A's vs. ANGELS

The season series is even at two games each as the A's won the first meeting in Oakland last night after losing two of three in Anaheim in April...have now lost six of their last eight games against the Angels...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 62-75 (.453) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 367-298 against the Angels...that includes 191-140 in Oakland and 176-158 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 416-375 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 12 games and 12.1 innings...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings from June 8 to July 9, 2008...now has a 1.45 ERA for the season, which is tied for ninth among American League relievers.

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 275-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Brian Fuentes is tied for fourth in the American League with nine saves...he has 196 career saves, which are the most among active left-handers.

Ryan Sweeney is a .335 (52 for 155) career hitter against Los Angeles, which is the second best mark ever against the Angels (min. 150 AB).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout and Dick Williams drives in three runs as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader, 10-0...in **1963** Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in **1996** Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 12-9 (.571) over the last 21 games (since April 23) and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...are one game over .500 overall at 21-20, which is one short of the season high of two games over (19-17 on May 9)...have been exactly .500 a total of 12 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...are in third place in the American League West, one game behind Texas...have not been in first place since June 3 of last year when they were tied for first with the Rangers...have not been closer than one game out or farther than two games back in the month of May...have spent one day in second, eight days tied for second, 32 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 9-4 (.692) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the third best record in the AL...are 12-16 (.429) against right-handed starters...are 6-8 in the first game of a series, 9-4 in the last game and 6-8 in all other games...have played 13 series this season and have not swept a series or been swept...that is the longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's blew a three-run lead last night but came back to win 5-4 in 10 innings...it was the A's fifth win this year when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Cincinnati for the Major League lead...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season...improved to 5-4 in extra inning games with the win and the nine extra inning contests are second most in the majors to the Angels (10)...had just four extra inning wins all last year and three in 2009...are 5-7 in games decided in the last at bat...improved to 7-8 in one-run decisions and the 15 one-run games are tied for second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 16)...the eight one-run losses are also tied for second in the AL (Los Angeles, 9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-12 with a **Major League-leading** 2.75 ERA (82 er in 268.2 ip)...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is tied with San Francisco for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.345), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank third in innings pitched (268.2) and tied for third in strikeouts (2032).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.64 ERA (38 in 129.1 ip) in the month of May after posting a 2.79 ERA in April...the May ERA is second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.63)...now have a **Major League-leading** 2.74 ERA for the season, a mark that is more than a half-run lower than the next closest American League team (Los Angeles, 3.31)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.336) and rank fourth in on-base percentage (.308)...have yielded 22 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 21).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 32 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 44 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL...10 of the A's 32 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .273 (36 for 132) with 17 runs scored over the first four games of the homestand...have scored 146 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to score 577 runs and have not scored fewer than 600 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have the third lowest batting average (.237), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.353) in the AL, the third fewest home runs (24) and are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (245)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for second most in the AL...are hitting .218 (76 for 348) with runners in scoring position, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Seattle, .214)...are 14-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-17 when scoring fewer than four.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 11-5 (.688) in day games and 10-15 (.400) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and the third worst mark at night...have a 2.17 ERA (36 er in 149.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.12 (77 er in 222.0 ip) at night...the day ERA is the lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.21)...are batting .263 (147 for 558) with 12 home runs in 16 day games and .219 (181 for 826) with 12 home runs in 25 contests at night...the night batting average is second lowest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's **lead the majors** with 11 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 19 of 38 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 14 times, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have the fourth lowest stolen percentage (28 for 42, 66.7%).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 2-2 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began Friday night...all 20 games will be played in California...following this seven game homestand with Chicago, Los Angeles and Minnesota the A's have a seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL)...conclude the 20-game stretch with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York from May 27 to June 1.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (1-0) and Minnesota (two games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Texas (3-1) and Cleveland (1-2) and are 10-10 at home for the season...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...are 11-10 on the road and are one of four American League teams with a winning record on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

SCORING CHANGE: In the fifth inning of the game last night, credit Mark Ellis with a base-hit...Callaspo is still charged with an error to allow the runners to advance and Pineiro is charged with three earned runs instead of one...the change is reflected in today's statistics.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and are 34-30 (.533) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in six of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA (9 er in 13.2 ip) and .188 (9 for 48) opponents batting average in two starts in May after going 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 41 batters in 43.2 innings but has also issued 20 walks...ranks ninth in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.45) and second in most walks per nine innings (4.12)...last year, he led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .133 (4 for 30) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are 0 for 15 with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .208 (12 for 58) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .281 (16 for 57) the second time through and .196 (9 for 46) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of one run or fewer in four of his seven starts...has run support of one and zero in his two losses this year and now has 19 runs of support in his 22 career losses (105.0 ip, 1.63 RSA)...is 24-4 in 39 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...Ross allowed one run in the seventh and two in the eighth as he went on to take the loss.

FOURTH START: Took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston April 20...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one...however, allowed four runs on eight hits over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning.

FIFTH START: Was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 defeat in Los Angeles April 25...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings, his shortest start of the year...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...then threw a scoreless fifth before he was replaced by Purcey after throwing 95 pitches.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Texas May 1 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and two outs in the seventh and Ziegler allowed one of those runners to score.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City May 6...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win.

RAINED OUT: Had his last scheduled start rained out last Wednesday at Texas...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-2 with a 3.90 ERA (32.1 ip, 33 h, 15 r, 14 er, 11 bb, 38 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, all starts...is 2-1 with a 4.43 ERA (10 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at Anaheim and 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-0 A's loss on April 25 at Los Angeles...allowed a two-run single to Kendrick in the second, an RBI double to Abreu in the third and two more runs in the fourth on an error and a grounded into double play...Weaver shutout the A's on seven hits...went 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in two starts last year...the first win came in a 10-4 victory at Anaheim on April 9...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Matsui in the bottom of the second...also yielded a RBI single to Izturis in the fifth and was relieved by Ramirez after allowing a leadoff double to River in the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead...then combined with Wuertz, Rodriguez and Ziegler on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win in Oakland Sept. 3...tossed six of the innings and allowed four of the hits while walking three...retired the side in order just once, the fifth inning.

2010 RECAP: Began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...the 15 wins tied for 10th most in the American League...was the only Athletic to spend the entire 2010 season in the starting rotation...entered the season with a 7-11 record and 6.24 ERA in 30 games, 24 starts, over his first two seasons...tied for fourth in the AL in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15)...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL...also ranked 10th in the AL in pitches (3369).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-4, 3.34 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA over his last five starts...committed his fourth error of the season in his last start, which is the most among Major League pitchers...the errors have led to six unearned runs, which is tied for fourth in the American League...is 0-1 with a 1.37 ERA in three starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 4.38 ERA in five starts on the road...has allowed just one home run in 56.2 innings for an average of 0.16 per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 loss to Chicago last Friday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.63 ERA in seven career appearances, including two starts, against Minnesota...the win came in his only outing this year, a 5-3 A's win at Minnesota April 10 (7.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

5-8, 2.73 ERA (102.1 ip, 82 h, 46 r, 31 er, 49 bb, 92 so, 6 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 11/16 (68.8%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 22 of its past 25 games (15 er in 65.2 ip, 2.06 ERA) and now has a 2.73 ERA for the season, which is the best in the American League...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 20 losses, which is tied for the second most by a bullpen in the AL and fifth most in the majors...has pitched 102.1 innings this season, which are the fewest by a bullpen in the AL...has 11 saves, which is tied for second most in the AL...has five blown saves for the fourth best save percentage (68.8%) in the AL...has not allowed a home run in its last 21 games and 58.2 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston (J.D. Drew off Blevins)...are tied for the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.311) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.222).

- Pitched 1.1 innings and threw 18 pitches in a rehab appearance at extended spring training Saturday (2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 0 so)...was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has not allowed a run over his last 12 games (12.1 ip, 6 h, 8 bb, 16 so) and has not yielded a run in 17 of his 19 outings for the season (1.45 ERA, 3 er in 18.2 ip).
- Earned his third win of the season last night, which is tied for first among American League relievers...is also tied for fourth in strikeouts (22), tied for seventh in appearances (19) and tied for eighth in walks (11).
- Has held opponents to a .182 batting average...opponents are 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.
- Has not allowed a run in his eight appearances during day games (7.2 ip, 2 h, 6 bb, 6 so).
- Is 2-3 with a 5.71 ERA in 17 career appearances against Los Angeles (17.1 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 20 so, 2 hr)...the ERA is his highest against any American League team.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his last 14 outings (2 er in 10.2 ip, 1.69 ERA) and has stranded all five of his inherited runners over that span.
- Has allowed just 1 of 8 (12.5%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is tied for the ninth lowest percentage in the American League...however, first batters faced are 7 for 16 (.438), which is the third highest in the AL.
- Opponents are batting .373, which ranks fifth highest among AL relievers...the batting average includes a .455 (10 for 22) mark against left-handed hitters and .310 (9 for 29) against righties.
- Is tied for third among Major League pitchers in pickoffs (3) and is tied for second in the AL in losses (2).
- Is 2-1 with a 3.31 ERA in 17 career games against the Angels (16.1 ip, 17 h, 9 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 19 so, 3 hr).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 2-6 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-35 (.453) in his 64 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer all eight times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA (34.2 ip, 36 h, 20 r, 15 er, 8 bb, 22 so) and .283 (36 for 127) opponents batting average over his last five starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his fourth error of the season in his last start, which is the **most** among Major League pitchers...the errors have led to six unearned runs, which is **tied for third** in the American League...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss.

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher in his last start, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the A's first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

ONE RUN OR LESS: Allowed four runs in his last start against Chicago, snapping a streak of five consecutive starts in which he allowed one run or fewer...fell one short of the Oakland record of six...has now allowed four runs in each of his two starts against the White Sox this year (6 er in 11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA) and one run or fewer in each of his other seven starts (6 er in 47.2 ip, 1.13 ERA).

WINS: Is 24-8 with a 2.55 ERA (71 er in 251.0 ip) and .220 (199 for 903) opponents batting average in 38 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are the **most in the majors** over that span...the A's are 27-11 (.711) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 62-78 (.443) with all other pitchers...is 34-22 (.607) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .122 (5 for 41) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the **third** lowest mark in the American League...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .130 (9 for 69) average...has yielded three of his four home runs to the bottom three hitters in the order...opponents are batting .305 (18 for 59) when leading off an inning.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0 ip, 18 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 26 so) in four interleague starts last year...tied for second in the majors in wins (Buehrle, CWS 4)...is now 5-2 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in eight career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 3 with a strikeout and two sacrifice hits in 2010 and is now 1 for 5 (.200) with a strikeout, a run scored and two sacrifice hits in his career...the hit came on June 17, 2009 of last year at Los Angeles, a single off Hiroki Kuroda in the third inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at home this year and 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts on the road...has the **third** lowest home ERA in the AL...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA (81 er in 243.1 ip) in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-11 with a 4.14 ERA (88 er in 191.1 ip) in 33 starts on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 5 for 30 (.167)...now has a 1.15 ERA (5 er in 39.0 ip) and .178 (23 for 129) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arenecibia doubled to start the sixth...Arenecibia later scored on a Nix single...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...Ramirez hit a three-run home run, then Konerko later drove in Pierre by grounding into a force out...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...allowed a run in the second inning when Wilson had an RBI single and then held the Mariners scoreless over the next four innings...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed one run, his third consecutive start of seven or more innings and one run or fewer...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth.

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago last Sunday in Oakland...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...after the A's tied the game in the fifth, he allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh...his own error allowed one run to score and Ramirez added a RBI single

CAHILL vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 2-0 with a 1.32 ERA (13.2 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two starts, both in Oakland...made one start last year and was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win on May 21...blanked the Giants on four hits and a walk over the first six innings and had a 4-0 lead entering the seventh inning...retired the first two batters before allowing a Bowker single and a Torres RBI double...was relieved by Ziegler after the double...his other win came in a 5-1 A's victory on June 22, 2009...allowed a two-out solo home run to Ishikawa in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's scored twice in the fourth and sixth innings and he retired each of the final seven batters that he faced, leaving with a 4-1 lead.
