A's vs. METS

The A's trail in the all-time series 3-4...won two of three in Oakland in 2005 and are now 1-3 in New York...snapped their four-game losing streak against the Mets with last night's win...the two clubs also met in the 1973 World Series, which the A's won in seven games.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 56 games in the outfield and now has a 297game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 76-game, 74.2-inning, 302-batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes saved the 199th game of his career Sunday, which is the most among active lefthanders...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500... is 10 for 32 (.313) with 10 walks, three home runs and 10 RBI over his past 11 games.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 153-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first threehomer inning in Oakland history...in **1979**, 12 days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park grand slam, Larry Murray hits an insidethe-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high six-game winning streak...have not won more than six in a row since Sept. 14-20, 2009 when they won seven straight...the winning streak follows a stretch where the A's lost 13 of 14...including 10 straight from May 30-June 9, which matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history...are 34-40 (.459) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League, but are just 5½ games out of first place in the AL West...were in a tie for first place in the West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 12-20 (.375) since then, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 11-21)...have spent each of the last 23 days and 30 of the last 31 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 34 days in fourth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-3 in interleague play this season...went 3-3 against San Francisco and are 1-0 against New York following last night's win...after this series, continue the road trip by traveling to Philadelphia before returning home to face Florida and Arizona...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 17-26 (.395) over the last three years, which is tied for the sixth worst mark in the majors...however, are 140-115 (.549) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 8 with two strikeouts and a sacrifice hit this year and now have a .089 (23 for 257) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 113 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span (Toronto, .093)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip through New York (1-0) and Philadelphia (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...the homestand followed a 1-9 road trip to Boston (0-3), Baltimore (0-3) and Chicago (1-3), matching the worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 Aug. 1-10, 2008 and May 12-21, 1981...have won five straight home games but have lost 15 of the last 19 on the road...are 19-16 at home and 14-25 on the road...have the second worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 10-21)...are batting .250 (289 for 1156) with 139 runs scored in 35 home games (3.97 per game) and .230 (307 for 1334) with 133 runs scored in 39 games on the road (3.41 per game).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-0 with a 1.16 ERA (5 er in 38.2 ip), .193 (27 for 140) opponents batting average, 10 walks and 27 strikeouts over the last six games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...the 11-game losing streak was second longest in Oakland history to a 13-game streak from July 29-Aug. 12, 1977...the 14-game streak without a win matched the fifth longest in Oakland history...starters are now 26-26 with a 3.28 ERA (164 er in 450.0 ip) for the season...the ERA is tied with Seattle for the **lowest in the American League** and is tied for second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.11)...have allowed 16 home runs in the last 20 games after yielding 18 over the first 54 contests...have allowed 34 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359) but have issued the third most walks (161).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.50 ERA (9 er in 54.0 ip) over the last six games after posting 5.70 ERA over the previous 13 contests...**lead the American League** and rank third in the majors with a 3.25 ERA for the season...have allowed two home runs over the last seven games and 48 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors (.354)...have a Major League leading 15 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 52 of 80 (65.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the AL...the 28 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 25 games, which matches the third longest such streak in Oakland history...have 39 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 85 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 272 runs, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.239) and slugging percentage (.347) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.309).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one or more errors in 10 of their past 11 games (13 errors total) and have 58 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 59)...the errors have led to 40 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors to Houston (42)...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (82).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-15 (.400) in one-run games this season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Texas, 9-12)...are 5-8 (.385) in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games and have the second most losses...the 13 extra-inning games are already two more than the A's total for the entire 2010 season and the losses are their most since going 3-10 in 2009...10 of the extra-inning games have gone 10 innings, one lasted 11, one lasted 12 and the season-high is 14...are 9-16 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-13 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 96 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season...the A's are 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 37-34 (.522) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 11 of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.69)...is sixth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.48) but is tied for second in most walks (42)...has allowed just six home runs and his average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings is 10^{th} lowest...has the lowest opponents average with runners in scoring position (.149) and the seventh lowest

opponents slugging percentage (.332)...also ranks tied for sixth in wild pitches (6) and hit batters (6) and both figures are already career highs.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Snapped a three-game losing streak with a win in his last start and is now 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) and .253 (24 for 95) opponents batting average in four starts in June...is 2-7 with a 4.46 ERA (34 er in 68.2 ip) in 12 career starts in the month...went 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Had a no decision in his only interleague start this year May 22 at San Francisco (6.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1.35 ERA)...is now 1-3 with a 3.46 ERA (16 er in 41.2 ip) in seven career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 2 with a strikeout and a sacrifice hit against the Giants earlier this year and is now 0 for 6 with four strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.23 ERA (12 er in 48.1 ip) and .218 (38 for 174) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip) and .250 (37 for 148) average in six starts during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 2-4 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five or more days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer 10 of his 14 starts...has just seven runs of support in his five losses this year (29.2 ip, 2.12 RSA) and 25 runs of support in his 25 career losses (123.2 ip, 1.82 RSA)...is 24-1 in 33 career starts with run support of three or more and 4-24 in 38 starts with support of two or fewer.

2011 START-BY-START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota April 9...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start ...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston *April 20...*gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 decision at Los Angeles *April* 25...surrendered two runs in the second and two more in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory over Texas May 1 in Oakland...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City May 6...allowed single runs in the first and third and the A's scored three times in the fifth for the win...had his scheduled start May 11 at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...did not allow a runner past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss May 22 at San Francisco...had a 3-2 lead when he was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh...however, Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore May 27 in Oakland...walked in a run in the second inning and allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to New York June 1 in Oakland ... allowed a RBI double to Rodriguez in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...then surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...was relieved by Devine with one out in the seventh inning and the A's trailing 4-2...dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Baltimore **June 6**...allowed a RBI single to Guerrero in the first inning and three more runs in the second...Wieters and Markakis had RBI singles and Reimold added a sacrifice fly...then shutout the Orioles on three hits over his final five innings but the A's were held to just two runs by Matusz and he left after seven innings trailing 4-2...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago June 11...issued a career-high seven walks in 5.1 innings...also had an intentional walk, a home run, two wild pitches, a hit batter and a balk and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to have at least one of each of those in one game ... the scored was tied at 2-2 when he issued a one-out walk to Lillibridge in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler, who allowed the run to score.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win over Kansas City last Thursday in Oakland...struck out 10 batters in just 6.0 innings, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...shutout the Royals on one hit and two walks over the first four innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed two runs on a Cabrera RBI single and a Francouer RBI double but then struck out three of the final four batters he faced.

GONZALEZ vs. NEW YORK: Is making his first career appearance.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Graham Godfrey (1-0, 4.76 ERA): Is scheduled to make the third appearance and start of his Major League career...has allowed a .313 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .182 (4 for 22) against left-handed hitters and .423 (11 for 26) against right-handers...had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-5 A's win at Chicago June 10...allowed nine hits, which are the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since April 10, 1983 when Bill Krueger yielded nine at California...he was credited with the first win of his Major League career in the A's 5-2 win over San Francisco last Friday in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Ross in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow over his first five innings.

8-14, 3.24 ERA (208.1 ip, 181 h, 91 r, 75 er, 78 bb, 181 so, 14 hr) The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in eight of its past 10 games (7 er in 29.0 ip, 2.17 ERA) and now has a 3.24 ERA for the season Save/Save Opportunities: 19/27 (70.4%) which ranks third in the American League...also has the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306), third lowest slugging percentage (.345) and is tied for the third lowest batting average (.234)...is tied for second in losses (14) and tied for second fewest in wins (8)...has allowed 14 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest, and issued 75 walks, which is tied for third fewest...have a league-leading 51 first batter strikeouts.

- Pitched a scoreless ninth inning Saturday night for his fourth save of the season...has converted his past four save chances after being charged with a blown save in his first opportunity this season.
- Has not allowed a run in seven of eight appearances (1 er in 8.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has never faced the Mets in his career.
- Has not allowed a run in two interleague appearances (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so) and has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in 18 career outings against the National League.
- Made four rehab appearances with Triple-A Sacramento and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his past 10 appearances (1 er in 10.0 ip, 0.90 ERA)...has a 1.13 ERA (1 er in 8.0 ip) in eight games in June after posting a 3.07 ERA in May.
- Is tied for first among American League relievers in wins (4), tied for sixth in appearances (33), ranks eighth in strikeouts (35) and is tied for ninth in grounded into double plays (5).
- Has a 0.98 ERA (2 er in 18.1 ip) in 17 appearances at home compared to a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) in 16 appearances on the road
- Has a win and a save in three career outings against the Mets (4.2 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 6 so).

- Is tied for seventh among all AL pitchers in pickoffs (3).
- His opponents are batting .305 this season, which ranks seventh highest among American League relievers...the batting average includes a .400 (18 for 45) mark against left-handed hitters and .233 (14 for 60) against righties.
