ON THE ANGELS BEAT: Halos have dropped four of last five games to fall ½ game out of first place...Last night marked the Angels' 10th extra-inning game – the most in club history after 42 games played – sixth time this season the Halos have had a rain delay...Halos are 4-6 in extra-inning affairs...Last night marked the club's ninth one-run loss (7-9) – 16 one-run games are most in A.L.... Tonight, the Angels continue a stretch of 20 games in 20 days (1-3)...Halos' 13 road wins are tied for MLB lead (13-10) – club is 9-10 at home...Tonight the Angels play the fifth game (1-3) of a seven-game A.L. West road trip to Texas (1-2), Oakland (May 16-17; 0-1) and Seattle (May 18-19)... Club has spent 20 days in first place this season – spent a total of four days in first place in 2010... Angels are 8-4-1 in 12 series played... Despite winning series record, club is just 6-8 in series openers.

<u>BULLPEN STRUGGLES:</u> Angels' bullpen has logged a 5.40 ERA (43.1 IP - 26 ER) this month after posting a 2.43 ERA in April...'Pen has allowed 14 ERs in last 17.0 IP spanning eight games...<u>Halo</u> relievers lead A.L. with nine losses and nine blown saves.

WHO'S HOT: Howie Kendrick is batting .363 (29/80) with 16 runs scored his last 20 games...Alberto Callaspo is hitting .419 (18/43) with 11 RBI his last 11games...Maicer Izturis ranks second in A.L. batting .391 on road and 5th overall in A.L. at .331.

<u>UP NEXT:</u> @ <u>SEATTLE:</u> Angels get first look at Mariners in 2011...<u>Halos tied a club record for most single-season wins vs. one opponent with 15 in 2010 (8-2 at home, 7-2 on road) and scored 100 runs vs. <u>Seattle in 2010 – most vs. any team in '10...</u>Angels' 52 wins (52-24) vs. M's since 2007 are club's most vs. any opponent in the span...The club has not dropped a season series to the Mariners since an 8-11 record in 2003...**The club is 84-49 vs. Seattle since the '04 campaign**.</u>

@ OAKLAND: Angels are 2-2 vs. A's in 2011 and have won six of last eight overall vs. Oakland...Halos are 8-1 in last nine home games vs. Oakland but 4-7 in last 11 in the Bay area...Halos have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003...In the Angels' last 13 victories, they have outscored A's 73-29...In their eight losses, they have been outscored 19-73...Athletics (2.74) and Angels (3.36) rank first and second in starters ERA this season.

MORALES OUT FOR 2011: Kendrys Morales will undergo a second surgery on his left ankle to clean out scar tissue, degenerative cysts and debris in the region. The surgery will take place in Vail, Colorado with Dr. Thomas Clanton on May 26th...Morales will not return this season.

SCIOSCIA REACHES 1,000: Manager Mike Scioscia won his 1,000th game as Angels' skipper in the May 8th 6-5 win over Cleveland...He joined Walter Alston (Dodgers), Tommy Lasorda (Dodgers), Earl Weaver (Orioles), Danny Murtaugh (Pirates), Red Schoendienst (Cardinals) and Tom Kelly (Twins) to win 1,000 games with the only major-league club he's managed...He is the 56th manager in MLB with 1,000 or more victories and just the 23rd with 1,000 or more victories with a single team...In his 12th season at the helm, Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the A.L. and second in the Majors to T. LaRussa.

ALL PHASES: Angels rank second in A.L. with .267 team average, rank 2nd in circuit with a 3.36 ERA and are 2nd in the league with a .989 fielding pct.

BOBBY & LOU: Bobby Abreu ranks third among actives with 532 career doubles (Helton, I. Rodriguez)...On MLB's all-time list, his 532 doubles are two shy of matching Lou Gehrig's 534 two-baggers for 32nd on all-time list.
