone quality start was his only win in season debut, 4/2 vs. BOS...Torrealba has caught all 4 starts...had at least 5 days of rest for first 4 starts, but makes today's start on regular 4 days' rest...has given up a HR in every start, including 7 HR during current 3-game slide, as his 8 HR allowed overall this season are 2nd-most in A.L. and T4th-most in majors...batters leading off an inning have a .389/.500/.611 slash line, 7-for-18 with a double, HR, and 3 walks...opponents batting .222 (4-18) with RISP...started and won team's second game on 4/2 vs. BOS, besting John Lackey in 12-5 victory...gave up a 2-run HR to David Ortiz in the 2nd...took the loss 4/9 at BAL-G1, a 5-0 Texas defeat in which opposing starter Zach Britton tossed 7.2 SHO IP ... was club's first loss of the season...surrendered a Nick Markakis solo HR in the first and a Mark Reynolds 3-run HR in the 2nd frame...retired 9 of the last 10 batters he faced...took 15-4 loss on 4/19 vs. LAA, club's biggest loss to date in '11...gave up 2-run HR to Trumbo in the 4th and solo HR to Izturis in the 5th...Texas trailed just 4-1 upon his exit after 5 innings, but 'pen allowed 11 runs.

IN APRIL: Lewis over 9 April starts from 2010-11: 4-3, 4.45 (27 ER/54.2 IP) with 23 walks and 52 strikeouts...in 2010, went 3-0, 2.76 (10 ER/32.2 IP) over 5 April starts to win Rangers April Player of the Month...Ied A.L. with 38 K's in April '10, T2nd-most in majors and 2nd-most ever for a Ranger in April behind Nolan Ryan's 49 K's in 1989.

LAST START: Shouldered a 6-4 loss to Toronto on Monday in Arlington (5.0 IP, 7 H, 6 R-ER, 3 HR, 4 BB, 3 SO, 95 pitches/60 strikes)...the Jays plated all 6 runs in the 5th inning by way of 3 home runs from Corey Patterson (3-run), Jose Bautista (solo) and Juan Rivera (2-run)...Patterson/Bautista shots came on conseuctive pitches, while all 3 HR came in span of 4 batters...Rivera HR followed walk to Adam Lind...Lewis had faced the minimum through 3.0 and held Toronto scoreless over his first 4.0 frames on 3 hits and a pair of walks.

VS. OAKLAND: The Bakersfield (CA) native and resident is 3-3 with a 3.36 ERA (23 ER/61.2 IP) in 12 career appearances against the A's, including 3-3, 3.57 (23 ER/58.0 IP) in 10 starts - went 1-3, 3.35 (14 ER/37.2 IP) in 6 starts against Oakland in 2010 despite tossing quality starts in 5 of those 6 outings...is 3-2, 2.92 (17 ER/52.1 IP) in 20 career appearances at the Oakland Coliseum, including 3-1, 2.60 (10 ER/34.2 IP) in 6 starts.

ON THE ROAD: Scheduled to make just his 2nd road start of 2011, as he started Gm 1 of April 9 DH at BAL...has gone 6-10, 4.05 (54 ER/120.0 IP) in 19 road starts over the past 2 seasons despite holding opponents to a .219 avg. (99-452)...has received an avg. of 3.9 runs-of-support in that stretch...has alternated wins and losses over his last 5 road starts (2-3), going 2-6, 4.77 (29 ER/54.2 IP) over 9 road starts beginning July 21, 2010 after starting last season 4-4, 3.44 (25 ER/65.1 IP) over his first 10 tilts away from Arlington.

PROUD POPPA: Was the first player placed on MLB's new Paternity Leave List from April 15-17 following the birth of his daughter in Bakersfield, Calif. on April 13...his spot in the rotation was essentially skipped while he was out.
