ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped their season-high six-game losing streak last night...it was their longest losing streak since they also lost six in a row from September 24 to 29 of last season...have now lost nine of their last 13 games...remain in last place in the American League West for the third consecutive day...were in a tie for first place in the West May 17, the day before the six-game losing streak began...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and seven days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times this year...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in each of the last six games and have a 1.47 ERA (5 er in 30.2 ip) and .207 (23 for 111) opponents batting average over that span...however, have one win, two losses and three no decisions in those six games...have a **Major League-leading** 2.59 ERA (90 er in 313.1 ip) for the season...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco and Philadelphia, 20)...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.334), are tied for third in strikeouts (235), are fourth in innings pitched (313.1) and tied for fourth in complete games (3).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.86 ERA, which is over one-half run better than the next American League team (Cleveland, 3.39)...have allowed just 26 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL (Seattle, 28)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.337) and are fifth in strikeouts (345)...also top the majors with 11 pickoffs and opponents have been successful in just 25 of 44 (56.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .210 (50 for 238) with 16 runs scored over their past seven games since tallying a season-high 14 runs on May 17 against the Angels...have hit four home runs over the last 12 games and 27 for the season, which is tied for the second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 26)...have scored 176 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are 16-4 when scoring four runs or more and 7-22 when scoring fewer than four...also have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.303) and the third lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.348)...have the second fewest strikeouts (290)...have been shut out five times this season, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in three of their last five games and now have 37 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...10 of the A's 37 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 51 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games for the season...the 12 extra-inning games lead the majors and the seven losses are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the most defeats...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...seven of the A's last 11 losses have been by one run and they are 7-11 in one-run games for the season...are tied for the American League lead in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 4-8 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...however, have outscored their opponents 47-44 over that span...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning next Friday.

WINS AND LOSSES: After beginning the season with 13 consecutive series without a sweep by either team, there has been a sweep in three of the last four series...after sweeping a two-game set from Los Angeles to start last week, the A's were swept in a two-game series by Minnesota and a three-game series by San Francisco...the A's are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the third best record in the American League...are 14-21 (.400) against right-handed starters...have an 11-8 (.579) record in day games and are 12-18 (.400) at night...have the second worst mark at night in the AL (Minnesota, 9-18)...are 6-11 in the first game of a series and 10-6 in the last game.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-1) and have now lost five of their last six road games...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 12-14 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and New York (three games)...the A's are batting .224 (198 for 884) with 83 runs scored in 26 games on the road (3.20 per game) and .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series 4-3 following last night's win...swept a two-game series in Oakland last week and are now 2-3 in Anaheim...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 64-76 (.457) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 369-299 against the Angels...that includes 192-140 in Oakland and 177-159 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 418-376 against the Angels

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has hit safely in five of his six games against Los Angeles this year (11 for 21, .524)...has a .340 (34 for 100) career average at Angel Stadium.

David DeJesus hit two home runs last night, which was his second time hitting two home runs in a game this season (also May 4 vs. CLE)...they are the only multiple home run games of his career and the only by an Athletic this season...has not committed an error this year and now owns a 281-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed an earned run in his last 29 games and 29.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 64-game, 63.0-inning, 252-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1931** the A's win their 17th consecutive game in a 4-2 win over the Yankees at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won an American League record 20 consecutive games...in **1975** Gene Tenace connects for the 6,000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-29 (.597) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in wins (6), ranks second in ERA (1.79), is tied for second in winning percentage (.857) and is fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.296)...also ranks second with seven wild pitches, which ties Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last season.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer eight of his 10 starts this year...the two exceptions came in his two starts against Chicago when he allowed four runs each time...has a 4.63 ERA (6 er in 11.2 ip) in his two starts against the White Sox and 1.17 ERA (7 er in 53.2) in his other eight starts...had a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer from April 17-May, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six.

WINS: Is 24-8 with a 2.52 ERA (72 er in 257.0 ip) and .217 (200 for 922) opponents batting average in 39 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are tied for the most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-12 (.692) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 65-83 (.439) with all other pitchers...is 34-22 (.607) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against American League West competition this year and 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts against everyone else...now has a 14-6 record and a 2.19 ERA (38 er in 156.1 ip) in 25 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 20-16 with a 4.18 ERA (132 er in 284.1 ip) in 47 starts against everyone else.

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at home this year and 3-0 with a 2.27 ERA (8 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts on the road...has the fourth lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest road ERA...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA (81 er in 243.1 ip) in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-11 with a 4.06 ERA (89 er in 197.1 ip) in 34 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .111 (5 for 45) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the second lowest mark in the American League...has not allowed more than one hit with a RISP in a game this year...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .132 (10 for 76) average...has allowed four home runs and three have been solo shots...three have been hit by the bottom three hitters in the order.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed his first first-inning run of the season in his last start and now has a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) and .152 (5 for 33) opponents batting average in the first inning this year...has a 1.35 ERA (6 er in 40.0 ip) and .174 (23 for 132) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...also allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco last Friday...allowed his first first-inning run of the season when Torres waked, stole second, took third on an error and scored on a ground out...then shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings before being removed for a pinch hitter in the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1.

CAHILL vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-1 with a 1.81 ERA (44.2 ip, 33 h, 11 r, 9 er, 20 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in seven career starts...is 3-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at Los Angeles...has not faced the Angels this year...went 3-1 with a 1.29 ERA (28.0 ip, 20 h, 5 r, 4 er, 9 bb, 13 so) in four starts last year...the loss came on May 16 at Los Angeles in a 4-0 decision...allowed a RBI single to Matsui in the second and two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth but Pineiro tossed a complete game shutout...picked up the win in the A's 6-1 victory over Los Angeles on June 10 in Oakland...allowed a Wilson RBI single in the fifth and then retired 10 of the final 11 batters that he faced...also picked up the win in a 5-2 decision in Oakland on July 11...allowed an unearned run in the fifth...extended his winning streak against the Angels to three games in a 3-1 A's win on Sept. 4...tossed 6.0 shutout innings but issued a career high six walks while allowing four hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (2-4, 3.18 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...is 0-3 with a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip) over his last five starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA over his first five starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: August 10 to September 1, 2010)...has received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 10 starts this year...is 0-4 in those seven starts and is 2-0 in three starts with run support of three or more...has a 1.58 ERA (7 er in 40.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 5.76 (16 er in 25.0 ip) after that...is 0-2 with a 4.55 ERA (31.2 ip, 20 h, 16 r, 16 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) in five career starts against Los Angeles.

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in each of its past six games (20 er in 23.0 ip, 7.83 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.52 ERA overall...has now been charged with 12 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the majors...has 11 saves, which is tied for fifth in the AL...their six blown saves are tied for fifth fewest...have no saves and have had just one opportunity over the past eight games...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents batting average (.241) and on-base percentage (.321)...has allowed four home runs in 23.0 innings over its past six games after not allowing a home run in its previous 23 games and 63.2 innings.

- Had his 14-game, 14.1-inning scoreless streak snapped Sunday when he allowed a home run to Schierholtz in the eighth inning...the scoreless streak was 0.1 inning short of the longest of his career (14.2 innings, June 8-July 9, 2008).
- Has not allowed a run in 19 of his 22 appearances this season and has a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip).
- Is tied for first among AL relievers in wins (3), tied for fifth in strikeouts (26), tied for seventh in appearances (22) and tied for 10th in walks (11).
- Has held opponents to a .192 (15 for 78) batting average...opponents are 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.
