A's vs. YANKEES

The A's lost the first game of 2011 yesterday and now have an eight-game losing streak against the Yankees...that matches Oakland's longest losing streak ever against New York (fourth time)...the last time the Athletics lost more than eight straight to the Yankees was from Aug. 6, 1964-April 18, 1965 when the Kansas City A's lost nine in a row...Oakland lost the season series last year 1-9 and have dropped 12 of their last 13 games to New York, including eight of the last nine in Oakland...the 1-9 mark last year was the worst in Oakland history against the Yankees and it matched the Athletics worst ever (2-18 in 1919)...have lost eight consecutive series, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive series lost to any team (see chart above)...have lost each of the last three season series and are 4-22 (.154) against New York since 2008, which is the worst mark by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 218-256 against the Yankees...that includes 120-116 in Oakland and 98-140 in New York...all-time, the A's are 759-1122 against the Yankees/Orioles.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1987 rookie Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...in 2002 the A's win the longest nine-inning game in Oakland history, defeating Tampa Bay 13-9 in 4 hours and 15 minutes...in 2006 Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high four-game winning streak snapped yesterday...have now won five of the last seven games on the heels of a season-high six-game losing streak (May 18-23)...are in fourth place in the American League West for the eighth time in the last nine days...were tied for first May 17 and despite losing eight of 13 games since then, have lost just 2½ games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 12 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...swept a three-game series from Baltimore to start the homestand, the A's first three-game series sweep of the season (swept a two-game series from Los Angeles, May 16-17).

SHUTOUT: The A's were shutout by the Yankees yesterday, 5-0...it was the sixth time the A's have been shutout this year, which is tied for second most in the American League...it marked the A's second consecutive shutout loss to New York as the A's were one-hit at Yankee Stadium Sept. 2, 2010...the A's now have a 22-inning scoreless streak against New York.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or fewer in each of the 28 games in May for a 2.59 ERA (51 er in 177.1 ip)...that is the A's longest streak of consecutive games with four runs or fewer since Oct. 4, 1980-May 9, 1981 when they went 32 consecutive games...have a **Major League-leading** 2.67 ERA (104 er in 350.0 ip) for the season, which is more than one-half run better than the next closest team (San Francisco, 3.23)...have allowed just three home runs in the last 15 games and 19 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.336), rank third in innings pitched (350.0) and most walks (115) and fourth in strikeouts (255).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** with a 2.88 ERA, which more than one-half run better than the next American League team (Seattle, 3.41)...the last time the A's finished with an ERA under 3.00 was in 1974 (2.95)...have allowed just 30 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 28)...are on pace to yield 88 and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.336), rank second in batting average (.242) and are fourth in on-base percentage (.311)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...allowed a season-high four steals last night but opponents have been successful in just 30 of 52 (57.7%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 22 caught stealings top the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (83 for 306) over the last nine games but are hitting .240 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.350) and the third fewest runs scored (197) and strikeouts (329)...have six home runs over the last nine games but have 30 for the season, which is tied with Minnesota for second fewest in the AL (Seattle, 28)...are on pace to hit just 88 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 40 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 34)...have turned 10 double plays in the last five games and now have 62 for the season, which is second most in the AL.

IN MAY: The A's are 14-14 (.500) in the month of May...had a winning record in May last year (16-12) but have finished with a losing record in the month in four of the previous six seasons...rank second in the American League this month with a 2.96 ERA (84 er in 255.0 ip) and have not finished May with an ERA under 3.33 since recording a 2.43 ERA in 1990...posted a 2.79 ERA in April this year...since 1990, the only time the A's have compiled an ERA under 3.00 in back-to-back months was in July (2.81) and August (2.87) of 2001...have allowed a Major League low 13 home runs this month...the last time the A's yielded fewer than 14 home runs in a month of 12 or more games was in June, 1989 when they allowed 10.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-1)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and are 14-13 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...begin a 10-game road trip to Boston (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games) on Friday...the A's are batting .254 (231 for 910) with 109 runs scored in 27 home games (4.04 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off that began May 13 and concludes tomorrow...all 20 games will be played in California...have an 8-10 record in this stretch but have outscored the opposition 68-64...the offense is batting .255 (156 for 611) and the pitching staff has a 3.15 ERA (57 er in 162.2 ip)...that includes 2.63 (32 er in 109.1 ip) by the starters and 4.22 (25 er in 53.1 ip) by the relievers.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-9 (.591) record in day games and are 14-19 (.424) at night...have the fourth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 10-19)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 17-23 (.425) against right-handed starters.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the seven losses are second most to the Angels (8)...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...are 7-13 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignments this year and are 27-33 (.450) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in five of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start to snap his losing streak at three games...is now 1-3 with a 3.99 ERA (17 er in 38.1 ip), 16 walks and four home runs allowed over his last six starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just four home runs in 73.0 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the American League...all four of the home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters...has surrendered 10 home runs over the last two seasons, all against right-handed hitters...has not allowed a home run to a left-hander since August 25, 2009 at Seattle (Branyan)...three of his home runs this year have come at home as have eight of his 10 over the last two years.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .188 (12 for 64) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .174 (15 for 86) average the first time through the lineup, .222 (20 for 90) the second time through the order and .326 (31 for 95) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...is 0-4 in those seven starts and is 3-0 in three starts with run support of three or more...has the third lowest run support in the American League with a mark of 2.71 (22 rs in 73.0 ip)...is now 2-19 in 32 career starts with two runs or support or fewer and 19-2 with at least three runs of support.

ON THE BASES: Ranks second in the majors with five pickoffs (Shields, TB 6)...that is already a career-high as he had four in each of his previous two seasons...opponents have been caught stealing six times this year, which is tied for the Major League lead (Lester, BOS), and have a stolen base percentage of 33.3% (3 sb), which is tied for sixth lowest in the American League.

THE FIRST FOUR INNINGS: Has a 1.43 ERA (7 er in 44.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 4.97 (16 er in 29.0 ip) after that...has not allowed a run in the second inning.

2011 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle **April 2** in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings before Cust had a RBI single in the sixth...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning with the score tied at 1-1...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota **April 8**...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...the only runs scored on back-to-back singles by Span and Mauer in the eighth...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Chicago **April 13**...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...allowed an unearned run in the fifth and two more in the sixth...earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston **April 19**...allowed only four hits and one walk while recording a season-high eight strikeouts...gave up one hit over the first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...struck out Cameron as Ellsbury was caught stealing before striking out McDonald to end the threat...was relieved by Breslow to start the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory at Seattle **April 24**...allowed only two runs, one earned, over seven innings...the earned run came in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...following a Kouzmanoff error in the seventh, Saunders scored on a Langerhans ground out to account for the other run...was replaced by Balfour to start the eighth inning...took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas **April 30**...surrendered a career-high-tying seven earned runs in 5.0 innings, allowing one run in the first, two in the third and four in the fifth...allowed a career-high-tying four walks after walking only four batters over his first five starts...also allowed a career-high-tying three home runs (also April 22, 2009 at NYY)...his home run allowed to Young in the third inning came after going 36.2 innings without allowing a home run to open the season...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 12 innings to Cleveland **May 5** in Oakland...tossed a career-high-tying 9.0 innings (also July 6, 2009 at Boston)...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Hafner singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Cabrera in the sixth inning...the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the eighth and he left after tossing 114 pitches in nine innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas **May 10**...issued a career-high-tying four walks in just 4.2 innings...held the Rangers scoreless over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth inning on a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Gentry RBI single...then allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the fifth inning and was relieved by Purcey with two outs...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles **May 16** in Oakland...issued a career-high-tying four walks for the second consecutive start, third time this year and fifth time in his career...blanked the Angels on four hits over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a fielders choice and a Trumbo sacrifice fly...was relieved by Wuertz with a 3-2 lead, two outs and a runner on first in the seventh inning but Wuertz allowed a two-run single to Kendrick for the blown save...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-0 loss at San Francisco **May 21**...walked Torres to start the game and he went to third on a Sanchez double before scoring on a Posey ground out...then shutout the Giants on four hits over the next four innings...pitched just 5.0 innings as he was removed for a pinch hitter in the top of the sixth...Lincecum shutout the A's on three hits.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at Los Angeles last Thursday...tossed 8.0 shutout inning and allowed just three hits while walking three...retired each of the first 10 batters before Aybar singled with one out in the fourth...was relieved by Balfour after to start the bottom of the ninth with the A's leading 4-0 and he allowed three runs.

ANDERSON vs. NEW YORK: Is 0-3 with a 4.68 ERA (25.0 ip, 32 h, 16 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 19 so, 4 hr) in four career starts...is 0-2 with a 5.00 ERA (10 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts at New York and 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 4-3 loss at New York September 1...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings but only one run was earned...Teixeira had a RBI double in the first but the Yankees scored three unearned runs in the second...the first scored on his own throwing error and he also yielded a two-run single to Teixeira...went 0-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three starts in 2009.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-2, 2.17 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA...is 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts...ranks second in the AL in strikeouts per nine innings (9.10) but is eighth in most walks (28)...opponents are 0 for 19 with runners in scoring position over his last four starts and they are batting .091 (4 for 44) for the season...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-2 A's win over Baltimore last Friday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 7 so)...is 1-2 with a 6.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against New York.

The A's bullpen has allowed one run in 13.1 innings (0.68 ERA) over its past four games after allowing 23 runs in 26.0 innings (7.96 ERA) over its previous eight games...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.38 ERA overall...has been charged with 12 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...is 13 for 19 (68.4%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...the six blown saves are tied for fourth fewest and the save opportunities are tied for sixth most...has recorded the save in two of the past three games after converting no saves in one opportunity over its previous 11 games...is tied for third in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.312) and is fourth in batting average (.233) and slugging (.337).

- Made his season debut Sunday after being reinstated from the disabled list and did not allow a run in one inning...it was his first appearance since September 17 of last season at Minnesota...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento May 20 and did not allow a run in four appearances (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hb).
- Has converted each of his three save opportunities and has a 1.29 ERA in six career appearances against the Yankees (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr).
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.

- Has allowed five runs in 4.0 innings (11.25 ERA) over his past four appearances, which has raised his ERA from 1.31 to 2.92 (8 er in 24.2 ip)...however, has not allowed a run in 21 of 25 appearances this season.
- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) in 13 appearances at home compared to a 6.10 ERA (7 er in 10.1 ip) in 12 appearances on the road...has a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in 14 appearances at night and a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) in 11 games during the day.
