A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Anaheim in April...have now lost six of their last seven games against the Angels...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 61-75 (.449) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 366-298 against the Angels...that includes 190-140 in Oakland and 176-158 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 415-375 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 11.1 innings.

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 274-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Brian Fuentes is tied for fourth in the American League with nine saves, while his 196 saves are the most by an active left-hander.

Ryan Sweeney is a .338 (52 for 154) career hitter against Los Angeles, which is the second best mark ever against the Angels (min. 150 AB).

Michael Wuertz has allowed just one hit this year and opponents are batting .036 off him.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1939 the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in 1975 Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in 1986 Tony Phillips hits for the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...in 1990 Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and are 20-20 for the season...this is the 12th time this season the A's have been exactly .500...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...are 11-9 (.550) over the last 20 games (since April 23) and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...are in third place in the American League West, 1½ games behind Los Angeles...have not been closer than one game out or farther than two games back in the month of May...have spent one day in second, eight days tied for second, 31 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 9-4 (.692) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the third best record in the AL...are 11-16 (.407) against right-handed starters...are 5-8 in the first game of a series, 9-4 in the last game and 6-8 in all other games...have played 13 series this season and have not swept a series or been swept...that is the longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-12 with a **Major League-leading** 2.71 ERA (79 er in 262.0 ip)...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 14)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.347), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank third in innings pitched (262.0) and are fourth in strikeouts (196).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.56 ERA (34 in 119.1 ip) in the month of May after posting a 2.79 ERA in April...the May ERA is second lowest in the majors (Arizona 2.48)...now have a **Major League-leading** 2.72 ERA for the season, a mark that is more than a half-run lower than the next closest American League team (Los Angeles, 3.33)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.338) and rank third in onbase percentage (.308)...have yielded 22 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 19).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games and now have 32 for the season, which is second most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 44 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL...10 of the A's 32 errors have be made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .220 (80 for 364) with 39 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.5 per game)...have scored 141 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to score 571 runs and have not scored fewer than 600 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have the third lowest batting average (.236), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.354) in the AL, the third fewest home runs (24) and are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (238)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for the most in the AL...are hitting .217 (74 for 341) with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest mark in the majors (Seattle, .217)...are 13-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-17 when scoring fewer than four.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 11-5 (.688) in day games and 9-15 (.375) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and are tied for the second worst mark at night...have a 2.17 ERA (36 er in 149.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.10 (73 er in 212.0 ip) at night...the day ERA is the lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.21)...are batting .263 (147 for 558) with 12 home runs in 16 day games and .217 (171 for 789) with 12 home runs in 24 contests at night...the night batting average is second lowest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's **lead the majors** with 11 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 19 of 38 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 14 times, which is tied for third most in the American League...have the third lowest stolen percentage (27 for 41, 65.9%).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 1-2 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began Friday night...all 20 games will be played in California...following this seven game homestand with Chicago, Los Angeles and Minnesota the A's have a seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL)...conclude the 20-game stretch with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York from May 27 to lune 1

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this seven-game homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (two games) and Minnesota (two games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-2) and are 9-10 at home for the season...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...are 11-10 on the road and are one of just three American League teams with a winning record on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses have been by one run and the A's are now 6-8 in one-run decisions for the season...the eight one-run losses are tied for the American League lead...are 4-4 in extra inning games and the eight extra inning contests are second most in the AL behind Los Angeles (9)... are 4-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments this year and are 25-32 (.439) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 6.27 ERA (13 er in 18.2 ip), eight walks and four home runs allowed over his

last three starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip).

ON THE BASES: Has picked off five base runners over his first eight starts this year, which is tied for the Major League lead (Sheilds, TB)...that is already a career-high as he had four in each of his previous two seasons...opponents have been caught stealing a ML-leading six times this year and have a stolen base percentage of 33.3% (3 sb), which is tied for seventh lowest in the American League.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in six of his eight starts this year and is 0-3 in those six starts...is 2-0 in two starts with run support of three or more...has the third lowest run support in the American League with a mark of 2.53 (15 rs in 53.1 ip)...is now 2-18 in 31 career starts with two runs or support or fewer and 18-2 with at least three runs of support.

DON'T WALK: Has issued just 12 walks in 53.1 innings for an average of 2.03 walks per nine innings...that is the ninth lowest mark in the American League...with 40 strikeouts, he also ranks 10th in the AL in strikeout to walk ratio (3.33)...has walked one batter or fewer in six of his eight starts...issued a career-high-tying four walks in each of his other two starts...has now walked one batter or fewer in 35 of his 57 career starts (61.4%), including 12 starts without a walk.

THE FIRST FOUR INNINGS: Has a 1.69 ERA (6 er in 32.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 5.48 (13 er in 21.1 ip) after that...has yielded a .175 (11 for 63) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .231 (15 for 65) the second time through and .360 (27 for 75) after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed four home runs, all to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 10 home runs over the last two seasons, all against right-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a left-hander since August 25, 2009 at Seattle (Branyan)...three of his home runs this year have come at home as have eight of his 10 over the last two years.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Chicago April 13...allowed three runs, two earned, on nine hits in 5.2 innings...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run...was replaced by Breslow following a Pierre single, who then stranded both runners by getting Beckham to pop out to short.

FOURTH START: Earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston April 19...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth.

FIFTH START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory at Seattle April 24...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...was replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning.

SIXTH START: Took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas April 30...surrendered a career-high-tying seven earned runs in 5.0 innings, allowing one run in the first, two in the third and four in the fifth...allowed a career-high-tying four walks after walking only four batters over his first five starts...also allowed a career-high-tying three home runs (also April 22, 2009 at NYY)...his home run allowed to Young in the third inning came after going 36.2 innings without allowing a home run to open the season.

SEVENTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 12 innings to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high-tying 9.0 innings (also July 6, 2009 at Boston)...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Hafner singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Cabrera in the sixth inning...the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the eighth and he left after tossing 114 pitches in nine innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas last Tuesday...issued a career-high-tying four walks in just 4.2 innings...held the Rangers scoreless over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth inning on a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Gentry RBI single...then allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the fifth inning and was relieved by Purcey with two outs.

ANDERSON vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 4.68 ERA (25.0 ip, 25 h, 13 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...is 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (8 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts in Los Angeles and 0-1 with a 3.55 ERA (5 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...made just one start against the Angels last year and had a no decision in a 6-5 loss at Los Angeles September 27...the A's scored once in the first and twice in the second to give him a 3-0 lead but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on an Izturis RBI single, an Aybar fielders choice and a Kendrick RBI single...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 4-3 lead and he was relieved by Ziegler after allowing a one-out single in the seventh...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save and loss...went 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA in three starts in 2009...including a no decision in the A's 1-0, 10 inning loss in Oakland on July 19...retired each of the first 20 batters he faced before Abreu singled with two outs in the seventh inning to break up the perfect game.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (4-2, 2.68 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eight start of the season...is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in two starts in May after going 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April...has allowed a .133 average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0 for 15 with RISP and two outs...had his last scheduled start rained out last Wednesday in Texas (2.2 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 1 so, 1 hr)...the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...picked up the win in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Kansas City May 6 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so)...is 3-2 with a 3.90 ERA in six career appearances, all starts, against Los Angeles...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-0 A's loss on April 25 at Los Angeles (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

season, which is the best in the American League...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 17 losses, which is tied for the most by a bullpen in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...has 11 saves, which is tied for second most in the AL...has four blown saves for the second best save percentage (73.3%) in the AL...has not allowed a home run in its last 20 games and 55.1 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston (J.D. Drew off Blevins)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.314) and the second lowest batting average (.221)

- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has allowed just 1 of 8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is the 10th lowest percentage in the American League...however, first batters faced are 7 for 16 (.438), which is the third highest in the AL.
