ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are on a season-high-tying six-game losing streak (also May 18-23) after winning a season-high four consecutive games...their last losing streak longer than six games was an eight-game streak from September 27, 2009 to April 5, 2010...are now 5-13 over the last 18 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high seven games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent 14 of the last 15 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 18 days in fourth...are now a season-high six games under .500...have been exactly .500 a total of 14 times this year...last season, were .500 an Athletics-record 33 times.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters are 1-4 with a 8.29 ERA (35 er in 38.0 ip) and .303 (47 for 155) opponents batting average over the past seven games after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a **Major League-leading** 3.13 ERA (131 er in 376.1 ip) for the season...have allowed 25 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.354), have allowed the third most walks (126) and rank sixth in innings pitched (376.1).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.35 ERA (40 er in 56.2 ip) during their six-game losing streak...however, have a 3.21 ERA for the season, which ranks **first in the American League** and is tied for second in the majors...have allowed just 37 home runs, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the American League...are on pace to allow 99 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.351) and rank fifth in on-base percentage (.316) and batting average (.247)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in just 40 of 65 (61.5%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 24 caught stealings top the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .225 (48 for 213) during their six-game losing streak and are now batting .240 for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.308) and slugging percentage (.351)...have the second fewest runs scored (219) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (364)...have hit 33 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 89 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 43 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 66 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-8 in extra-inning games this season...the 13 extra-inning games are the most in the majors and the eight losses are tied for the most (Los Angeles)...they are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...lost to the Red Sox 9-8 in 14 innings on Saturday, which was the A's longest game in terms of innings since playing 15 innings on May 3, 2009 against Seattle...the time of game of 5:17 is tied for the seventh longest in Oakland history...are 7-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-12 in one-run games...are third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 3-6 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-0 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York, 0-3 at Boston)...the stretch continues with a three-game series at Baltimore beginning today...it marks just the second time this year the A's have traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-9 (.357) against the East this year.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-12 (.520) record in day games and are 14-21 (.400) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the second worst mark at night (Minnesota, 11-21)...are 10-5 (.667) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...are 17-28 (.378) against right-handed starters...are 20-6 when scoring four or more runs and 7-27 when scoring less than four...are 21-10 when scoring first and 6-23 when the opponent scores first...are 7-13 in the first game of a series and 12-8 in the last game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-2), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-18 on the road for the season...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .230 (247 for 1072) with 105 runs scored in 31 games on the road (3.39 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Rosales, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping the Orioles in Oakland May 27 to 29...have won eight consecutive series against the Orioles...that is the A's longest series winning streak against Baltimore in Oakland history and the fifth longest against any team...have won 20 of the last 24 games against the Orioles, including 12 of the last 13 in Oakland...won the season series last year 7-3...have won each of the previous three season series and 11 of the previous 12...are 75-31 (.708) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League** team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-237 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 120-124 in Oakland and 122-113 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 978-917 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 49 games in the outfield and now has a 290-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Cliff Pennington is batting .321 (26 for 81) over his past 23 contests (since May 10) after hitting .217 in his first 35 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in **2003** the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments this year and are 36-32 (.529) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in nine of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Took the loss in his first start of June after going 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...the ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks six in the American League in ERA (2.47)...has struck out 67 and walked 32 in 68.2 innings...ranks fourth in the AL in strikeouts per nine innings (8.78) but is tied for fourth in most walks...has hit at least one batter in each of his last three starts (four total) and has five for the season, which is a new career high and tied for sixth in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.75 ERA (7 er in 36.0 ip) and .190 (24 for 126) opponents batting average in six starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) and .256 (32 for 125) average in five starts during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 3.00 ERA (12 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five or more days rest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .113 (6 for 53) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest mark in the majors (Robertson, NYY .114)...yielded his first hit with RISP and two outs in his last start and opponents are 1 for 25 (.040) in that situation for the season...has allowed a .200 (18 for 90) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .276 (24 for 87) the second time through and .189 (14 for 74) after that...has surrendered four of his five home runs at home and also has four during the day...three have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in six of his 11 starts but has support of six runs or more in three of his other starts...has run support of one run or less in two of his three losses and now has 21 runs of support in his 23 career losses (111.1 ip, 1.70 RSA)...is 25-5 in 43 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-18 in 25 starts with support of one run or fewer.

2011 START-BY-START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota **April 9**...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit **April 14**...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start but matched his career high with six walks...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston **April 20**...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 decision at Los Angeles **April 25**...surrendered two runs in the second on a Wells single, one in the third on an Abreu double and two more in the fourth when Kendrick came in on a Crisp error and Aybar scored as Mathis hit into a double play...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory over Texas **May 1** in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...Ziegler allowed an inherited runner to score in the seventh...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City **May 6**...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win...had his scheduled start **May 11** at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles **May 17** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...retired each of the first 11 batters before walking Izturis with two outs in the fourth...surrendered his only hit when Kendrick singled to leadoff the fifth...neither base runner advanced past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss **May 22** at San Francisco...allowed a RBI double to Freddy Sanchez in the first inning and was also charged with an unearned run in the third inning when Posey scored on a two-out error by LaRoche...Jonathan Sanchez shutout the A's over the first five innings, but Oakland scored once in the sixth and twice in the seventh to take a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh but Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore **May 27** in Oakland...struck out the side in the first inning but then allowed back-to-back singles followed by back-to-back walks to start the second inning...Reynolds walked with the bases loaded to force in a run...also allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning and was relieved by Ziegler after allowing a one out single to start the sixth...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to New York last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Rodriguez in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...then surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...was relieved by Devine with one out in the seventh inning and the A's trailing 4-2.

GONZALEZ vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (17.1 ip, 18 h, 5 r, 4 er, 9 bb, 18 so, 0 hr) in three career starts...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-2 A's win in Oakland May 27...struck out the side in the first inning but then allowed back-to-back singles followed by back-to-back walks to start the second inning...Reynolds walked with the bases loaded to force in a run...also allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning and was relieved by Ziegler after allowing a one out single to start the sixth...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...also had a no decision in his only start last year, a 7-5 A's win at Baltimore May 27...left in the seventh inning trailing 3-2 but the A's scored five times in the eighth for the win...the win came in a 9-1 A's victory at Baltimore on August 10, 2009...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, scattered seven hits and walked just one...the biggest threat came in the seventh inning when Mora singled and Wieters doubled to start the inning...the game was delayed by rain for 52 minutes and when it resumed he was relieved by Breslow who retired the next three batters to end the inning.

The A's bullpen has allowed nine runs in 34.2 (2.34 ERA) over its past seven games after allowing 23 runs in 26.0 innings (7.96 ERA) over its previous eight games...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.38 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is the most in the AL...is 13 for 21 (61.9%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the eight blown saves are tied for fifth most and the save opportunities are sixth most...rank second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.312), third in batting average (.235) and fourth in slugging (.343)...also rank third with a .232 batting average with runners in scoring position...have allowed 35.6 percent of inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Entered the game in the 11th inning Saturday and was charged with a blown save after allowing one run in one inning...it was his first save opportunity since converting the save September 17, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Has not allowed a run in two of three appearances (1 er in 3.0 ip, 3.00 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
