### A's vs. GIANTS

The A's trail in the season series 0-3 as they were swept in a three-game series in San Francisco in May...now have a six-game losing streak against the Giants, which is the longest in Oakland history against San Francisco...the two clubs split the season series last year 3-3 with each team sweeping a three-game series in its home ballpark...in the previous 14 season series, the A's have won four, the Giants two and the clubs have split the season series eight times...the A's are 42-41 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 23-17 in Oakland and 19-24 in San Francisco.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Bob Melvin** is the second manager in Oakland history who also played for the San Francisco Giants (1986-88)...the other was Jim Marshall, who played for the Giants in 1960-61 and managed the A's in 1979...Alvin Dark, who managed Oakland in 1974-75, played for the New York Giants (1951-56).

**Joey Devine** has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 75-game, 73.2-inning, 297-batter homerless streak.

**Hideki Matsui** has 499 career home runs between the Japan and the United States.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1967** the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in **1988** Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the this three game series with the Rangers...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight but have lost 13 of the last 16 games...are 30-40 (.429) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 28-39) and tied for fourth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 8-20 (.286) since then, which is the second worst record in the Majors (Florida, 8-21)...have spent each of the last 18 days and 25 of the last 26 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 29 days in fourth...had a season-high 10-game losing streak from May 30 to June 9...that matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history and it was the longest since July 28-August 7, 2008 when they also lost 10 straight.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 0-3 in interleague play as they were swept by the Giants in May...will play their next 15 games against the National League...after this three-game series with San Francisco, the A's travel to New York and Philadelphia before returning home to face Florida and Arizona...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 13-26 (.333) over the last three years, which is tied with Cleveland, Houston and Washington for the worst mark in the majors...however, are 136-115 (.542) all-time, which is the eighth best record.

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 3-11 (.214) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Florida, 1-15)...have a 4.99 ERA (68 er in 122.2 ip) this month, which is third highest in the American League...also have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.284) and are tied for the fourth most home runs (14)...the offense is batting .230 (109 for 473), which is fourth lowest in the AL...are tied for the third fewest home runs (7).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Gio Gonzalez struck out 10 batters yesterday after A's starting pitchers combined to strikeout just nine over the previous six games...A's starting pitchers have picked up the win in each of the last two games after going 0-11 over a 14-game stretch from May 30 to June 14...the 11-game losing streak was second longest in Oakland history to a 13-game streak from July 29-Aug. 12, 1977...the 14-game streak without a win matched the fifth longest in Oakland history...starters are now 2-11 with a 6.41 ERA (62 er in 87.0 ip), .297 (102 for 343) opponents batting average, 45 walks and 49 strikeouts over the past 16 games...are 23-26 with a 3.39 ERA (162 er in 430.1 ip) for the season...have the second lowest ERA in the American League (Seattle, 3.38)...have allowed 14 home runs in the last 16 games after yielding 18 over the first 54 contests...have allowed 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.362) but have issued the third most walks (155).

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff had 16 strikeouts yesterday, the 10<sup>th</sup> game of 16 or more strikeouts in Oakland history...it was just the fifth time it happened in a nine-inning game...have a 3.38 ERA, which **leads the American League**...have allowed 17 home runs in the last 16 games but have surrendered just 46 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.358)...have a Major League leading 14 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 52 of 80 (65.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 28 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have hit just 38 home runs, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 88 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 254 runs, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.239) and slugging percentage (.347) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.306)...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for third most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last seven games (nine errors total)...have 54 for the season, which is the **most in the American League** and third most in the majors...the errors have led to 36 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors to Houston (39)...12 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (81).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 16-16 at home for the season...after this series, the A's begin a six-game interleague road trip to New York (three games) and Philadelphia (three games)...went 1-9 on the last road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-3), matching the worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 Aug. 1-10, 2008 and May 12-21, 1981...have now lost 15 of the last 18 road games and are 14-24 (.368) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Kansas City, 9-19)...are batting .252 (269 for 1069) with 128 runs scored in 32 home games (4.00 per game) and .228 (297 for 1301) with 126 runs scored in 38 games on the road (3.32 per game).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 9-15 (.375) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League (Texas, 7-12)...are 5-8 (.385) in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games and have the second most losses...the 13 extra-inning games are already two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season and the losses are their most since going 3-10 in 2009...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 8-16 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make the second appearance and start of his Major League career...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento a week ago today and made his Major League debut that night at Chicago...was the 42<sup>nd</sup> pitcher in Oakland history to make a start in his debut.

**LAST START:** Had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-5 A's win at Chicago a week ago today...allowed nine hits, which are the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since April 10, 1983 when Bill Krueger yielded nine at California...allowed a two-out two-run home run to Konerko in the first and then loaded the bases before striking out Beckham for his first strikeout...blanked the White Sox on three hits over the next three innings but was charged with three runs in the fifth...was relieved by Wuertz with one out in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2 and Wuertz allowed an inherited runner to score...the A's then scored four times in the ninth for the win.

**GODFREY vs. SAN FRANCISCO:** Is making his first career appearance and start.

## 2011 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:

Combined for a 7-1 record, a 2.32 ERA and a .221 opponents batting average in 10 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...began the year with the Rockhounds and had a no decision April 7 against Arkansas (4.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 6 so) before he was promoted to Sacramento...went 7-1 with a 2.50 ERA in nine starts with the River Cats...combined to allow just two home runs in 54.1 innings...struck out 51 and walked 15...his teams were 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignment...tossed six or more innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed three runs or fewer in all 10 starts and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Was leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA (2.50) and winning percentage (.875) and was tied for the league lead in wins (7) at the time of his promotion...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.222).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .221 opponents batting average included a .188 (18 for 96) mark against left-handed hitters and .250 (27 for 108) against right-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to righties...opponents were 10 for 50 (.200) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.273 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed a .189 (21 for 111) average with the bases empty and .286 (14 for 49) with runners in scoring position...both of his home runs were solo shots.

**INNING BY INNING:** Allowed seven of his 18 runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip)...compiled a 1.62 ERA (8 er in 44.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents hit .273 (33 for 121) over the first three innings and .146 (12 for 82) after that.

**DISABLED LIST:** Was placed on Sacramento's disabled list effective May 6 with a sprained right wrist...was reinstated May 19.

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the season with two no decisions: one with Midland and one with Sacramento...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high seven hits in his first start with the River Cats, April 12 against Las Vegas...then tossed a season-high 7.0 innings April 17 at Tacoma for his first win...that began a four-game winning streak that ran from April 17 to May 5...posted a 1.82 ERA and allowed a .186 opponents average during the streak...had his first of three seven-strikeout games April 23 against Tucson...matched the strikeout total May 5 against Salt Lake...surrendered his only two home runs and tossed a season-low 3.2 innings in his only loss in his first start after returning from the DL, May 19 against Oklahoma City...allowed a season-high tying three runs in that start...then went 3-0 with a 2.12 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his final three starts...walked three batters in a 3-2 win over New Orleans May 24, his only outing of the season with more than two walks...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in the second game of a doubleheader at Reno May 29.

**MINOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Was 33-32 with a 4.20 ERA (278 er in 590.0 ip) in 119 career minor league appearances, including 103 starts, over five seasons...allowed just 42 home runs in 590.2 innings, an average of 0.64 per nine innings...was originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 34<sup>th</sup> round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to the A's with pitcher Kristian Bell for infielder Marco Scutaro, Nov. 18, 2007.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Guillermo Moscoso (2-3, 3.91 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season...is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two relief appearances...has allowed a .196 batting average against right-handed hitters and .280 against left-handers...has made one career interleague appearance and it came in relief June 13, 2009 against Los Angeles-NL (1.0 ip, 1 h)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Chicago last Sunday (6.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 after going...3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts, with the River Cats...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings and allowed just 13 walks and one home run.

**Save/Save Opportunities: 15/23 (65.2%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed 19 runs in 45.0 innings (3.80 ERA) over its past 13 games after surrendering one run in 19.2 innings (0.46 ERA) over its previous six games...ranks third in the American League with a 3.36 ERA overall...is tied for second in the AL in losses (14) and tied for second fewest in wins (7)...is also tied for fifth in strikeouts (169) and ranks sixth in innings pitched (198.0)...is 15 for 23 (65.2%) in save opportunities this season...the 23 save opportunities and eight blown saves are both tied for fifth fewest...has allowed 14 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...is second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.308), fourth in slugging percentage (.350) and fifth in batting average (.239)...has allowed 31 of 87 inherited runners to score (35.6%), which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Pitched a perfect ninth inning Wednesday for his second save of the season.
- Has not allowed a run in five of six appearances (1 er in 6.0 ip, 1.50 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has not allowed a run and has converted each of his two save opportunities in three career appearances against San Francisco (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season...the A's are 2-2 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings twice, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA (10 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 and won each of his first two starts...had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2 and pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...matched his career high with three strikeouts in 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4<sup>th</sup>...is 0-2 with a 4.76 ERA (6 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts since then.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .196 (9 for 46) batting average against right-handed hitters and .280 (14 for 50) against left-handers...opponents are batting .283 (13 for 46) with the bases empty and .200 (10 for 50) with runners on base...including .167 (3 for 18) with runners in scoring position...has held the opposition to a .196 (9 for 46) batting average the first time through the lineup and .280 (14 for 50) after that.

**VENEZUELA:** Is the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
