A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three in Chicago, April 11-13...went 5-4 against the White Sox last year and have won the season series in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are now 58-32 (.644) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the best record by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 285-262 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 150-127 in Oakland and 135-135 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 962-1017 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last nine games and 8.2 innings.

David DeJesus needs three hits to reach the 1,000-hit career milestone...he also owns a 272-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Brian Fuentes is tied for third in the American League with nine saves, while his 196 saves are the most by an active left-hander.

Kurt Suzuki has gone 17 consecutive games without a strikeout, which is the longest streak by an Athletic since Marco Scutaro had an 18-game streak in 2004

Josh Willingham will serve his one-game suspension tonight.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1981 Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in 1986 Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings, in the A's 6-3 win over Toronto...in 2007 the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7...Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Were rained out Wednesday in Texas, the A's first rainout since April 29, 2009, also at Texas...are 10-7 (.588) over the last 17 games (since April 23) and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...the A's .588 winning percentage over that stretch is tied with Cleveland for second best in the American League behind Tampa Bay (13-4, .765)...remain in a tie for second place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and fifth time in the last seven days...have spent one day in second, seven days tied for second, 29 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 5-7 in the first game of a series, 9-3 in the last game and 5-8 in all other games...have been exactly .500 a total of 10 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...the A's are 9-3 (.750) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the best record in the AL...are 10-15 (.400) against right-handed starts.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's begin a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off tonight...however, all 20 games will be played in California...following this seven game homestand with Chicago, Los Angeles and Minnesota the A's have a seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL)...conclude the 20-game stretch with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York from May 27 to June 1.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 15-10 with a **Major League-leading** 2.69 ERA (72 er in 240.2 ip)...have allowed just three home runs in 68.0 innings in May and 14 for the season, which is tied with Philadelphia and San Francisco for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.343), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.305) and third in innings pitched (240.2) and strikeouts (181).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.75 ERA, a mark that is a half-run lower than the next closest American League team (Tampa Bay, 3.25)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.337) and rank third in batting (.243) and on-base percentage (.310)...have yielded the fewest home runs in the AL and second fewest in the majors (20).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .201 (54 for 269) with 27 runs scored over the last eight games (3.4 per game) but have seven home runs over that span...for the season, have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (129), the third lowest batting average (.233) and the third fewest home runs (23)...are 12-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-15 when scoring fewer than four...also have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.300) and third lowest slugging percentage (.354)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for the most in the AL...are hitting .213 (68 for 320) with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last three games and now have 30 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 24 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...have turned 37 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers **lead the majors** with 10 pickoffs (Anderson 5, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1, Fuentes 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 19 of 38 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 13 times, which is tied for third most in the American League...have the third lowest stolen percentage (24 for 37, 64.9%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand tonight against Chicago (three games), Los Angeles (two games) and Minnesota (two games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-2) and are 8-8 at home for the season...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...are 11-10 on the road and are one of just three American League teams with a winning record on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 10-4 (.714) in day games and 9-14 (.391) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and the fourth worst mark at night...have a 2.20 ERA (32 er in 131.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.10 (70 er in 203.0 ip) at night...the day ERA is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 1.80)...are batting .258 (127 for 492) with 11 home runs during the day and .217 (165 for 760) with 12 home runs at night...the night batting average is second lowest in the majors (Colorado, .204)

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's are 6-4 (.600) in the month of May, which is tied for the third best record in the American League behind Detroit (8-3, .727) and Tampa Bay (7-3, .700)...have a 2.63 ERA (27 er in 92.1 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (San Francisco, 2.23)...have surrendered a Major League-low three home runs in 92.1 innings this month...A's starting pitchers are 5-2 with a 2.51 ERA (19 er in 68.0 ip)...the offense is batting .224 (76 for 339), which is second lowest in the AL...finished April with a record of 13-14, the seventh time in the last eight seasons they have not posted a winning record in the month...had a Major League-leading 2.79 ERA, which was the fourth lowest April ERA in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 1981 (1.89)...it was the A's lowest ERA in any month since posting a 2.48 ERA in August, 2005...committed 25 errors, their most in April since making 29 in 1983...had 21 stolen bases, their most in the first month of the season since they had 25 in 1990...had a .305 on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since posting a .282 mark in 1979 (minimum 10 games).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-4 in extra inning games and the eight extra inning contests are second most in the American League behind Los Angeles (9)... are 4-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have a 6-6 record in one-run games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (108)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 2-5 (.286) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-34 (.460) in his 63 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in six of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer all seven times.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 3.90 ERA (27.2 ip. 31 h. 16 r. 12 er.

with a 3.90 ERA (27.2 ip, 31 h, 16 r, 12 er, 6 bb, 16 so) and .298 (31 for 104) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

DON'T WALK: Has issued two walks in each of his last two starts after walking one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts...has walked just eight batters in 49.2 innings for an average of 1.45 per nine innings...that is the fourth lowest figure in the American League...has struck out 30 and his strikeout to walk ratio of 3.75 is seventh best in the AL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed just one home run in 49.2 innings for an average of 0.18 per nine innings, which is second lowest figure in the American League...is tied for the lead in complete games (2), tied for fifth in most unearned runs allowed (5) and tied for ninth in grounded into double plays (6)...has yielded 54 hits, which is tied for sixth most in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .353 (12 for 34) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are hit .175 (10 for 57) the first time through the lineup and .336 (44 for 131) after that.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...now has three errors for the season, which is tied for the lead among American League pitchers...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...Lind drove in Davis with a sacrifice fly, Hill singled home Escobar and Encarnacion scored Hill with a double...Snider then brought in Rivera, who had reached on a Kouzmanoff throwing error, on a groundout to tie the game at 5-5...then pitched two more scoreless innings before being relieved by Blevins to start the ninth after throwing 89 pitches...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle, a no decision in a 7-4 Rangers win (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so).

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...was replaced by Blevins with one out and runners on second and third in the eighth inning, with both runners going on to score.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss.

FOURTH START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes.

FIFTH START: Was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles April 26...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth...was then replaced by Ziegler with one out in the sixth inning.

SIXTH START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eight and Matsui in the 10^{th} for the win.

LAST START: Tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City last Saturday...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss.

McCARTHY vs. CHICAGO: Was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 9-6 Rangers win in Texas on May 2, 2009...allowed a Ramirez sacrifice fly in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work...retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced and left with a 9-1 lead...made his Major League debut with Chicago in 2005 and was 7-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 65 games, 12 starts, in two seasons with the White Sox.

2010 RECAP: Was 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games, nine starts, at Triple-A Oklahoma City in a season interrupted by right shoulder problems...had three stints on the DL with the RedHawks and was added to the Rangers' 60-day disabled list July 29...struck out 44 and walked just 11 in 56.1 innings...allowed a .234 opponents batting average last season, which broke down to .227 (22 for 97) against left-handed hitters and .240 (29 for 121) against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs to righties and six were solo shots...opponents batted .190 with runners in scoring position and .208 when leading off an inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Tyson Ross (2-2, 2.51 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and fifth start of the season...moved into the starting rotation April 22 after Dallas Braden went on the disabled list and is 1-1 with a 2.28 ERA in his four starting assignments after going 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA in three relief appearances...has not allowed a home run in 28.2 innings this year, which are the most innings pitched in the majors among pitchers with no home runs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 win at Kansas City last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...it was his first career win as a starter...has faced the White Sox once in his career and it came in relief earlier this year on April 11 at Chicago...relieved Dallas Braden to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 1-0 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings (1 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...Oakland tied the game with a run in the ninth and he picked up the win when the A's added another run in the 10th.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 18 of its past 21 games (14 er in 56.2 ip, 2.22 ERA) and now has a 2.89 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 2.84)...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 17 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...has 11 saves, which is second most in the AL...has four blown saves for the second best save percentage (73.3%) in the AL...has not allowed a home run in its last 17 games and 49.2 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston by J.D. Drew (off Blevins)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL 21) and the third lowest batting average (.226)

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has not allowed a run over his last nine games (8.2 ip, 4 h, 8 bb, 11 so) and has not yielded a run in 14 of his 16 outings for the season (1.80 ERA, 3 er in 15.0 ip).
- Has held opponents to a .185 batting average...that includes .120 (3 for 25) against left-handed hitters and .241 (7 for 29) against righthanders...opponents are 0 for 8 with runners in scoring position.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in wins (2), tied for fourth in walks (11) and tied for 12th in strikeouts (17).
- Has not allowed a run in his seven appearances during day games (6.0 ip, 1 h, 6 bb, 6 so).
- Pitched a scoreless inning and earned the win in his only appearance against the White Sox this season...is 2-0 with a 5.30 ERA in 21 career appearances against the team (18.2 ip, 17 h, 12 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 18 so, 3 hr).
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his last 14 outings (2 er in 10.2 ip, 1.69 ERA) and has stranded all five of his inherited runners over that span.
- Has allowed just 1 of 8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is the 10th lowest percentage in the American League...however, first batters faced are 7 for 16 (.438)...the batting average is the fourth highest in the AL and the on-base percentage (.471) is eighth highest.
- Opponents are batting .373, which ranks sixth highest among AL relievers...the batting average includes a .455 (10 for 22) mark against left-handed hitters and .310 (9 for 29) against righties.
- Ranks third among all Major League pitchers with three pickoffs.
- Has made two appearances against Chicago this season (1 er in 2.1 ip, 3.86 ERA) and is 0-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 19 career appearances (18.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 2 hr).
- Made a team-leading 75 appearances for the A's in 2010, registering a 4-4 mark with five saves and 3.01 ERA...the games pitched tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history...also set an Oakland record for strikeouts by a left-handed reliever with 71.

with a 2.28 ERA (6 er in 23.2 ip) in his four starting assignments after going 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA in three relief appearances...is now 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA (12 er in 31.1 ip) in six career starts and 2-3 with a 4.91 ERA in 27 career relief appearances.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in 28.2 innings this year, which are the second most innings pitched in the American League among pitchers with no home runs...his last home run allowed was June 30 of last year at Baltimore (Tejada)...has allowed just two extra base hits in 2011, both doubles, for a .272 opponents slugging percentage.
