A's vs. YANKEES

The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2011 and now have a nine-game losing streak against the Yankees...that is an Oakland record for longest losing streak against New York and is the longest by an Athletics team since the Kansas City A's lost nine in a row from Aug. 6, 1964-April 18, row from Aug. 6, 1904-April 10, 1965...have not lost more than nine straight since Sept. 13, 1956-July 12, 1957 when they dropped 14 straight...Oakland lost the season series last year 1-9 and have lost 13 of their last 14 games a New York including pine of the to New York, including nine of the last 10 in Oakland...the 1-9 mark last year was the worst in Oakland history against the Yankees and it matched the Athletics worst ever matched the Athletics worst ever (2-18 in 1919)...including this series, have now lost nine consecutive series, which is an Oakland record for consecutive series lost to any team (see chart above)...have lost each of the last three season series and are 4-23 (.148) against New York since 2008, which is the worst mark by an AL team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 218-257 against the Yankees...that includes 120-117 in Oakland and 98-140 in New York...all-time, the A's are 759-1123 against the Yankees/Oriole

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 Reggie Jackson homers in the third inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York to give the A's a home run in 13 consecutive games, what was then a club games, what was then a club record...the A's hit 25 round trippers during the streak, including six by Jackson...in 2006

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning a season-high four consecutive games...are 5-3 over the last eight games but are 5-9 over the last 14 games as the A's had a season-high four game losing streak from May 18-23...finished May with a 14-15 record, the fifth time in the last seven seasons the A's had a losing record in the month...are in fourth place in the American League West for the ninth time in the last 10 days...were tied for first May 17 and despite losing nine of 14 games since then, have lost just 21/2 games in the standings...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 13 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times...swept a three-game series from Baltimore to start the homestand, the A's first three-game series sweep of the season (swept a two-game series from Los Angeles, May 16-17).

STARTING PITCHING: Brett Anderson allowed 10 runs last night, snapping a 28-game streak in which A's starting pitchers allowed four runs or fewer...that was the A's longest such streak since Oct. 4, 1980-May 9, 1981 when they went 32 consecutive games...starters are now 2-2 with a 6.43 ERA (20 er in 28.0 ip) and .287 (31 for 108) opponents batting average on the homestand but have a **Major League-leading** 2.86 ERA (113 er in 355.1 ip) for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (21)...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.342), rank third in innings pitched (355.1) and tied for third in most walks

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a 2.99 ERA and have allowed just 32 home runs, which is second fewest...are on pace to allow 93 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.339) and rank fourth in batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.313)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...have allowed a season-high four steals in each of the last two games but opponents have been successful in just 34 of 57 (59.6%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 23 caught stealings top the maiors

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (92 for 340) over the last 10 games but are hitting .241 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.353) and the third fewest runs scored (200) and strikeouts (335)...have seven home runs over the last 10 games but have 31 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 90 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 41 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...have turned a double play in each of the last 10 games (15 total), which are their most consecutive games with a double play since July 23-Aug. 3, 1999 when they had an 11-game streak...have 63 double plays for the season, which is second most in the AL.

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's conclude their stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off today...are 8-11 over that span but have been outscored just 74-71...the offense is batting .256 (165 for 645) and the pitching staff has a 3.46 ERA (66 er in 171.2 ip)...that includes 3.21 (41 er in 114.2 ip) by the starters and 3.95 (25 er in 57.0 ip) by the relievers...all 20 games were played in California.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-0 vs. Baltimore, 0-2 vs. New York)...the stretch continues with a pair of three-game series at Boston and Baltimore beginning Friday...that will mark just the second time this year the A's travel to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-5 (.500) against the East this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-2)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and are 14-14 at home for the season...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...begin a 10-game road trip to Boston (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games) on Friday...the A's are batting .254 (240 for 944) with 112 runs scored in 28 home games (4.00 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-9 (.591) record in day games and are 14-20 (.412) at night...have the fourth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 10-20)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the AL...are 17-24 (.415) against right-handed starters

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the seven losses are second most to the Angels (8)...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 7-13 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat ... are 7-11 in one-run games ... are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 36-31 (.537) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in eight of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (6 er in 32.1 ip) and .202 (23 for 114) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...all

(twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...all five starts came in May and the ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010)...ranked fourth in the American League in ERA in May, tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.17)...has struck out 63 and walked 28 in 62.1 innings...ranks second in the AL in strikeouts per nine innings (9.10) but is tied for eighth in most walks.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 0 for 19 with runners in scoring position over his last four starts and they are batting .091 (4 for 44) for the season...has not allowed a hit with RISP and two outs (21 at bats)...has yielded a .195 (16 for 82) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .275 (22 for 80) the second time through and .200 (13 for 65) after that...has surrendered four home runs, three of which have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in five of his 10 starts but has support of six runs or more in three of his other starts...has run support of one and zero in his two losses and now has 19 runs of support in his 22 career losses (105.0 ip, 1.63 RSA)...is 25-4 in 42 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

START-BY-START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota April 9...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston *April 20*...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one...however, allowed four runs on eight hits over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 decision at Los Angeles *April 25*...allowed a season-high five runs, four earned, over five innings...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...then threw a scoreless fifth before he was replaced by Purcey after throwing 95 pitches...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory over Texas **May 1** in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and two outs in the seventh and Ziegler allowed one of those runners to score...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas Čity May 6...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win...had his scheduled start **May 11** at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles *May 17* in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...retired each of the first 11 batters before walking Izturis with two outs in the fourth...surrendered his only hit when Kendrick singled to leadoff the fifth...neither base runner advanced past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss May 22 at San Francisco...allowed a RBI double to Freddy Sanchez in the first inning and was also charged with an unearned run in the third inning when Posey scored on a two-out error by LaRoche...Jonathan Sanchez shutout the A's over the first five innings, but Oakland scored once in the sixth and twice in the seventh to take a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh but Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save.

LAST START: Had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore last Friday in Oakland...struck out the side in the first inning but then allowed back-to-back singles followed by back-to-back walks to start the second inning...Reynolds walked with the bases loaded to force in a run...also allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning and was relieved by Ziegler after allowing a one out single to start the sixth...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win

GONZALEZ vs. NEW YORK: Is 1-2 with a 6.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 11 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...including 0-2 with a 10.80 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year...the first loss came in a 7-3 decision in Oakland on April 20...allowed three runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Posada and a two-run single by Swisher but then retired 11 of the next 12 batters before walking Johnson and Teixeira with one out in the fifth...was relieved by Breslow with the A's trailing 3-0 and Breslow allowed a three-run home run to the first batter he faced, Rodriguez...also lost in a 6-2 decision on July 7 in Oakland...walked five batters and allowed eight hits in just 4.0 innings...allowed four hits and two over the first three innings but did not allow a run...then yielded five runs in the fourth inning on RBI singles by Pena and Jeter and a three-run home run by Teixeira...the win came in the A's 6-4 victory at New York July 25, 2009...blanked the Yankees on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and allowed his only run in the sixth inning when a Jeter walk was followed by a Gardner triple.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Josh Outman (1-0, 2.08 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego as he had "Tommy John" surgery June 30 of that year...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over Baltimore last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 2 so)...it was his first Major League win since June 8, 2009 against Minnesota...has never faced Boston in his career...was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts, with Sacramento...went 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA and .306 opponents average over his first four starts and 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .232 opponents average over his final four starts.

- Made his season debut Sunday after being reinstated from the disabled list and did not allow a run in one inning...it was his first appearance since September 17 of last season at Minnesota...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento May 20 and did not allow a run in four appearances (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hb).
