The Royals evened the season series with Oakland by taking the opener of this 3-game set last night...it was the first of 6 straight games slated for Overstock.com Coliseum after KC was 1-2 in Kauffman in May...the Royals trail the all-time series by a 241-293 margin, including a 106-160 deficit here.

DUFFYSHINES BEFORE "HOME" CROWD--Rookie southpaw Danny Duffy allowed just 2 runs over 6.0 innings to record his first Major League victory here last night in front of over 150 family and friends from Lompoc, CA, a 7-4 triumph...the 22-year old gave up just 4 hits while walking 4 and fanning a pair to make the big league win column in his sixth attempt...the offense was led by shortstop Alcides Escobar, who went 3-for-5 with a double and 2 RBI, his fourth consecutive multi-hit game, the longest such streak of his career...leading by a 2-1 count entering the fifth, KC plated a pair of runs on a Billy Butler double and then played tack-on with 2 more runs in the eighth and another in the ninth...the win gave the Royals a 3-1 start to this road trip after taking 2 of 3 from the Angels in Anaheim...overall, Kansas City has gone 4-1 in its last 5 games.

DUFF JOINS THE WIN LIST--Danny Duffy's triumph last night made him the 258th different pitcher to record a victory in franchise history and the sixth different rookie hurler join the all-time team win list this year...he joins Nate Adcock, Tim Collins, Aaron Crow, Greg Holland and Jeremy Jeffress as rookies to post a win this season for the Royals.

REHAB ROAD CONTINUES FOR CHEN & K.D.--Kansas City starting pitchers Bruce Chen and Kyle Davies, both currently on the 15-day disabled list, will each get at least one more minor league injury rehab start this Saturday...Chen, out since May 6 with a left lat strain, will make his third minor league start on Saturday with Omaha (AAA) in an 80-90 pitch appearance at Round Rock...Davies, out since May 17 with right rotator cuff inflammation, will make his third rehab appearance (second start) on Saturday for the Northwest Arkansas Naturals (AA) at home against Springfield.

MEET US IN ST. LOUIE--The Royals wrap up this 9-game tour with the resumption of Interleague play as KC pays a weekend visit to St. Louis beginning Friday night...the set against the Cardinals jumpstarts the final 15 games against National League competition for 2011, as the Royals will return home for 3-game visits from Arizona and the Chicago Cubs before heading out to 3-game stops in San Diego and Colorado...KC went 1-2 when the Redbirds stopped by "The K" in May and now trails the all-time body of work by a 27-36 margin, including a 12-12 split in St. Louis and a 7-5 advantage in new Busch Stadium.

ROAD TRIP OFF TO SOLID START--The Royals have kicked off their toughest stretch of road work by being successful in 3 of the first 4 games on this 9-game journey, taking 2 of 3 from the Angels prior to last night's series opening win...KC is in a stretch in which 18 of 24 games will be contested on the road...after being at home for 41 of the first 63 games of the season, Kansas City will play 59 of its final 99 contests away from home...the Royals are now 9-17 on the road, while posting a 21-20 ledger in Kauffman Stadium.

FRENCHYNABS ANOTHER ONE--The most prolific outfield assist man since he first set foot on a major league field in 2005, Jeff Francoeur added another to his resume last night when he nailed Conor Jackson at the plate in the second inning...it was the 88th outfield assist for "Frenchy" since coming up with Atlanta in 2005, 21 more than his nearest competition, the Cubs' Alfonso Soriano (67)...the 9-2 double play by Francoeur was the 18th of his career, two in back of Soriano in the 2005-present time frame...the Kansas City outfield leads the majors in outfield assists with 20, which ties the N.L. leading Dodgers.

LUKE HOHEVAR takes the hill for his team-leading 15th start in 2011...this is Luke's 84th career appearance (80th start) and seventh start against the A's...he was Kansas City's first-ever first overall selection (2006).

WINLESS STREAK HALTED--Hoch snapped a 6-start winless streak by defeating Toronto, 3-2 at home last Thursday, earning his first victory since May 1... Luke outdueled Ricky Romero, who took the complete-game loss for the Blue Jays... Hochevar recorded his seventh quality start of 2011, going 7.0 innings and yielding 6 hits and 2 runs with 3 walks and 3 K's...he induced 3 inning-ending double play ground balls...both Toronto runs came on a triple by J.P. Arencibia in the fourth.

QUALITY INNINGS EATER--Luke has consistently pitched deep into games this season, making his way through at least 6.0 innings in all but 2 of his starts, both coming against the Angels (April 31 and May 30)...he currently ranks 12th in the league in innings (91.0).

HOMERS HALTED--Hochevar was tagged for 13 home runs over his first 10 starts of the season, but has since kept the opposition in the ballpark over his last 4 starts covering 25.0 innings...his 13 home runs allowed are still tied for the third-most in the league...opponents are batting .260 against him, but he has allowed 41 extra-base hits among his 92 hits allowed.

31 STRAIGHT RETIRED--On April 20 vs. Cleveland, Luke came up 2 batters shy of equaling Steve Busby's club record of retiring 33 straight hitters, accomplished in 1974...Hochevar retired the final 16 Mariners he faced on April 15 before getting the first 15 Indians on April 20.

A NEW NAME CAN'T HURT--Luke has yet to record a victory against Oakland, going 0-5 with a 7.26 ERA (31.0 IP, 35 H, 25 ER) in 6 career starts...he was in line for the victory on May 7 against the A's, tossing 7.0 innings and giving up just 4 hits and 1 run, but a 3-run eighth inning enabled Oakland to tie the game, leaving Hoch with a no decision...the Royals won 4-3 in walk-off fashion when Mike Aviles drove in Jarrod Dyson with a sacrifice fly in the ninth inning...maybe the new name of Overstock.com Coliseum will help, because in 3 career starts on this piece of property, Luke has gone 0-3, allowing 20 earned runs over 12.0 innings for a 15.00 ERA...the Royals have been outscored 27-9 in those contests.

ROAD STRUGGLES--Hochevar makes his fifth road start, looking to snap a personal 3-game losing streak away from Kauffman Stadium...he is 1-3 this season in 4 starts away from "The K" with a 6.49 ERA (26.1 IP, 31 H, 19 ER)...his last victory away from home was in his 2011 visiting debut at Detroit on April 10...he is 10-20 lifetime with a 6.97 ERA over 37 road appearances (35 starts).

Pitching Notes

Tomorrow's Starter - Jeff Francis

- A Vancouver native and Canucks fan, Jeff will make his 15th start of 2011 in tomorrow's matinee...is 3-6 with a 4.40 ERA in 88.0 innings (43 ER).
- Francis earned his first road victory with KC on Friday in Anaheim...he was efficient early, holding the Halos scoreless through the fifth while throwing just 57 pitches over those innings...L.A. broke through with 2 runs on 5 hits in the sixth, cutting KC's lead to 4-2...Francis received help from Alex Gordon, who threw a strike from left field to cut down Bobby Abreu at the plate...Jeff allowed the 2 runs on 8 hits and a walk over 6.1 IP in the 4-2 win.
- Francis has pitched at least 6.1 innings in each of his last 7 outings, recording 5 of his 9 quality starts on the year during the stretch.
- Jeff faced the A's for the first time on May 8 at home, taking a loss in a 5-2 game...Oakland scored 2 in the opening frame, with the first being unearned...he held Oakland in check until Kevin Kouzmanoff's solo shot in the sixth, allowing the 3 runs (2 earned) on 8 hits and a walk over 6.1 IP.

 - He pitched a scoreless seventh in a 2-2 game on April 30 vs. Minnesota...KC went on to an 11-2 victory, lifting Nate to his first big league win.
 - A 2010 Rule 5 pick from Pittsburgh, Adcock was 11-7 in 27 appearances (26 starts) in 2010 for Bradenton in the Florida State League.

 - The 25-year old made his Major League debut on April 21 vs. the Indians in KC, pitching 2.0 scoreless innings in a game that the Royals won, 3-2.
 - Louis was 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA and 2 saves in 6 outings for Omaha, holding batters to a .167 average with 16 K's in 7.0 innings pitched.

 - The 21-year old rookie leads the A.L. with 32 appearances...he has now allowed 29 walks in 34.2 big league innings.
 - Collins spent time in the Toronto and Atlanta organizations in 2010 before joining the Royals in a July 31 deadline deal with the Braves.

- Aaron inherited a runner from Greg Holland with 2 outs in the eighth last night and KC ahead by a 6-4 count...he walked Daric Barton on 5 pitches, then retired Jemile Weeks on a fly ball to right...he leads the team with 6 holds.
 - Crow began his big league career with a stretch of 15.1 scoreless innings...he also retired the first batter that he faced in each of his first 13 outings.
 - Crow and pitching coach Bob McClure are the only pitchers in club history to begin their Royals career with no runs allowed over their first 13 games.
 - The Mizzou product was KC's first-round pick (12th overall) in 2009...pitched at the High-A and AA levels in 2010, going 9-10 with a 5.73 ERA.

- Greg entered last night's game with the Royals holding a 4-2 lead in the seventh...he recorded a 1-2-3 frame, then ran into trouble in the eighth after KC had extended the lead to 6-2 in the top half...Holland allowed 2 runs (1 earned), his first tallies since his recall from Omaha on May 19...he is limiting opponents to a .157 average.
 - He has 18 strikeouts in 14.1 innings...his 6 K's on June 1 vs. L.A. were the most by a KC reliever since John Bale fanned 7 Yankees on September 9, 2007.
 - Holland, who made his Major League debut here on August 2, 2010, earned his first Major League win in his 2011 debut on May 19 vs. Texas.
 - Greg was 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA and 2 saves in 13 games for Omaha...he posted 27 K's in 21.2 IP while limiting opponents to a .176 batting average.

 - He recorded a career-high 43 saves in 2010 to earn his second Royals' Bruce Rice Pitcher of the Year...Soria was selected to his second All-Star Game in 2010.

Hitting Notes

Wilson Betemit *This Series: Has not played* *This Trip: Has not played* **Hit Streak:** 1 g (1-4)

- Wilson has yet to appear on the trip...he snapped an 0-for-12 spell with a double last Thursday vs. Toronto, his 99th career two-bagger.
- Is hitting .347 (25-for-72) on the road and .322 (19-for-59) with 2 outs.
- He hit .400 (18-for-45) during his career-high 13-game hitting streak from April 2-22 with 4 doubles, 11 RBI, 8 walks and 7 runs scored.
- Hitting .304 (42-for-138) vs. right-handers and .370 (17-for-46) with runners in scoring position.

Billy Butler *This Series: 1-for-4, 2B, 2 RBI, BB* *This Trip: 6-for-16 (.375), 2 runs, 2 2B, HR, 5 RBI, 3 BB* **Hit Streak:** 7 g (9-26)

- Billy was 1-for-4 here last night with a walk and a 2-run double in the fifth inning, upping his current hit streak to 7 games in which he's batting .346 (9-for-26)...he is hitting .357 (30-for-84) with a .449 on-base pct. in 22 games since May 22 and .362 (17-for-47) in June, sixth in the A.L.
- He recorded the first walk-off home run of his career on June 1 vs. Los Angeles, giving KC a 2-0 win with a 1-out shot in the ninth.
- He is fourth in the league in OBP (.407), sixth in walks (41), tied for eighth in multi-hit games (21) and tied for 10th in hits (74).
- His double last night extended his franchise-record hitting streak to 128 consecutive series...he has shattered Willie Wilson's streak of 96 (1979-81) last year...it's the second-longest active streak in Majors (Nick Markakis-BAL, 161).
- Leads all Major Leaguers since the start of 2009 with 112 doubles (NYY's Robinson Cano is second with 102).

ESKY HEATING UP--Kansas City shortstop Alcides Escobar has amazed with the leather from the outset this year, but more recently he has been just as much of a contributor at the plate as he hit safely in his seventh straight game last night, going 3-for-5 with a double, run scored, 2 RBI and a stolen base...it was his first 3-hit game as a Royal and marked his fourth consecutive multi-hit effort, a career first...Esky has gone 9-for-16 (.563) thru the first 4 games of this road trip, while hitting at a .500 clip (13-for-26) during his 7-game hitting streak, which is one shy of his career best set in 2009 with Milwaukee...Escobar has also swiped 3 bases during the streak to raise his season total to 9, just one shy of his career high established last year.

PUCETAS ASSIGNED TO OMAHA--Righthanded pitcher Kevin Pucetas, who was designated for assignment on June 10, has cleared waivers and been assigned outright Omaha (AAA)...the Major League roster remains at 40.

YOUNG SQUAD GETTING YOUNGER--The Royals opened the year with the youngest roster in baseball but on Friday the ninth rookie on the active roster got his big league initiation when Mike Moustakas arrived from AAA...Moose joined a roster that also includes rookies Eric Hosmer, Nate Adcock, Louis Coleman, Tim Collins, Aaron Crow, Danny Duffy, Greg Holland and Everett Teaford...in up-to-the-minute information from the Elias Sports Bureau, the Royals have the youngest active roster in the Majors by nearly a year and a half at 26 years, 151 days (Florida is 27 years, 326 days).

PEN SHOWING IMPROVEMENTS--Kansas City's youthful relief corps consisting of 6 rookie hurlers, is well ahead of the pen of a year ago, as this year's group has compiled a 14-11 record and 3.74 ERA in 65 games while holding opposing hitters to a collective .239 batting average...after the same number of games a season ago, the pen had a 4.15 ERA, a 10-12 ledger and opponents BA of .264...in recent work, KC relievers have allowed just 3 earned runs in its last 12.2 innings.

STARTERS ALSO ON A ROLL--The last lap through the starting rotation has produced a 4-0 record in 5 games with a 2.30 ERA...dating back to last Thursday's win at home over the Jays, the rotation has allowed no more than 2 earned runs in any of the games, totaling 8 earnings over 31.1 innings.

ON THE RUN AGAIN--With three stolen bases last night and five in the last two games, the Royals have reassumed the top spot in the Major League stolen base race with 66, two up on both the Texas Rangers in the A.L. and New York Mets, the N.L. leaders...Kansas City is way ahead of its running pace of a season ago when the club pilfered just 43 bags through the first 67 games...KC is currently on a pace to steal 159 bases which would be the highest total since the '96 club stole 195.

HOLLAND FINALLY SCORED UPON--The leadoff single by Hideki Matsui in the eighth inning last night snapped Greg Holland's streak of consecutive batters retired at 11, spanning 3 appearances...later in the eighth inning, the A's plated a pair of runs, one of which was earned, for the first tally Holland has surrendered since joining the club on May 19, spanning 10 appearances...despite the run scored last night, he has held opponents to a .157 average (8-for-51).

NED AT THE HELM--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he has a lifetime mark of 542-611, including a 85-109 ledger with the Royals...a catcher during his playing days, his coaching career began in the Atlanta organization, including 12 seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
