WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won five of their last seven games as they conclude their nine-game, 10-day trip today in Oakland ... left-hander Mark Buehrle, who owns a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.2 IP) in his last two starts, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- Following today's game, the White Sox return to U.S. Cellular Field for a seven-game homestand vs. Texas (5/16-17), Cleveland (5/18-19) and Los Angeles-NL (5/20-22).
- The Sox are in a stretch where they play 20 consecutive days from 5/13-6/1 (1-1 so far).
- The White Sox were 1-5 on their last homestand vs. Baltimore (1-3) and Minnesota 4-13 from 4/29-5/4 and 3-8 on the last trip to Tampa Bay (1-3), Detroit (0-3) and New York (2-2) from 4/18-28, which tied the longest April trip in franchise history.
- Chicago has used 30 different lineups this season.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are 5-3 on this trip after going 6-11 on their first two trips combined.
- Mark Buehrle is 4-13 with a 3.70 ERA (66 ER/160.1 IP) lifetime vs. the A's and 1-7 with a 4.46 ERA (41 ER/82.2 IP) at the Oakland Coliseum.
- Paul Konerko is hitting .464 (13-28) during his current seven-game hitting streak ... Konerko needs one home run to tie Carlton Fisk for 66th all-time.
- The White Sox bullpen has allowed just one unearned run in 18.2 IP over the last seven games.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Rookie Tyson Ross allowed two runs on six hits over 7.1 IP to lead Oakland to a 6-2 victory over the White Sox.
- Gavin Floyd took the loss, giving up five runs on nine hits over 4.1 IP ... the Sox bullpen allowed one unearned run in 3.2 IP.
- Paul Konerko hit his 375th career home run, a two-run shot off Ross, to move past Rocky Colavito into 67th place all-time.
- Adam Dunn hit a pair of doubles.
- The Sox were 0-7 with runners in scoring position.

ON THE TRIP

- The White Sox are 5-3 on the trip to Seattle (2-1), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Oakland (1-1), hitting .286 (80-280) with a 2.89 ERA (23 ER/71.2 IP) and a 35-24 edge in runs scored.

SELF-STARTERS

- White Sox starting pitchers own a 3.16 ERA (26 ER/74.0 IP) over the last 11 games ... during that span, the Sox rotation has made eight quality starts while lowering its season ERA from 4.44 to 4.08.

BULLPEN BOUNCING BACK

- The White Sox bullpen has not allowed an earned run in 18.2 IP over the last eight games and owns a 0.40 ERA (1 ER/22.1 IP) in the last 10.
- Sox relievers have posted a 0.98 ERA (3 ER/27.2 IP) with three saves in three chances in May, down from 5.55 (45 ER/73.0 IP) with six blown saves in April.

SOX BATS GETTING OFFENSIVE

- The Sox are hitting .300 (75-250) with 19 doubles, six home runs and 33 runs scored in the last seven games.
- Chicago hit at least three doubles in five consecutive road games from 5/7-11, the first time they have accomplished that feat since 6/15-7/3/00.
- The Sox hit .307 (103-336) in their first nine games (4/1-10) but fell to .202 (157-776) in 24 games from 4/11-5/6.

HITTERS LEAVING HIBERNATION

- Adam Dunn has gone 12-29 (.414) with seven doubles, a home run, four RBI and seven runs scored in his last seven games.
- Paul Konerko owns a seven-game hitting streak (.464, 13-28) and is hitting 17-41 (.415) with a double, four home runs and 11 RBI in 12 games in May.
- A.J. Pierzynski has gone 7-16 (.438) with two doubles and a RBI in his last four games.
- Alexei Ramirez is 8-25 (.320) with two doubles, a home run, two doubles and six runs scored over his last six games.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

- Since the start of the 2003 season, White Sox pitchers lead the major leagues with 726 quality starts, eight more than Los Angeles-AL.
- The Sox are tied for seventh in the American League this season with 22 but have made 13 in their last 19 games.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The A's lead the season series, 3-2 ... three of the five games have been decided by one run.
- Oakland won two of three games in Chicago on 4/11-13 ... all three games went to extra innings.
- The Sox are hitting .209 (36-172) with a 4.02 ERA (21 ER/47.0 IP) and have been outscored, 23-17
- Chicago was 4-5 in 2010, going 2-1 at home and 2-4 in Oakland, to fall to 2-10-1 in 13 season matchups since 1998.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 263-286 ... they are 135-135 in Chicago (47-53 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 128-151 at the Oakland Coliseum.

SOX PUTTING UP A FIGHT AT THE COLISEUM

- The White Sox have gone 7-6 in their last 13 games in Oakland, compared to 6-28 (.214) in their previous 34.

SANTOS STARTS OFF SCORELESS AGAIN

- Sergio Santos leads all American League relievers with a 0.00 ERA (18.0 IP) and is the only qualifying reliever in baseball yet to allow a run ... Pedro Beato of the Mets has yielded four unearned runs in 17.0 IP.
- Santos' 18.0 IP is the second-longest scoreless streak to begin a season by a Sox pitcher, 3.0 behind Dustin Hermanson's 21.0 in 2005, while his 13 scoreless outings are tied with Octavio Dotel (2009) and Kelly Wunsch (2003) for the second-longest.

THE RETURN OF HAWK AND WIMPY

- Tom Paciorek, who served as the color analyst in the White Sox TV booth from 1988-99, rejoins his former play-by-play partner, Ken Harrelson, for this three-game series in Oakland ... Paciorek is filling in for Steve Stone, who has the series off.

WINNING ON THE WEST COAST

- The White Sox are 25-20 playing at Seattle, Los Angeles and Oakland since 2008, including a 11-8 record since 2010 ... by contrast, the Sox were 24-64 (.273) on the road vs. the Mariners, Angels and A's from 2001-07.

300 CLUB

- Paul Konerko (375) and Adam Dunn (358) rank ninth and 10th, respectively, in home runs among active players.
- Konerko and Dunn are one of five sets of teammates in baseball with 300-plus homers, joining the Yankees' Alex Rodriguez and Andruw Jones, Colorado's Jason Giambi and Todd Helton, St. Louis' Albert Pujols and Lance Berkman, and Baltimore's Vladimir Guerrero and Derrek Lee.

CLEANING IT UP

- The White Sox have committed eight errors in their last 26 games, compared to 15 in their first 14 ... during that span, the White Sox have improved to seventh in the American League with a .985 fielding percentage.

UPCOMING MILESTONES

- Paul Konerko needs one home run to tie Carlton Fisk for 66th place all-time with 376 ... Adam Dunn needs one homer to pass Yogi Berra (358) for 74th place all-time.
- Juan Pierre is one stolen base shy of Herman Long (29th place, 533) on the all-time stolen-base list.
- Omar Vizquel needs one hit to tie George Sisler for 46th place all-time with 2,812.

AT THE HELM

- Ozzie Guillen is 616-559 (.524) in his eighth season as White Sox manager ... Guillen is the only manager to guide the Sox to more than one division/league title.
- Is tied with Boston's Terry Francona for the fourth-longest current tenure as manager with one club in the major leagues, behind St. Louis' Tony La Russa (1996), the Angels' Mike Scioscia (2000) and Minnesota's Ron Gardenhire (2002).
- Has been ejected 26 times (once in 2011).
- Is signed through 2012 (Sox exercised option on 1/21/11).

For the first time this season, the White Sox do not have the lead in a game as they are beaten by the Orioles, 6-2 ... the streak of being ahead in 37 straight games establishes a major-league record from the beginning of a season and ties the 1934 Yankees and the 1942 Cardinals for the third-longest span in major league history.

BUEHRLE AT A GLANCE

- 32-year-old left-hander makes his ninth start of the season and sixth on the road ... has allowed two runs in 14.2 IP over his last two starts (1.23 ERA) ... his 150 wins rank seventh in White Sox history, six behind Ed Cicotte (156).
- **Ranks seventh among active pitchers with 2,234.2 IP and 10th with 150 victories ... among active lefties, ranks first in IP and second behind CC Sabathia (160) in wins.**
- **His 3.22 lifetime ERA (138 ER/386.0 IP) in May is his best monthly mark.**
- Has 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for a franchise-record 10 consecutive seasons (2001-current), the only active pitcher in baseball to accomplish that feat.
- Is 1-1 with a 1.66 ERA (4 ER/21.2 IP) at home this season and 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA (20 ER/31.2 IP) on the road ... owns a career mark of 66-61 with a 3.95 ERA (482 ER/1,098.0 IP) away from home.
- His 212 quality starts since 2001 rank second in the major leagues behind Roy Oswalt (213) ... owns a .580 career winning percentage (150-113).

2011 SEASON

- Sox are 4-4 in his starts ... opponents are hitting .288 (59-205), with lefties at .278 (15-54) ... has made four quality starts, including three in a row ... **is averaging 4.22 strikeouts (25 SO/53.1 IP), fifth-lowest in the American League, and 2.36 walks (14 BB) per 9.0 IP ... has induced seven double play grounders, tied for fifth-most in the AL ...** has struck out 22 batters in his last five starts, compared to three in his first three ... is averaging 6.7 IP and 97.4 pitches per start ... is receiving 4.05 runs of support per 9.0 IP (24 R/53.1 IP), but the Sox have scored just 10 runs in his last seven starts after tallying 14 on Opening Day.

LAST START

- Posted a no decision on 5/8 at Seattle ... allowed two runs on nine hits over 8.0 IP for his third straight quality start ... did not walk a batter and struck out three ... streak of 16.2 consecutive scoreless IP ended in the fifth inning when he allowed both runs ... left with the score tied, 2-2, after throwing 99 pitches (66 strikes) ... Sox went on to win, 5-2, in 10 innings ... game lasted 3:09.

2011 STARTS OF NOTE

- Earned his 150th career victory on 5/2 vs. Baltimore ... posted a ND on 4/11 vs. Oakland despite allowing just two singles over 8.0 scoreless IP ... faced just 26 batters and did not allow a runner to reach second base ... carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning for the ninth time in his career (Elias) and retired 10-plus batters in a game for the 53rd time ... opposed Dallas Braden, the 21st game in major-league history featuring starters who have thrown perfect games.
- Made his 362nd career appearance on 4/11 vs. Oakland, moving past Hoyt Wilhelm into seventh place in franchise history ... earned the win on 4/1 at Cleveland in his ninth career Opening Day start (4 ER/6.0 IP) ... retired 10 straight batters in one stretch ... received 14 runs of support, his highest total since 7/21/04 at Cleveland ... OD assignment was his ninth, extending his franchise record over Billy Pierce (7).

2010 SEASON

- Went 13-13 with a 4.28 ERA (100 ER/210.1 IP) in 33 starts ... recorded 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the 10th consecutive season, extending both his own franchise record and also the longest active streak in the major leagues ... won his second straight Rawlings Gold Glove Award (see note below).
- Ranked among the American League leaders in starts (T4th), walks per 9.0 IP (6th, 2.1) and complete games (T8th, 3) ... also led the major leagues with 11 pickoffs.

SEEING DOUBLE

- Has recorded 10 or more victories in a franchise-record 10 consecutive seasons ... he and CC Sabathia (2001-10) are the only active pitchers with 10-plus wins in each of the last 10 campaigns.

GOOD AS GOLD

- Won his second straight American League Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2010, becoming the first White Sox player to garner the honor in back-to-back seasons since Robin Ventura in 1991-93.
- Is one of six pitchers in major-league history to throw a no-hitter and win a Gold Glove, joining Bob Gibson, Phil Niekro, Jim Palmer, Kenny Rogers and Bret Saberhagen.
- **Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads all major-league pitchers with 75 pickoffs, ranks second with 428 assists and third with 560 total chances.**

PERFECTION

- Threw the 18th perfect game in major-league history and second in White Sox history (first since 1922) on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay ... marked his second career no-hitter (also 4/18/07 vs. Texas) ... perfect game was the first in the majors since Arizona's Randy Johnson on 5/18/04 at Atlanta and the first in the American League since New York's David Cone on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal.

WORKHORSE

- Has thrown 2,273.1 IP since the start of the 2001 season, most in the major leagues ... is the only pitcher in baseball to throw at least 200.0 IP each season from 2001-10 ... led the AL in IP in back-to-back seasons in 2004-05, the first Sox pitcher to accomplish the feat since Wilbur Wood in 1972-73.

AMONG THE BEST

- **Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads the major leagues in IP (2,273.1), pickoffs (75) and opponents GIDP (262) and ranks among the leaders in quality starts (2nd, 212), starts (3rd, 339), wins (4th, 146), complete games (4th, 27), shutouts (T10th, 8) and walks per 9.0 IP (13th, 2.03).**

NO WALKING OR RUNNING

- Has averaged 2.06 walks per 9.0 IP over his career and 2.23 in 2011 ... has issued no walks in 72 of 342 career starts ... opponents have been successful on just 47 of 109 (43.1 percent) steal attempts and are 1-2 in 2011 ... has picked off 79 runners (one in 2011 and MLB-high 11 in 2010).

DON'T GO TO THE FRIDGE

- Nine of his career starts have been played in less than 2:00 ... his 1:39 game on 4/16/05 vs. Seattle was the fastest in the majors since 9/30/84 when Atlanta beat San Diego in 1:39 and fastest Sox game since 7/7/75 (1:38).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is a four-time All-Star (2002, 2005-06, '09) ... is one of four American League pitchers since 1969 with multiple no-hitters, joining Nolan Ryan (6), Steve Busby (2) and Justin Verlander (2) ... 213 of his 342 (62.3 percent) career starts have been quality ... ranks among the Sox all-time leaders in starts (4th, 342), strikeouts (5th, 1,312), wins (8th, 150) and IP (8th, 2,324.2).
- Lasted at least 6.0 IP in 49 straight starts from 5/11/04-7/26/05, the longest streak in the majors since Steve Carlton went 69 straight with Philadelphia from 1979-82 ... has retired 10 or more straight batters in a game 53 times (last, 10 on 4/11/11 vs. Oakland).
