ON THE ANGELS BEAT: Today the Angels continue their stretch of 20 games in 20 days (1-2)...Halos' 13 road wins are tied for MLB lead (13-9) – club is 9-10 at home...Today the Angels play the fourth game of a seven-game A.L. West road trip to Texas (May 13-15, 1-2), Oakland (May 16-17) and Seattle (May 18-19)...Halos are 12-6 in last 18 road games...Club has spent 20 days in first place this season – spent a total of four days in first place in 2010...Angels are 8-4-1 in 12 series played...Despite winning series record, club is just 6-7 in series openers.

WHO'S HOT: Howie Kendrick is batting .368 (28/76) with 16 runs scored his last 19 games...Alberto Callaspo is hitting .421 (16/38) with 10 RBI his last 10 games...Maicer Izturis ranks second in A.L. batting .373 on road and ranks T7th overall in A.L. at .319.

CENTURY CLUB: Tonight's starting pitcher Joel Pineiro is one win shy of his 100th career victory (99-86)...Only 31 active pitchers have 100+ wins...Pineiro's first career victory came August 8, 2000 at Chicago...Teammate Dan Haren (95) is on pace to reach 100 wins later this season.

SPARK PLUG: Erick Aybar is riding a career-high 13-game hit streak while batting .357 (35/98) his last 23 games...His two home runs against Texas were first since August 7, 2010, a span of 61 games (247 plate appearances)...Aybar leads all MLB shortstops batting .351.

FAST FACTS: Angels were 18-23 after 41 games a season ago (19-23 after 42)...Halos' .285 average in May leads A.L...Yesterday was just 5th loss (18-5) for Halos when scoring four or more...Club was just 3-for-31 (.097) with RISP in three games in Arlington...Angels have logged 10+ hits in 20 of 41 games.

FANTASTIC FOUR: The Angels have four players hitting over .300: Aybar, Izturis, Callaspo and Kendrick...The Halos are the only team in MLB with more than three players above the mark (min. 100 at-bats; STATS, LLC).

STAY AWAY: Angels are the AL's best hitting club (.292) on the road, averaging 5.0 runs and have hit a MLB best 27 homers (see comparison below)...Halos' 326 road wins since start of 2004 lead MLB

@ OAKLAND: Angels are 2-1 vs. A's in 2011...Halos are 8-1 in last nine home games vs. Oakland but 4-6 in last 10 in the Bay area...Halos have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003...In the Angels' last 13 victories, they have outscored A's 73-29...In their eight losses, they have been outscored 15-68...Athletics (2.71) and Angels (3.25) rank first and second in starters ERA this season.

MORALE OUT FOR 2011: Kendrys Morales will undergo a second surgery on his left ankle to clean out scar tissue, degenerative cysts and debris in the region. The surgery will take place in Vail, Colorado with Dr. Thomas Clanton on May 26th...Morales will not return this season.

SCIOSCIA REACHES 1,000: Manager Mike Scioscia won his 1,000th game as Angels' skipper in the May 8th 6-5 win over Cleveland...He joined Walter Alston (Dodgers), Tommy Lasorda (Dodgers), Earl Weaver (Orioles), Danny Murtaugh (Pirates), Red Schoendienst (Cardinals) and Tom Kelly (Twins) to win 1,000 games with the only major-league club he's managed...He is the 56th manager in MLB with 1,000 or more victories and just the 23rd with 1,000 or more victories with a single team...In his 12th season at the helm, Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the A.L. and second in the Majors to T. LaRussa.

ALL PHASES: Angels lead A.L. with .268 team average, rank 2nd in circuit with a 3.33 ERA and are T2nd in the league with a .989 fielding pct.

BOBBY & LOU: Bobby Abreu ranks third among actives with 532 career doubles (Helton, I. Rodriguez)...On MLB's all-time list, his 532 doubles are two shy of matching Lou Gehrig's 534 two-baggers for 32nd on all-time list.

THIS N' THAT: Angel batters have struck out 309 times – most in A.L...Angels are 11 wins from 4,000 in club history...Angels' average of 38,550 fans per home game ranks second in A.L...Angels have already played nine extra-inning affairs (most in MLB)...Halos are batting .320 (70/219) with RISP in their 22 victories and .127 (18/142) in their 19 losses...Angels have used 31 different lineups in 41 games...Halos have totaled at least 100 SBs each of last 10 seasons, the only team in baseball to do so...Club has recorded 15+ hits six times after totaling only 10 such games a season ago.

MAKING HIS MARK: Mark Trumbo leads AL rookies in nearly every offensive category including HRs (6), hits (32), runs (14), total bases (55) and RBI (17).

SOUND ON THE MOUND: Halos have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 23 of 41 games (19-4 in those games)...Angels have posted 27 quality starts in 41 games...Starters are averaging 6.2 IP per outing...Opponents are hitting .234 vs. Halo pitching, lowest clip in A.L.

KIDS TODAY: The Angels' current 25-man roster features seven players ages 25-or-younger (Amarista, Bell, Bourjos, Chatwood, Conger, Trumbo & Walden)...11 players on the current 25-man roster have less than two years of MLB service time.

One win shy of 100 for career

- Making fourth start of 2011 after missing first 25 games with tightness in his right shoulder.
- Has thrown seven innings-or-more in 10 of last 14 starts, dating back to last season, posting a 6-0 record in those starts.
- **Dating back to last season, has posted a 1.56 ERA (40.1 IP – 7 ER) in last six starts, but has recorded just two victories in that span (2-0).**
- Has posted a 1.70 ERA (79.1 IP – 15 ER) in his last 11 starts at Angel Stadium, allowing two runs or less in eight of the 11 starts.
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeout mark, May 5th at Boston...Is one win shy of 100 for career, only 30 active pitchers have 100+ victories.
- Went 10-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 2010...Missed significant time with a right oblique strain...Won seven of final eight decisions in 2010, posting a 2.77 ERA (84.1 IP – 26 ER) over the span to drop ERA from 5.23 to 3.84.
- Posted seven straight victories, June 6 – July 15, coming one win shy of career-best win streak...Five wins in June matched his most victories in a calendar month (also July 2003).
- Is 99-86 with 15 complete games, six shutouts and a 4.31 ERA (1629 IP – 779 ER) in 311 career appearances, 242 starts.

VS. OAKLAND: Is making 26th career appearance, 21st start vs. Oakland...Has made more starts and appearances vs. Athletics than any other ML opponent...Was 1-0 with one shutout and a 1.57 ERA (23 IP – 4 ER) in three starts vs. Oakland in 2010...Is 9-8 lifetime with two complete games, one shutout and a 4.13 ERA (130.2 IP – 60 ER).
