ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and 12 of the last 13 games to fall a season-high 11 games under .500 at 28-39...those are the A's most games under .500 since they finished the 2009 season 12 games under (75-87)...have the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 26-39)...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 6-19 (.240) since then, which is the worst record in the Majors (Florida, 8-17)...are a season-high tying eight games out of first place for the sixth consecutive day...have spent each of the last 15 days and 22 of the last 23 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 26 days in fourth...had a season-high 10-game losing streak from May 30 to June 9...that matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history and it was the longest since July 28-August 7, 2008 when they also lost 10 straight

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 1-9 on the last road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-3), matching the worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 Aug. 1-10, 2008 and May 12-21, 1981...have now lost 15 of the last 18 road games and are 14-24 (.368) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Kansas City, 8-17)...begin a six-game homestand tonight against Kansas City (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and New York (0-3) and are 14-15 at home for the season...are batting .252 (245 for 974) with 114 runs scored in 29 home games (3.93 per game) and .228 (297 for 1301) with 126 runs scored in 38 games on the road (3.32 per game).

IN JUNE: The A's are 1-10 (.091) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Florida, 1-11)...have a 5.27 ERA (56 er in 95.2 ip) this month, which is second highest in the majors (Toronto, 7.02)...are tied for second in most home runs allowed in the AL (14) and have the third highest opponents batting average (.291)...the offense is batting .225 (85 for 378), which is third lowest in the AL this month...have the second fewest home runs (5) and the third fewest runs scored (40).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-10 with a 7.23 ERA (56 er in 69.2 ip) and .316 (89 for 282) opponents batting average over the past 13 games...the 10-game losing streak matches the second longest by starting pitchers in Oakland history...it is the longest since June 28-July 14, 1997 when they also had a 10-game losing streak...the record is 13 games from July 29-Aug. 12, 1977...the last win by an A's starter was by Guillermo Moscoso on May 29 against Baltimore...starters are 21-25 with a 3.40 ERA (156 er in 413.0 ip) for the season...have the **lowest ERA in the American League** (Seattle, 3.41) but are tied for the third lowest winning percentage...have allowed 14 home runs in the last 13 games after yielding 18 over the first 54 contests...have allowed 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.367) but have issued the third most walks (144).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.35 ERA, which **leads the American League**...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last six games (nine total) and 12 of the last 13 (17 total)...however, have allowed just 46 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.359)...have a Major League leading 13 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 45 of 71 (63.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 26 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit just 36 home runs, which is the fewest in the Major Leagues...are on pace to hit 87 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 240 runs, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...also have the second lowest batting average (.238) and slugging percentage (.346) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.305)...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (six total) and have 51 for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 36 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...11 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (78).

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's two losses have been by one run and they are now 8-15 (.348) in one-run games for the season...have the worst record in one-run games in the majors...are 5-8 (.385) in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games and have the second most losses (Los Angeles, 9)...the 13 extra-inning games are already two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season and the losses are their most since going 3-10 in 2009...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 8-16 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's have a 10-9 record in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-30 against right-handers...are batting .246 (151 for 614) against left-handers and .235 (391 for 1661) against righties.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

BOB MELVIN: The A's are 1-3 since Bob Melvin was named interim manager June 9...he replaced Bob Geren, who was relieved of his duties after a 27-36 start...Geren registered a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons with Oakland...Melvin compiled a record of 493-508 in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with Seattle (156-168) and Arizona (337-340)...this is the seventh in-season managerial change in Oakland history, the first since Tony La Russa took over in 1986.

A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three games in Kansas City in May...have won the season series from the Royals in each of the previous two seasons and are 14-6 (.700) against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season...have won six of the eight games in Oakland over that stretch...all-time, the A's are 293-240 against the Royals...that breaks down to 160-105 in Oakland and 133-135 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daric Barton has played 420 career games at first base, which is tied with Scott Hatteberg for third in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire (1251) and Jason Giambi (728) have played more games at first base in Oakland history.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 73-game, 71.2-inning, 286-batter homerless streak.

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 53 games in the outfield and now has a 294-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Cliff Pennington has hit second in each of the last four games (6 for 15, .400)...he is batting .324 (34 for 105) over his last 30 games after hitting .217 over his first 35 contests.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error and now has a 149-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1969** the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in **1975** Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season...the A's are 6-8 (.429) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-33 (.566) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in seven of his 14 starts, allowed one run or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 5.35 ERA (21 er in 35.1 ip) and .308 (41 for 133) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...the losing streak matches the longest of his career (July 27 to Aug. 11, 2009)...it comes on the heels of a career-high tying seven-game winning streak as he won his final start of 2010.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has allowed 19 runs in his last four starts (18 er in 22.1 ip, 7.25 ERA) after allowing 15 runs over his first 10 starts (1.79 ERA)...has surrendered at least one home run in each of his last four starts (five home runs total) after allowing four over his first 10 starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA (9 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts at home and 3-2 with a 4.18 ERA (22 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 21-12 with a 3.06 ERA (85 er in 250.0 ip) in 39 career starts in Oakland and 13-13 with a 4.35 ERA (103 er in 213.0 ip) in 37 starts on the road.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has issued 34 walks, which is eighth most in the American League...also ranks third with seven wild pitches, which matches Henry Rodriguez' team-leading total from last year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .203 (13 for 64) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .114 with RISP over his first eight starts but are 9 for 29 (.310) over his last six...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .157 (11 for 70) average...has allowed nine home runs and six have been solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 3-3 with a 4.25 ERA (26 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest and 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (5 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed four runs in the first inning over his last three starts after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...allowed just five runs in the first inning all last year for a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip).

WINS: Is 24-11 with a 2.90 ERA (90 er in 279.1 ip) and .227 (230 for 1011) opponents batting average in 43 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...the A's are 27-16 (.628) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 70-92 (.432) with all other pitchers...is 34-25 (.576) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...earned the win in a 5-1 decision over Detroit **April 17** in Oakland...allowed his only run when Wells led off the sixth inning with a home run...improved to 5-0 with a 3-1 victory over Cleveland **May 4** in Oakland...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings, a RBI single by Hafner in the third inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...that snapped his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...allowed four runs to snap a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at San Francisco **May 20**...allowed his first first-inning run of the season but shutout the Giants on one hit over his final five innings...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth on a Pedroia RBI single, a Youkilis RBI double and a Crawford RBI single...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to a career-high tying four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago last Thursday...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a Vizquel sacrifice fly, a bases loaded walk to Pierre and a Ramirez RBI single...surrendered three more runs in the third, including a two-run home run to Dunn and a bases loaded walk to Ramirez...was relieved by Cramer with the bases loaded and two outs in the third.

CAHILL vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 3-1 with a 4.55 ERA (31.2 ip, 27 h, 16 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 15 so, 6 hr) in five career starts...is 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 8.49 ERA (11 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts in Kansas City...has not faced the Royals this year...was 1-1 with a 4.79 ERA (11 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts last year...the no decision came in a 6-5 A's win at Kansas City July 17...allowed five runs in 6.2 innings but all five runs came in the second inning...Betancourt had a grand slam and Podsednik followed with a triple before scoring on a Kendall sacrifice fly...retired 16 straight beginning with the Kendall sacrifice fly...then tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 6-0 win in Oakland August 2...walked four but was aided by five double plays...allowed just one runner as far as second base and that was when Betemit double to lead off the eighth...walked the next batter but then got a fly out and a double play to end the threat...the loss came in the A's 6-3 loss at Kansas City Sept. 15...retired seven of the first eight batters he faced and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a grand slam to Betemit in the third inning...also allowed a two-run home run to Butler in the fifth.
