A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's won the first meeting of 2011 last night after winning the season series last year, 7-3...have now won 18 of the last 22 games, including 10 of the last 11 in Oakland...have won seven consecutive series...have won each of the previous three season series and 11 of the previous 12...are 73-31 (.702) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League** team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 240-237 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 118-124 in Oakland and 122-113 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 976-917 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error this year and now owns a 284-game errorless streak, the longest active streak among Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed an earned run in his last 30 games and 30.1 innings dating back to 2008...he also has a 65-game, 64.0-inning, 255-batter homerless streak dating back to 2006.

Cliff Pennington is a .333 (16 for 48) career hitter against the Orioles, his best mark against any American League team.

Ryan Sweeney went 2 for 5 last night and now has an 11-game hitting streak against Baltimore (18 for 42, .429)...is a .367 (22 for 60) career hitter against the Orioles.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing a season-high six consecutive contests...are now 6-10 over the last 16 games...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day...were in a tie for first place May 17 and despite losing seven of 10 games since then, have lost just 1½ games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and 10 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

OFFENSE: All nine players in the A's starting lineup collected at least one hit yesterday for the second consecutive game...it was the first time the A's have done that in back-to-back games since May 13-14, 1995...the A's are now batting .281 (59 for 210) over the last six games but are hitting .240 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.350) and the third fewest runs scored (187) and strikeouts (310)...have hit just four home runs over the last 12 games and have 28 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 27)...are on pace to hit just 87 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of the last 11 games but are just 3-3 despite a 1.70 ERA (12 er in 63.2 ip) and .225 (51 for 227) opponents batting average over that span...have a **Major League-leading** 2.55 ERA (94 er in 332.1 ip) for the season, which is more than one-half run better than the next closest team (San Francisco, 3.17)...have allowed just two home runs in the last 12 games and 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.337) and are third in innings pitched (332.1) and strikeouts (250).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.84 ERA, which is more than one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.36)...have allowed just 29 home runs, which is tied with Seattle for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 26)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.338) and rank fourth in strikeouts (365)...have a Major League leading 11 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 25 of 46 (54.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 21 caught stealings top the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 39 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is the **most in the majors**...turned a season-high-tying four double plays last night (also May 15 vs. Chicago) and now have 58 for the season, which is second most in the AL.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 12-8 (.600) record in day games and are 13-19 (.406) at night...have the third best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 9-19)...are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 15-22 (.405) against right-handed starters.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (1-0) and New York (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 12-12 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...the A's are batting .254 (207 for 814) with 99 runs scored in 24 home games (4.13 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13 and concludes with this six-game homestand...all 20 games will be played in California...have a 6-9 record in this stretch but have outscored the opposition 58-53...the offense is batting .256 (132 for 515) and the pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA (46 er in 135.2 ip)...that includes 2.16 (22 er in 91.2 ip) by the starters and 4.91 (24 er in 44.0 ip) by the relievers.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 1-0 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams...after this six-game homestand with Baltimore and New York, the A's begin their next road trip with three-game series at Boston and Baltimore...are 3-3 (.500) against the East this year, the fewest games against the East of any AL team.

IN MAY: The A's are 12-13 (.480) in the month of May...have finished with a losing record in May in four of the previous six seasons...rank second in the American League this month with a 2.88 ERA (73 er in 228.0 ip) and have not finished May with an ERA under 3.33 since recording a 2.43 ERA in 1990...posted a 2.79 ERA in April this year...since 1990, the only time the A's have compiled an ERA under 3.00 in back-to-back months was in July (2.81) and August (2.87) of 2001.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied with Kansas City for the most in the majors and the seven losses are tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the most defeats...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 5-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses and one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Braden, Bailey, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...the A's lost in his first start and are now 9-8 (.529) in his 17 career starting assignments.

COMEBACK: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the Padres game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: His last Major League win came June 8, 2009 against Minnesota, a 4-3 A's victory...the victory extended his winning streak to a career-high four games, but he lost at San Francisco on June 13 before being injured June 19.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles last Monday...walked Izturis to start the game and, after an Aybar sacrifice, Abreu had a RBI single...that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was relieved by Fuentes to start the eighth inning with the score tied at 1-1.

OUTMAN vs. BALTIMORE: Is making his first career appearance and start.

THIS SPRING: Began his comeback this spring by going 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in five games, including one start...opponents hit .442 (23 for 52)...tossed a scoreless fifth and sixth inning in his first outing February 27 at Mesa against the Cubs...it was his first appearance against Major League competition since June 19, 2009 at San Diego...then allowed at least two runs in each of his final four outings...including a start March 6 at San Diego (1.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League in wins at the time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...also allowed six home runs...the River Cats were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in two of his eight starts (his last two), allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

FIRST FOUR, LAST FOUR: Went 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA and .306 opponents average over his first four starts and 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .232 opponents average over his final four starts....tossed fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts and five or more in each of his final four.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .264 opponents batting average broke down to .237 (14 for 59) against left-handed hitters and .282 (24 for 85) against right-handers...yielded five of his six home runs to righties...opponents hit .256 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed 12 of his 24 runs in the first inning for a 12.38 ERA and .395 opponents batting average...had a 2.73 ERA and .217 opponents batting average from the second inning on...had 10 walks in the first inning and 17 after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-0 with a 3.68 ERA in four starts on the road and 1-1 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts at home.

SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in each of his first three starts, tossing fewer than 5.0 innings in each outing...walked four batters in 4.0 innings in his first start April 7 against Tacoma...tossed a season low 2.0 innings in his second start April 13 against Las Vegas...then allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings April 18 at Tacoma...had his first decision April 24 against Tucson when he allowed a season-high six runs (four earned) in 4.2 innings for the loss...then won each of his final four starts...allowed a season high eight hits in 5.0 innings at Las Vegas April 30...surrendered a season high two home runs May 6 against Colorado Springs...tossed 6.0 shutout innings at Memphis May 11 but had season-highs in walks (5) and strikeouts (6)...pitched a season-high 7.0 innings in his final start May 16 at Nashville and allowed just two hits in 7.0 innings.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2008 as a September call-up and then went 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts, in 2009 before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery in June...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued his recovery...is 5-3 with a 3.60 ERA (40 er in 100.0 ip) in 21 career appearances, including 17 starts...was originally drafted by Philadelphia in the 10th round of the 2005 draft and was dealt to the A's in the Joe Blanton trade in July of 2008.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento Tuesday and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win (6.0 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 3 so)...became the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977 and the first to win since Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...has no decision and a 16.20 ERA (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Baltimore, both in relief...was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts, at Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game.

Save/Save Opportunities: 11/17 (64.7%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more earned runs in seven of its past nine games (23 er in 30.0 ip, 6.90 ERA) after allowing no earned runs in eight of its previous 10 games (4 er in 24.1 ip, 1.48 ERA)...ranks sixth in the American League with a 3.54 ERA overall...has been charged with 12 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 11 for 17 (64.7%) in save opportunities this season, which is tied for the fifth fewest opportunities in the AL...the six blown saves are tied for fourth fewest and the save percentage ranks fifth...has no saves and has had just one opportunity over the past 11 games...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.315) and slugging (.341) and tied for fourth in batting average (.236)...first batters faced are batting .256 (33 for 129), which is tied for third highest in the AL.

- Made a rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento yesterday and did not allow a run in one inning (2 h, 0 bb, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in his four rehab appearances with the River Cats (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has allowed five runs in 2.0 innings over his past two appearances, which has raised his ERA from 1.31 to a season-high 3.18 (8 er in 22.2 ip)...however, has not allowed a run in 19 of 23 appearances this season.
- Has a 0.73 ERA (1 er in 12.1 ip) in 11 appearances at home compared to a 6.10 ERA (7 er in 10.1 ip) in 12 appearances on the road...has a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in 13 appearances at night and a 4.66 ERA (5 er in 9.2 ip) in 10 games during the day.
- Is tied for first among AL relievers in wins (3), ranks fifth in strikeouts (28), is tied for sixth in appearances (23) and tied for ninth in walks (12).
- Has held opponents to a .205 (17 for 83) batting average...opponents are 1 for 12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.
- Had a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in six appearances against Baltimore last year and is 2-0 with two saves (three opportunities) and a 3.13 ERA in 21 career appearances (23.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 26 so).
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has allowed just 1 of 10 (10.0%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is tied for the sixth lowest percentage in the American League.
- Opponents are batting .338, which is 10th highest among AL relievers...the batting average includes a .387 (12 for 31) mark against left-handed hitters and .302 (13 for 43) against righties...first batters faced are 8 for 21 (.381), which is third highest in the AL.
- Is tied for third in the majors in pickoffs (3) and is tied for 10th in the AL in losses by relievers (2).
- Had a 4.15 ERA (2 er in 4.1 ip) in four games against the Orioles last year...however, has a 1.53 ERA in 15 career appearances (17.2 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 1 hr).
- Made a team-leading 75 appearances for the A's in 2010, registering a 4-4 mark with five saves and 3.01 ERA...the games pitched tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history...also set an Oakland record for strikeouts by a left-handed reliever with 71.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-30 (.589) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) and .304 (21 for 69) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in wins (6), ranks fourth in ERA (2.02) and tied for sixth in winning percentage (.750)...also ranks second with seven wild pitches, which ties Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

WINS: Is 24-9 with a 2.57 ERA (75 er in 263.0 ip) and .222 (210 for 947) opponents batting average in 40 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are second most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-13 (.675) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 64-80 (.444) with all other pitchers...is 34-23 (.596) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at home this year and 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA (81 er in 243.1 ip) in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-12 with a 4.07 ERA (92 er in 203.1 ip) in 35 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .132 (7 for 53) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for the second lowest mark in the American League...opponents are hitting .304 (21 for 69) with three walks (.333) on-base percentage when leading off an inning...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .143 (12 for 84) average...has allowed six home runs and five have been solo shots.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed just one first inning run for a 0.82 ERA (1 er in 11.0 ip) and .139 (5 for 36) opponents batting average in the first inning this year...has a 1.32 ERA (6 er in 41.0 ip) and .170 (23 for 135) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago **April 12**...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle **April 23**...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...also allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh...that snapped a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco **May 20**...allowed his first first-inning run of the season when Torres waked, stole second, took third on an error and scored on a ground out...then shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings before being removed for a pinch hitter in the seventh inning with the score tied at 1-1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles last Wednesday...allowed a RBI single to Bourjos in the second inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth...allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth on back-to-back home runs by Hunter and Callaspo and a RBI double by Willits...it was the second time in his career he allowed back-to-back home runs (Aug. 30, 2010 at New York).

CAHILL vs. NEW YORK: Is 0-2 with a 12.60 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 14 r, 14 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the first loss came in a 6-1 decision in Oakland on July 6, snapping his career best seven-game winning streak...retired each of the first six batters he faced before allowing five runs in the third inning...Granderson scored on a Jeter fielders choice before Rodriguez hit a grand slam...also allowed a solo home run to Rodriguez in the sixth...also lost in the A's 11-5 loss at New York August 30...allowed a career-high-tying eight runs in 4.0 innings, but it was the first time all eight runs were earned...Swisher had a two-run double in the Yankees three-run first, Teixeira and Cano hit back-to-back home runs in the third and Pena had a RBI in the fourth...was also charged with two runs in the fifth.
