### A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail the season series 3-1 following yesterday's loss...are 0-2 in Boston and 1-1 in Oakland...went 5-4 against the Red Sox last season, winning the season series for the first time since going 7-3 in 2006...are now 26-25 (.510) against the Red Sox since 2006, which is the **best record by any American League team over that span**...have swept just three series from Boston over the last 18 years (all in Oakland), most recently May 23-25, 2008...have won 17 of the last 24 games in the Coliseum but have lost 14 of the last 18 at Fenway...are 218-271 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-114 in Oakland, 88-156 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 860-1052 against the Red Sox.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**David DeJesus** is batting .306 (22 for 72) over his last 21 games (since May 13) after hitting .217 over his first 32 contests...has not committed an error in 49 games in the outfield and now has a 290-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

**Mark Ellis** a .311 (76 for 244) career hitter against the Red Sox, which is his second highest batting average against any American League team (Tampa Bay, .313).

**Kurt Suzuki** is a .328 (41 for 125) career hitter against Boston, which is his highest average against any American League team...has hit safely in 15 of 16 career games at Fenway Park (22 for 64, .344).

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2004** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost the past five games after winning a season-high four consecutive games...the losing streak is one short of the season-high of six games (May 18-23)...are 5-12 over the last 17 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high six games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent 13 of the last 14 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 17 days in fourth...are now a season-high five games under .500...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost to the Red Sox 9-8 in 14 innings yesterday, which was the A's longest game in terms of innings since playing 15 innings on May 3, 2009 against Seattle...the time of game of 5:17 is tied for the seventh longest in Oakland history...are now 5-8 in extra-inning games...the 13 extra-inning games are the most in the majors and the eight losses are tied for the most (Los Angeles)...the 13 extra-inning games are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 7-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-12 in one-run games...are third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starters are 1-5 with a 8.18 ERA (30 er in 33.0 ip) and .286 (38 for 133) opponents batting average over the past six games after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a **Major League-leading** 3.05 ERA (126 er in 371.1 ip) for the season...have allowed 23 home runs this season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.348), have allowed the third most walks (124) and rank fifth in innings pitched (371.1).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 5.93 ERA (38 er in 57.2 ip) over the past six games but have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which ranks **first in the American League** and second in the majors (Atlanta, 3.01)...have allowed just 35 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors...are on pace to allow 96 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.346) and rank fifth in on-base percentage (.315) and batting average (.245)...have a Major League leading 12 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 39 of 63 (61.9%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 24 caught stealings top the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored eight runs on 13 hits yesterday but are batting .242 for the season, which is tied for second lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.308) and slugging percentage (.352)...have the third fewest runs scored (216) and the fifth fewest strikeouts (360)...have hit 32 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 88 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 43 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 35)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 65 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's are 3-5 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-0 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York, 0-2 at Boston)...following this series with Boston, the stretch continues with a three-game series at Baltimore beginning tomorrow...it marks just the second time this year the A's have traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-7 (.417) against the East this year.

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's have a 13-11 (.542) record in day games and are 14-21 (.400) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 11-21)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...are 17-27 (.386) against right-handed starters...are 20-6 when scoring four or more runs and 7-26 when scoring less than four.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-2), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-17 on the road for the season...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .232 (242 for 1042) with 102 runs scored in 30 games on the road (3.40 per game).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 5-7 (.417) in his starting assignments this year and are 27-34 (.443) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

**LAST SEVEN STARTS:** Is 1-4 with a 5.36 ERA (26 er in 43.2 ip), 19 walks and six home runs allowed over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA, four walks and no home runs over his first five starts (34.2 ip)...his five losses are tied for ninth in the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-3 with a 2.35 ERA (10 er in 38.1 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.95 ERA (22 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts at home...is tied for the fourth best road ERA in the American League...has allowed five of his six home runs in Oakland...over the last two years, has surrendered 10 of his 12 home runs at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed two home runs in his last start, both to left-handed hitters (Granderson and Teixeira)...those were his first home runs allowed to a lefty since August 25, 2009 at Seattle (Brayan)...has issued 21 of his 23 walks this year to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .191 (18 for 94) average the first time through the lineup, .235 (23 for 98) the second time through the order and .343 (36 for 105) after that.

**ON THE BASES:** Ranks second in the majors with five pickoffs (Shields, TB 6)...that is already a career-high as he had four in each of his previous two seasons...opponents have been caught stealing seven times this year, which is the most in the majors.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 12 starts...is 0-4 in those seven starts and is 3-1 in four starts with run support of three or more...has the sixth lowest run support in the American League with a mark of 2.87 (25 rs in 78.1 ip)...is now 2-19 in 32 career starts with two runs or support or fewer and 19-3 with at least three runs of support.

**THE LAST START IN A MONTH:** Allowed a career-high 10 runs in 5.1 innings in his last start on May 31 against New York after allowing just 10 runs over his previous five starts (33.1 ip)...also allowed seven runs in 5.0 innings in his final start in April after yielding eight in his first five starts that month (34.3 ip)

**THE FIRST FOUR INNINGS:** Has a 2.06 ERA (11 er in 48.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and 6.23 (21 er in 30.1 ip) after that...has not allowed a run in the second inning.

**2011 START-BY-START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle **April 2** in Oakland...allowed his only run on a Cust RBI single in the sixth...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota **April 8**...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...the only runs scored on back-to-back singles by Span and Mauer in the eighth...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Chicago **April 13**...allowed an unearned run in the fifth and two more in the sixth...earned his first win of the season in the A's 5-0 victory over Boston **April 19**...shutout the Red Sox on one hit over first seven innings and then allowed three hits in the eighth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 victory at Seattle **April 24**...allowed a run in the first when Bradley scored Suzuki with a ground out...was also charged with an unearned run in the seventh...took the loss in the A's 11-2 defeat against Texas **April 30**...matched his career highs with four walks and three home runs...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 12 innings to Cleveland **May 5** in Oakland...matched his career high by tossing 9.0 innings...allowed a two-run single to Cabrera in the sixth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Texas **May 10**...issued a career-high-tying four walks in just 4.2 innings...held the Rangers scoreless over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth inning on a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Gentry RBI single...then allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the fifth inning and was relieved by Purcey with two outs...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles **May 16** in Oakland...issued a career-high-tying four walks for the second consecutive start, third time this year and fifth time in his career...blanked the Angels on four hits over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the sixth inning on a fielders choice and a Trumbo sacrifice fly...was relieved by Wertz with a 3-2 lead, two outs and a runner on first in the seventh inning but Wertz allowed a two-run single to Kendrick for the blown save...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-0 loss at San Francisco **May 21**...walked Torres to start the game and he went to third on a Sanchez double before scoring on a Posey ground out...then shutout the Giants on four hits over the next four innings...pitched just 5.0 innings as he was removed for a pinch hitter in the top of the sixth...Lincese shutout the A's on three hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at Los Angeles **May 26**...tossed 8.0 shutout inning and allowed just three hits while walking three...retired each of the first 10 batters before Aybar singled with one out in the fourth...was relieved by Balfour after to start the bottom of the ninth with the A's leading 4-0 and he allowed three runs.

**LAST START:** Was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-3 A's loss to New York last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high 10 runs on a career-high 11 hits in 5.1 innings...Granderson had a two-run home run in the first and a two-run single in the fourth...also allowed an unearned run in the third and a two-run home run to Cano in the fifth...was relieved by Ziegler with one out and the bases loaded in the sixth inning and he allowed all three runs to score

**ANDERSON vs. BOSTON:** Is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA (39.0 ip, 28 h, 9 r, 9 er, 12 bb, 36 so, 3 hr) in six career starts...lost his first decision but has won each of his last four, which equals the third longest winning streak by an Oakland pitcher against the Red Sox...is 2-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts at Fenway Park and 2-1 with a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year when he combined with Breslow and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win in Oakland April 19...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just one base runner as far as second base and that was on back-to-back two-out singles by Crawford and Saltalamacchia...struck out McDonald to end that inning...has one career complete game, a two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a one-out single to Bay in the second and a Green single with two outs in the fifth...it was the fifth shutout by an Oakland pitcher at Fenway Park, the first since Bobby Witt (July 3, 1994)...according to Elias, he was the first rookie to shutout Boston at Fenway since California's Jim Abbott on August 30, 1989...the only other visiting rookies to allow no more than two hits in a Fenway shutout were the Philadelphia A's Mule Watson in 1918 (one-hitter), the Senators' Bill Phebus in 1937 (two-hitter) and the Angels' Bo Belinski in 1962 (two-hitter).

**LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-3, 2.49 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 12<sup>th</sup> start of the season...took the loss in his first start of June after going 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...the ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...ranks sixth in the AL with a 2.49 ERA this season...is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (17.1 ip, 18 h, 5 r, 4 er, 9 bb, 18 so, 0 hr) in three career starts against Baltimore.

**Save/Save Opportunities: 13/21 (61.9%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed eight runs in 31.2 (2.27 ERA) over its past seven games after allowing 23 runs in 26.0 innings (7.96 ERA) over its previous eight games...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.38 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is the most in the AL...is 13 for 21 (61.9%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL... the save opportunities and blown saves are both tied for fifth most...rank third in the AL in opponents batting average (.234) and on-base percentage (.313) and fourth in slugging (.341).

- Entered the game in the 11<sup>th</sup> inning yesterday and was charged with a blown save after allowing one run in one inning...it was his first save opportunity since converting the save September 17, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Has not allowed a run in two of three appearances (1 er in 3.0 ip, 3.00 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has converted four of his five save opportunities and has a 4.50 ERA in seven career appearances against Boston (10.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 1 hr).
