A's vs. GIANTS

The A's lost the first meeting of 2011 last night and now have a seven-game losing streak at AT&T Park...that is the A's longest losing streak ever in San Francisco...split the season series last year 3-3 with each team sweeping a three-game series in its home ballpark...in the previous 14 season series, the A's have won four, the Giants two and the clubs have split the season series eight times...the A's are 42-39 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 23-17 in Oakland and 19-22 in San Francisco...including 15-19 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in his last 14 games and 14.1 innings...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings from June 8 to July 9, 2008.

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 279-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1930** Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in **1974** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in **1995** the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in **1997** Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last three games, matching the longest losing streak of the season (April 20-22)...have also lost six of the last nine games to fall to 22-23 for the season...this is the first time the A's have been under .500 since April 30 when they were 13-14...have been between two games over and two games under .500 every day since April 9...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...are in third place in the American League West, one game behind Texas...were in a tie for first on May 17, marking the first time the A's were in first since June 3 of last year...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 33 days in third, two days tied for third and four days in fourth...began the season without a sweep or being swept in the first 13 series, an Oakland record to start the season...then swept a two-game series from Los Angeles to start the week before being swept by Minnesota in a two-game series on Wednesday and Thursday...are 9-4 (.692) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 13-19 (.406) against right-handed starters...are 6-10 in the first game of a series, 10-5 in the last game and 6-8 in all other games.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's played their third extra inning game in the last five games last night and are now 5-6 in extra frames for the season...the 11 extra inning games are the most in the majors and match the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings and the other lasted 12 frames...are now 5-9 in games decided in the last at bat...dropped to 7-10 in one-run decisions with the loss last night...are tied for the American League lead in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 11-6 (.647) in day games and 11-17 (.393) at night...have the second best day record in the American League (New York, 9-3) and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 8-16)...are batting .259 (153 for 590) with 12 home runs in 17 day games and .223 (209 for 937) with 12 home runs in 28 contests at night...the night batting average is second lowest in the AL.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's began the 15th season of interleague play with a loss last night in the first game of a three-game series against San Francisco...also host the Giants June 17-19 before traveling to New York (June 21-23) and Philadelphia (June 24-26)...conclude play against the National League with a pair of three-game series against Florida (June 28-30) and Arizona (July 1-3)...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 13-24 (.351) over the last three years and 70-75 (.483) since 2003...however, are 136-113 (.546) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: Trevor Cahill went 0 for 2 last night and A's pitchers now have a .092 (23 for 251) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 11 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span (Toronto, .094)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a 2.84 ERA, which is more than one-half run better than the next American League team (Cleveland, 3.45)...have allowed just 25 home runs, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 23)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.336) and rank second in on-base percentage (.306).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one hit in three of the last four games and opponents are 12 for 69 (.174) over that span...starters are 17-13 with a **Major League-leading** 2.71 ERA (87 er in 288.2 ip) for the season...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 18)...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.337)...are tied for second in the American League in complete games (3), rank third in innings pitched (288.2) and on-base percentage (.301) and tied for third in strikeouts (217).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone a season-high-tying five consecutive games without a home run and have 24 for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...went 5 for 34 (.147) and scored one run last night after batting .270 with 35 runs scored in seven games on the last homestand...are batting .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game) and .223 (167 for 749) with 72 runs scored in 22 road contests (3.27 per game)...for the season, have the third fewest runs scored in the American League (165) and the third lowest batting average (.237), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.348)...have the second fewest strikeouts (262).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 34 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 48 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL...10 of the A's 33 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game road trip against San Francisco (0-1) and Los Angeles (four games)...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 11-11 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home for the season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Brandon McCarthy and Tyson Ross on the disabled list yesterday and have now used the DL seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 3-5 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles (AL) and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning a week from today.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...the A's are 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments this year and are 26-32 (.448) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in four of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 5.68 ERA (16 er in 25.1 ip), 12 walks and four home runs allowed over his last four starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip).

ON THE BASES: Is tied for the Major League lead with five pickoffs (Shields, TB)...that is already a career-high as he had four in each of his previous two seasons...opponents have been caught stealing a ML-leading six times this year and have a stolen base percentage of 33.3% (3 sb), which is tied for eighth lowest in the American League.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in six of his nine starts this year and is 0-3 in those six starts...is 2-0 in three starts with run support of three or more...has the fifth lowest run support in the American League with a mark of 2.70 (18 rs in 60.0 ip)...is now 2-18 in 31 career starts with two runs or support or fewer and 18-2 with at least three runs of support.

THE FIRST FOUR INNINGS: Has a 1.50 ERA (6 er in 36.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 6.00 (16 er in 24.0 ip) after that...has yielded a .183 (13 for 71) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .230 (17 for 74) the second time through and .341 (28 for 82) after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed four home runs, all to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 10 home runs over the last two seasons, all against right-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a left-hander since August 25, 2009 at Seattle (Brayan)...three of his home runs this year have come at home as have eight of his 10 over the last two years.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 9 so) in two career interleague starts, both in 2009...his last came on June 20 at San Diego, a no decision in a 6-3 A's win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

WITH THE BAT: Is 0 for 3 with two strikeouts in three career plate appearances, all in 2009.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning with the score tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Chicago April 13...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run.

FOURTH START: Earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston April 19...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth.

FIFTH START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory at Seattle April 24...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...was replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning.

SIXTH START: Took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas April 30...surrendered a career-high-tying seven earned runs in 5.0 innings, allowing one run in the first, two in the third and four in the fifth...allowed a career-high-tying four walks after walking only four batters over his first five starts...also allowed a career-high-tying three home runs (also April 22, 2009 at NYY)...his home run allowed to Young in the third inning came after going 36.2 innings without allowing a home run to open the season.

SEVENTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 12 innings to Cleveland last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high-tying 9.0 innings (also July 6, 2009 at Boston)...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Hafner singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Cabrera in the sixth inning...the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the eighth and he left after tossing 114 pitches in nine innings.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas last Tuesday...issued a career-high-tying four walks in just 4.2 innings...held the Rangers scoreless over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth inning on a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Gentry RBI single...then allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the fifth inning and was relieved by Purcey with two outs.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles last Monday in Oakland...issued a career-high-tying four walks for the second consecutive start, third time this year and fifth time in his career...blanked the Angels on four hits over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a fielders choice and a Trumbo sacrifice fly...was relieved by Wuertz with a 3-2 lead, two outs and a runner on first in the seventh inning but Wuertz allowed a two-run single to Kendrick for the blown save.

ANDERSON vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 7-1 A's loss at San Francisco on June 14, 2009...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the first on a Winn sacrifice fly and a two-run home run by Sandoval...allowed three hits in the second inning, but did not allow a run...then allowed a three-run inside-the-park home run to Schierholtz in the third inning...struck out each of the last four batters he faced and finished with six strikeouts in 4.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-2, 2.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .145 opponents batting average in three starts in May...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four...is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (5) and ranks seventh in ERA (2.31)...has allowed a .133 average with runners in scoring position and opponents are 0 for 15 with RISP and two outs...he combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles last Tuesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...went 1-2 with a 3.16 ERA in five interleague starts last year and is 1-3 with a 3.86 ERA in six career interleague starts...including 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA in three career starts against San Francisco.

The A's bullpen has been charged with 10 of the team's 23 losses, which is tied for the most by a bullpen in the American League...has allowed one earned run or fewer in 25 of its past 29 games (26 er in 83.0 ip, 2.82 ERA) and now has a 3.16 ERA for the season, which is third best in the AL...has 11 saves, which is tied for third in the AL...has five blown saves and is tied for the third best save percentage (68.8%) in the AL...allowed season highs in runs (10) and hits (15) Thursday after Ross left the game after facing one batter...it was the most runs allowed by an A's bullpen since it also allowed 10 runs August 25, 2007 at Tampa Bay...it was its first time allowing 15 hits in a game since surrendering 16 hits August 29, 2008 against Minnesota...also had its 23-game, 65.0-inning streak in which it did not allow a home run snapped Thursday when Purcey allowed a home run to Rivera in the second inning...it was the first home run allowed by an A's reliever since April 20 against Boston (J.D. Drew off Blevins).

- Has allowed 6 of 9 (66.7%) inherited runners to score this season, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.
