ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won seven of their last 13 games and 11 of their last 19...have spent each of the last 19 days in third place and 22 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) titles...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a record of 13-14...have now finished April with a record below .500 in three of their past five seasons and at .500 or below in seven of their past eight...had a 2.79 ERA (75 er in 241.2 ip), their first time finishing the month of April with an ERA under 3.00 since 1989 (74 er in 230.0 ip, 2.90 ERA)...the last time they had an ERA lower than 2.79 was 1981 (40 er in 190.0 ip, 1.89 ERA)...had 21 stolen bases, their most in the first month of the season since stealing 19 bases in 1998...batted .237 (216 for 913), the fourth time they have finished the month with a batting average below .240 in the past six seasons.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 2.76 ERA (53 er in 172.2 ip) this season, which **ranks first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers...have allowed three earned runs or less in 20 of their 27 games this season, including seven games in which they did not allow an earned run...are tied for fourth in the majors in innings pitched (172.2) and have recorded 132 strikeouts, sixth most in the American League...have allowed 11 home runs this season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.79 ERA (75 er in 241.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...also rank first in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.344), third in on-base percentage (.306) and sixth in opponents batting average (.242)...have recorded 193 strikeouts, which ranks fifth in the AL, and have allowed 82 walks, tied for third fewest.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers lead the majors with nine pickoffs (Anderson 5, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 14 of 22 (63.6%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in the majors...the A's, meanwhile, have been successful in 21 of their 27 (77.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...the 21 steals are the sixth most in the AL...stole 156 bases last season, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .237 (216 for 913) on the season, which is the fourth lowest average in the AL...are batting .199 (48 for 241) with runners in scoring position, the second lowest average in the majors...their 90 runs this season are the third fewest in the majors...are 8-2 when scoring four runs or more and 5-12 when scoring less than four...have been shut out four times this season...their 13 home runs are second fewest in the majors, but their 53 doubles are the fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 25 errors this season, which are the second most in the majors...have committed at least one error in 12 of their last 17 games (16 total over that span) since going a season-high six games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 7-3 (.700) in day games and 6-11 (.353) at night...the day record is fourth best in the majors while the night record is fifth worst...have a 2.37 ERA (24 er in 91.0 ip) during the day, which is the second best in the majors, compared to a 3.05 ERA (51 er in 150.2 ip) at night, which ranks seventh...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record in day games and went 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (1-1) and Cleveland (three games)...went 3-4 on their last road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (1-2), which concluded Wednesday...are now 5-6 at home and 8-8 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-4 in one-run games this year...have had 12 of their 27 games this season decided by two runs or less and are 6-6 in those games...are 3-3 in extra-inning games.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used 20 different lineups through their first 27 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used seven times.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (106)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have four (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) after reinstating Wuertz April 25...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

A's vs. RANGERS

The A's are 1-1 against the Rangers this season, having split the first two games of this series...lost the season series to the Rangers 9-10 last season...went 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Texas...have now lost the season series four times in the past five seasons...are 46-51 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...the A's are 287-295 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 153-139 in Oakland and 134-157 in Texas...have an all-time record of 384-377 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton has played 386 games at first base in his career...his next appearance at first base will tie Bruce Bochte for **fourth most in Oakland history**.

David DeJesus has a 264-game errorless streak, which is the **longest active streak among all Major League outfielders**...his last error came on September 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis has recorded 200 career doubles and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for **eighth most in Oakland history**.

Hideki Matsui has scored a combined 1,499 runs between the United States and Japan, leaving him one away from the 1,500th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925**, Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991**, Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992**, Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 2-3 in his starting assignments this year and are 32-30 (.516) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in four of his five starts, allowed one run or less three times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has allowed nine runs, eight earned, in 11.0 innings over his past two starts to raise his ERA from 0.47 to 2.70...however, the 2.70 ERA still is tied for 13th in the American League among starting pitchers this season...has a 3.16 ERA (81 er in 230.2 ip) over the past two seasons, which is the ninth lowest ERA in the American League over that span (minimum 163.0 ip).

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact...it was the A's first shutout of the season.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...Ross allowed one run in the seventh and two in the eighth as he went on to take the loss.

FOURTH START: Took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston April 20...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one, a season low...however, also allowed season highs in hits (9) and runs (4) over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second and then Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning.

LAST START: Was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 defeat in Los Angeles Monday...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings, his shortest start of the year...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...then threw a scoreless fifth before he was replaced by Purcey after throwing 95 pitches.

GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS: Is 3-1 with a 2.09 ERA (38.2 ip, 33 h, 9 r, 9 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in eight career appearances, six starts...is 2-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in four games in Oakland and 1-1 with a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in four games in Texas...is 3-1 with a 2.27 ERA (9 er in 35.2 ip) in six starts...went 2-1 with a 2.79 ERA (9 er in 29.0 ip) in five games last season...the loss came in a 10-1 decision at Texas May 12...allowed two runs in the fourth and a two-run home run to Hamilton in the fifth...then had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 10-inning loss at Texas July 27...allowed a RBI double to Guerrero in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...Lee limited the A's to a run on five hits in 9.0 innings...earned the win in a 6-2 victory in Oakland August 7...tossed seven shutout innings and allowed four hits while walking three...allowed just one baserunner past second base and was aided by two double plays...also picked up the win in an 8-2 decision at Texas August 29...the A's scored a run in the third but he allowed a RBI single to Hamilton in the bottom of the third...Oakland then built a 7-1 lead before he allowed a solo home run to Hamilton in the sixth...was relieved by Breslow after six innings with a 7-2 lead...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 in Oakland September 25...the A's scored a run in the first inning but that was the only run of support he would receive in his 6.0 innings pitched...allowed a leadoff home run to Young in the third inning and a RBI single to Cantu in the sixth and left trailing 2-1...the A's scored twice in the seventh to get him off the hook.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-1 with a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts against the American League West this season...his career numbers are 11-4 with a 3.02 ERA (43 er in 128.1 ip) against divisional foes and 13-18 with a 4.98 ERA (130 er in 235.0 ip) against all other teams.

2010 RECAP: Began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...the 15 wins tied for 10th most in the American League...has now won 17 games over the past two seasons, which is 12th most in the AL over that span...was the only Athletic to spend the entire 2010 season in the starting rotation...entered the season with a 7-11 record and 6.24 ERA in 30 games, 24 starts, over his first two seasons.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for fourth in the American League in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15)...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL...also ranked 10th in the AL in pitches (3369).

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents average in 11 starts during the day last year, 8-8 with a 3.86 ERA and .249 opponents average in 22 starts at night...ranked second in the AL in day ERA, tied for third in wins and fourth in opponents average...is now 11-5 with a 3.66 ERA (54 er in 132.2 ip) in 22 career appearances during the day, compared to 13-17 with a 4.64 ERA (119 er in 230.2 ip) in 46 games at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of two runs or fewer in each of his nine losses last year and had just six total runs of support in those starts (45.2 ip, 1.18 RSA)...has 19 runs of support in his 22 career losses (105.0 ip, 1.63 RSA)...is 22-4 in 37 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-2, 3.57 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has tossed six or more innings in four of his five starts this season, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked one batter or fewer five times...was charged with the loss in his last start, an A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles last Tuesday...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth... was 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games, nine starts, at Triple-A Oklahoma City in a 2010 season interrupted by right shoulder problems...had three stints on the DL with the RedHawks and was added to the Rangers' 60-day disabled list July 29... made four starts for Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League following last season and was 2-0 with a 1.96 ERA and .227 opponents batting average... is 1-2 with a 3.94 ERA (16.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 4 hr) in four career appearances vs. Texas...is 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA (6 er in 12.2 ip) in two career starts...has not faced Texas since 2006 as he had spent the previous four seasons in the Rangers organization...has not started against the Rangers since making two starts against the team in 2005.

Save/Save Opportunities: 8/12 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of its past 12 games and has a 1.67 ERA (6 er in 32.1 ip) over that span...ranks third in the American League and eighth in the majors with a 2.87 ERA (22 er in 69.0 ip) overall this season...has been charged with six of the team's 14 losses, which are tied for the second most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted eight of 12 (66.7%) save opportunities, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the four blown saves are tied for third most in the AL...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.344), third in on-base percentage (.306) and are sixth in opponents batting average (.242)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities in 2010, which was third best in the AL.

- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).

- Has a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in six appearances with one day of rest or less and a 6.75 ERA (3 er in 4.0 ip) in four appearances with two days rest or more.
- Has allowed six of eight (75.0%) inherited runners to score this season, which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League.
- Had a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in six games against the Rangers last year and has a 1.76 ERA in 16 career appearances against the team (15.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 17 so)...the 17 strikeouts are his most against any team.
