ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are on a season-high 10-game losing streak...it is their longest losing streak since also losing 10 consecutive games from July 28-August 7, 2008...the A's last losing streak of 11 or more games was September 22, 1995-April 4, 1996 when they lost 12 consecutive games... are 5-17 over the last 22 games (since May 18)...were tied for first place May 17 but are now a season-high-tying eight games out of first and in fourth place, where the A's have spent the last 11 days and 18 of the last 19 days...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 22 days in fourth...are now a season-high 10 games under .500...have swept or been swept in seven of their past eight series...began the season without a sweep or being swept in the in the first 13 series, an Oakland record to start a season.

SCORING CHANGE: Jemile Weeks was awarded a triple yesterday on the ball he hit toward left fielder Nolan Reimold in the eighth inning during Wednesday's game at Baltimore...it had originally been ruled a three-base error...the change is reflected in today's statistics.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters are 0-8 with a 7.55 ERA (45 er in 53.2 ip) and a .318 (69 for 217) opponents batting average during the 10-game losing streak after going 5-5 with a 2.21 ERA and .238 opponents batting average over their previous 16 games...have a 3.29 ERA for the season, which is tied for the **American League lead**...have allowed 29 home runs this season, which is fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.361), are tied for third in most walks allowed (131) and tied for fifth in innings pitched (397.0).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.33 ERA for the season, which is the **best in the American League**...have allowed one or more home runs in nine of the past 10 games (14 total over that span)...however, have allowed just 43 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.358) and are tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.317)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs this season...opponents have been successful in just 42 of 68 (61.8%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 26 caught stealings are tied for the most in the majors (Kansas City).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (75 for 343) during the 10-game losing streak and are now batting .239 for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.347) and third lowest on-base percentage (.304)...have the fewest runs scored (227) and are tied for fourth fewest in strikeouts (391)...have hit 35 home runs this season, which is the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit just 89 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have been shutout seven times this season, which is second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 8).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 46 errors this season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Houston, 36)...10 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...have recorded 71 double plays this season, which is the second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-7 on this 10-game road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (0-1)...have now lost 13 of their past 15 road games...went 2-5 on the last road trip to San Francisco (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are now 13-22 (.371) on the road for the season, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 6-16)...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .228 (274 for 1202) with 113 runs scored in 35 games on the road (3.23 per game).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 13-12 (.520) record in day games and are 14-25 (.359) at night...have the sixth best day record in the American League and the worst mark at night...are 10-8 (.556) in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 17-29 (.370) against right-handed starters...are 20-7 when scoring four or more runs and 7-30 when scoring less than four...are 21-11 when scoring first and 6-26 when the opponent scores first...are 7-15 in the first game of a series and 12-9 in the last game of a series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-8 in extra-inning games this year...the 13 extra-inning games are tied for the most in the majors and the eight losses are second most (Los Angeles-AL, 9)...the 13 extra-inning games are two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season when they went 4-7...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one has lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 7-15 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 8-13 in one-run games...the 13 one-run losses are third most in the American League...have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

LOCKED UP: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's trail the season series 3-4...are 2-2 in Chicago and 1-2 in Oakland...went 5-4 against the White Sox last year and have won the season series in eight of the previous 10 seasons...are now 59-35 (.628) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the **best record by any American League team** over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 286-265 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 151-129 in Oakland and 135-136 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 963-1020 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton has played 417 career games at first base, which is three away from tying Scott Hatteberg for third in Oakland history...is 8 for 21 (.381) with five RBI and two runs scored in six games against Chicago this year.

Coco Crisp has 997 career hits and is three away from the 1,000th of his career.

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 52 games in the outfield and now has a 293-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Ryan Sweeney is batting .315 (23 for 73) over his past 26 games (since May 3) after batting .222 in his first 16 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire's hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder.

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento today and will be making his Major League debut...is the 42nd pitcher in Oakland history to make a start in his debut...the previous 41 have combined for a 13-14 record and a 3.62 ERA...each of the last two have picked up the win (Cramer, Sept. 13, 2010 and Mazzaro, June 2, 2009)...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago.

2011 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Combined for a 7-1 record, a 2.32 ERA and a .221 opponents batting average in 10 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...began the year with the Rockhounds and had a no decision April 7 against Arkansas (4.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 6 so) before he was promoted to Sacramento...went 7-1 with a 2.50 ERA in nine starts with the River Cats...combined to allow just two home runs in 54.1 innings...struck out 51 and walked 15...his teams were 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignment...tossed six or more innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed three runs or fewer in all 10 starts and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Was leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA (2.50) and was tied for the league lead in wins (7) at the time of his promotion...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.222).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .221 opponents batting average included a .188 (18 for 96) mark against left-handed hitters and .250 (27 for 108) against right-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to righties...opponents were 10 for 50 (.200) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.273 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed a .189 (21 for 111) average with the bases empty and .286 (14 for 49) with runners in scoring position...both of his home runs were solo shots.

INNING BY INNING: Allowed seven of his 18 runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip)...compiled a 1.62 ERA (8 er in 44.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents hit .273 (33 for 121) over the first three innings and .146 (12 for 82) after that.

DISABLED LIST: Was placed on Sacramento's disabled list effective May 6 with a sprained right wrist...was reinstated May 19.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season with two no decisions: one with Midland and one with Sacramento...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high seven hits in his first start with the River Cats, April 12 against Las Vegas...then tossed a season-high 7.0 innings April 17 at Tacoma for his first win...that began a four-game winning streak that ran from April 17 to May 5...posted a 1.82 ERA and allowed a .186 opponents average during the streak...had his first of three seven-strikeout games April 23 against Tucson...matched the strikeout total May 5 against Salt Lake...surrendered his only two home runs and tossed a season-low 3.2 innings in his only loss in his first start after returning from the DL, May 19 against Oklahoma City...allowed a season-high tying three runs in that start...then went 3-0 with a 2.12 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his final three starts...walked three batters in a 3-2 win over New Orleans May 24, his only outing of the season with more than two walks...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in the second game of a doubleheader at Reno May 29.

FINAL MINOR LEAGUE START: Was the winning pitcher in Sacramento's 5-3 win at Colorado Springs last Saturday...did not walk a batter for the second time...allowed a sacrifice fly to Garner in the bottom of the first but the River Cats tied the game with a run in the second...allowed a Taveras RBI single in the bottom of the second but then blanked the SkySox on one hit over his final four innings...Sacramento scored three times in the sixth for the win.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Was 33-32 with a 4.20 ERA (278 er in 590.0 ip) in 119 career minor league appearances, including 103 starts, over five seasons...allowed just 42 home runs in 590.2 innings, an average of 0.64 per nine innings...was originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 34th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to the A's with pitcher Kristian Bell for infielder Marco Scutaro, Nov. 18, 2007.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-4, 2.62): Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season...is 0-2 with a 4.73 ERA (7 er in 13.1 ip) and .269 (14 for 52) opponents batting average in two starts in June after going 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...the ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...ranks sixth in the AL with a 2.62 ERA this season...has allowed a .150 (9 for 60) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the second lowest mark in the AL...is 0-3 with a 6.45 ERA in four career starts against the White Sox (22.1 ip, 22 h, 18 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 22 so, 4 hr)...is 0-2 with a 7.53 ERA (12 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (4 er in 8.0 ip) in one start in Chicago.

The A's bullpen has allowed one or more runs in five of its past seven games (13 er in 26.1 ip, 4.44 ERA) after not allowing a run in five of its previous six games (1 er in 19.2 ip, 0.46 ERA)...ranks fourth in the American League with a 3.41 ERA overall...has been charged with 14 losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...is 13 for 21 (61.9%) in save opportunities this season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 21 save opportunities are fifth fewest but the eight blown saves are tied for sixth most...rank fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.238), on-base percentage (.310) and slugging percentage (.350)...have allowed 33.3 percent of inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.
