June 1, 1925: Lou Gehrig begins his record streak of 2,130 consecutive games played, pinch-hitting for "Pee Wee" Wanninger in a 5-3 loss to Washington at Yankee Stadium.

June 2, 1925: In an 8-5 win over Washington at Yankee Stadium, Lou Gehrig plays in the second game of his 2,130-game streak. After pinch-hitting in the streak's first game on June 1, he starts today's contest, replacing Wally Pipp in the lineup.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the second game of a three-game series tonight at Oakland...is the second stop of a nine-game, 10-day road trip also including series in Seattle (1-2 last Friday-Sunday) and Los Angeles-AL (Friday-Sunday)...is their first of two West Coast trips this season, and matches their longest road trip of the season (also nine games in 10 days from 9/9-18 (at Los Angeles-AL, Seattle and Toronto).

- ** At 29-23 (.558), are percentage points ahead of Boston (30-24, .556) for first place in the AL East...have been in first, or had at least a share of first place for 39 of the first 61 days this season...own the AL's second-best winning pct. (Cleveland, 31-20, .608).
- 🕅 Have won nine of their last 13 games...comes on the heels of their season-high six-game losing streak (5/11-16).
- ** The Yankees' 22 road games played is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the Majors this season...are tied with Texas (30) for the second-most home games played in the Majors in 2011 behind Kansas City (31).
- ** Thursday's off day ended a stretch of 16 games in 16 days for the Yankees (went 8-8), and a longer stretch of 32 games in 33 days (went 17-15).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won their second straight game and recorded their first shutout of the season, defeating Oakland, 5-0 at Overstock.com Coliseum...stole a season-high four bases...**RHP Bartolo Colon** tossed a 9.0IP-complete game shutout (4H, 0BB, 6K), his first shutout and complete game since 7/5/06 w/ Los Angeles-AL at Seattle...**1B Mark Teixeira** (1-for-4) hit a two-run HR in the first...has 4HR in his last five games and has driven in a run in six straight games...**2B Robinson Cano** (2-for-4) had an RBI double in the first and a triple in the eighth...**SS Derek Jeter** (1-for-3) had a sacrifice fly in the seventh, snapping a six-game RBI drought...**C Francisco Cervelli** (1-for-2) had a career-high 2SB and drove in a run in the ninth on a sacrifice fly.

ROCK OF AGES: RHP Bartolo Colon tossed a 9.0IP complete-game shutout in Monday's 5-0 win at Oakland at age 38 yrs., 6 days...is one of just five Yankees as old or older to toss a complete game win in the last 25 years, joining Roger Clemens, Tommy John, Randy Johnson and David Wells...was his ninth career shutout and 32nd career complete game, his first of each since 7/5/06 w/ Los Angeles-AL at Seattle.

18 Has not walked any of his 69 leadoff hitters faced the year, the best mark in the AL this season.

HE TAKES AND HE TAKES: C Francisco Cervelli had 2SB in Monday's win at Oakland after having just one prior stolen base in his entire career (7/17/10 vs. Tampa Bay).

ON THE MARK: **1B Mark Teixeira** has hit safely in each of his last seven games, batting .310 (9-for-29) over the stretch...<u>has homered in four of his last five games (4HR) and seven of his last 11 contests (7HR)</u>...has scored 10R in his last 12 games...his 10HR in May are the third-most in the Majors (Jay Bruce-12, Jose Bautista-11)...11 of his 16HR this season have come with men on base, and 11 of his 16HR have come over the first three innings.

★ Has had at least one RBI in six consecutive games, tying for the second-longest such streak of his career...with 1RBI tonight, would tie his career best streak from 9/21-28/07 w/ Atlanta (7G).

1961 REVISITED: **1B Mark Teixeira** (15HR) and **CF Curtis Granderson** (16HR) became the first Yankees teammates to each hit at least 15 homers in the team's first 50 games of a season since Mickey Mantle and Roger Maris did it in 1961, according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...overall, are the fourth set of Yankees teammates to accomplish the feat: also Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (1928 and '30) and Yogi Berra and Mickey Mantle (1956).

HOMER HAPPY: The Yankees lead the Majors in home runs (80) and multi-home run games (24) this season...have homered in 41 of the team's 52 games in 2011...have scored a Major League-high 49.4 percent of their runs via HR (269 total runs, 133 via HR).

- M According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Yankees' total of 78HR through their first 50 games was their second-highest total in franchise history through their first 50 games of a season behind 2009 (80HR).
- ★ The Yankees have three players with double-digit home runs in 2011 (Granderson-16, Teixeira-16 and Cano-10).

FROM THE TOP: SS Derek Jeter is batting .375 (27-for-72) with 3 doubles, 2HR, 6BB and a .430 OBP *leading off innings in 2011*.

M Has reached base safely to lead off the first inning in 20 of the 41 games he has started at the top of the order this season (15H, 4BB, 1HP).

UNDER THE SUN: The Yankees are 13-3 (.813) in day games this season, marking the best record in the Majors in day games in 2011…lead the Majors with 6.63 runs per day game (106R/16G).

SPEED DEMON: SS Derek Jeter established a franchise record with his 327th career stolen base in Saturday's loss at Seattle, surpassing Rickey Henderson (326SB in four-and-a-half seasons with the Yankees) for the most steals in franchise history...according to Elias, is one of three players who are the franchise leaders in SB *for their current team*: Ichiro Suzuki (w/Seattle) and Jose Reves (w/the Mets)

HOMETOWN HERO: LHP CC Sabathia will throw out the ceremonial first pitch as part

of the North Vallejo Little League Spring Classic on Wednesday...Sabathia underwrote the rebuilding of North Vallejo Little League's Thurmon Field – the field he played on as a youth – through his PitCCh In Foundation.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Yankees pitchers have allowed opposing No. 1 hitters to hit a Major League-low .181 (41-for-226) with a .241 OBP (lowest in Majors) in 2011.

THIS DAY IN JOLTIN' JOE'S STREAK: This year marks the 70th anniversary of Joe DiMaggio's all-time Major League-best 56-game hitting streak...on this day in 1941 (5/31), the Yankees did not play and his streak remained at 16 games...on 6/1/41 the Yankees played a doubleheader at Cleveland... in the 17th game of his streak (Game 1), he went 1-for-4 with a single in a 2-0 win...in the 18th game of his streak (Game 2), he went 1-for-4 with a single in a 5-3 Yankees win...hit .408 (91-for-223) with 56R, 56 singles, 16 doubles, 4 triples, 15HR, 55RBI and 21BB as the Yankees went 41-13 with 2 ties over the record-setting stretch from 5/15-7/16/41...the team was off the next day (5/31/41).

ALEXCELLENT: 3B Alex Rodriguez had his season-high nine-game hitting streak snapped in Monday's win at Oakland...is batting .357 (20-for-56) with 9R, 1 double, 3HR, 5RBI, 3BB and five multi-hit contests in his last 13 games.

COUNT TO 10: 2B Robinson Cano hit his 10th HR of the season in Saturday's at Seattle, marking seven straight seasons with at least 10HR to begin his Major League career...according to ESPN Stats, joins the Yankees Joe Gordon (11 straight, 1938-50) as the only second basemen (played 50% of games at 2B) all time to accomplish the feat.

MILESTONE WATCH: SS Derek Jeter has 2,981 career hits and needs 4H to tie Sam Rice (2,985) for 28th place on Baseball's all-time list...needs 19H to become the 28th player in Baseball history to reach 3,000H...has 1,715R and needs 5R to tie Willie Keeler for 22nd place on Baseball's all-time...3B Alex Rodriguez has 1,858 career RBI and needs 6RBI to tie Mel Ott (1,864) for ninth on Baseball's all-time list...has 622 career HR and needs 8HR to tie Ken Griffey Jr. (630) for fifth all-time...has 1,787 career runs and needs 12R to tie Ted Williams (1,799) for 16th place all time.

GRAND PLANS: CF Curtis Granderson is tied for second in the Majors with 16HR (Jose Bautista-20, Mark Teixeira-16)...has 30HR since 8/14/10, marking the second-most HR in the Majors over the span (Bautista-38)...did not hit his 16th HR in 2010 until 9/2/10 vs. Oakland in his 109th game (when he also hit No. 17)...is averaging 1HR per 12.44AB in 2011, the third-best ratio in the Majors (Bautista-1HR/8.15AB, Teixeira-1HR/12.13AB).

- 🗯 Hit his Major League-leading eighth HR off LHP this season in 5/21 win vs. the Mets...no other LH batter has more than 5HR off LHP in 2011...has hit the 8HR in just 57AB off LHP in 2011, surpassing his previous career best of 5HR vs. LHP in 2008 (in 147AB)...had 4HR in 158AB off lefties in 2010.
- 👭 Has 29RBI and scored 32 runs in 34 games while batting in the No. 2 spot in the lineup this season...since moving permanently into the No. 2 spot in the lineup on 5/6, has hit .292 (28-for-96) with 24R, 8HR, 19RBI, 12BB and a .376 on-base percentage...leads the Majors in runs scored over the stretch, is tied third in home runs and is tied for sixth in RBI.
- Scored a run in eight consecutive games from 5/21-29, matching his career high streak (also 8/27-9/4/08 w/Detroit).

GAME RESET: Please note the Yankees-Twins game postponed on 4/6, will be made up on Monday, 9/19 at 1:05 p.m. at Yankee Stadium.

ACE IN THE HOLE: LHP CC Sabathia has won his last three starts and is 6-2 with a 3.17ERA (59.2IP, 21ER) over his last eight starts...has tossed at least 8.0IP in each of his last three starts, matching his longest such stretch as a Yankee – also 6/20-7/1/10.

M According to the Elias Sports Bureau, with Sunday's win at Seattle, has won each of his four starts in which the Yankees were in danger of being swept in a series: also 8/2/09 at Chicago-AL, 9/13/09 vs. Baltimore and 7/1/10 vs. Seattle.

SKIPPING AHEAD: Manager Joe Girardi recorded his 314th career win as Yankees manager on Wednesday vs. Toronto, surpassing Buck Showalter (313) for sole possession of eighth place on the franchise's all-time managerial wins list...next up is Clark Griffith with 419 career wins as Yankees manager.

PEN-MANSHIP: RHP Lance Pendleton has not allowed a run in his first 8.1 career IP (six games), holding opponents to a .167 batting average (5-for-30)...is the fourth-longest scoreless stretch by a Yankee to begin his Major League career over the last 15 years (since 1996) behind Joba Chamberlain (15.1IP, 8/7-9/12/07), Matt Smith (12.0IP, 4/14-7/3/06) and Phil Coke (11.2IP, 9/1-23/08).

TRIPLING THEIR PLEASURE: The Yankees have hit 13 triples this season, tied for third-most among AL teams...six different Yankees have recorded at least one triple (Cano-2, Chavez-1, Gardner-3, Granderson-5, Jeter-1 and Nunez-1)...CF Curtis Granderson's 56 triples are the most in the Majors over the last five years (since 2007).

FRONTRUNNERS: The Yankees have outscored their opposition 80-44 over the first two innings this season (42-16 in the first inning and 38-28 in the second)...have scored the game's first run in 32 of their 52 contests this season.

MO-LLENIUM: RHP Mariano Rivera, pitched in his 1,000th career game in Wednesday's win vs. Toronto, becoming the 15th pitcher all time to reach the 1,000-appearance plateau...no pitcher has appeared in more games for a single team in Baseball history (now has appeared in 1,001G)...is one game shy of tying Goose Gossage (1,002) for 14th place on Baseball's all-time games pitched list.

HOUDINI: RHP David Robertson has allowed an earned run in just two of his 24 appearances this season...has struck out a batter in all but three outings...opponents are just 5-for-41 (.122) with runners in scoring position against Robertson...has held opponents to 1H in 8AB with 7K with the bases loaded this season...has stranded 17 of his 23 inherited runners in 2011.

🕅 Visited his hometown of Tuscaloosa, Ala., on Thursday's off day, touring the tornado-ravaged area...he and his wife, Erin, have established the David and Erin Robertson Foundation to raise funds to donate to the relief efforts in his hometown (www.highsocksforhope.com)...David will donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season.

RHP Freddy Garcia, 34, will make his ninth start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...will be his 22nd career start against the Athletics...last started on 5/25 vs. Toronto, recording the win in a 7-3 Yankees victory (6.1IP, 8H, 3ER, 0BB, 4K)...marked his first win in four starts against an AL east opponent this season...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 2/10/11...was signed to a Major League contract and selected to the roster on 3/30/11...bio can be found on page 417 of the Yankees' Media Guide.

300: Is making his 300th career start in the American League tonight...will become the fifth active pitcher to reach the plateau, joining Tim Wakefield, Mark Buehrle and teammates CC Sabathia and Bartolo Colon.

TAKING THE FIRST: Has yet to allow a run in the first inning this season, and owns a 0.56 combined ERA (16.0IP, 1ER) over the first two innings...opponents are batting just .212 (14-for-66) their first time through the lineup.

WESTWARD BOUND: Is 33-18 with a 3.92 ERA in 78 career starts against the AL West...since 2006, has lost just once in his last 17 starts against AL West opponents (7/24/10 w/Chicago-AL at Oakland), going 10-1 with a 2.83 ERA (105.0IP, 33ER).

BAY AREA BLUES: Has won one of his last nine starts against Oakland, dating back to 6/24/02...owns a 1-4 record with a 5.55 ERA (48/.4IP, 30ER) vs. the A's over the stretch, which includes his shortest career start (1.1IP, 7/24/10 w/Chicago-AL at Oakland Coliseum) and his most runs allowed in a start (10R on 5/24/02 w/Seattle vs. Oakland).

KEEP AWAY FROM HOME: Opponents are batting .195 (15-for-77, 3HR) against Garcia with runners on base in 2011...<u>are just 6-for-49 (.122)</u>, but with 2HR, with runners in scoring position, and have just 3H in 22AB (.136) with RISP and two outs.

GRAND STANDING: According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Garcia has the most career innings pitched (1979.1) of any active pitcher who has never allowed a grand slam.

BULLPEN LOGS: Made his Yankees debut in 4/10 loss at Boston, tossing 1.0 inning of relief (1ER)...was his second career relief appearance...his only other relief outing came on 8/18/00 w/Seattle at Cleveland, tossing 3.0 scoreless IP (1H, 1BB, 2K) in the Mariners' 9-8 loss.

** Had his first scheduled start of the season rained out on 4/6 vs. Minnesota.

A MAN OF HIS PEOPLE: Among Venezuelan-born pitchers, Garcia currently ranks first all-time in wins (136) and innings pitched (1,979.1), and third in strikeouts (1,426)...pitched for Venezuela in the inaugural World Baseball Classic in 2006, going 1-0 with a 1.23 ERA (7.1IP, 1ER) and 11K in two starts.

*W With his win on 4/16 vs. Texas, became the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to earn a win for the Yankees in franchise history...Gustavo Molina – also a native of Venezuela was the catcher that day.

NO FREEBIES: Has averaged 2.85 BB/9.0IP during his time in the AL, the third-lowest such ratio among all current active AL pitchers...has held his opponent to 2BB or less in 31 of his 36 starts over the last two seasons.

2010 RECAP: Went 12-6 with a 4.64 ERA (157.0IP, 81ER) in 28 starts with the White Sox, making more appearances than he did the prior three seasons combined (23) and marking his most outings in a season since 2006 (33)...held opponents to 3ER or less in 20 of his outings and lost consecutive starts just once (4/10 vs. Minnesota and 4/15 at Toronto)...won six consecutive decisions over an eight-start stretch from 5/28-7/7 (3.25 ERA), tying the second-longest winning streak of his career...missed time from 9/8-27 due to lower back stiffness, suffering the injury in his 9/7 start at Detroit.
