2010 HIGHLIGHTS

- Batted a combined .206 with 0 HR and 5 RBI in 45 games between Cincinnati and Milwaukee
- Made 23 starts (17g in CF, 3g in LF, 3g in RF)
- Began the season on the Reds' Opening Day roster before landing on the 15-day disabled list on 4/30.....was transferred to the 60-day DL on 5/29
- Underwent surgery on 5/3 to remove the broken hook of the hamate bone in his right hand, along with a procedure to clean out his right wrist
- Appeared in 13 games at Triple-A Louisville from 7/16-8/3 while on rehab assignment
- Was reinstated from the disabled list on 8/9 and traded to Milwaukee the same day in exchange for OF Jim Edmonds
- Batted .205 (9-for-44) without an RBI in 20 games with the Reds
- Made 10 starts with Cincinnati (6g in CF, 3g in LF, 1g in RF)
- Batted .208 (11-for-53) with 5 RBI in 25 games with the Brewers
- Made 13 starts with Milwaukee (11g in CF, 2g in RF)
- Played in his first 3 games with the Brewers as #11.....switched to #7 on 8/13
- His first Major League ejection came in Trevor Hoffman's 600th save game on 9/7 vs. St. Louis for arguing balls and strikes with umpire Bob Davidson
- Was nominated for the 2010 Branch Rickey Award for his humanitarian efforts

- Graduated from Notre Dame (CA) High School
- Attended the University of Nevada-Reno

- While playing in Cincinnati was active in the Reds Rookie League, a character-building baseball league for kids, and the Cincinnati Public Library reading program

DID YOU KNOW.....

Each of Chris Dickerson's first 6 hits in the Major Leagues went for extra bases (4 doubles, triple, home run).....Dickerson enters the 2011 season as one of just three active players whose first 6 hits in the majors were extra-base hits.....the other active players to accomplish this feat are Carlos Quentin (6h, 2006) and Carlos Gonzalez (7h, 2008).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2009

- Batted .275 with 2 HR, 15 RBI and 11 stolen bases in 97 games with Cincinnati
- Made 59 starts (27g in LF, 19g in CF, 13g in RF)
- Had stints on the 15-day disabled list from 7/27-8/10 with a bruised right rotator cuff and from 8/25-9/29 with a sprained left ankle
- Appeared in 4 games at Triple-A Louisville from 8/6-8/9 while on rehab assignment

2008

- Spent most of the season at Triple-A Louisville, where he batted .287 with 11 HR, 53 RBI and 26 stolen bases in 97 games
- Was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month for July after batting .326 (30-for-92) with 8 HR, 20 RBI and 7 stolen bases
- Was recalled by Cincinnati on 8/12, replacing Adam Dunn (traded)
- Batted .304 with 6 HR, 15 RBI and 5 stolen bases in 31 games with the Reds
- Made 25 starts (19g in LF, 6g in CF).....batted leadoff in each start
- From 8/12-9/6 started 22 of the Reds' 23 games.....made just 3 starts after 9/6 and made his last appearance of the season on 9/18 after suffering a stress fracture in his left ankle
- Underwent surgery on 9/26 to remove a piece of bone related to the stress fracture.....surgery was performed by Dr. Timothy Kremchek
- Made his Major League debut on 8/12 at Pittsburgh as he started in left field and went 1-for-4 with a run, double, walk and a stolen base.....his first career hit was a double off Jeff Karstens
- His first 6 hits went for extra bases (4 doubles, triple, home run)
- Belted his first career home run on 8/15 vs. St. Louis with a leadoff shot off Brad Thompson
- Also hit a leadoff homer on 9/2 vs. Pittsburgh (off Ian Snell)
- Had his best game as a Major Leaguer on 8/29 vs. San Francisco as he went 3-for-5 with 3R, a double, home run, 4 RBI and a stolen base in the Reds' 11-7 win

2007

- Batted .263 with 14 HR, 55 RBI and 30 stolen bases in 134 games between Double-A Chattanooga and Triple-A Louisville
- His 30 stolen bases led all Reds minor leaguers
- Began the season at Chattanooga, where he batted .272 with 1 HR, 11 RBI and 7 stolen bases in 30 games
- Went 5-for-5 with a double and a stolen base on Opening Day with Chattanooga (4/5 at Mobile)
- Was promoted to Louisville on 5/7 and batted .260 with 13 HR, 44 RBI and 23 stolen bases in 104 games
- Hit for the cycle on 7/26 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 4-for-6 with 3R and 5 RBI
- Was named fastest baserunner and best athlete in the Reds organization according to *Baseball America*
- Following the season played in the Arizona Fall League for the Surprise Rafters (.259, 4hr, 15rbi, 5sb)

- Spent the entire season at Double-A Chattanooga, where he batted .242 with 12 HR, 48 RBI and 21 stolen bases in 115 games

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has gone 32-22 with a 3.39 ERA (178ER/472.1IP) in 102 minor league games, including 88 starts...has worked as a starter in every professional season, making no more than five relief appearances in any season.
- In his career as a starter, has gone 28-22 with a 3.39 ERA (166ER/440.2IP) in 88 games...as a reliever, he is 4-0 with a 3.46 ERA (12ER/31.2IP) in 14 appearances.
- For the third straight season, named an All-Star in 2010, this time in the Double A Eastern League...was 7-4 with a 3.97 ERA (42ER/95.1IP) in the first half to earn midseason honors.
- Led all Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts (130) in 2009 while being named to the Florida State League Postseason All-Star team.
- Named a South Atlantic League Midseason All-Star in 2008 after posting a 6-2 record with a 1.89 ERA (13ER/62IP) in 15 first-half games, including 10 starts.

MINOR LEAGUES:

2010: Posted a 12-5 record and a 3.61 ERA (62ER/154.2IP) in a combined 29 appearances (27 starts) at Double A Trenton and Triple A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...began the year at Trenton, where he went 10-4 with a 3.43 ERA in 23 games, 22 starts...named an Eastern League All-Star after going 7-4 with a 3.97 ERA (42ER/95.1IP) in the first half...in his final five starts at the Double A level, went 3-0 with a 1.72 ERA (6ER/31.1IP) earning him a promotion to Scranton on Aug. 10...earned EL Pitcher of the Week during that run for the week of July 26...made six appearances, five starts, for Scranton to end his campaign, posting a 2-1 record and a 4.24 ERA (16ER/34IP)...**2009:** Combined to go 12-8 with a 3.14 ERA in 28 appearances (26 starts) with Class A Tampa and Double A Trenton...led all Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts (130) and tied for second in wins...began the season with Tampa, going 11-5 with a 2.58 ERA in 20 appearances (18 starts)...did not allow an earned run over four consecutive starts from June 15-July 3 (21.1IP)...was named to the FSL postseason All-Star team...was promoted to Trenton on July 31 and went 1-3 with a 4.47 ERA in eight starts...**2008:** Went 7-9 with a 3.52 ERA in 28 appearances (23 starts) with Class A Charleston...began the season as a reliever, going 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA in five appearances...had a 34.2-inning scoreless stretch from May 6-June 1...during the six-start stretch, allowed just 12 hits and 13 walks, while striking out 28 batters...was named to the SAL midseason All-Star team...**2007:** Appeared in eight games (six starts) with the GCL Yankees, posting a 4.61 ERA with no decisions...did not begin the season until July 26 as he began rehabilitation from an elbow injury...**2006:** Missed the entire season while on the disabled list with a right elbow injury...**2005:** In first professional season, posted a 1-0 record with a 2.33 ERA in nine games (six starts) with short-season Class A Staten Island before being placed on the disabled list on Aug. 26 with tendinitis in his right elbow.

Astros NOTES

- Graduated from Kingwood High School, a suburb of Houston, where he was named to the Texas High School Baseball Coaches Association All-State Team as a senior outfielder in 2002.
- Attended Rice University in Houston, and was a member of the 2004 College World Series team...in his senior season in 2005, posted a 5-3 record and a 3.69 ERA...drafted by New York (AL) in the fourth round of the June 2005 draft.
- While with Rice, played in the annual Houston College Classic Baseball Tournament held every March at Minute Maid Park...named to the HCC's All-Tournament Team two consecutive seasons from 2004-05, both times as an outfielder.
- Added to the Astros 40-man roster after being drafted in the 2010 Major League portion of the Rule 5 Draft...if he does not make the Astros 25-man roster following Spring Training, he must be offered back to New York.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has spent parts of eight seasons in the big leagues with San Diego (2003-04) and Houston (2005-10)...owns a .232 (189x813) career average with 69 RBI in 300 career games.
- Has a .992 career fielding pct. as catcher...has thrown out 42 of 133 attempted base stealers (68.4 stolen base pct.)...has picked off 11 baserunners in his career.
- Named a Southern League All-Star in 2003 while with Double A Mobile after hitting .298 (115x386) with three home runs and 52 RBI.
- Garnered a spot on the Midwest League All-Star team in 2001 while with the White Sox Class A Kannapolis affiliate.
- Named the top defensive catcher in the Midwest League in 2000 by a *Baseball America* survey of league managers...the same publication also named him the top defensive catcher in Chicago's organization...gunned down a league-leading 41 percent (39-of-93) of would-be basestealers...his defensive prowess earned him a reserve spot on the Midwest League All-Star team.

Astros NOTES

- Name is pronounced "hum-BEAR-toe" "kin-TEAR-o."
- A native of Venezuela, Quintero signed with Chicago (AL) as a 17-year-old, non-drafted free agent on Jan. 16, 1997...signed by White Sox scouts Mike Sgobba and Hector Rincones.
- Quintero and LHP Wandy Rodriguez are the longest-tenured Astros, having both made appearances for Houston in the 2005 season.
- Avoided his third year of arbitration by signing a one-year contract that runs through the 2011 season on Nov. 30, 2010...has one remaining year of arbitration eligibility.

2010: Hit .234 (62x265) with four home runs and 20 RBI while spending the entire season with the Major League club...set career highs in games (88), at-bats (265), hits, doubles (10) and RBI...posted a .992 fielding percentage in 87 games, 74 starts, behind the plate...caught 16-of-51 attempting base stealers and recorded a Major League-high seven catcher pickoffs...according to Elias, over the last 20 years, the only other Astros catcher with four-or-more pickoffs was Brad Ausmus (4 PO's) in 2001...the club went 15-4 over his final 19 starts of the season, beginning on Aug. 19...overall the team went 41-33 in his
