**THE TWINS:** The Twins win last night snapped a season-high nine-game losing streak...the Twins have lost four of their last five games on the road...the Twins are 1-1 on this three-city, seven-game road trip after splitting in Seattle... tonight, the Twins will play the first game of a two-game series at Oakland...they conclude the trip as interleague play begins, with a three-game series against the Diamondbacks in Arizona (May 20-22)...the Twins are 4-11 at home and 9-16 on the road this season.

**LIRIANO AND CUDDYER PROPEL TWINS:** The Twins beat the Mariners 2-1 last night in Seattle...Francisco Liriano (3-5) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on three hits in 7.0 innings, with one walk and nine strikeouts...Glen Perkins tossed a 1-2-3 eighth inning and Matt Capps allowed one walk in a scoreless ninth inning to record his sixth save of the season...Michael Cuddyer was 2-for-3 with a two-run single in the first inning...Ben Revere had the only other hit for the Twins, who were 1-for-7 with runners in scoring position and left five runners on base.

**THE STREAK IS BEHIND US:** The Twins win last night snapped a season-high nine-game losing-streak...it was the first time the Twins lost nine straight games since a 10-game losing-streak, September 9-19, 1998...the 2003 season was the last time the Twins have had multiple losing streaks of six-or-more games (they also had a six-game losing streak this season, April 27-May 1).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Twins have played 25 road games this season (9-16 record), which is tied of for the second-most in Major League Baseball so far this season...they are batting .208 (174-for-837) with 74 runs, 12 homers, 63 rbi, 75 walks, 154 strikeouts...they have an ERA of 4.37 (214.1 ip, 104 er), allowing 217 hits and 30 homers, with 87 walks and 143 strikeouts.

**A LOOK AT THE RUNS:** The Twins have scored just 123 runs this season, the fewest in baseball (San Francisco Giants have scored the second fewest with 142 runs this season)...last night marked the 28th time in 40 games this season that the Twins scored three-or-fewer runs...the Twins have scored three runs-or-less in 11 of their 14 games in May... this season, Twins pitchers have allowed 215 runs, the second most in the Major Leagues (Houston has allowed 219)... the next closest American League team is the Kansas City Royals (200 runs allowed)...the Twins run differential of -92 is the largest in baseball, with the next closest team being the Astros at -47.

**TWINS VS. THE A'S:** In 13 games since September of 2009, the Twins have posted a record of 8-5 against the Athletics... in that span, the pitching staff has posted a 2.44 ERA (118.0 ip, 32 er) with seven home runs allowed, 38 walks and 75 strikeouts...Minnesota won their last series at the Coliseum, June 4-6, 2010...lastly, they are 7-6 in their last 13 games at Oakland (since August 29, 2008), with seven of those games being decided by one run.

Individually, Danny Valencia leads all Twins batters in hitting against A's pitching with a .372 average (16-for-43) with two doubles and two home runs...Justin Morneau is batting .309 (63-for-204) with 14 doubles, 14 home runs and 42 rbi lifetime...additionally, he is batting .483 (14-for-29) with five home runs and 12 rbi in his last nine games at Oakland.

**ROD CAREW ON HARMON KILLEBREW:** "This is a sad day for all of baseball and even harder for those of us who were fortunate enough to be a friend of Harmon's. Harmon Killebrew was a gem. I can never thank him enough for all I learned from him. He was a consummate professional who treated everyone from the brashiest of rookies to the groundskeepers to the ushers in the stadium with the utmost of respect. I would not be the person I am today if it weren't for Harmon Killebrew. He was a Hall of Famer in every sense of the word."

**JOE MAUER ON HARMON KILLEBREW:** "When I learned the news about Harmon's passing, I felt like I lost a family member. He has treated me like one of his own. It's hard to put into words what Harmon has meant to me. He first welcomed me into the Twins family as an 18 year old kid and has continued to influence my life in many ways. He is someone I will never forget and will always treasure the time we spent together. Harmon will be missed but never forgotten."

**A WIN FOR THE "KILLER":** The Twins win last night on the day Harmon Killebrew passed had signs of "Killer"...the two teams combined to score 3 runs, and each team had 3 hits.

■ The Twins .225 batting average this season ranks 29th in baseball, while their .291 on-base percentage and 18 home runs rank last in the Major Leagues.

**LAST START:** Did not factor into the decision in the Twins' 2-0 defeat, May 13 vs. Toronto opposite Ricky Romero, who pitched 8.2 shutout innings...started the first of three games between the Jays and Twins at Target Field...Twins were shutout for the fourth time on the season...the first run of the game was scored in the seventh inning by Toronto...tied his season-high with three walks allowed...did not factor into a decision for the second time this season and first since April 14...threw a season-high 115 pitches, 71 for strikes.

**TWO STARTS AGO...:** Was the loser in the Twins' 9-5 defeat, May 8 vs. Boston opposite Daisuke Matsuzaka... did not strikeout a batter for the second consecutive start...surrendered four runs in the third inning...Twins committed three fielding errors in the game - two with Pavano on the mound...threw 91 pitches, 61 strikes.

**ROUGH ROAD RECENTLY:** He has lost each of his last four road decisions with his last win away from Target Field coming on September 16, 2010 at Chicago (AL)...prior to his current losing skid, he went 7-4, starting on June 20, 2010 at Philadelphia...he has won 33 of his last 57 road decisions, dating back to June 4, 2004 while his teams (Marlins, Yankees, Indians and Twins) have gone 38-29 behind him during that span...he went 9-7, 3.77 (124.0 ip, 52 er) in 18 road starts in 2010...his nine road wins in 2010 were the fifth-most in the American League.

**ON STRIKE:** His 18 strikeouts entering today rank as the fewest in baseball among pitchers with a minimum of 45.0 innings pitched...he struck out one batter in his last start, May 13 vs. Toronto (Corey Patterson in the second inning)...his previous strikeout was Grady Sizemore for the second out of the seventh inning, April 24 vs. Cleveland.  
 » He did not strikeout a batter in consecutive starts, May 1 and 8, marking the first time in his career... he has not struck out a batter seven times in his career.

**NO MIDDLE GROUND:** Since joining the Twins in August of 2009, the Twins have 24 losses in Pavano's starts while he has posted an ERA of 6.01 (146.2 ip, 98 er) in those games...in the Twins 28 wins behind him, he has posted an ERA of 2.90 (195.1 ip, 63 er).

**MAY NUMBERS:** He is 19-17, 4.30 (314.0 ip, 150 er) in 50 career starts in May...he is 7-5 in 16 May starts since 2009...the seven wins are tied for seventh-most in the American League...he went 5-0 in seven May starts for the Indians in 2009.

**GRAND THEFT:** Pavano ranks fourth in baseball since the start of 2010 in stolen bases allowed with 38... this season, he is tied for 13th with seven stolen bases allowed.

**MISC. PAVANO:**

- » He needs just 26 strikeouts to reach 1,000 for his career.
- » He is tied for sixth in baseball since 2010 in hits allowed with 284.

**2010 QUICK HITS:**

- » Started the season as the Twins' number three starter after re-signing in the off-season...made his first start, April 7 at LAA, allowing one run on six hits in 7.0 innings with no walks and six strikeouts.
- » Tossed 7.0-plus innings with two earned runs-or-less in four consecutive starts, April 23-May 12, tying the longest such stretch of his career...last time was with the Florida Marlins in May/June of 2004.
- » Eighth career complete game, April 29 at Detroit (L), ninth career CG, June 20 at Philadelphia (W).
- » Tossed a three-hit complete game shutout, June 26 at New York (NL), his sixth career shutout and 10th complete game...first Twins pitcher to toss consecutive complete games since Nick Blackburn in 2009.
- » He recorded his 900th career strikeout, July 1 vs. Tampa Bay, fanning Willy Aybar in the second inning.
- » Finished the first-half 10-6, 3.58 (125.2 ip, 50 er) with 71 strikeouts and just 18 walks in 18 starts... was one of nine American League pitchers with 10-plus wins...was tied for third with three complete games and ranked third in innings pitched.
- » Tossed his 11th career complete game, July 17 vs. Chicago (AL)...fourth of the season.
- » Fifth complete game, and second shutout, July 22 at Baltimore, allowing just five hits and walking one... seventh career shutout and 12th career complete game...first pitcher to pitch back-to-back complete games twice in one season since Frank Viola did it in 1988 (May 1 and 6 & August 15 and 20).
- » Won eight consecutive decisions, June 9-July 27...tied with Liriano for longest winning streak by a Twins pitcher in 2010.
- » Won his 15th game on August 13 vs. Oakland (his 24th start), allowing two runs on 10 hits in 6.1 innings... became the first pitcher to reach 15 wins in so few starts since Brad Radke earned 15 in 24 starts in 1997.
- » Went 10-1 in a stretch from June 9-August 13, posting a 2.63 ERA (95.2 ip, 28 er) with four complete games during that span...CC Sabathia was the only other pitcher in the Majors with 10 wins during that time frame.
- » Tied a club record by allowing 15 hits, August 19 vs. Chicago (AL), tying Brad Radke (August 27, 2004 at Anaheim) and Geoff Zahn (August 26, 1978 at Toronto).
- » Surpassed 200.0 innings pitched for the third time in his career, September 10 at Cleveland.
- » Earned his 17th and final win, September 16 at Chicago (AL), finishing one short of his career-high with 2004 Florida Marlins.
- » Pitched 8.0-plus innings 11 times, most ever in a season, going 6-5 in those games...pitched 7.0-plus innings 21 times (13-8).
- » Walked just 37 batters in 221.0 innings pitched last season, which was third-fewest among Major League pitchers with a minimum of 175.0 innings (Cliff Lee lead with 18 walks then Roy Halladay with 30...additionally he finished third in the Majors in walks-per-9.0 ip (1.51) behind Lee (0.76) and Halladay (1.08).
- » Was the Game 2 starter in the ALDS against the Yankees in Target Field, allowing four runs on 10 hits in 6.0 innings and was dealt the loss opposite Andy Pettitte.

**CAREER NOTES**

- He was originally drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 13th round of the 1994 First-Year Player Draft.
- Graduated from Southington (Conn.) High School in 1994, winning the state championship as a senior.
- Traded to the Expos in November of 1997 in a deal that sent Pedro Martinez to Boston.
- Won a World Series as a member of the Florida Marlins in 2003...started Game 4 vs. NYY (8.0-7-1-1-0-4).
- Was a 2004 National League All-Star as a member of the Florida Marlins.
- Finished sixth in the National League Cy Young Award voting in 2004...Roger Clemens was the winner.
- His 18 wins in 2004 were good for second-most in the National League.
- Signed a four-year contract with the New York Yankees after the 2004 season and appeared in 26 games over the four-year span after missing time with numerous injuries, including "Tommy John" surgery in 2007.
- Has spent seven different stints on the disabled list in his career: 1999, 2000, 2001, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008 (one time in each of those seasons).
- He is in his 18th season at the professional level and 14th in the Major Leagues.
- Traded to the Twins on August 7, 2009 from Cleveland for PTBNL (RHP, Yohan Pino).
- Signed a two-year contract to remain with the Twins, January, 19, 2011.

**AGAINST THE A'S:** He is making his fifth career start...he has been the winner in each of his last three starts, including his last start, April 8 at Target Field, allowing one run on four hits in 8.0 innings with one walk and one strikeout...in 28.0 career innings he has allowed 29 hits, walked seven and logged 11 strikeouts...all of his three career starts have been home starts: Once in 2005 with the Yankees, one in 2009 with Cleveland, one in 2010 and 2011 with the Twins...**the Coliseum remains the only current ballpark in the American League in which Pavano has yet to make a start or appearance in (also one of three in ALL of baseball, the others being Nationals Park and Great American Ball Park)...the A's remain the only team in baseball in which he has yet to lose to; losing to all other 29 teams at least once during his 13-year career.**
