#### A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lead the season series 3-1...are 0-1 in Baltimore and 3-0 in Oakland...have won eight consecutive series against the Orioles...that is the A's longest series winning streak against Baltimore in Oakland history and the fifth longest against any team...have won 20 of the last 25 games against the Orioles, including 12 of the last 13 in Oakland...won the season series last year 7-3...have won each of the previous three season series and 11 of the previous 12...are 75-32 (.701) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-238 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 120-124 in Oakland and 122-114 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 978-918 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 49 games in the outfield and now has a 290-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

**Cliff Pennington** is batting .321 (27 for 84) over his past 24 contests (since May 10) after hitting .217 in his first 35 games.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 2001 the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menechino is hit by a pitch twice...in 2008 Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are on a season-high seven-game losing streak after winning a season-high four consecutive games...their last losing streak longer than seven games was an eight-game losing streak from September 27, 2009 to April 5, 2010...are now 5-14 over the last 19 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high seven games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent 15 of the last 16 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 19 days in fourth...are now a season-high seven games under .500.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starters are 1-5 with a 7.60 ERA (38 er in 45.0 ip) and .306 (56 for 183) opponents batting average over the past seven games (since May 29) after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a **Major League-leading** 3.15 ERA (134 er in 383.1 ip) for the season...have allowed 25 home runs this season, which is fewest in the American League and tied for the fewest in the majors...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.354), have allowed the third most walks (127) and rank sixth in innings pitched (383.1).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 5.98 ERA (43 er in 64.2 ip) during their seven-game losing streak...however, have a 3.21 ERA for the season, which ranks **first in the American League** and third in the majors...have allowed just 37 home runs, which is the fewest in the American League...are on pace to allow 98 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest in a non-strike season is 90 in 1974...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.350), rank fifth in on-base percentage (.316) and are tied for fifth in batting average (.248)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs this season...opponents have been successful in just 41 of 66 (62.1%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 25 caught stealings top the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .224 (55 for 245) during their seven-game losing streak and are now batting .240 for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also have the third lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.350)...have scored 221 runs, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...are tied for third fewest with 370 strikeouts...have hit 34 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 90 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors last night and have now committed eight errors over their past 12 games...have committed a total of 45 errors this season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 46)...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 67 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-8 in extra-inning games this season...the 13 extra-inning games and eight losses are tied for the most in the majors...the 13 extra-inning games are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...lost to the Red Sox 9-8 in 14 innings on Saturday, which was the A's longest game in terms of innings since playing 15 innings on May 3, 2009 against Seattle...the time of game of 5:17 is tied for the seventh longest in Oakland history...are 7-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 7-12 in one-run games...are tied for third in the American League in one-run losses...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's are 3-7 in this stretch of 12 consecutive games against American League East teams (3-1 vs. Baltimore, 0-3 vs. New York, 0-3 at Boston)...the stretch marks just the second time this year the A's have traveled to the Eastern time zone (had a three-game series at Toronto, April 5-7)...are 5-10 (.333) against the East this year.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-12 (.520) record in day games and are 14-22 (.389) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the lowest mark at night...are 10-6 (.625) in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the fourth best record in the AL...are 17-28 (.378) against right-handed starters...are 20-6 when scoring four or more runs and 7-28 when scoring less than four...are 21-10 when scoring first and 6-24 when the opponent scores first...are 7-14 in the first game of a series and 12-8 in the last game of a series.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-4 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-2), Baltimore (three games) and Chicago (four games)...have now lost 10 of their past 12 road games...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 13-19 on the road for the season...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .230 (254 for 1104) with 107 runs scored in 32 games on the road (3.34 per game).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list seven times this year...currently have four players on the DL (Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) after activating Adam Rosales yesterday and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 94 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

Angeles...went 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston last Friday and Saturday, allowing one run in 3.0 innings (3.00 ERA)...matched his career high with three strikeouts in 2.1 scoreless innings Friday and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss Saturday, when he allowed a run on two hits and a walk in 0.2 innings.

**FIRST START:** Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings and matched his best with three strikeouts...did not allow a run and just three runners advanced into scoring position.

LAST START: Won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high four runs on a career-high five hits in 5.0 innings...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero...the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

**MOSCOSO vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 1-0 with a 9.45 ERA (6.2 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 4 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, one start...the start and win came in his only outing this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland May 29 (see last start above)...made his only appearance of 2010 against Baltimore in relief on May 20 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...allowed a Jones RBI double and walked Markakis with the bases loaded...his other outing also came in relief on September 6, 2009 at Baltimore (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...pitched the seventh inning of a 7-0 Texas loss and allowed a RBI single to Fiorentino.

**VENEZUELA:** Is the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

**THE FIRST TWO INNINGS:** Allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) and .302 (19 for 63) opponents batting average...had a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) and .183 (17 for 93) opponents average from the third inning on.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .231 opponents average broke down to .216 (16 for 74) against left-handed hitters and .244 (20 for 82) against right-handers...surrendered his only home run and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...allowed a .236 (21 for 89) average with the bases empty and .308 (12 for 39) with runners in scoring position.

SACRAMENTO HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in his first start April 8 against Tacoma, allowing a run in 5.0 innings in a 3-1 loss...the run came in the first inning and he did not allow a run in each of his next two appearances...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision against Las Vegas April 14 and then pitched 5.0 shutout innings in relief of a rehabbing Michael Wuertz April 20 at Reno...picked up the win against Reno but was charged with his first loss April 25 at Tucson...allowed two runs in the first inning, snapping his scoreless streak at 15.0 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings in his next start, a loss at Las Vegas May 1...had back-to-back scoreless outings again May 7 against Colorado Springs and May 12 at Memphis, both wins...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings and struck out a season-high eight in each outing...then allowed five runs on six hits in 3.0 innings in his final start May 17 at Nashville

**MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Made his Major League debut with Texas in 2009 and posted a 3.21 ERA in 10 relief appearances...also made one relief appearance for the Rangers last year, allowing two runs in 0.2 innings...had no decisions and a 4.30 ERA in 11 career appearances, all in relief, entering this season.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Josh Outman (1-0, 4.02 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...the A's are 1-2 (.333) in his starting assignments this year and are 10-9 (.526) in his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left that game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...he had a no decision his last start, an 8-6 A's loss at Boston on Friday...tossed just 2.2 innings but matched his career highs in runs (5) and earned runs (4)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Baltimore, a 4-2 A's win on May 28 in Oakland earlier this year...issued a career-high tying five walks in 6.0 innings.

previous eight games...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.36 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is the most in the AL...is 13 for 21 (61.9%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the eight blown saves and 21 save opportunities are both tied for sixth most...rank third in the AL in opponents batting average (.234), tied for third in on-base percentage (.311) and fourth in slugging (.341)...have allowed 35.6 percent of inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in the AL

- Entered the game in the 11<sup>th</sup> inning Saturday and was charged with a blown save after allowing one run in one inning...it was his first save opportunity since converting the save September 17, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Has not allowed a run in two of three appearances (1 er in 3.0 ip, 3.00 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL
- Has not allowed a run and has converted all five of his save opportunities in seven career games against the Orioles (7.1 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 6 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has allowed five runs in 5.0 innings (9.00 ERA) over his past five appearances, which has raised his ERA from 1.31 to 2.81 (8 er in 25.2 ip)...however, has not allowed a run in 22 of 26 appearances this season.
- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) in 13 appearances at home compared to a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) in 13 appearances on the road...has a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip) in 15 appearances at night and a 4.22 ERA (5 er in 10.2 ip) in 11 games during the day.
