A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's won the season series last year, 7-3...won three of four in Oakland and four of six in Baltimore...have won each of the last three seasons series and 11 of the last 12...have won 17 of the last 21 games, including 9 of the last 10 in Oakland...have won seven consecutive series...are 72-31 (.699) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 239-237 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 117-124 in Oakland and 122-113 in Daltimore...all-time, the A's are 975-917 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus is batting .372 (16 for 43) over his last 13 games after hitting .217 over his first 32 contests...has not committed an error this year and now owns a 283-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed an earned run in his last 29 games and 29.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 64-game, 63.0-inning, 252-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

Cliff Pennington is batting .321 (17 for 53) over his last 15 games after hitting .217 over his first 35 contests...is a .341 (15 for 44) career hitter against the Orioles, his best mark against any American League team.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1984 Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in 1985 Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing a season-high six consecutive games...are now 5-10 over the last 15 games...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day...were in a tie for first place May 17 and despite losing seven of nine games since then, have lost just 2½ games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and nine days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times this year...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of the last 10 games but are just 3-3 despite a 1.69 ERA (11 er in 58.2 ip) and .219 (46 for 210) opponents over that span...have a **Major League-leading** 2.56 ERA (93 er in 327.1 ip) for the season, which is more than one-half run better than the next closest team (Seattle, 3.14)...have allowed just two home runs in the last 11 games and 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.338), are third in innings pitched (327.1) and strikeouts (243) and tied for fourth in complete games (3).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.87 ERA, which is nearly one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.36)...have allowed just 29 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Seattle, 28)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.341)...also top the majors with 11 pickoffs and opponents have been successful in just 25 of 46 (54.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 21 caught stealings also lead the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit just three home runs over the last 11 games and have 27 for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit just 86 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have the third fewest runs scored (181) and strikeouts (303) in the American League and also have the third lowest batting average (.238), on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.347)...have been shut out five times, which is tied for third most...have been successful in just 35 of 50 (70.0%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 30 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...10 of the 38 errors have be made by pitchers, which is the **most in the majors**...have turned 54 double plays, which is third most in the AL.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's will play each of their next 12 games against American League East teams...after this six-game homestand with Baltimore and New York, the A's begin their next road trip with three-game series at Boston and Baltimore...are 2-3 (.400) against the East this year, the fewest games against the East of any AL team...have lost two of three to Toronto and split a two-game series with Boston.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13 and concludes with the six-game homestand...all 20 games will be played in California...have a 5-9 record in this stretch but have outscored the opposition 52-51...the offense is batting .251 (120 for 479) and the pitching staff has a 3.20 ERA (45 er in 126.2 ip)...that includes 2.18 (21 er in 86.2 ip) by the starters and 5.40 (24 er in 40.0 ip) by the relievers.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games lead the majors and the seven losses are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the most defeats...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for second in the American League in one-run losses and one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (6)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

IN MAY: The A's are 11-13 (.458) in the month of May...have finished with a losing record in May in four of the previous six seasons...rank third in the American League this month with a 2.96 ERA (72 er in 219.0 ip) and have not finished May with an ERA under 3.33 since recording a 2.43 ERA in May, 1990...posted a 2.79 ERA in April this year...since 1990, the only time the A's have record an ERA under 3.00 in back-to-back months was in July (2.81) and August (2.87) of 2001.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 15-22 (.405) against right-handed starters...have a 12-8 (.600) record in day games and are 12-19 (.387) at night...have the third best day record in the AL and the second worst mark at night in the AL (Minnesota, 9-18).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Baltimore (three games) and New York (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 11-12 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...the A's are batting .251 (195 for 778) with 93 runs scored in 23 home games (4.04 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...the A's are 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments this year and are 35-31 (.531) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in eight of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) and .186 (18 for 97) opponents batting average in four starts in May...the winning streak is

one short of his career high of four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...has never won four games in one month...his lowest single-month ERA is 1.98 in August, 2010...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for eighth in the American League with five wins and ranks sixth with a 2.20 ERA...has struck out 56 in 57.1 innings for an average of 8.79 per nine innings...that is tied for fifth best in the Al

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 0 for 14 with runners in scoring position over his last three starts and they are batting .103 (4 for 39) for the season...has not allowed a hit with RISP and two outs (20 at bats)...has yielded a .187 (14 for 75) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .284 (21 for 74) the second time through and .180 (11 for 61) after that...has surrendered four home runs, three of which have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of one run or fewer in four of his nine starts but has support of six runs or more in three of his other starts...has run support of one and zero in his two losses this year and now has 19 runs of support in his 22 career losses (105.0 ip, 1.63 RSA)...is 25-4 in 41 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches.

FOURTH START: Took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston April 20...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one...however, allowed four runs on eight hits over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning.

FIFTH START: Was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 defeat in Los Angeles April 25...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings, his shortest start of the year...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...then threw a scoreless fifth before he was replaced by Purcey after throwing 95 pitches.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Texas May 1 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and two outs in the seventh and Ziegler allowed one of those runners to score.

SEVENTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City May 6...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win.

RAINED OUT: Had his last scheduled start rained out May 11 at Texas...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay.

EIGHTH START: He combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...retired each of the first 11 batters before walking Izturis with two outs in the fourth...surrendered his only hit when Kendrick singled to leadoff the fifth...neither base runner advanced past first base.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss last Sunday at San Francisco...allowed a RBI double to Freddy Sanchez in the first inning and was also charged with an unearned run in the third inning when Posey scored on a two-out error by LaRoche...Jonathan Sanchez shutout the A's over the first five innings, but Oakland scored once in the sixth and twice in the seventh to take a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh but Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save.

GONZALEZ vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in two career starts...made one start last year, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Baltimore May 27...the A's scored twice in the second to give him a 2-0 lead, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a fielders choice and a Wieters RBI single...also allowed a run to score on a groundout in the sixth inning and left trailing 3-2...the A's scored five times in the eighth for the win...his win came in a 9-1 A's victory at Baltimore on August 10, 2009...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, scattered seven hits and walked just one...the biggest threat came in the seventh inning when Mora singled and Wieters doubled to start the inning...the game was delayed by rain for 52 minutes and when it resumed he was relieved by Breslow who retired the next three batters to end the inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Josh Outman (0-0, 1.29 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento Monday and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery...was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts, with Sacramento this year...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League in wins at the time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...has never faced the Orioles in his career.

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in seven of its past eight games (23 er in 26.0 ip, 7.96 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks sixth in the American League with a 3.65 ERA overall...has now been charged with 12 losses, which is the most by a bullpen in the majors...are 11 for 17 (64.7%) in save opportunities this season, which is tied for the fifth fewest opportunities in the AL...the six blown saves are tied for fourth fewest and the save percentage ranks sixth...has no saves and has had just one opportunity over the past 10 games...first batters faced are batting .262 (33 for 126), which is third highest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in on-base percentage (.320) and slugging (.347)...has allowed five home runs in 26.0 innings over its past eight games after not allowing a home run in its previous 23 games and 63.2 innings
