### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's are on a season-high six-game losing streak and have lost nine of their last 12 games...the losing streak matches their longest from last season (September 24-29) and is their longest since losing eight in a row from September 27, 2009 to April 5, 2010...the losing streak has dropped the A's to a season-low four games under .500 at 22-26...with the loss yesterday, the A's remain in last place in the American League West for the second consecutive day...were in a tie for first place in the West May 17, the day before the losing streak began...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and six days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

**DURING THE LOSING STREAK:** The A's are batting .200 (41 for 205) during the losing streak with one home run and 10 runs scored...A's starting pitchers have posted a 2.27 ERA (8 er in 31.2 ip) and have allowed just one earned run in five of the games...the pitching staff as a whole has a 4.45 ERA (27 er in 54.2 ip) as the bullpen has allowed 20 runs in 23.0 innings (19 er, 7.43 ERA)...the A's have been outscored 29-10.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run in each of the last five games and have a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) and .222 (20 for 90) opponents batting average over that span...have two losses and three no decisions in those five games...this is the **first time in Oakland history** A's starters have allowed one earned run or fewer in five consecutive games and not picked up at least one win...have a **Major League-leading** 2.64 ERA (89 er in 300.1 ip) for the season...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 19)...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.337), rank third in strikeouts (232), fourth in innings pitched (307.1) and tied for fourth in complete games (3).

**PITCHING:** The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.90 ERA, which is nearly one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.35)...have allowed just 26 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL (Seattle, 28)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.339) and are tied for fourth in strikeouts (340)...also top the majors with 11 pickoffs and opponents have been successful in just 22 of 41 (53.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have just two home runs over the last 11 games and 25 for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors...have scored just 10 runs in the six games since tallying a season-high 14 last Tuesday against the Angels...have scored 170 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are 15-4 when scoring four runs or more and 7-22 when scoring fewer than four...also have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.302) and the third lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.344)...have the second fewest strikeouts (284)...have been shut out five times this season, which is tied for third most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in three of their last four games and now have 37 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...10 of the A's 37 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 50 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

**EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have played four extra-inning games in the last eight contests and are 5-7 in extra frames for the season...lead the majors with 12 extra-inning games and are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the lead with seven losses...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...seven of the A's last 11 losses have been by one run and they are 7-11 in one-run games for the season...are tied for second in the American League in one-run games and one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS:** The A's are 3-8 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...have been outscored 43-41 over that span...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning next Friday.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** After beginning the season with 13 consecutive series without a sweep by either team, there has been a sweep in each of the last three series...after sweeping a two-game set from Los Angeles to start last week, the A's were swept a in two-game series by Minnesota and a three-game series by San Francisco...the A's are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the third best record in the American League...are 13-21 (.382) against right-handed starters...have an 11-8 (.579) record in day games and are 11-18 (.379) at night...have the second worst mark at night in the AL (Minnesota, 8-18)...are 6-11 in the first game of a series and 10-6 in the last game.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-4 on this seven-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (0-1) and have now lost five straight road games...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 11-14 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and New York (three games)...the A's are batting .222 (189 for 851) with 77 runs scored in 25 games on the road (3.08 per game) and .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

### A's vs. ANGELS

The season series is even at three games each...swept a two-game series in Oakland last week and are 1-3 in Anaheim...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 63-76 (.453) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 368-299 against the Angels...that includes 192-140 in Oakland and 176-159 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 417-376 against the Angels

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is 14 for 38 (.368) with four doubles, a home run and four RBI over his last nine games after going 3 for 28 (.107) over his previous eight contests.

**David DeJesus** has not committed an error this year and now owns a 280-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

**Joey Devine** has not allowed an earned run in his last 28 games and 28.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 63-game, 62.0-inning, 248-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota...the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in major league history to reach 300 saves...he reached 300 in just 499 relief appearances, the fewest ever needed by a reliever to reach 300...in **2009** Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44<sup>th</sup> player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today and is scheduled to make his first start of the season and his career.

**CAREER:** Made his Major League debut with Texas in 2009 and posted a 3.21 ERA in 10 relief appearances...also made one relief appearance for the Rangers last year, allowing two runs in 0.2 innings...has no decisions and a 4.30 ERA in 11 career appearances, all in relief.

### LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE:

His last Major League appearance was last year on May 20 against Baltimore (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hbp)...entered the game to start the ninth inning with the Rangers leading 13-5...allowed a Tatum single and a Jones RBI double before striking out Montanez...then hit Izturis and walked Patterson before striking out Wigginton...walked Markakis to force in a run and was relieved by Feliz.

**MOSCOSO vs. LOS ANGELES:** Has faced the Angels once in his career and it came in relief on September 29, 2009 at Los Angeles...relieved Rangers starter Scott Feldman in the fourth inning with two outs, runners on first and third, and Texas trailing 4-1...tossed 2.1 scoreless innings, walked one and struck out two in a 5-2 loss.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

**THE FIRST TWO INNINGS:** Allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) and .302 (19 for 63) opponents batting average...had a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) and .183 (17 for 93) opponents average from the third inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .231 opponents average broke down to .216 (16 for 74) against left-handed hitters and .244 (20 for 82) against right-handers...surrendered his only home run and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...allowed a .236 (21 for 89) average with the bases empty and .308 (12 for 39) with runners in scoring position.

**SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS:** Had a no decision in his first start April 8 against Tacoma, allowing a run in 5.0 innings in a 3-1 loss...the run came in the first inning and he did not allow a run in each of his next two appearances...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision against Las Vegas April 14 and then pitched 5.0 shutout innings in relief of a rehabbing Michael Wuertz April 20 at Reno...picked up the win against Reno but was charged with his first loss April 25 at Tucson...allowed two runs in the first inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 15.0 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his next start, a loss at Las Vegas May 1...had back-to-back scoreless outings again May 7 against Colorado Springs and May 12 at Memphis, both wins...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings and struck out a season-high eight in each outing...then allowed five runs on six hits in 3.0 innings in his final start May 17 at Nashville.

**MINOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Is 44-27 with a 3.19 ERA (236 er in 665.2 ip) in 140 career minor league appearances, including 101 starts...has 670 strikeouts in 665.2 innings...has walked just 170 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.94...was named Pitcher of the Year at Oneonta in 2007...threw a nine-inning perfect game in the New York-Penn League July 15, 2007...was originally signed by the Detroit Tigers as a non-drafted free agent in 2003 and spent two seasons in the Dominican Summer League before coming to the United States in 2005...traded to Texas following the 2008 season as part of the Gerald Laird trade...was acquired by the A's for minor leaguer Ryan Kelly January 8, 2011.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Trevor Cahill (6-1, 1.79 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is tied for the American League lead in wins (6), ranks second in ERA (1.79), tied for second in winning percentage (.857) and is fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.296)...has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 10 starts this year...the two exceptions came in his two starts against Chicago when he allowed four runs each time...has a 4.63 ERA (6 er in 11.2 ip) in his two starts against the White Sox and 1.17 ERA (7 er in 53.2) in his other eight starts...is 24-8 with a 2.52 ERA (72 er in 257.0 ip) and .217 (200 for 922) opponents batting average in 39 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are the most in the majors over that span...is 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against American League West competition this year and 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts against everyone else...is 4-1 with a 1.81 ERA (44.2 ip, 33 h, 11 r, 9 er, 20 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in seven career starts against the Angels...is 3-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at Los Angeles.

**5-12, 3.53 ERA (127.1 ip, 114 h, 66 r, 50 er, 59 bb, 108 so, 10 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 11/17 (64.7%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in each of its past five games (19 er in 20.0 ip, 8.55 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks fifth in the American League with a 3.53 ERA overall...has now been charged with 12 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the majors...has 11 saves, which is tied for fourth in the AL...their six blown saves are tied for fifth fewest...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.241) and on-base percentage (.322)...has allowed four home runs in 20.0 innings over its past five games after not allowing a home run in its previous 23 games and 63.2 innings.

- Made a rehab appearance yesterday with Triple-A Sacramento and did not allow a run in one inning...has not allowed a run or hit in his two rehab appearances with the River Cats (2.0 ip, 0 bb, 2 so).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

**First Hitters: 3-21 (1 bb)**

- Had his 14-game, 14.1-inning scoreless streak snapped Sunday when he allowed a home run to Schierholtz in the eighth inning...the scoreless streak was 0.1 inning short of the longest of his career (14.2 innings, June 8-July 9, 2008).
- Has not allowed a run in 19 of his 22 appearances this season and has a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip).
- Is tied for first among AL relievers in wins (3), is fourth in strikeouts (26), tied for sixth in appearances (22) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in walks (11).
- Has held opponents to a .192 (15 for 78) batting average...opponents are 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.
- Has not allowed a run in two appearances against Los Angeles this year (2.0 ip)...however, is 2-3 with a 5.71 ERA in 17 career appearances (17.1 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 20 so, 2 hr).
