A's vs. RED SOX

The season series is tied at one game each...went 5-4 against the Red Sox last season, winning the season series for the first time since going 7-3 in 2006...are now 26-23 (.531) against the Red Sox since 2006, which is the best record by any American League team over that span...have swept just three series from Boston over the last 18 years (all in Oakland), most recently May 23-25, 2008...have won 17 of the last 24 games in the Coliseum but have lost 12 of the last 16 at Fenway...are 218-269 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-114 in Oakland, 8154 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 860-1050 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus is batting .323 (21 for 65) over his last 19 games (since May 13) after hitting .217 over his first 32 contests...has not committed an error in 47 games in the outfield and now has a 288-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a run in seven games and 6.2 innings and now has a career-high 16.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to 2008...has now gone 33 games and 33.0 innings without allowing an earned run.

Kurt Suzuki is a .328 (40 for 122) career hitter against Boston, which is his highest average against any American League team...has hit safely in 14 of 15 career games at Fenway Park (21 for 61, .344).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980 trailing 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland, Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs but the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning a season-high four consecutive games...are 5-4 over the last nine games but are 5-10 over the last 15 games as the A's had a season-high six-game losing streak from May 18-23...were tied for first place May 17 and have lost four games in the standings since then and fallen to fourth place, where the A's have spent 11 of the last 12 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 15 days in fourth...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters went 2-3 with a 6.29 ERA (24 er in 34.1 ip) and .273 (36 for 132) opponents batting average in six games on the past homestand but have a **Major League-leading** 2.91 ERA (117 er in 361.2 ip) for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (22)...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.344), rank third in innings pitched (361.2) and third in most walks (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.01 ERA, which is tied with Atlanta for first in the majors...have allowed just 33 home runs, which is second fewest...are on pace to allow 94 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.339) and rank fourth in batting average (.242) and on-base percentage (.312)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 35 of 58 (60.3%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the AL...the 23 caught stealings top the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .240 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.306) and slugging percentage (.353)...are tied for second fewest in runs scored (202) and have the third fewest strikeouts (342)...have eight home runs over the last 11 games but have 32 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 91 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 41 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 34)...had their streak of turning at least one double play in 10 consecutive games (15 total) snapped Wednesday, which was their most consecutive games with a double play since July 23 to August 3, 1999 when they had an 11-game streak...have 63 double plays for the season, which is second most in the AL.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 3-3 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-0 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York)...the stretch continues with a pair of three-game series at Boston and Baltimore beginning today...it marks just the second time this year the A's have traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-6 (.455) against the East this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to Boston (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games) today... went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-15 on the road for the season...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .228 (217 for 953) with 88 runs scored in 28 games on the road (3.14 per game).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-10 (.565) record in day games and are 14-20 (.412) at night...have the fifth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 11-21)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...are 17-25 (.405) against right-handed starters.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-7 in extra-inning games...the 12 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the seven losses are second most to the Angels (8)...the 12 extra-inning games are one more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11 and the season-high is 12...are 7-13 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-11 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire

20 GAMES IN 20 DAYS: The A's concluded their stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off Wednesday...went 8-12 over that span but were only outscored just 78-73...the batted .252 (170 for 675) and the pitching staff had a 3.49 ERA (70 er in 180.2 ip)...that included 3.35 (45 er in 121.0 ip) by the starters and 3.77 (25 er in 59.2 ip) by the relievers...all 20 games were played in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's are 1-1 in his starting assignments this year and are 10-8 (.556) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in each of his two starts and allowed two runs or fewer both

COMEBACK: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles May 23...walked Izturis to start the game and, after an Aybar sacrifice, Abreu had a RBI single...that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was relieved by Fuentes to start the eighth inning with the score tied at 1-1.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Baltimore last Saturday in Oakland...it was his first Major League win since June 8, 2009 against Minnesota...issued a career-high tying five walks in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Jones in the third...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the third but he allowed a RBI single to Tatum in the fourth...Oakland then scored once in the sixth to take the lead for good.

OUTMAN vs. BOSTON: Is making his first career appearance and start.

THIS SPRING: Began his comeback this spring by going 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in five games, including one start...opponents hit .442 (23 for 52)...tossed a scoreless fifth and sixth inning in his first outing February 27 at Mesa against the Cubs...it was his first appearance against Major League competition since June 19, 2009 at San Diego...then allowed at least two runs in each of his final four outings...including a start March 6 at San Diego (1.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League in wins at the time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...also allowed six home runs...the River Cats were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in two of his eight starts (his last two), allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

FIRST FOUR, LAST FOUR: Went 0-1 with an 8.59 ERA and .306 opponents average over his first four starts and 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .232 opponents average over his final four starts....tossed fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts and five or more in each of his final four.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .264 opponents batting average broke down to .237 (14 for 59) against left-handed hitters and .282 (24 for 85) against right-handers...yielded five of his six home runs to righties...opponents hit .256 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed 12 of his 24 runs in the first inning for a 12.38 ERA and .395 opponents batting average...had a 2.73 ERA and .217 opponents batting average from the second inning on...had 10 walks in the first inning and 17 after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-0 with a 3.68 ERA in four starts on the road and 1-1 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts at home.

SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in each of his first three starts, tossing fewer than 5.0 innings in each outing...walked four batters in 4.0 innings in his first start April 7 against Tacoma...tossed a season low 2.0 innings in his second start April 13 against Las Vegas...then allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings April 18 at Tacoma...had his first decision April 24 against Tucson when he allowed a season-high six runs (four earned) in 4.2 innings for the loss...then won each of his final four starts...allowed a season high eight hits in 5.0 innings at Las Vegas April 30...surrendered a season high two home runs May 6 against Colorado Springs...tossed 6.0 shutout innings at Memphis May 11 but had season-highs in walks (5) and strikeouts (6)...pitched a season-high 7.0 innings in his final start May 16 at Nashville and allowed just two hits in 7.0 innings.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2008 as a September call-up and then went 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts, in 2009 before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery in June...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued his recovery...is 6-3 with a 3.57 ERA (42 er in 106.0 ip) in 22 career appearances, including 18 starts...was originally drafted by Philadelphia in the 10th round of the 2005 draft and was dealt to the A's in the Joe Blanton trade in July of 2008.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (6-3, 2.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season...is 0-3 with a 3.51 ERA (10 er in 25.2 ip) and .275 (25 for 91) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four from July 27 to August 11, 2009...is tied for third in the American League in wins (6), ranks fifth in ERA (2.31) and tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667)...has allowed a .130 (7 for 54) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for the third lowest mark in the American League...is 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA (9 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts at home this year and 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts on the road...is 1-2 with a 5.19 ERA (17.1 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 7 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Boston...including 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA in two starts last year.
