A's vs. TWINS

The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three in Minnesota in April...lost the season series last year 3-6 and have won just one season series over the previous five seasons...are 22-27 against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-282 against Minnesota...that includes 150-122 in Oakland and 121-160 in Minnesota...are 328-351 all-time against the Twins and have a 975-987 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's went 10 for 18 with runners in scoring position last night...the hits with RISP were their most in one game since Sept. 30, 2000 against Texas when they went 10 for 20 in a 23-2 win.

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 12 games and 12.1 innings...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings from June 8 to July 9, 2008...now has a 1.45 ERA for the season, which ranks 10th among American League relievers.

David DeJesus has a 25-game hitting streak against Minnesota (40 for 105, .381), which is one short of the record for longest hitting streak against the Twins...Ron LeFlore holds the mark with a 26-game streak (Aug. 3, 1977 to Sept. 11, 1981)...has not committed an error this year and now owns a 276-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Brian Fuentes is tied for fourth in the AL with nine saves...he has 196 career saves, which are the most among active left-handers.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games to move into a tie for first place in the American League West for the first time since June 3 of last year...have not been in sole possession of first since May 31, 2010...are now 13-9 (.591) over the last 22 games (since April 23), which is tied for the third best record in the AL...have not won or lost more than two games in a row over that span...are a season-high-tying two games over .500 for the season at 22-20 (also 19-17 on May 9)...have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...swept a two-game series from Los Angeles to start the week, snapping a season-opening streak of 13 consecutive series with out a sweep or being swept...that is the longest such streak in Oakland history...have been exactly .500 a total of 12 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...have spent one day tied for first, one day in second, eight days tied for second, 32 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...are 9-4 (.692) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the third best record in the AL...are 13-16 (.448) against right-handed starters...are 6-8 in the first game of a series, 10-4 in the last game and 6-8 in all other games

SHUTOUT: The A's shutout the Angels last night, 14-0...that equaled the third biggest shutout in Oakland history behind a 16-0 whitewashing of San Francisco June 26, 2005 and a 15-0 decision at Baltimore August 30, 2001...it was the A's third shutout of the season, which is tied for third in the American League...held the Angels to just two hits last night, which is the A's low-hit game of the season...A's pitchers have now compiled a 2.47 ERA (38 in 138.1 ip) in the month of May after posting a 2.79 ERA in April...the May ERA is the lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.49)...now have a **Major League-leading** 2.68 ERA for the season, a mark that is more than a half-run lower than the next closest AL team (Tampa Bay, 3.41)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.330) and on-base percentage (.304) and have the third lowest batting average (.240)...have yielded 22 home runs, which is tied with San Francisco for the fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high 14 runs on a season-high 15 hits last night...are now batting .297 (51 for 172) with 31 runs scored over the first five games on the homestand...however, have just 160 runs scored for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the third lowest batting average (.241), on-base percentage (.310) and slugging percentage (.357)...have just one home run on the homestand and 24 for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the second fewest strikeouts (248)...are 15-3 when scoring four runs or more and 7-17 when scoring fewer than four.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 17-12 with a **Major League-leading** 2.68 ERA (82 er in 275.2 ip)...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (SF and PHI, 17)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.339), are tied for the lead in complete games (3), rank second in innings pitched (275.2) and strikeouts (210) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.302).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this seven-game homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (two games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand and are 11-10 at home for the season...begin a seven-game road trip to San Francisco (three games) and Los Angeles (four games) on Friday...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...are 11-10 on the road and are one of four American League teams with a winning record on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 11-5 (.688) in day games and 11-15 (.423) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York 9-3, .750) and the third worst mark at night...have a 2.17 ERA (36 er in 149.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.00 (77 er in 231.0 ip) at night...the day ERA is the lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.21)...are batting .263 (147 for 558) with 12 home runs in 16 day games and .226 (196 for 866) with 12 home runs in 26 contests at night...the night batting average is tied for second lowest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 32 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 45 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL...10 of the A's 32 errors have be made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**.

ON THE BASES: The A's **lead the majors** with 11 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in only 19 of 38 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 19 caught stealings also lead the majors...offensively, the A's have been caught stealing 14 times, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have the fourth lowest stolen percentage (28 for 42, 66.7%).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began Friday night...all 20 games will be played in California...following this seven game homestand with Chicago, Los Angeles and Minnesota the A's have a seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL)...conclude the 20-game stretch with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York from May 27 to June 1.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's blew a three-run lead Monday night but came back to win 5-4 in 10 innings...it was the A's fifth win this year when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City for the American League lead...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season...improved to 5-4 in extra inning games with the win and the nine extra inning contests are second most in the majors to the Angels (10)...had just four extra inning wins all last year and three in 2009...are 5-7 in games decided in the last at bat...improved to 7-8 in one-run decisions and the 15 one-run games are tied for fourth in the AL...the eight one-run losses are tied for third in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 2-6 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-35 (.453) in his 64 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer all eight times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA

(34.2 ip, 36 h, 20 r, 15 er, 8 bb, 22 so) opponents batting average over his last five starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his fourth error of the season in his last start, which is the most among Major League pitchers...the errors have led to six unearned runs, which is tied for fourth in the American League...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed just one home run in 56.2 innings for an average of 0.16 per nine innings, which is the lowest figure in the majors...is tied for the American League lead in complete games (2), ranks fifth in fewest walks per nine innings, tied for sixth in most hits (59) and grounded into double plays (7), seventh in strikeout to walk ratio (3.60) and tied for ninth in losses (4).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 1.37 ERA (3 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 4.38 ERA (18 er in 37.0 ip) in five starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .368 (14 for 38) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the American League...opponents are hitting .190 (12 for 63) the first time through the lineup and .318 (47 for 148) after that.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...Lind drove in Davis with a sacrifice fly, Hill singled home Escobar and Encarnacion scored Hill with a double...Snider then brought in Rivera, who had reached on a Kouzmanoff throwing error, on a groundout to tie the game at 5-5...then pitched two more scoreless innings before being relieved by Blevins to start the ninth after throwing 89 pitches...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle, a no decision in a 7-4 Rangers win (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so).

SECOND START: Earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...was replaced by Blevins with one out and runners on second and third in the eighth inning, with both runners going on to score.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes

FOURTH START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes.

FIFTH START: Was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles April 26...allowed a careerhigh-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth...was then replaced by Ziegler with one out in the sixth inning.

SIXTH START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eight and Matsui in the 10th for the win.

SEVENTH START: Tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City last Saturday...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss.

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago last Friday...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...the first run scored on a fielders choice but Vizguel followed with a RBI double and Beckham scored on a sacrifice fly before his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Vizquel to score...shutout the Rangers on two hits over his final five innings

McCARTHY vs. MINNESOTA: Is 1-0 with a 1.63 ERA (27.2 ip, 21 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including two starts...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) in one start at Target Field, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in one appearance in the Metrodome and 0-0 with a 1.04 ERA (2 er in 17.1 ip) in five games, one start, in his home ballparks...is 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA (3 er in 15.1 ip) in his two ..including a win in his only outing this year, a 5-3 A's win at Minnesota April 10...shutout the Twins on six hits over the first seven innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the eighth inning...put runners on second and third with one out and was relieved by Blevins who allowed both inherited runners to score.

2010 RECAP: Was 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games, nine starts, at Triple-A Oklahoma City in a season interrupted by right shoulder problems...had three stints on the DL with the RedHawks and was added to the Rangers' 60-day disabled list July 29...struck out 44 and walked just 11 in 56.1 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Tyson Ross (3-2, 2.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and sixth start of the season...has picked up the win in each of his last two starts, marking the first time in his career he has won back-to-back decisions...is now 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA over his last four starts after going 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA over his first four games, including one start...allowed his first home run of the season in his last start and has yielded just four extra base hits (three doubles) this year for a .292 opponents slugging percentage...is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA during the day and has the sixth lowest day ERA in the American League...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's win over Chicago last Saturday (7.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA in two career appearances against Minnesota, both in relief last year.

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 23 of its past 26 games (15 er in 67.2 ip, 1.99 ERA) and now has a 2.67 ERA for the season, which is the best in the American League...however, has been charged with eight of the team's 20 losses, which is tied for third most by a bullpen in the AL...has pitched 104.1 innings this season, which are the second fewest by a bullpen in the AL...has 11 saves, which is tied for second most in the AL...has five blown saves for the fourth best save percentage (68.8%) in the AL...has not allowed a home run in its last 22 games and 60.2 innings...the last home run allowed by an A's reliever was on April 20 against Boston (J.D. Drew off Blevins)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.308) and the third lowest batting average (.220) and on-base percentage (.309)

- Pitched one scoreless inning and threw 19 pitches yesterday in a rehab appearance at extended spring training...now has a 4.50 ERA in two rehab appearances (2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 so).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

Was originally drafted by Toronto in the first round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft and spent parts of each of the last three seasons with the Blue Jays...went 4-9 with a 5.81 ERA in 21 games, all starts, over his first two seasons in 2008 and 2009...made 33 appearances, all in relief, in 2010 and posted 3.71 ERA...tied a Toronto rookie record with 11 strikeouts Aug. 27, 2008 at Tampa Bay...led the International League with a 2.69 ERA at Triple-A Syracuse in 2008...was named the Blue Jays fifth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2004 season and the third best in 2005.
