CHICAGO WHITE SOX (15-23) at OAKLAND A'S (19-18) RHP Phil Humber (2-3, 2.97) vs. RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-3, 3.26) Game #39/Road #23 • Friday, May 13, 2011

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last five games as they open a three-game series tonight in Oakland ... right-hander Phil Humber, who owns a 1.71 ERA (4 ER/21.0 IP) over his last three starts, will take the mound for the Sox.
- Following Sunday's game, the Sox return to U.S. Cellular Field for seven-game homestand vs. Texas (5/16-17), Cleveland (5/18-19) and Los Angeles-NL (5/20-22).
- The White Sox were 1-5 on the six-game homestand vs. Baltimore (1-3) and Minnesota (0-2) from 4/29-5/4 and 3-8 on the last trip to Tampa Bay (1-3), Detroit (0-3) and New York (2-2) from 4/18-28, which tied the longest April trip in franchise history.
- Chicago has used 28 different lineups this season.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have won two consecutive series for the first time this season ... Chicago is 8-1 in its last nine games played on Friday the 13th.
- Phil Humber has allowed three hits or less while throwing at least 7.0 innings in three straight starts, tying a club record (See note below).
- Chicago has hit at least three doubles in five consecutive road games for the first time since 6/15-7/3/00 ... the Sox have accomplished the feat in six straight games only twice since 1917 (9/20/19-4/27/20 and 5/17-22/26).

WEDNESDAY'S RECAP

- Alexei Ramirez scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch during an intentional walk in the 10th inning, and the White Sox rallied from a three-run deficit for a 6-4 victory at the Angels ... the win gave the Sox their first back-to-back series victories in 2011.
- Jake Peavy made his first start since 7/6/10, allowing four runs over 6.0 IP, while Jesse Crain (1.0 IP), Sergio Santos (W, 2.0) and Matt Thornton (SV, 1.0 IP) combined for 4.0 scoreless IP in relief ... Santos made his 13th straight scoreless appearance to start the season (17.0 IP).
- Adam Dunn matched his career high with four hits (fourth time), going 4-5 with a double, home run, RBI and three runs scored ... Mark Teahen left the game with a mild strain of his right oblique muscle ... his replacement, Omar Vizquel, hit an RBI double in the eighth and tied the game with a sacrifice fly in the ninth.

THE RETURN OF HAWK AND WIMPY

- Tom Paciorek, who served as the color analyst in the White Sox TV booth from 1988-99, rejoins his former play-by-play partner, Ken Harrelson, for the three-game series in Oakland ... Paciorek is filling in for Steve Stone, who has the series off.
- Harrelson and Paciorek last broadcast a game together on 10/3/99 vs. Minnesota (1-1 tie).

NOT-SO SCARY DAY FOR THE SOX

- The Sox are 8-1 in their last nine games played on Friday the 13th, dating back to a 7-2 victory on 7/13/01 at the Cubs ... Chicago has outscored its opponent's, 57-31, in those games.
- The White Sox last loss on Friday the 13th was on 7/13/07 at Baltimore (2-0).
- Paul Konerko is 9-27 (.333) with two doubles, a home run and nine RBI in his last nine games played on Friday the 13th.

HUMBER MATCHES PIERCE STREAK

- Phil Humber has allowed three hits or less while throwing at least 7.0 IP in three straight starts, one of two pitchers in Sox history to accomplish the feat (also Billy Pierce from 5/30-6/8/57).
- No White Sox pitcher has gone 7.0 IP or more with less than four hits in four consecutive starts.
- Boston's Josh Beckett and Florida's Josh Johnson each went three straight outings of at least 7.0 IP and three hits allowed or less in 2011 ... the last pitcher in baseball to achieve the feat in at least four starts in a row was Johan Santana in 2004 (five).

SOX PUTTING UP A FIGHT AT THE COLISEUM

- The White Sox have gone 6-5 in their last 11 games in Oakland, compared to 6-28 (.214) in their previous 34.

WINNING ON THE WEST COAST

- The White Sox are 24-19 playing at Seattle, Los Angeles and Oakland since 2008, including a 10-7 record since 2010 ... by contrast, the Sox were 24-64 (.273) on the road vs. the Mariners, Angels and A's from 2001-07.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The Sox trail in the season series, 2-1, after losing two of three games on 4/11-13 ... all three games went to extra innings.
- The Sox are hitting .216 (24-111) with a 3.90 ERA (13 ER/30.0 IP) and have been outscored, 14-11
- Chicago was 4-5 in 2010, going 2-1 at home and 2-4 in Oakland, to fall to 2-10-1 in 13 season matchups since 1998.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 262-285 ... they are 135-135 in Chicago (47-53 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 127-150 at the Oakland Coliseum.

ON THE TRIP

- The White Sox are 4-2 on the trip to Seattle (2-1), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Oakland (5/13-15), hitting .311 (68-219) with a 2.47 ERA (15 ER/54.2 IP) and a 29-15 edge in runs scored.

SELF-STARTERS

- White Sox starting pitchers own a 2.54 ERA (18 ER/63.2 IP) over the last nine games ... during that span, Sox starters have lowered their season ERA from 4.44 to 3.96.

BULLPEN BOUNCING BACK

- White Sox relievers are 2-1 with a 0.57 ERA (1 ER/15.2 IP), one save, 14 strikeouts and a .161 (9-56) opponents average in their last eight games ... the bullpen has not allowed a run over their last five games (12.0 IP).
- Chicago relievers were 2-4 with a 5.55 ERA (45 ER/73.0 IP) and six blown saves in April.

SOX BATS GETTING OFFENSIVE

- The Sox are hitting .333 (63-189) with 16 doubles, five homers and 27 runs scored (5.4 per game) over their last five games.
- Chicago has hit at least three doubles in five consecutive road games for the first time since 6/15-7/3/00 ... the Sox have accomplished the feat in six straight games only twice since 1917 (9/20/19-4/27/20 and 5/17-22/26).
- The Sox hit .307 (103-336) in their first nine games from 4/1-10, before batting .202 (157-776) in 24 games from 4/11-5/6.

HITTERS LEAVING HIBERNATION

- Adam Dunn has gone 10-21 (.476) with five doubles, a home run, four RBI and seven runs scored in his last five games.
- Paul Konerko is 14-33 (.424) with a double, three home runs and nine RBI in his last 10 games.
- A.J. Pierzynski has gone 7-14 (.500) with two doubles and a RBI in his last three games.
- Alexei Ramirez is 7-18 (.389) with two doubles, a home run, two doubles and five runs scored over his last four games.

SANTOS STARTS OFF SCORELESS AGAIN

- Sergio Santos leads all American League relievers with a 0.00 ERA (17.0 IP) and is the only qualifying reliever in baseball yet to allow a run (Mets' Pedro Beato has yielded four unearned runs in 17.0 IP).
- Santos' 17.0 IP is the third-longest scoreless streak to begin a season by a Sox pitcher, 0.2 IP behind Gerry Staley (4/19-5/8/60), while his 13 scoreless outings are tied for the fourth-longest (also Roberto Hernandez from 3/31-4/29/96).

- Paul Konerko needs one home run to pass Rocky Colavito (374) for 67th place all-time ... Adam Dunn needs one homer to pass Yogi Berra (358) for 74th place all-time.
- Juan Pierre is one stolen base shy of Herman Long (29th place, 533) on the all-time stolen-base list.
- Omar Vizquel needs three hits to tie George Sisler for 46th place all-time with 2,812.

AT THE HELM

- Ozzie Guillen is 615-558 (.524) in his eighth season as White Sox manager ... Guillen is the only manager to guide the Sox to more than one division/league title.
- Is tied with Boston's Terry Francona for the fourth-longest current tenure as manager with one club in the major leagues, behind St. Louis' Tony La Russa (1996), the Angels' Mike Scioscia (2000) and Minnesota's Ron Gardenhire (2002).
- Has been ejected 26 times (once in 2011).
- Is signed through 2012 (Sox exercised option on 1/21/11).
