A's vs. INDIANS

The A's are 1-1 against the Indians this season following last night's win...won the season series 6-3 last year, their second consecutive season series win...went 2-1 in Oakland and 4-2 in Cleveland...have won nine of their last 10 series with Cleveland in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-216 against the Indians...that includes 132-95 in Oakland and 117-121 in Cleveland, including 32-52 at Progressive Field...alltime, the A's are 884-1,009 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton is a career .309 (29 for 94) hitter against Cleveland, which matches his highest average against any American Leaque team (Seattle).

Coco Crisp hit safely in six of his past seven games (13 for 29, .448) and has four multiple-hit games over that span.

David DeJesus has a 267-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on September 15, 2008.

Kurt Suzuki is 6 for 20 (.300) with two home runs and six RBI in five games since being reinstated from the paternity leave list Friday.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1949** Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning...in **1971** Vida Blue tosses a four hit shutout and strikes out 11 in the A's 5-0 win at Detroit...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won five of their past seven games and 14 of 24 since their 2-5 start...their 14-10 (.583) record over that span, which began April 9, is tied for fourth best in the American League and eighth best in the majors...at 16-15, are now a season-high one game above .500 for the third time this season...have also been exactly .500 eight times, including three times in the past six days...last season, were exactly .500 an Oakland-record 33 times...remain one game out of first place for the third consecutive day following wins by Texas and Los Angeles yesterday...have spent each of the past 23 days in third place and 26 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 2.58 ERA (57 er in 198.2 ip) this season, which **ranks first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers and is nearly half a run better than any other team (Atlanta, 3.05)...have allowed three earned runs or less in 24 of their 31 games this season, including eight games in which they did not allow an earned run...rank third in the majors in innings pitched (198.2) and have recorded 151 strikeouts, which is tied for fourth in the American League...have allowed 11 home runs this season, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for the fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.65 ERA (82 er in 278.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...also rank first in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.337), tied for fourth in on-base percentage (.310) and sixth in opponents batting average (.244)...have recorded 221 strikeouts, which ranks fifth in the AL, and have allowed 98 walks, which is seventh fewest.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers **lead the majors** with 10 pickoffs (Anderson 5, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1, Fuentes 1), nearly twice as many as any other team (Detroit, 6)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 14 of 22 (63.6%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the third lowest percentage in the majors...the A's, meanwhile, have been successful in 22 of 33 (66.7%) stolen base attempts...the steals are the sixth most in the American League, but the percentage is tied for fourth lowest.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .237 (247 for 1042) this season, which is the fourth lowest average in the American League...are batting .205 (56 for 273) with runners in scoring position, the second lowest average in the majors...their 106 runs this season are the third fewest in the majors...are now 10-2 when scoring four runs or more and 6-13 when scoring less than four...have been shut out four times this season...their 18 home runs are the third fewest in the AL, but their 60 doubles are the fifth most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 27 errors this season, which are tied for third most in the majors...have committed at least one error in 13 of their last 21 games (18 total over that span) since going a season-high six games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) last season for the sixth time in the last seven years.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 9-3 (.750) in day games and 7-12 (.368) at night...the day record is third best in the majors while the night record is tied for fourth worst...have a 2.13 ERA (26 er in 110.0 ip) during the day, which is the second best in the majors, and a 2.99 ERA (56 er in 168.2 ip) at night, which ranks fourth...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record in day games and went 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this seven-game homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-1)...went 3-4 on their last road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (1-2) and are now 8-7 at home and 8-8 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-6 in games decided by two runs or less this season, including a 5-4 record in one-run games...are 4-5 in games decided in the last at bat and 4-3 in extra-inning games.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used 24 different lineups through their first 31 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used seven times.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (103)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have four (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) after reinstating Wuertz April 25...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a record of 13-14...have now finished April with a record below .500 in three of their past five seasons and at .500 or below in seven of their past eight...had a 2.79 ERA (75 er in 241.2 ip), their first time finishing the month of April with an ERA under 3.00 since 1989 (74 er in 230.0 ip, 2.90 ERA)...the last time they had an ERA lower than 2.79 was 1981 (40 er in 190.0 ip, 1.89 ERA)...committed 25 errors, their most in April since committing 29 errors in 1983...had 21 stolen bases, their most in the first month of the season since stealing 19 bases in 1998...batted .237 (216 for 913), the fourth time they have finished the month with a batting average below .240 in the past six seasons.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...the A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 25-30 (.455) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in four of his six starts this year, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked one batter or fewer five times.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Allowed a

career-high-tying seven earned runs in his last start (also Aug. 14, 2009 vs. CWS), which raised his ERA from 1.56, the third lowest ERA in the AL at the time, to 2.95...that breaks down to a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 14.0 ip) in night games, which is the lowest among AL starting pitchers, and 4.21 (12 er in 25.2 ip) during the day...is now 17-12 with a 2.89 ERA (83 er in 258.1 ip) in 42 starts since June 29, 2009, which is 10th lowest ERA in the majors over that span (minimum 162.0 ip).

WALKS: Allowed a career-high-tying four walks (third time, last: July 29, 2009 at BOS) in his last start, his first time allowing multiple walks in a game this season...however, only has eight walks in 39.2 innings this season for an average of 1.82 walks per nine innings, which is tied for the sixth lowest average in the American League...has now walked one batter or less in 34 of his 55 career starts, including 11 starts in which he has not walked a batter.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have been successful in only three of nine attempts (33.3 percent) this season, which is tied for the 10th lowest percentage in the American League among starting pitchers...has also recorded five pickoffs, which are the most in the Major Leagues...last season, he finished tied for eighth in the AL with four pickoffs and he now has 12 in his three seasons.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning after throwing 108 pitches...left with the scored tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles...he threw 75 of his 109 pitches for strikes.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win in Chicago April 13...allowed three runs, two earned, on nine hits in 5.2 innings...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run...was replaced by Breslow following a Pierre single, who then stranded both runners by getting Beckham to pop out to short.

FOURTH START: Earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston April 19...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth after throwing 109 pitches.

FIFTH START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory over Seattle April 24...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...threw 69 of 106 pitches for strikes before being replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning.

LAST START: Took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas Saturday...surrendered a career-hightying seven earned runs in 5.0 innings, allowing one run in the first, two in the third and four in the fifth...allowed a career-high-tying four walks after walking only four batters over his first five starts...also allowed a career-high-tying three home runs (also April 22, 2009 at NYY)...his home run allowed to Young in the third inning came after going 36.2 innings without allowing a home run to open the season.

ANDERSON vs. CLEVELAND: Is 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 15 so) in two career starts...had a no decision in his only start last season, a 6-1 A's loss on April 24...shut out the Indians on one hit and one walk over the first five innings before allowing his only run in the sixth inning on a Choo RBI single...Carmona limited the A's to a run in 7.1 innings and Anderson left after six innings with the score tied at 1-1...the bullpen then allowed two runs in the eighth and three in the ninth for the loss...the win came on September 18, 2009 in a 2-1 A's victory in Oakland...struck out a career high 10 batters in 6.0 shutout innings...allowed just two runners into scoring position...Shoppach had a one-out double in the fifth and Brantley a one-out double in the sixth but both did not advance past second.

2010 RECAP: Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...allowed all six of his home runs to righties last year...five came at home, five were hit in night games and five were with the bases empty...his opponents batting average dropped to .225 with runners in scoring position after yielding a .314 average with RISP in 2009.

QUALIFICATIONS: Tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (3-2, 2.70 ERA) Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and .296 (21 for 71) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first three contests...has struck out 35 batters in 36.2 innings but has also issued 16 walks...ranks eighth in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.59) and is sixth in walks (3.93)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...is 1-2 with a 7.85 ERA (18.1 ip, 22 h, 17 r, 16 er, 11 bb, 17 so, 4 hr) in four career starts against Kansas City...is 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA (11 er in 13.0 ip) in three starts in Kansas City and 0-0 with an 8.44 ERA (5 er in 5.1 ip) in one start in Oakland...the win came in a 5-1 A's victory July 16 of last year at Kansas City...allowed a leadoff double to Podsednik and he went to third on a Kendall single and scored when DeJesus hit into a double play...that was the only run he allowed in 7.0 innings.
