WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers snapped a 2-game losing streak on Saturday and are 1-1 on this 7-game trip to Oakland and Seattle...Texas has dropped 4 of its last 6 games beginning April 25 and 10 of last 17 after a 9-1 start...club is 5-4 since April 22...Texas' 16 wins are 2nd most in the A.L., 2 behind Cleveland and the club's .593 winning pct. is 3rd-best in A.L. behind the Indians (.692) and Yankees (.625) and tied for 6th best in the majors...the 16-11 mark is the team's best after 27 games since 2004 (17-10)...Rangers' 9-1 start matched the best 10-game record in club history (also 1989)...since that time, beginning April 12, the Rangers .412 (7-10) winning percentage matches is the 4th lowest in the American League behind the White Sox at .222 (4-14), the Twins at .353 (6-11) and the Orioles at .375 (6-10).

THE STANDINGS: Texas moved back into sole possession of 1st place on Saturday, a game in front of the Angels, and enter May in 1st place for the 1st time since 2006, when the club led Oakland by a half game...the Rangers were a half game behind the Angels and A's through April 30, 2010..the 1.0 game lead is the team's largest through April 30 since 1999 (2.0 GA)...club has had sole possession of 1st place for 8 of last 9 days...the Rangers have gained or lost ground in the A.L. West for 15 consecutive days since having a 2.0-game lead for 3 straight days April 13-15...Rangers have had at least a share of the division lead for 28 days in 2011, while Angels have held top spot the other 3 days...Texas has been in first place in the A.L. West for 146 of 149 days over 2 seasons beginning June 8, 2010.

STRONG OPENING ACT: Texas' 16 wins in April matched 1996 for the 3rd most in team history for the month to 1998 (18) and 1989 (17)...the club's .593 April winning percentage was 7th best ever for the team in the opening month, best since 1998 at .720 (18-7)...this was the 1st time that the club has had a winning record in April since 2006 (13-12).

APRIL AVERAGES: The Rangers concluded April with a 3.89 team ERA, the club's 4th lowest ERA for the opening month of a season in the last 20 years (beginning 1991) behind: 3.13--1993; 3.69--2010; and 3.80--1997...the club's opponents batting average of .246 is the lowest for any March-April since 1991 (.227).

--Texas posted a .270 team batting average for the month, the squad's best through the end of April since 2008 (.273)...The Rangers had their 2rd most extra base hits (98), matched their 3rd most doubles (55), hit their 4th most homers (36), and posted their 5th most runs (140) and total bases (418) ever in March April...the team's 27 games through April 30 tied 2003 for Texas' 2nd most ever to 2008 (28).

VERSUS THE A'S: The Rangers and A's have split the season's 1st 2 meetings with Texas capturing 4 of the last 5, all here at the Coliseum, beginning September 24, 2010...club has won 7 of the last 11 meetings after starting last year at 1-3...Texas has captured the season's series in 4 of the last 5 years vs. the A's, holding a 51-46 advantage in that span...Texas is 7-7 here in Oakland since the start of 2010...the Rangers lead the all-time series, 295-287 with the A's leading, 153-139 in Oakland.

MICHAEL'S MONTH: Michael Young is 2nd in the A.L. with 38 hits, one behind Ichiro, matching the 3rd most ever by a Ranger in March-April:

FINALLY, THE LONG BALL: Young connected for his 1st homer of 2011 in the 3rd inning Saturday in his 27th game, ending the longest drought to open season of his career...was his 1st homer since Sept. 25, 2010 here in Oakland (32-game overall drought), the day Rangers clinched A.L. West title...entering Saturday, Young's 17 RBI tied the 3rd most for a player in March-April without benefit of a home run since research in 1st available in 1946 ... still, his 19 RBI are the most for any major leaguer with only one home run in 2011.

MORE YOUNG: Michael leads all A.L. qualifiers in batting average with runners in scoring position at .538 (14-26), 2nd in the majors to Atlanta's Brian McCann at .579 (11-19)...of his 17 total RBI, 15 have come with runners at 2nd and 3rd, tied for 4th most in the league...Young also has the A.L.'s best road average at .422 (19-45), 2nd in ML to St. Louis' David Freese at .462, and has hit safely in last 10 road contests at .463 (19-41). --19 RBI are Young's most ever in March-April, 10th month with 19+ RBI --12 doubles tied the club record for March-April with Ivan Rodriguez (1996 and 1998) and Rusty Greer (1999 and 2001).

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR HITS: Of Mike Napoli's 12 hits in 2011, 9 have gone for extra bases (3 2B/6 HR), including the last 7 (3 2B/4 HR) since a 3rd inning single on April 9 (Game 2) in Baltimore...of all ML players with at least 12 hits, the only other player with as high a percentage of EBH to total hits is Tampa Bay's Sean Rodriguez, who also has 9 EBH on 12 total hits...Napoli has 3 homers and 7 RBI in last 8 games.

BATTING BITS: Saturday was Texas' 4th game of 10+ runs this season, most in the A.L., tied with Arizona and Philadelphia for most in ML...Texas leads the ML in extra base hits (98) and is 2nd in total bases (418) while striking out the fewest number of times (139)...Texas ranks 2nd among all A.L. clubs in average (.270), runs (140), doubles (55), homers (36), onbase percentage (.338), and slugging (.468).

SHORTS: Texas snapped a 3-game road losing streak on Saturday...Rangers are 7-4 in day games in 2011, 3-3 on the road...Texas is 6-2 in games started by lefthanders this season with LH starters allowing 25 runs in 16.0 innings in last 4 starts vs. Texas (0-3)...only LH starter with a win vs. Texas is Baltimore's Zach Britton on April 9 (Game 1)...happy birthday to Rangers Director of Travel Chris Lyngos

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER #54 Matt Harrison, LHP

(3-2, 3.69)

TODAY: The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance of the season today, the 69th game and 38th start of his career...will pitch on normal 4 days' rest for 2nd time this year (also 4/20 vs. LAA)...took loss in last start on Tues. vs. Toronto, matching shortest start by a Texas pitcher in 2011 (3.0 IP)...has gone 0-2, 9.31 (10 ER/9.2 IP) his last 2 starts to raise season ERA from 1.23 to season-high 3.69...has won both road starts this season, and also won lone day start in season debut (4/3 vs. BOS).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: Harrison logged a quality start in each of his first 4 starts this season, the 2nd-longest streak by a member of the season-opening rotation in the last 14 seasons (1998-2011)...C.J. Wilson set the club record of 7 to begin last season.

LAST START: Entered game with A.L.'s 6th-lowest ERA and gave up season-high 7 runs in just 3.0 innings on Tues. vs. Toronto, taking 10-3 defeat (3.0 IP, 8 H, 7 R-ER, 3 BB, 1 SO, 1 HR, 60 pitches/36 strikes)...allowed first 6 batters to reach (3 singles, 3 walks), including walking in 2 runs before recording an out...tossed a 1-2-3 2nd inning, but gave up 4 straight hits to begin the 3rd (HR to Lind then 3 consec. singles) and did not come out for the 4th inning...matched 2nd-shortest start of his career and also matched shortest start by a Ranger in 2011.

2011: Made the Rangers Opening Day rotation for a 3rd straight season (started 3rd game), the only pitcher to make that claim over last 3 years...his 3 wins are tied for the staff lead...team is 3-2 in 5 starts, the only Texas starter with a decision in every outing...Napoli caught first 2 starts (2-0, 1.29, 2 ER/14.0 IP) while Torrealba has caught last 3 straight (1-2, 5.60, 11 ER/17.2 IP)...Texas scored 5+ runs in each of 3 wins, 3-runs-or-less in both defeats...had quality starts in each of first 4 outings (see separate note)...has at least 6.0 innings in 4 of 5...has issued 3-walks-or-less in all 5...right-handers are hitting 200 points lower (.179) than lefties (.379)...has permitted just 6 XBH (4 HR, 1 double, 1 triple) in 31.2 innings for a .363 opponents SLG, 2ndlowest in Texas rotation (Ogando, .333)...all of his 6 XBH allowed have come with the bases empty...has held middle of the order (spots 3 thru 6) to a .180 (9-50) avg. w/ 2 $\,$ HR, including 0-for-12 by hitters batting 3rd...opposition batting .317 (13-41) with men on base, all singles...batting .161 (5-31) with no XBH with 2 outs in an inning...won first start 4/3 vs. BOS, matching career high with 8 K's and besting John Lackey in 12-5 victory that secured a season-opening series sweep for Rangers...struck out Jacoby Ellsbury with the bases loaded to end the 7th inning...won back end of twinbill on 4/9 at BAL-G2, allowing just an Adam Jones solo HR in the 2nd inning of 13-1 Texas victory...retired final 18 straight after the HR...earned 3rd straight win on 4/15 at NYY, Rangers' lone win in that series...held New York to just 3 hits over innings 2 thru 7...took first loss despite quality start on 4/20 vs. LAA, a 4-1 defeat in matchup with Jered Weaver, who tossed a CG.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-0, 3.57 (9 ER/22.2 IP) in 6 games/3 starts in his career against the A's, including winning all 3 starts at 3-0, 1.35 (3 ER/20.0 IP)...made 3 relief appearances vs. A's last year, allowing 6 runs in 2.2 innings...all 3 starts were in his rookie season of 2008, and he is 2-0, 0.64 (1 ER/14.0 IP) in his 2 starts here in Oakland...first time to face A's was 4th career start on July 26, 2008 at the Coliseum (5.0 IP, 3 R-1 ER), besting then-A.L. ERA leader Justin Duchscherer in 9-4 Texas win...next, and most recent, start here at Coliseum was his first career CG SHO on Sept. 12, 2008 (9.0 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 4 BB, 5 SO)...his 118 pitches in that SHO remain 2nd-most in his career, and was first SHO by a Texas rookie since 2003...also earned win in most recent start on Sept. 24, 2008 in Arlington, a 14-4 Rangers win...was Harrison's 9th win in '08 in club's final home game that year, a club record by a rookie lefty.

<u>ON ROAD</u>: His 1.20 road ERA (2 ER/15.0 IP) leads the A.L...has won each of his first 2 road starts, the only Texas starter with multiple road wins in 2010...is 9-5, 4.82 (52 ER/97.0 IP) in his 16 career road starts, having won 3 straight (3-0, 1.71, 4 ER/21.0 IP)...Harrison is seeking to win 3 straight road starts to begin the year...last Texas pitcher in the season-opening rotation to do that was Kevin Millwood, as he won his first 5 road starts in 2006 to begin his Rangers career.

AS A STARTER: IS 17-11 with a 5.37 ERA (127 ER/212.2 IP) in 37 career starts with 3 complete games and 2 shutouts...has won 4 of his last 6 decisions <u>as a starter</u>, going 4-2 with a 4.01 ERA (19 ER/42.2 IP) over his last 7 outings in a starting capacity...won 13 of his first 22 career starts, but is 4-6 last 15 starts since back-to-back complete-game wins May 8 and 14, 2009.
