ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 11-8 (.579) over the last 19 games (since April 23) and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...the A's .579 winning percentage over that stretch is fourth best in the American League...for the season, the A's are 9-3 (.750) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the best record in the AL...are 11-16 (.407) against right-handed starters...are one game over .500 at 20-19 and have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...have been exactly .500 a total of 11 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...are in a tie for second place in the AL West for the sixth time in the last nine days...have spent one day in second, eight days tied for second, 30 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 5-8 in the first game of a series, 9-3 in the last game and 6-8 in all other games.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 11-4 (.733) in day games and 9-15 (.375) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and are tied for the second worst mark at night...have a 2.19 ERA (34 er in 140.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.10 (73 er in 212.0 ip) at night...the day ERA is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.11)...are batting .261 (137 for 524) with 11 home runs during the day and .217 (171 for 789) with 12 home runs at night...the night batting average is second lowest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-11 with a **Major League-leading** 2.72 ERA (77 er in 255.0 ip)...have allowed just 15 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 14)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.342), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.302) and third in innings pitched (255.0) and strikeouts (195).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.74 ERA, a mark that is nearly a half-run lower than the next closest American League team (Tampa Bay, 3.23)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.335) and rank third in batting (.241) and on-base percentage (.306)...have yielded 21 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 19).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .212 (70 for 330) with 36 runs scored over the last 10 games (3.6 per game)...have scored 138 runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League, and are batting .235, which is third lowest...also have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.302), the third lowest slugging percentage (.353) and the third fewest home runs (23) and strikeouts (230)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for the most in the AL...are hitting .219 (73 for 333) with runners in scoring position, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Seattle, .217)...are 13-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-16 when scoring fewer than four.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last five games and now have 31 for the season, which is second most in the American League and tied for third in the majors...the errors have led to 25 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...have turned 40 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 1-1 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began Friday night...all 20 games will be played in California...following this seven game homestand with Chicago, Los Angeles and Minnesota the A's have a seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL)...conclude the 20-game stretch with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York from May 27 to June 1.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers **lead the majors** with 10 pickoffs (Anderson 5, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1, Fuentes 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 19 of 38 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 14 times, which is tied for third most in the American League...have the second lowest stolen percentage (25 for 39, 64.1%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game homestand against Chicago (1-1), Los Angeles (two games) and Minnesota (two games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-2) and are 9-9 at home for the season...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...are 11-10 on the road and are one of just three American League teams with a winning record on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 6-7 in one-run games with the loss Friday night...the seven one-run losses are tied for fourth in the American League...are 4-4 in extra inning games and the eight extra inning contests are second most in the AL behind Los Angeles (9)... are 4-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's are 7-5 (.583) in the month of May, which is fourth best in the American League...have a 2.61 ERA (32 er in 110.0 ip), which is second lowest in the majors (Arizona, 2.61)...have surrendered a Major League-low four home runs in 110.1 innings this month (0.33 per nine innings)...A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.62 ERA (24 er in 82.1 ip)...the offense is batting .230 (92 for 400), which is third lowest in the AL...finished April with a record of 13-14, the seventh time in the last eight seasons they have not posted a winning record in the month...had a Major League-leading 2.79 ERA, which was the fourth lowest April ERA in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 1981 (1.89)

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (108)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have split the first two games in Oakland after winning two of three in Chicago, April 11-13...went 5-4 against the White Sox last year and have won the season series in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are now 59-33 (.641) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the **best record by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 286-263 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 151-128 in Oakland and 135-135 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 963-1018 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 11.1 innings.

David DeJesus tripled in the fifth inning yesterday for his 1000th career hit...has not committed an error this year and now owns a 274-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Brian Fuentes is tied for fourth in the American League with nine saves, while his 196 saves are the most by an active left-hander.

Ryan Sweeney has a career-long 132-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

Michael Wuertz has allowed just one hit this year and opponents are batting .040 off him.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958** Ned Garver tosses a seven-hit shutout and Vic Power hits a three-run home run to account for all the offense in a 3-0 Kansas City win over Chicago...in **1985** the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3...Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-27 (.614) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in five of his eight starts, allowed one run or fewer seven times and has walked two batters or fewer four times.

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: Won his final decision of 2010 and now has a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...that matches his career high from May 21 to July 1, 2010...has a 1.52 ERA (10 er in 59.1 ip) and .210 (46 for 219) opponents batting average during his current winning streak which spans nine starts...his last loss was on September 26, 2010 against Texas...the last A's pitcher with a winning streak longer than seven games is Dan Haren, who had a 10-game winning streak from April 18 to July 1, 2007.

6-0: Has started the season 6-0 and is the first A's pitcher to win each of his first six decisions since 1996 when Jim Corsi compiled a 6-0 record in relief for the entire season...the last A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 was Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the last time an A's pitcher started the season 7-0 was in 1992 when Jeff Parrett went 7-0 in relief...Cahill is one of two Major Leaguers with a perfect 6-0 record this year (Scherzer, DET).

ONE RUN OR LESS: Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 5-0 with a 1.03 ERA (4 er in 35.0 ip) over that span...the Oakland record for consecutive starts with one run or fewer is six set by Jim Nash in 1968 (April 30-May 28) and matched by Cory Lidle in 2002 (Aug. 4-31)...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his eight starts this year.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors with a 1.72 ERA...is tied for the AL lead in wins (6), ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.281), tied for second in wins (6) and 10th in opponents batting average (.209) and on-base percentage (.269)...also has a Major League-leading seven wild pitches...that ties Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

WINS: Is 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA (69 er in 244.0 ip) and .215 (189 for 878) opponents batting average in 37 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are the most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-10 (.730) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 62-78 (.443) with all other pitchers...is 34-21 (.618) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .209 opponents batting average includes a .179 (17 for 95) mark against right-handed hitters and .114 (4 for 35) with runners in scoring position...the mark with RISP is third lowest in the American League and his average against righties is seventh best...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .114 (7 for 61) average...has yielded all three of his home runs to the bottom three hitters in the order.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.01 ERA (3 er in 26.2 ip) in four starts at home this year and 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the AL...is now 21-10 with a 3.01 ERA (79 er in 236.1 ip) in 37 career starts in Oakland and 13-11 with a 4.14 ERA (88 er in 191.1 ip) in 33 starts on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 4 for 27 (.148)...now has a 1.18 ERA (5 er in 38.0 ip) and .175 (22 for 126) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger - Vida Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings (Ted Lilly, 9 so in 4.2 ip on July 2, 2003 vs. Seattle and Tim Conroy, 9 so in 4.2 ip on June 17, 1984 vs. Chicago)...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arencebia doubled to start the sixth...Arencebia later scored on a Nix single...was replaced by Fuentes to start the ninth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...Ramirez hit a three-run home run, then Konerko later drove in Pierre by grounding into a force out...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...allowed a run in the second inning when Wilson had an RBI single and then held the Mariners scoreless over the next four innings...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched.

LAST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas last Monday...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed one run, his third consecutive start of seven or more innings and one run or fewer...the Rangers cored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth.

CAHILL vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-1 with a 3.93 ERA (34.1 ip, 30 h, 16 r, 15 er, 12 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in six career starts...is 0-0 with a 6.08 ERA (9 er in 13.1 ip) in three starts in Chicago and 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (6 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-5 A's loss in 10 innings at Chicago on April 12...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the second on a three-run home run by Ramirez and a Konerko fielders choice...was relieved by Breslow with two outs in the fifth inning after throwing 97 pitches...left trailing 4-3 but the A's scored twice in the sixth to get him off the hook.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (2-3, 3.21 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 6.27 ERA, eight walks and four home runs allowed over his last three starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip)...is tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs (5)...has the third lowest run support in the American League (2.53)...has a 1.69 ERA over the first four innings of a game and 5.48 after that...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 loss at Texas last Tuesday (4.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 4.68 ERA in four career starts against Los Angeles...made just one start against the Angels last year and had a no decision in a 6-5 loss at Los Angeles September 27 (6.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-8, 2.78 ERA (97.0 ip, 78 h, 45 r, 30 er, 48 bb, 84 so, 6 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 11/15 (73.3%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 20 of its past 23 games (14 er in 60.1 ip, 2.09 ERA) and now has a 2.78 ERA for the season, which is the best in the American League...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 17 losses, which is tied for the most by a bullpen in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...has 11 saves, which is second most in the AL...has four blown saves for the second best save percentage (73.3%) in the AL...has not allowed a home run in its last 19 games and 53.1 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston by J.D. Drew (off Blevins)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.316) and the third lowest batting average (.222).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 2-6 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-35 (.453) in his 64 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer all eight times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA (34.2 ip, 36 h, 20 r, 15 er, 8 bb, 22 so) and .283 (36 for 127) opponents batting average over his last five starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his fourth error of the season in his last start, which is the **most** among Major League pitchers...the errors have led to six unearned runs, which is **tied for third** in the American League...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed just one home run in 56.2 innings for an average of 0.16 per nine innings, which is **second** lowest figure in the American League...is **tied for the lead** in complete games (2), ranks **fourth** in fewest walks per nine innings, **tied for sixth** in most hits (59), **seventh** in strikeout to walk ratio (3.60), **tied for seventh** in losses (4) and **tied for ninth** in grounded into double plays (7).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 1.37 ERA (3 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 4.38 ERA (18 er in 37.0 ip) in five starts on the road...ranks **fifth** in the American League in home ERA.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .368 (14 for 38) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is **fifth** highest in the American League...opponents are hitting .190 (12 for 63) the first time through the lineup and .318 (47 for 148) after that.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...Lind drove in Davis with a sacrifice fly, Hill singled home Escobar and Encarnacion scored Hill with a double...Snider then brought in Rivera, who had reached on a Kouzmanoff throwing error, on a groundout to tie the game at 5-5...then pitched two more scoreless innings before being relieved by Blevins to start the ninth after throwing 89 pitches...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle, a no decision in a 7-4 Rangers win (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so).

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...was replaced by Blevins with one out and runners on second and third in the eighth inning, with both runners going on to score.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss.

FOURTH START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes.

McCARTHY vs. MINNESOTA: Is 1-0 with a 1.63 ERA (27.2 ip, 21 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including two starts...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) in one start at Target Field, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in one appearance in the Metrodome and 0-0 with a 1.04 ERA (2 er in 17.1 ip) in five games, one start, in his home ballparks...is 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA (3 er in 15.1 ip) in his two starts...including a win in his only outing this year, a 5-3 A's win at Minnesota April 10...shutout the Twins on six hits over the first seven innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the eighth inning...put runners on second and third with one out and was relieved by Blevins who allowed both inherited runners to score.

2010 RECAP: Was 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games, nine starts, at Triple-A Oklahoma City in a season interrupted by right shoulder problems...had three stints on the DL with the RedHawks and was added to the Rangers' 60-day disabled list July 29...struck out 44 and walked just 11 in 56.1 innings.
