WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's close this series today...Texas has lost 2 of 3 to Oakland and has dropped 3 of 4 overall...club has lost 5 of its last 7 games beginning April 25 and 11 of last 18 after a 9-1 start...club is 5-5 since April 22...Texas' 16 wins are T2nd most in the A.L., 3 behind Cleveland and the club's .571 winning pct. is T3rd-best in A.L. and T6th best in the majors...the 16-12 mark is the team's best record after 28 games since 2006 (16-12) as club was 14-14 in 2010...Rangers' 9-1 start matched the best 10-game record in club history (also 1989)...since that time, beginning April 12, the Rangers .389 (7-11) winning percentage matches is the 4th lowest in the American League behind the White Sox at .222 (4-14), the Twins at .353 (6-11) and the Orioles at .375 (6-10).

THE STANDINGS: For the 2nd time in 3 days, the Rangers dropped back into a 1st place tie with the Angels in the A.L. West... club has had sole possession of 1st place for 9 of last 10 days...the Rangers have gained or lost ground in the A.L. West for 16 consecutive days since having a 2.0-game lead for 3 straight days April 13-15...Rangers have had at least a share of the division lead for 29 days in 2011...Texas has been in first place in the A.L. West for 147 of 150 days over 2 seasons beginning June 8, 2010....Texas entered May in 1st place for the 1st time since 2006, when the club led Oakland by a half game.

--the Rangers have not trailed by more than a half game in the A.L. West since May 31, 2010, when the club was a full game back.

VERSUS THE A'S: The Rangers have lost 2 of 3 in this series but have capturing 4 of the last 6, all here at the Coliseum, beginning September 24, 2010...club has won 7 of the last 12 meetings after starting last year at 1-3...Texas has captured the season's series in 4 of the last 5 years vs. the A's, holding a 51-47 advantage in that span...Texas is 10-13 here in Oakland since the start of 2009...the Rangers lead the all-time series, 295-288 with the A's leading, 154-139 in Oakland...the teams next meet in a 3-game series in Arlington, May 9-11.

SHORT START: Matt Harrison worked just 1.2 innings on Sunday, the shortest starting stint of his major league career and the briefest for a Texas starter since Derek Holland lasted 1.0+ innings on May 30, 2010 at Minnesota...previous outing as short was 0.2 frames by Brandon McCarthy on Sept. 15, 2008 vs. Detroit.

--Harrison's 1.2 inning outing matched the shortest for an A.L. starter in 2011 done twice previously: Scott Kazmir, Los Angeles, April 3 at Kansas City (ND) and Chris Tillman, Baltimore, April 13 at New York (L)

--Harrison worked as few as 3.0 innings in just 2 of his 1st 36 career major league starts through April 20, 2011...however, that has been the case in each of his last 2 outings, 3.0 IP on April 26 vs. Toronto and Sunday.

LONG RELIEF: Dave Bush worked 4.1 innings in relief of Harrison on Sunday, the longest bullpen outing of his major league career...despite having made the fewest total relief appearances in the majors at 65, Texas relievers own 2 of the 4 longest bullpen outings in the majors this season.

--The 6.1 total innings worked by the Rangers bullpen on Sunday was the club's most bullpen innings in a game since 10.0 IP on Sept. 10, 2010 vs. the Yankees.

--the 2 outings listed above for Bush and Tomko have combined for 9.1 of the Rangers 76.1 total relief innings in 2011.

FOREVER YOUNG: Michael Young leads all A.L. qualifiers in batting average with runners in scoring position at .556 (15-27), 2nd in the majors to Atlanta's Brian McCann at .579 (11-19)...of his 20 total RBI, 16 have come with runners at 2nd and 3rd, tied for 3rd most in the league, 2 behind the league leader Adam Lind...Young also has the A.L.'s best road average at .417 (20-48), 3rd in ML to St. Louis teammates David Freese at .444, and Matt Holliday at .426...Michael has hit safely in last 11 road contests at .455 (20-44)...he is tied for the A.L. lead in hits with Ichiro Suzuki at 39.

TANDEM WITH 20 RBI: Adrian Beltre (22) and Michael Young (20) give the Rangers 2 players with at least 20 RBI in 2011, one of 5 ML clubs that can make that claim...Kansas City has 3 players with 20+ RBI:

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR HITS: Of Mike Napoli's 12 hits in 2011, 9 have gone for extra bases (3 2B/6 HR), including the last 7 (3 2B/4 HR) since a 3rd inning single on April 9 (Game 2) in Baltimore...of all ML players with at least 12 hits, the only other player with as high a percentage of EBH to total hits is Tampa Bay's Sean Rodriguez, who also has 9 EBH on 12 total hits...Napoli has 3 homers and 7 RBI in last 9 games.

YORVIT TORREALBA is 9-for-21 (.429) with 4 RBI in last 6 games and has hit safely in 10 of last 12 contests at .349 (15-43) to rise from .222 to .291, 3rd best among qualifying A.L. catchers behind Detroit's Alex Avila (.299) and New York's Russell Martin (.297)...his 23 starts behind the plate are one off the A.L. lead shared by Chicago's A.J. Pierzynski and Baltimore's Matt Wieters.

OGANDO NAMED PLAYER OF THE MONTH: RHP Alexi Ogando, who will start the opener of the series in Seattle on Tuesday, has been selected as the Rangers Player of the Month for April by the writers and broadcasters that cover the club on a regular basis...Ogando was 3-0 with a 2.30 ERA in his 5 starts, his 1st ever ML starts, for the month while holding opponents to a .171 batting average.

ON THE SEATTLE: The Rangers close this trip with a 3-game series at Safeco Field beginning Tuesday night...Texas swept 3 games from the Mariners in Texas, April 4-6, and has won 15 of 22 games from Seattle since the start of 2010...the Rangers won 6 of 9 games at Safeco Field a year ago, their most wins in Seattle for a season since 2005 (6-3).

DAY BALL: Today completes a string of 3 consecutive day games for the Rangers, the 2nd longest streak in 2011 to 4 in a row from April 10-13 (2-2)...Texas is 7-5 in day games, 3-4 on the road...after today, the Rangers are not scheduled to play more than 2 straight day games the rest of 2011.

DEFENSE: Texas committed 3 errors on Sunday, its 2nd highest total of the season to 4 on April 19 vs. the Angels...the Rangers have 17 errors in the last 12 games after just 8 in the season's 1st 16 contests...the club's .976 fielding percentage is the 2nd lowest in the majors to Houston's .974 figure...team has permitted 5 unearned runs in the last 4 games after allowing just 8 in the 1st 24 contests in 2011.

ON THE REHAB FRONT: Neftali Feliz will celebrate his 23rd birthday today by throwing his 2nd bullpen in 3 days in Oakland...Scott Feldman is scheduled for 4 innings in an extended spring game on Tuesday in Arizona...Tommy Hunter will throw a bullpen today in Arizona which will determine his next pitching assignment...Brandon Webb pitches Thursday in an extended spring game in Arizona.

SHORTS: Texas leads the ML in extra base hits (100) and is 2nd in total bases (428) while striking out the fewest number of times (148)...Texas is 5-7 on the road, losing 4 of the last 5 games....on Sunday, Gio Gonzalez joined Baltimore's Zach Britton (April 9-Game 1) as the only LH starters to defeat the Rangers this season.

**Derek Holland, LHP
(3-1, 5.12)**

TODAY: The 24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance of the season this afternoon against Oakland...looking to become the first Texas starter to win 4 games this season...did not factor in the decision in last start on Wednesday vs. Toronto, a 7-6 Texas victory...surrendered exactly 5 runs for a 3rd consecutive outing...had completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his first 4 starts before lasting 5.0 innings in his last outing...has gone 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA (15 ER/19.2 IP) in last 3 starts, after winning each of his first 2 starts and posting a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP)...has allowed 10 runs in the 4th inning this season, compared to 8 runs in all other innings combined...will be pitching on normal 4 days' rest for the 2nd consecutive start...for his career, right-handed batters are hitting nearly 30 points higher (.287) than lefties (.258), as right-handers have hit 31 of the 35 career home runs off Holland with 61 of his 81 career walks.

LAST START: Did not factor in the decision in last start on Wednesday vs. Toronto, a 7-6 Texas victory (5.0 IP, 11 H, 5 R-ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 100 pitches/61 strikes)...surrendered exactly 5 runs for a 3rd consecutive outing, going 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA (15 ER/19.2 IP) over that stretch...Rangers offense supported Holland with 6 unearned runs off Toronto starter JoJo Reyes in the 3rd inning...exited with a 6-5 advantage and in line for the victory, but Cody Eppley allowed a game-tying home run to Juan Rivera in the 7th...Mitch Moreland's go-ahead home run in the bottom of the frame secured the Texas victory and Eppley's first major league win.

2011: Made an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career this season...club is 4-1 in his 5 starts...Torrealba has caught all 5 games...has quality starts in 2 of 5 games, tossing at least 6.0 innings in each of his first 4 to open the season, longest such streak at any point of his career...lefties batting .316 (12-38), with right-handers at .295 (26-88)...opponents' 7-8-9 hitters are a combined 7-for-39 (.179)...#3 (.692, 9-13), #5 (.357, 5-14), and #6 (.313, 5-16) slots in order only slots hitting above .250...teams batting .281 (9-32) with RISP vs. Holland, including 3-for-15 (.200) w/ 2 outs and RISP...has fared better 1st (.275, 11-40) and 3rd (.293, 12-41) times through the order than 2nd (.351, 13-37) time through order...posted quality start in first outing (team's 4th game) on April 4 vs. SEA (W, 6.0 IP, 3 R-ER)...on April 10 at BAL, combined with Oliver/O'Day/Feliz in 3-0 shutout win (6.0 IP, 0 R)...took 5-2 loss on April 16 at NYY, permitting a pair of 2-run HR's to Teixeira/Cano.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-1, 2.63 (7 ER/24.0 IP) in 6 G/3 GS in career vs. the A's...his career ERA against Oakland is the lowest vs. any opponent he has made multiple starts against and over a full run lower than the next closest club (Seattle - 3.81 ERA in 7 games/3 starts)...was 1-0 with a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.2 IP) in 3 games/2 starts against Oakland in 2010, including 1-0, 0.82 (1 ER/11.0) as a starter.

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (5 ER/13.2 IP) in 2 starts away from Arlington this season...is 4-11 with a 5.06 ERA (59 ER/105.0 IP) in 26 career appearances on the road, including a 3-11, 5.30 (53 ER/90.0 IP) mark in 17 starts...opponents actually batting 40 points lower for his career in road starts (.259) than in home starts (.299)...run support figure on the road (3.40) is almost 3 runs lower than his home run support (6.92).

AS A STARTER: Is 12-17 with a 5.62 ERA (122 ER/195.1 IP) and one complete game (Aug. 9, 2009 at LAA) in 36 career starts over the past 3 seasons (2009-11), although he went 3-4, 4.44 (23 ER/46.2 IP) across 10 starts in 2010...opponents avg. as a starter in 2010 (.251) was over 30 points lower than same figure in 2009 (.286)...has logged at least 6.0 full innings in 15 of his 36 starts (8 quality starts).

SPRING TRAINING: Went 2-1 with a 6.38 ERA (13 ER/18.1 IP) over 5 'A' games/starts in Cactus League play this spring...also pitched in one intrasquad contest in Feb. and started Rangers exhibition game on March 30 at Round Rock.

2010 FOR TEXAS: Was 3-4, 4.44 (23 ER/46.2 IP) in 10 starts and posted a 2.53 ERA (3 ER/10.2 IP) in 4 relief appearances over 3 different stints with Texas, May 12-30, Aug. 18-19, and Aug. 28-end of season...was 7th on the staff in starts (10)...compiled a 2.32 ERA (8 ER/31.0 IP) in 7 games/4 starts in Arlington and a 6.15 mark (18 ER/26.1 IP) in 7 games/6 starts on the road...held left-handed batters to a .130 (6-46) average with RHB at .277 (49-177)...opponents batting average at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington was .214 (25-117)...opponents hit .194 (13-67) with runners in scoring position.

2010 POSTSEASON: Posted a 4.76 ERA (6 ER/11.1 IP) in 6 relief appearances in the playoffs, appearing in 2 games in each round...led club in relief innings for the postseason...issued 3 runs in 4.2 innings in Games 3 and 4 of ALDS vs. Tampa Bay...his 4.00 inning outing in Game 4 is the longest playoff relief stint ever by a Ranger...fanned 4 in that game...pitched 5.2 scoreless innings in 2 ALCS contests against New York...posted the only postseason relief win in franchise history with a 3.2 inning outing in Game 4 at Yankee Stadium...appeared twice in the World Series...walked all 3 Giants faced (Nate Schierholtz, Cody Ross, Aubrey Huff) with all 3 scoring in 8th inning of Game 2...of 13 pitches thrown, 12 were balls...was the 3rd pitcher with at least 3 walks and no batters retired in a World Series game: 4 BB—Art Reinhart, St. Louis (NL), Oct. 6, 1926 vs. New York (AL)—also one hit; 3 BB—Ryan Speier, Colorado, Oct. 24, 2007 vs. Boston...pitched a scoreless inning in Game 4.

INJURIES IN 2010: Was placed on the disabled list June 1 (retroactive to May 31) with left rotator cuff inflammation and was sent to Arizona extended spring program to rehab...while the inflammation dissipated quickly, suffered a right knee injury on June 18 during fielding practice in Arizona...had been throwing bullpen sessions in anticipation of a rehab assignment when the knee was injured...pitched 3.0 scoreless innings for AZL Rangers (Rookie) on July 23 and issued one run in 5.0 innings for Oklahoma City on July 28 in a pair of rehab starts...was activated from disabled list on August 1 and optioned to Oklahoma City.

CAREER: Had 3 different stints with the Rangers in 2010 after spending all but 13 days in the majors in his rookie year the previous season...missed nearly 2 months due to injuries before becoming a valuable contributor to the Rangers in September and during the post-season...made his major league debut in 2009 after just 43 minor leagues games, only 5 of those above the Single-A level...entered 2009 as the organization's second-best prospect by Baseball America...the 2008 Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year has made a rapid rise through the organization after not signing with Texas until May 20, 2007 as a draft and follow pick.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER: RHP Alexi Ogando (3-0, 2.30 ERA in 5 games/starts)

The 27-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 6th start and appearance on Tuesday night in the opener of a 3-game set against Seattle at Safeco Field...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest for a 2nd consecutive outing after each of his first 4 starts came on extended rest...last took mound on Thursday in a 5-2 loss to Toronto at Rangers Ballpark, but did not factor into the decision despite holding the Jays to a pair of runs over 6.0 frames (6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 1 HR, 3 BB, 7 SO, 96 pitches/54 strikes)...surrendered a 2-run HR to Adam Lind following a 2-out walk to Jose Bautista before finishing his outing with 5.0 scoreless innings...notched a career-high 7 strikeouts, reaching that mark with the first out of the 4th inning (strikeouts accounted for 7 of the first 10 outs he recorded)...Toronto broke a 2-2 tie with 3 runs in the top of the 9th, aided by a pair of Texas errors...since becoming the club's 5th starter following an injury to Tommy Hunter (groin) late in spring training, Ogando has logged at least 6.0 innings in all 5 starts with quality starts in 4 of those...opponents are batting just .171 (19-111) with 8 extra-base hits (3 doubles, 5 HR)...all 5 HR have come in his last 3 tilts after no HR in his first 2...has permitted an average of just 8.33 base runners-per-9.0 IP, 4th-lowest figure in the A.L., 6th-lowest in majors...slated for his 3rd road start of 2011, going 1-0, 3.38 (5 ER/13.1 IP) in 2 previous outings on April 11 at DET (7.0 SHO IP) and April 17 at NYY (5 ER/6.1 IP), the latter of which has been his only non-QS this year...was 2-1, 1.93 (4 ER/18.2 IP) in 19 relief appearances away from Arlington during his rookie campaign in 2010...has tossed a combined 7.1 scoreless innings across 3 career games against Seattle...earned first win of 2011 in a 3-2 Texas victory over the M's on April 5 at RBIA (0 R/6.0 IP), throwing 90 pitches in his first ever major league start...also appeared twice in relief last season against Seattle, once at Safeco Field.
