# A's vs. YANKEES

The A's lost the season series last 9-1...lost five of six in Oakland and dropped all four games in New York...the 1-9 mark was the worst in Oakland history against the Yankees and it matched the Athletics worst ever (2-18 in 1919)...have a seven-game losing streak against New York, which is one short of the Oakland record for consecutive losses to the Yankees (8, three times; last: June 12, 2008-July 24, lost 2009)...have eight consecutive series, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive series lost to any team (see chart above)...have lost each of the last three season series and are 4-21 (.160) against New York since which is the worst mark by 2008 an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 218to 255 against the Yankees...that includes 120-115 in Oakland and 98-140 in New York...all-time, the A's are 759-1121 against the Yankees/Orioles

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have compiled a 23-17 record on Memorial Day...have won three straight and seven of the last nine on the holiday.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1932 AI Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each in a 13-2 win over Washington...in **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off th bottom of the 14th inning as th A's defeat the New York Yankees 3-2

### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won a season-high four consecutive games to return to the .500 mark for the 14<sup>th</sup> time this year...last season, were exactly .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...have also won five of the last six games after a season-high six-game losing streak (May 18-23)...swept a three-game series from Baltimore to start the homestand, the A's first three-game series sweep of the season (swept a two-game series from Los Angeles, May 16-17)...are currently in a tie for third place in the American League West...were tied for first May 17 and despite losing seven of 12 games since then, have lost just 1½ games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 11 davs in fourth.

**ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON:** The A's have played 54 games, which is one-third of the season...the pitching staff has allowed just 29 home runs, which puts them on pace for 87...the Oakland record for fewest home runs allowed in a non-strike season is 90 in 1994...however, the offense is on pace for just 90 home runs, which would also be the fewest in Oakland history (94 in 1968)...have a 2.84 ERA, which is currently the second lowest mark in Oakland history (2.58 in 1972)...the defense has turned 61 double plays and are on pace for 183, which would be second most in Oakland history (195 in 1996)...the offense is on pace for 591 runs scored and 495 walks...both of those figures would be the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (573 runs and 482 walks)...the A's .352 slugging percentage would also be the lowest since 1979 (.346)...have a .309 onbase percentage, which would be the lowest since 1982 (also .309).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or fewer in each of the 27 games in May for a 2.48 ERA (47 er in 170.2 ip)...also had a 27-game streak with four runs or fewer last year (July 31-August 29) but have not had a longer streak of four runs or fewer since they had a 32-game stretch from Oct. 4, 1980-May 9, 1981...have a **Major League-leading** 2.62 ERA (100 er in 343.1 ip) for the season, which is more than one-half run better than the next closest team (Los Angeles-AL, 3.24)...have allowed just two home runs in the last 14 games and 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.335), rank third in innings pitched (343.1) and tied for third in strikeouts (253).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a 2.84 ERA, which is one-half run better than the next American League team (Los Angeles, 3.34)...have allowed just 29 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 27)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.334), rank third in batting average (.242) and are fourth in on-base percentage (.310)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 26 of 48 (54.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 22 caught stealings top the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .286 (79 for 276) over the last eight games but are hitting .242 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.352) and the third fewest runs scored (197) and strikeouts (323)...have six home runs over the last eight games but have 30 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Seattle, 28)...are 20-4 when scoring four or more runs in a game and 7-23 when scoring fewer than four.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 40 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 32)...have turned nine double plays in the last four games and now have 61 for the season, which is second most in the AL.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-8 (.619) record in day games and are 14-19 (.424) at night...have the third best day record in the American League and are tied with Chicago for the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 10-19)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 16-22 (.421) against right-handed starters.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and are 14-12 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...begin a 10-game road trip to Boston (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games) on Friday...the A's are batting .258 (227 for 880) with 109 runs scored in 26 home games (4.19 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

**20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS:** The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13 and concludes with this three-game series...all 20 games will be played in California...have an 8-9 record in this stretch and have outscored the opposition 68-59...the offense is batting .262 (152 for 581) and the pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA (52 er in 153.2 ip)...that includes 2.45 (28 er in 102.2 ip) by the starters and 4.24 (24 er in 51.0 ip) by the relievers

IN MAY: The A's are 14-13 (.519) in the month of May and need one win in the remaining two games to post a winning record for the second consecutive season (16-12 last year)...rank second in the American League this month with a 2.89 ERA (79 er in 246.0 ip) and have not finished May with an ERA under 3.33 since recording a 2.43 ERA in 1990...posted a 2.79 ERA in April this year...since 1990, the only time the A's have compiled an ERA under 3.00 in back-to-back months was in July (2.81) and August (2.87) of 2001.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games and are tied with Kansas City and Los Angeles (AL) for the most extra inning games in the majors...played just 11 extra inning games all last year...are 7-13 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12 h start of the season...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments this vear and are 43-30 (.589) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) and .304 (21 for 69) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.02), tied for second in wins (6) and tied for fourth in winning percentage (.750)...also ranks second with seven wild pitches, which matches Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

WINS: Is 24-9 with a 2.57 ERA (75 er in 263.0 ip) and .222 (210 for 947) opponents batting average in 40 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-13 (.675) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 69-83 (.454) with all other pitchers...is 34-23 (.596) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday (42, Vida Blue).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at home this year and 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-11 with a 3.00 ERA (81 er in 243.1 ip) in 38 career starts in Oakland and 13-12 with a 4.07 ERA (92 er in 203.1 ip) in 35 starts on the road.

34 27 OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .132 (7 for 53) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the fifth lowest mark in the American 26 25 League...opponents are hitting .304 (21 for 69) with three walks (.333) on-base percentage when leading off an inning...has held the opponents three through five hitters to a .143 (12 for 84) average...has allowed six home runs and five have been solo shots.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed just one first inning run for a 0.82 ERA (1 er in 11.0 ip) and .139 (5 for 36) opponents batting average in the first inning this year...has a 1.32 ERA (6 er in 41.0 ip) and .170 (23 for 135) opponents batting average in the first inning over the last two years.

FIRST LOSS: Was the losing pitcher May 15 against Chicago, snapping his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss snapped a seven-game winning streak dating back to October 1, 2010...the winning streak matched his career high (May 21 to July 1, 2010)...posted a 1.52 ERA and .210 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory at Toronto **April 7**...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Chicago April 12...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit April 17 in Oakland ... allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...earned the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...extended his season winning streak to four games in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **April 29**...walked three batters in the first inning, the fifth time in his career he walked three batters in an inning (last: July 17, 2009 vs. LAA)...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland May 4 in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago May 15 in Oakland ... held the White Sox scoreless until Ramirez homered to lead off the fourth...also allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and two unearned runs in the seventh...that snapped a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco **May 20**...allowed his first firstinning run of the season when Torres waked, stole second, took third on an error and scored on a ground out...then shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings before being removed for a pinch hitter in the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles last Wednesday...allowed a RBI single to Bourjos in the second inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth...allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth on back-to-back home runs by Hunter and Callaspo and a RBI double by Willits...it was the second time in his career he allowed back-to-back home runs (Aug. 30, 2010 at New York).

CAHILL vs. NEW YORK: Is 0-2 with a 12.60 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 14 r, 14 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the first loss came in a 6-1 decision in Oakland on July 6, snapping his career best seven-game winning streak...retired each of the first six batters he faced before allowing five runs in the third inning...Granderson scored on a Jeter fielders choice before Rodriguez hit a grand slam...also allowed a solo home run to Rodriguez in the sixth...also lost in the A's 11-5 loss at New York August 30...allowed a career-high-tying eight runs in 4.0 innings, but it was the first time all eight runs were earned...Swisher had a two-run double in the Yankees three-run first, Teixeira and Cano hit back-to-back home runs in the third and Pena had a RBI in the fourth...was also charged with two runs in the fifth.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (3-4, 2.84 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12<sup>th</sup> start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win at Los Angeles last Thursday (8.0 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 4 so)...the win snapped a three-game losing streak and he is now 1-3 with a 3.99 ERA, 16 walks and four home runs allowed over his last six starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip)...has allowed just four home runs in 73.0 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the American League...has the fifth lowest run support in the AL (2.71)...ranks second in the AL with five pickoffs...is 0-3 with a 4.68 ERA (25.0 ip, 32 h, 16 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 19 so, 4 hr) in four career starts against New York...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 4-3 loss at New York September 1 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

First Hitters: 0-1 (0 bb) Made his season debut yesterday after being reinstated from the disabled list and did not allow a run in one inning...it was his first appearance since September 17 of last season at Minnesota...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.

Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento May 20 and did not allow a run in four appearances (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hb).

Save/Opportunities: 0-0

- Has converted each of his three save opportunities and has a 1.29 ERA in six career appearances against the Yankees (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr).
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).


**GONZALEZ vs. NEW YORK:** Is 1-2 with a 6.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...including 0-2 with a 10.80 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year...the first loss came in a 7-3 decision in Oakland on April 20...allowed three runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Posada and a two-run single by Swisher but then retired 11 of the next 12 batters before walking Johnson and Teixeira with one out in the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with the A's trailing 3-0 and Breslow allowed a three-run home run to the first batter he faced, Rodriguez...also lost in a 6-2 decision on July 7 in Oakland...walked five batters and allowed eight hits in just 4.0 innings...allowed four hits and two over the first three innings but did not allow a run...then yielded five runs in the forth inning on RBI singles by Pena and Jeter and a three-run home run by Teixeira...the win came in the A's 6-4 victory at New York July 25, 2009...blanked the Yankees on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and allowed his only run in the sixth inning when a Jeter walk was followed by a Gardner triple.

**COMEBACK:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles May 23...walked Izturis to start the game and, after an Aybar sacrifice, Abreu had a RBI single...that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was relieved by Fuentes to start the eighth inning with the score tied at 1-1.
