A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series 3-1 after winning three of four games in Oakland to start the season series...lost the season series last year, 9-10...it marked the fourth time in the last five years the A's dropped the season series to the Rangers...are 48-51 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...the A's are 289-295 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-139 in Oakland and 134-156 in Texas...including 67-68 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 386-377 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus needs three hits to reach the 1,000-hit career milestone...he also owns a 271-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis played his 996th career game at second base yesterday, tying him with Eddie Collins for third most in Athletics history...is a .348 career hitter at Rangers Ballpark, which is the second best mark among batters with 200 or more at bats.

Brian Fuentes is tied for third in the AL with nine saves, while his 196 saves are the most by an active left-hander.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1972 the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in 1988 Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in 2010 Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three games in Kansas City and are now 9-6 over the last 15 games...have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...the A's .600 (9-6) winning percentage since April 23 is third best in the American League behind Tampa Bay (11-3, .786) and Cleveland (9-5, .643)...are a season-high-tying one game over .500 for the fifth time this year...have been exactly .500 a total of 10 times, including five times in the past 10 days...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...the A's 18-17 record matches their mark after 35 games last year (lost game 36)...with the win yesterday, moved back into a tie for second place for the second time in the last three days...have spent four days tied for second, 29 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 4-7 in the first game of a series, 9-2 in the last game and 5-8 in all other games.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-9 with a **Major League-leading** 2.63 ERA (67 er in 229.0 ip)...have allowed just one home run in 56.1 innings in May and 12 for the season, which is tied with Atlanta for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.340), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank second in innings pitched (229.0) and lowest on-base percentage (.303) and fourth in strikeouts (169).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.27 ERA (19 er in 75.1 ip) over the first eight games in May and now has a 2.67 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the majors...**rank first in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.331) and fourth in batting average (.240) and on-base percentage (.306)...have surrendered just one home run in 75.1 innings in May (Alex Gordon-KC, May 6) and have yielded 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .237, which is the fourth lowest mark in the American League...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.300) and slugging percentage (.357)...have scored 120 runs, which is second fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...are 11-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-14 when scoring fewer than four...have been shut out four times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have the third fewest home runs in the AL (21) and are tied for the third fewest walks (99)...are hitting .210 (65 for 310) with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the majors (San Diego, .181).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their five-game errorless streak snapped yesterday and now have 28 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 32) and tied for third most in the majors...the errors have led to 23 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...have turned 35 double plays, which is tied for third in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers **lead the majors** with 10 pickoffs (Anderson 5, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1, Fuentes 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 18 of 37 (48.6%) stolen base attempts this season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 13 times, which is tied for second most in the American League...have the third lowest stolen percentage (23 for 36, 63.9%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (three games)...are now 10-9 on the road for the season and are one of just three American League teams with a winning record on the road (Tampa Bay 11-4, Los Angeles 12-7)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-2) and are 8-8 at home...return home following the game Wednesday and, after an off-day on Thursday, begin a seven-game homestand against Chicago (three games), Los Angeles (two games) and Minnesota (two games) on Friday.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 10-4 (.714) in day games and 8-13 (.381) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and the fourth worst mark at night...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record in day games and went 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst...have a 2.20 ERA (32 er in 131.0 ip) during the day, which is the second best in the majors (Philadelphia, 1.80), and a 3.00 ERA (62 er in 186.0 ip) at night, which ranks fourth best.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their streak of three consecutive one-run decisions end yesterday...are 6-6 in one-run games for the season...lost a 4-3, 12-inning decision to Cleveland last Thursday and are now 4-4 in extra inning games...the eight extra inning games are tied with the Angels and Padres for the most in the majors...are 4-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (108)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a record of 13-14, the seventh time in the last eight seasons they have not posted a winning record in the month...had a Major League-leading 2.79 ERA, which was the fourth lowest April ERA in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 1981 (1.89)...it was the A's lowest ERA in any month since posting a 2.48 ERA in August, 2005...committed 25 errors, their most in April since making 29 in 1983...had 21 stolen bases, their most in the first month of the season since they had 25 in 1990...had a .305 on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since posting a .;282 mark in 1979 (minimum 10 games).

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments this year and are 42-27 (.609) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his seven starts this year, allowed one run or fewer six times and has walked two batters or fewer three times.

5-0: Has started the season 5-0 and is the first A's pitcher to win each of his first five

decisions since Rich Harden went 5-0 in 2008...the last time an A's pitcher started the season 6-0 was in 1996 when Jim Corsi compiled a 6-0 record in relief for the entire season...the last A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 was Dave Stewart in 1990...Cahill's five-game winning streak is tied for the longest active streak in the majors this year (Masterson, CLE; Scherzer, DET; McClellan, STL).

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: Won his final decision of 2010 and now has a six-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...that is one short of his career high of seven from May 21 to July 1, 2010...has a 1.55 ERA (9 er in 52.1 ip) and .211 (41 for 194) opponents batting average during his current winning streak which spans eight starts...his last loss was on September 26, 2010 against Texas

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 1.79 ERA...also ranks second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.275), tied for second in wins (5) and 10th in opponents batting average (.211) and on-base percentage (.274)...is also tied for first in wild pitches (6).

WINS: Is 23-7 with a 2.58 ERA (68 er in 237.0 ip) and .216 (184 for 853) opponents batting average in 36 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are the most in the majors over that span...is 33-21 (.611) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .211 opponents batting average includes a .185 (15 for 81) mark against right-handed hitters and .129 (4 for 31) with runners in scoring position...the mark with RISP is third lowest in the American League...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .163 (7 for 43) average...has yielded his two home runs to the eight and nine hitters.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-0 with a 1.02 ERA (2 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts against American League West competition this year...now has a 13-6 record and a 2.23 ERA (37 er in 149.1 ip) in 24 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 20-15 with a 4.28 ERA (129 er in 271.1 ip) in 45 starts against everyone else.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger - Vida Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings (Ted Lilly, 9 so in 4.2 ip on July 2, 2003 vs. Seattle and Tim Conroy, 9 so in 4.2 ip on June 17, 1984 vs. Chicago)...walked Suzuki to start the game but then retired each of the next eight batters he faced...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning to make the score 2-1 and was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save.

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto April 7...did not walk a batter for the seventh time in his career...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arencibia doubled to start the sixth...Arencibia later scored on a Nix single...was replaced by Fuentes to start the ninth.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago April 12...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...Ramirez hit a three-run home run, then Konerko later drove in Pierre by grounding into a force out...retired the side in order in the third and fourth innings before allowing a single to Dunn to lead off the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with two outs after Rios reached on an error...Breslow then got Pierzynski to fly out to left to end the inning.

FOURTH START: Earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit April 23 in Oakland...recorded a seasonhigh nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter for the eighth time in his career...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...was replaced by Ross to start the ninth inning.

FIFTH START: Earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...allowed a run in the second inning when Wilson had an RBI single and then held the Mariners scoreless over the next four innings...was relieved by Ziegler after throwing 100 pitches in six innings.

SIXTH START: Extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas April 29...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth inning.

LAST START: Improve to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland last Wednesday in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...it was the sixth time in seven starts he allowed one run or fewer...the A's added a run in the fourth and one more in the eighth for the win.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 7-2 with a 2.27 ERA (63.1 ip, 56 h, 19 r, 16 er, 19 bb, 37 so, 6 hr) in 10 career starts...has no more than four wins against any other team...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...is 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA (2 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts in Texas and 5-2 with a 2.95 ERA (14 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland April 29...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, scattering seven hits and four walks...left with a 7-0 lead...went 3-1 with a 2.64 ERA (30.2 ip, 29 h, 12 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 15 so) in five starts last year...the first win came in a 4-1 victory on May 5 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on four hits and three walks over the first five innings...then had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 13-inning win in Texas on May 11...left with the score tied at 2-2...picked up the win in the A's 3-1 victory at Texas July 28...tossed 8.0 innings and did not allow a run...also won in the A's 3-2 win in Oakland on August 8...blanked the Rangers on three hits over the first five innings before allowing two unearned runs in the sixth...then took the loss in a 16-9 decision in Oakland September 26...allowed seven runs on a career high 12 hits in just 4.0 innings.

LHP Brett Anderson (2-2, 2.77 ERA):. Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...leads the Majors in pickoffs (5), which is already a career high as he had four in each of the previous two seasons...has walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven starts and ranks fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.48)...has received run support of two runs or fewer in five of his seven starts and has the ninth lowest run support in the AL (2.77)...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss in 12 innings to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland (9.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so)...is 1-3 with a 6.44 ERA in six career starts against Texas...went 1-1 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in 2009 but is 0-2 with a 14.14 ERA in two starts since then...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 11-2 A's loss in Oakland April 30 (5.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 3 so, 3 hr).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 17 of its past 19 games (11 er in 51.1 ip, 1.93 ERA) and now has a 2.76 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 2.69)...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 17 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the AL and third most in the majors...has 11 saves, which is second most in the AL...has four blown saves for the third best save percentage (73.3%)...has not allowed a home run in its last 15 games and 44.1 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston by J.D. Drew (off Blevins)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.307) and the third lowest batting average (.215).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has not allowed a run in his last nine games (8.2 ip, 4 h, 8 bb, 11 so)...has not yielded a run in 14 of his 16 outings for the season (1.80 ERA).
- Has held opponents to a .185 batting average...that includes .120 (3 for 25) against left-handed hitters and .241 (7 for 29) against right-handers...opponents are 0 for 8 with runners in scoring position.
- Is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (2), tied for second in walks (11), tied for sixth in appearances (16) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (17).
- Has not allowed a run in his seven appearances during day games (6.0 ip, 1 h, 6 bb, 6 so).
- Has a win in three appearances against Texas this year (3.0 ip, 2 h, 4 bb, 5 so) and is 3-0 with a 2.22 ERA (6 er in 24.1 ip) in 20 career appearances against the Rangers.
- Earned his first save as an Athletic last Wednesday against Cleveland...it was his first save since October 3, 2009 with Tampa Bay against New York (AL).
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.
