A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 2-0 after winning the first two games of this series...have now won eight consecutive series against the Orioles...that is the A's longest series winning streak against Baltimore in Oakland history and the fifth longest against any team...have won 19 of the last 23 games against the Orioles, including 11 of the last 12 in Oakland...won the season series last year 7-3...have won each of the previous three season series and 11 of the previous 12...are 74-31 (.705) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 241-237 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 119-124 in Oakland and 122-113 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 977-917 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record again

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has a career high 14.2 inning scoreless streak and has not allowed an earned run in his last 31 games and 31.1 innings dating back to 2008.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1909 Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in 1990 Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in 2000 Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of their last three games, matching the longest winning streak of the season (third time, last: April 16-19)...have now won four of the last five games after a season-high six-game losing streak...have won the first two games of this series and with a win today would record their first three-game series sweep of the season (swept a two-game series from Los Angeles, May 16-17)...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the seventh consecutive day...were in a tie for first place May 17 and despite losing seven of 11 games since then, have lost just 1½ games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, two days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of the last 12 games but are just 4-3 despite a 1.81 ERA (14 er in 69.2 ip) and .228 (57 for 250) opponents batting average over that span...have a **Major League-leading** 2.55 ERA (96 er in 338.1 ip) for the season, which is more than one-half run better than the next closest team (San Francisco, 3.16)...have allowed just two home runs in the last 13 games and 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.336) and rank third in innings pitched (338.1) and strikeouts (252).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.82 ERA, which is nearly one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.31)...have allowed just 29 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 27)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.336) and are tied for fourth in strikeouts (369)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 25 of 47 (53.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 22 caught stealings top the

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .282 (69 for 245) over the last seven games but are hitting .241 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.351) and the third fewest runs scored (191) and strikeouts (320)...have five home runs over the last seven games but have 29 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Seattle, 27)...are on pace to hit just 89 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...are 19-4 when scoring four or more runs in a game and 7-23 when scoring fewer than four.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 40 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 32)...have turned eight double plays in the last three games and now have 60 for the season, which is second most in the AL

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 12-8 (.600) record in day games and are 14-19 (.424) at night...have the third best day record in the American League and are tied with Chicago for the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 10-19)...are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 16-22 (.421) against right-handed starters.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (2-0) and New York (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Chicago (1-2), Los Angeles (2-0) and Minnesota (0-2) and are 13-12 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...the A's are batting .256 (217 for 849) with 103 runs scored in 25 home games (4.12 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13 and concludes with this six-game homestand...all 20 games will be played in California...have a 7-9 record in this stretch but have outscored the opposition 62-55...the offense is batting .258 (142 for 550) and the pitching staff has a 2.99 ERA (48 er in 144.2 ip)...that includes 2.21 (24 er in 97.2 ip) by the starters and 4.60 (24 er in 47.0 ip) by the relievers.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 2-0 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams...after this six-game homestand with Baltimore and New York, the A's begin their next road trip with three-game series at Boston and Baltimore...are 4-3 (.571) against the East this year, the fewest games against the East of any AL team.

IN MAY: The A's are 13-13 (.500) in the month of May...have finished with a losing record in May in four of the previous six seasons...rank second in the American League this month with a 2.85 ERA (75 er in 237.0 ip) and have not finished May with an ERA under 3.33 since recording a 2.43 ERA in 1990...posted a 2.79 ERA in April this year...since 1990, the only time the A's have compiled an ERA under 3.00 in back-to-back months was in July (2.81) and August (2.87) of 2001.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied with Kansas City and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors and the seven losses are second most to the Angels (8)...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 7-13 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses and tied for fourth in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

VENEZUELA: Became the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

LAST START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles last Tuesday...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings and matched his best with three strikeouts...did not allow a run and allowed just three runners into scoring position.

MOSCOSO vs. BALTIMORE: Has no decision and a 16.20 ERA (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Baltimore, both in relief...made his only appearance of 2010 against Baltimore on May 20 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...allowed a Jones RBI double and walked Markakis with the bases loaded...his other outing came on September 6, 2009 at Baltimore (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...pitched the seventh inning of a 7-0 Texas loss and allowed a RBI single to Fiorentino.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

THE FIRST TWO INNINGS: Allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) and .302 (19 for 63) opponents batting average...had a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) and .183 (17 for 93) opponents average from the third inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .231 opponents average broke down to .216 (16 for 74) against left-handed hitters and .244 (20 for 82) against right-handers...surrendered his only home run and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...allowed a .236 (21 for 89) average with the bases empty and .308 (12 for 39) with runners in scoring position.

SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in his first start April 8 against Tacoma, allowing a run in 5.0 innings in a 3-1 loss...the run came in the first inning and he did not allow a run in each of his next two appearances...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision against Las Vegas April 14 and then pitched 5.0 shutout innings in relief of a rehabbing Michael Wuertz April 20 at Reno...picked up the win against Reno but was charged with his first loss April 25 at Tucson...allowed two runs in the first inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 15.0 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his next start, a loss at Las Vegas May 1...had back-to-back scoreless outings again May 7 against Colorado Springs and May 12 at Memphis, both wins...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings and struck out a season-high eight in each outing...then allowed five runs on six hits in 3.0 innings in his final start May 17 at Nashville.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Texas in 2009 and posted a 3.21 ERA in 10 relief appearances...also made one relief appearance for the Rangers last year, allowing two runs in 0.2 innings...had no decisions and a 4.30 ERA in 11 career appearances, all in relief, entering this season.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 44-27 with a 3.19 ERA (236 er in 665.2 ip) in 140 career minor league appearances, including 101 starts...has 670 strikeouts in 665.2 innings...has walked just 170 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.94...was named Pitcher of the Year at Oneonta in 2007...threw a nine-inning perfect game in the New York-Penn League July 15, 2007...was originally signed by the Detroit Tigers as a non-drafted free agent in 2003 and spent two seasons in the Dominican Summer League before coming to the United States in 2005...traded to Texas following the 2008 season as part of the Gerald Laird trade...was acquired by the A's for minor leaguer Ryan Kelly January 8, 2011.

RHP Trevor Cahill (6-2, 2.02 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...is tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks third in ERA...is 0-2 with a 2.84 ERA and .304 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 24-9 with a 2.57 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in 40 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are second most in the majors over that span...is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA in five starts at home and has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-12 with a 4.07 ERA in 35 starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss at Los Angeles last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 4 so, 2 hr)...is 0-2 with a 12.60 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 14 r, 14 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two career starts against New York, both last year.

- Was reinstated from the disabled list today...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL
- Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento May 20 and did not allow a run in four appearances (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hb).
- Converted each of his three save opportunities against Baltimore last year (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 so)...has not allowed a run and is a perfect 5 for 5 in saves in six career appearances against the Orioles (6.1 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 6 so).
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).
