A's vs. ANGELS

The season series is even at four games each...swept a two-game series in Oakland last week and are now 2-4 in Anaheim...lost the season series last year 8-11...it was their third consecutive season series loss and sixth in the last seven years...are 64-77 (.454) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 369-300 against the Angels...that includes 192-140 in Oakland and 177-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 418-377 against the Angels

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has hit safely in six of his seven games against Los Angeles this year (12 for 25, .480)...has a .337 (35 for 104) career average at Angel Stadium.

David DeJesus hit two home runs Tuesday, which was his second time hitting two home runs in a game this season (also May 4 vs. CLE)...they are the only multiple home run games of his career and the only by an Athletic this season...has not committed an error this year and now owns a 282-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed an earned run in his last 29 games and 29.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 64-game, 63.0-inning, 252-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1954 Gus Zernial hits the last grand slam in Philadelphia A's history in a 6-5 win over Boston...in 1975 Gene Tenace has five RBI including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 11th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Baltimore...in 1989 Todd Burns, Rick Honeycutt and Eric Plunk combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in a 4-0 victory at New York.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost seven of their last eight games and 10 of their last 14...had a season-high six-game losing streak from May 18 to 23, their longest since also losing six in a row from September 24 to 29 of last season...were in a tie for first place in the American League West May 17, the day before the losing streak began...following last night's loss, have now spent the past four days in last place...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and eight days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times this year...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in six of the last seven games and have a 1.96 ERA (8 er in 36.2 ip) over that span...however, have one win, three losses and three no decisions in those seven games...have a **Major League-leading** 2.62 ERA (93 er in 319.1 ip) for the season...have allowed just 18 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors (San Francisco and Philadelphia, 20)...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.243), are third in innings pitched (319.1) and strikeouts (239) and tied for fourth in complete games (3).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.87 ERA (144 er in 451.2 ip), which is nearly one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.35)...have allowed just 28 home runs, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the AL...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.341) and are tied for fifth in strikeouts (350)...also top the majors with 11 pickoffs and opponents have been successful in just 25 of 46 (54.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (58 for 271) with 17 runs scored over their past eight games since tallying a season-high 14 runs on May 17 against the Angels...have hit four home runs over the last 13 games and 27 for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors...have scored 177 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are 16-4 when scoring four runs or more and 7-23 when scoring fewer than four...also have the third lowest batting average (.237), on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.347) in the AL...have the second fewest strikeouts (298)...have been shut out five times this season, which is tied for third most in the AL...have been successful in just 35 of 50 (70.0%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in four of their last six games and now have 38 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 30 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...10 of the A's 38 errors have been made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 52 double plays, which is fourth most in the AL.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games for the season...the 12 extra-inning games lead the majors and the seven losses are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the most defeats...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...seven of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run and they are 7-11 in one-run games for the season...are tied for the American League lead in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are 4-9 in this stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13...however, have matched their opponents in runs (48) over that span...all 20 games will be played in California...the stretch began with a seven-game homestand, continues with this seven-game road trip and concludes with a six-game homestand against Baltimore and New York beginning next Friday.

WINS AND LOSSES: After beginning the season with 13 consecutive series without a sweep by either team, there has been a sweep in three of the last four series...after sweeping a two-game set from Los Angeles to start last week, the A's were swept in a two-game series by Minnesota and a three-game series by San Francisco...the A's are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 14-22 (.389) against right-handed starters...have an 11-8 (.579) record in day games and are 12-19 (.387) at night...have the second worst mark at night in the AL (Minnesota, 9-18)...are 6-11 in the first game of a series and 10-6 in the last game.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this seven-game road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2) and have now lost six of their last seven road games...went 3-2 on the last road trip through Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 12-15 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and New York (three games)...the A's are batting .225 (206 for 917) with 84 runs scored in 27 games on the road (3.11 per game) and .251 with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (109)...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...the A's are 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and are 26-33 (.441) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in four of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip), 13 walks and four home runs allowed over his last five starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip)...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: August 10 to September 1, 2010).

RUN SUPPORT: The A's were shutout in his last start and he has received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 10 starts this year...is 0-4 in those seven starts and is 2-0 in three starts with run support of three or more...has the **fifth** lowest run support in the American League with a mark of 2.49 (18 rs in 65.0 ip)...is now 2-19 in 32 career starts with two runs or support or fewer and 18-2 with at least three runs of support.

ON THE BASES: Is tied for the Major League lead with five pickoffs (Shields, TB)...that is already a career-high as he had four in each of his previous two seasons...opponents have been caught stealing a ML-leading six times this year and have a stolen base percentage of 33.3% (3 sb), which is tied for sixth lowest in the American League.

THE FIRST FOUR INNINGS: Has a 1.58 ERA (7 er in 40.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 5.76 (16 er in 25.0 ip) after that...has yielded a .195 (15 for 77) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .229 (19 for 83) the second time through and .337 (29 for 86) after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed four home runs, all to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 10 home runs over the last two seasons, all against right-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a left-hander since August 25, 2009 at Seattle (Brayan)...three of his home runs this year have come at home as have eight of his 10 over the last two years.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle **April 2** in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning with the score tied at 1-1...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota **April 8**...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Chicago **April 13**...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run...earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston **April 19**...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory at Seattle **April 24**...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...was replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning...took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas **April 30**...surrendered a career-high-tying seven earned runs in 5.0 innings, allowing one run in the first, two in the third and four in the fifth...allowed a career-high-tying four walks after walking only four batters over his first five starts...also allowed a career-high-tying three home runs (also April 22, 2009 at NYY)...his home run allowed to Young in the third inning came after going 36.2 innings without allowing a home run to open the season...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 12 innings to Cleveland **May 5** in Oakland...tossed a career-high-tying 9.0 innings (also July 6, 2009 at Boston)...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Hafner singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Cabrera in the sixth inning...the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the eighth and he left after tossing 114 pitches in nine innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas **May 10**...issued a career-high-tying four walks in just 4.2 innings...held the Rangers scoreless over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth inning on a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Gentry RBI single...then allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the fifth inning and was relieved by Purcey with two outs...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles **May 16** in Oakland...issued a career-high-tying four walks for the second consecutive start, third time this year and fifth time in his career...blanked the Angels on four hits over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a fielders choice and a Trumbo sacrifice fly...was relieved by Wuertz with a 3-2 lead, two outs and a runner on first in the seventh inning but Wuertz allowed a two-run single to Kendrick for the blown save.

LAST START: Extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-0 loss at San Francisco last Friday...walked Torres to start the game and he went to third on a Sanchez double before scoring on a Posey ground out...then shutout the Giants on four hits over the next four innings...pitched just 5.0 innings as he was removed for a pinch hitter in the top of the sixth...Lincecum shutout the A's on three hits.

ANDERSON vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 4.55 ERA (31.2 ip, 20 h, 16 r, 16 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) in five career starts...is 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (8 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts in Los Angeles and 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (8 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's win in 10 innings on May 16 in Oakland...issued a career-high-tying four walks...blanked the Angels on four hits over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a fielders choice and a Trumbo sacrifice fly...was relieved by Wuertz with a 3-2 lead, two outs and a runner on first in the seventh inning but Wuertz allowed a two-run single to Kendrick for the blown save...made just one start against the Angels last year and had a no decision in a 6-5 loss at Los Angeles September 27.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-2, 2.20 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) and .186 (18 for 97) opponents batting average in four starts in May...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...has never won four games in one month...ranks sixth in the American League with a 2.20 ERA and is tied for eighth with five wins...opponents are 0 for 14 with runners in scoring position over his last three starts and they are batting .103 (4 for 39) for the season...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss last Sunday at San Francisco...allowed a RBI double to Freddy Sanchez in the first inning and was also charged with an unearned run in the third inning when Posey scored on a two-out error by LaRoche...is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in two career starts against Baltimore.

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in six of its past seven games (20 er in 25.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.47 ERA overall...has now been charged with 12 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the majors...have are 11 for 17 (64.7%) in save opportunities this season, which is tied for the fifth fewest opportunities in the AL...the six blown saves are tied for fourth fewest and the save percentage ranks sixth...has no saves and has had just one opportunity over the past nine games...ranks fourth in the AL in on-base percentage (.318) and slugging (.340) and fifth in opponents batting average (.238)...has allowed four home runs in 25.0 innings over its past seven games after not allowing a home run in its previous 23 games and 63.2 innings.

- Has not allowed a run in 19 of his 22 appearances this season and has a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip).
- Is tied for first among AL relievers in wins (3), tied for fifth in strikeouts (26), tied for seventh in appearances (22) and tied for 10th in walks (11).
- Has held opponents to a .192 (15 for 78) batting average...opponents are 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position.
