A's vs. GIANTS

The A's trail in the season series 1-3...won the first game in Oakland last night after being swept in a three-game series in San Francisco in May...the win last night snapped the A's sixgame losing streak against the Giants, which was the longest in Oakland history against San Francisco...the A's have a fourgame winning streak in Oakland and the Giants have a nine-game winning streak in Oakland and the Giants have a nine-game winning streak in San Francisco...the two clubs split the season series last year 3-3 with each team sweeping a three-game series in its home ballpark...in the previous 14 season series, the A's have won four, the Giants two and the clubs have split the season series eight times...the A's are 43-41 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 24-17 in Oakland and 19-24 in San Francisco.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 75-game, 73.2-inning, 297batter homerless streak.

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between the Japan and the United States.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 150-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1984** Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in **1993** the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9...trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, which is one short of the longest winning streak of the season (4, May 26 to 29)...however, have lost 13 of the last 17 games and are 31-40 (.437) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 29-39) and tied for fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 9-20 (.310) since then, which is the second worst record in the Majors (Florida, 8-22)...have spent each of the last 19 days and 26 of the last 27 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 30 days in fourth...had a season-high 10-game losing streak from May 30 to June 9...that matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history and it was the longest since July 28-August 7, 2008 when they also lost 10 straight.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-3 in interleague play, all against San Francisco...will play their next 14 games against the National League...after this series with San Francisco, the A's travel to New York and Philadelphia before returning home to face Florida and Arizona...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 14-26 (.350) over the last three years, which is tied for the second worst mark in the majors (Houston, 11-22)...however, are 137-115 (.544) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

IN JUNE: The A's are 4-11 (.267) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the majors (Florida, 1-16)...have a 4.72 ERA (69 er in 131.2 ip) this month, which is fourth highest in the American League...also have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.277)...the offense is batting .233 (117 for 502), which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the third fewest home runs (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 er in 20.0 ip), .208 (15 for 72) opponents batting average, four walks and 15 strikeouts over the last three games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...the 11-game losing streak was second longest in Oakland history to a 13-game streak from July 29-Aug. 12, 1977...the 14-game streak without a win matched the fifth longest in Oakland history...starters are now 24-26 with a 3.35 ERA (163 er in 437.1 ip) for the season...have the lowest ERA in the American League (Seattle, 3.36) and the third lowest in the majors...have allowed 15 home runs in the last 17 games after yielding 18 over the first 54 contests...have allowed 33 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.363) but have issued the third most walks (155).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the American League** and rank fifth in the majors with a 3.35 ERA...have allowed 18 home runs in the last 17 games but have surrendered just 47 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors (.358)...have a Major League leading 14 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 52 of 80 (65.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...the 28 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit just 38 home runs, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 87 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 259 runs, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.239) and slugging percentage (.347) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.308)...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in a season-high tying eight consecutive games (10 errors total)...have 55 for the season, which is the **most in the American League** and third most in the majors...the errors have led to 37 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors to Houston (40)...12 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (81).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (1-0)...went 3-3 on the last homestand and are 17-16 at home for the season...after this series, the A's begin a six-game interleague road trip to New York (three games) and Philadelphia (three games)...went 1-9 on the last road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-3), matching the worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 Aug. 1-10, 2008 and May 12-21, 1981...have now lost 15 of the last 18 road games and are 14-24 (.368) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Kansas City, 10-19)...are batting .252 (277 for 1098) with 133 runs scored in 33 home games (4.03 per game) and .228 (297 for 1301) with 126 runs scored in 38 games on the road (3.32 per game).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 9-15 (.375) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League (Texas, 7-12)...are 5-8 (.385) in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games and have the second most losses...the 13 extra-inning games are already two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season and the losses are their most since going 3-10 in 2009...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 8-16 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-13 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ellis, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season...the A's are 2-2 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings twice, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA (10 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts

and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 and won each of his first two starts...had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2 and pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...matched his career high with three strikeouts in 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th...is 0-2 with a 4.76 ERA (6 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .196 (9 for 46) batting average against right-handed hitters and .280 (14 for 50) against left-handers...opponents are batting .283 (13 for 46) with the bases empty and .200 (10 for 50) with runners on base...including .167 (3 for 18) with runners in scoring position...has held the opposition to a .196 (9 for 46) batting average the first time through the lineup and .280 (14 for 50) after that.

INTERLEAGUE: Has made one career interleague appearance and it came in relief June 13, 2009 against Los Angeles-NL (1.0 ip, 1 h).

FIRST START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and matched his career high with three strikeouts...did not allow a run and just three runners advanced into scoring position.

SECOND START: Won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...allowed four runs on five hits in 5.0 innings...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero...the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

THIRD START: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore June 7...allowed a lead-off home runs to Hardy in the bottom of the first and Scott in the bottom of the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.0 innings...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago last Sunday...had career highs in innings pitched (6.1), hits (6), runs (5) and walks (4)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the White Sox on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a three-run home run to Dunn in the fourth...the A's tied the game with single runs in the sixth and seventh and he put runners on first and second with a pair of walks in the seventh...was relieved by Balfour who allowed both of the inherited runners to score.

MOSCOSO vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is making his first career appearance and start.

VENEZUELA: Is the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

THE FIRST TWO INNINGS: Allowed 13 of his 19 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) and .302 (19 for 63) opponents batting average...had a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) and .183 (17 for 93) opponents average from the third inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .231 opponents average broke down to .216 (16 for 74) against left-handed hitters and .244 (20 for 82) against right-handers...surrendered his only home run and issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...allowed a .236 (21 for 89) average with the bases empty and .308 (12 for 39) with runners in scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (6-5, 3.42 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...is 0-5 with a 5.67 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high...has allowed 23 runs in his last five starts (7.43 ERA) after allowing 15 runs over his first 10 starts (1.79 ERA)...is 3-3 with a 2.62 ERA in seven starts at home and 3-2 with a 4.18 ERA in eight starts on the road...is now 21-13 with a 3.15 ERA in 40 career starts in Oakland and 13-13 with a 4.35 ERA in 37 starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss to Kansas City on Tuesday (4.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 7 bb, 0 so)...had a no decision in his only interleague start this year on May 20 against San Francisco (6.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so) and is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA in three career starts against the Giants...is 5-2 with a 2.93 ERA in nine career interleague starts.

chicago **May 15** in Oakland...that shapped his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...allowed four runs to snap a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...allowed three runs in the second and three more in the third.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
