A's vs. PHILLIES

The A's lead the all-time series, 5-4...won two of three in Oakland in both 2005 and 2008 and lost two of three in Philadelphia in 2003...the A's spent 54 seasons in Philadelphia from 1901-54 and won five World Series championships...have won four in Oakland and the nine World Championships are surpassed only by the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 57 games in the outfield and now has a 298-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 77-game, 75.2-inning, 307-batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes saved the 199th game of his career Sunday, which is the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 154-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

Jemile Weeks stole two bases yesterday, giving six in the first 15 games of his career...has reached six career steals in fewer games than any player in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1979** Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning a season-high six consecutive games (June 15-21)...that follows a stretch where the A's lost 13 of 14, including 10 straight from May 30-June 9, which matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history...are now 7-15 over the last 22 games and 34-42 (.447) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 12-22 (.353) since then, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 11-23)...are now six games behind Texas...have spent each of the last 25 days and 32 of the last 33 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 36 days in fourth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-5 (.444) in interleague play...went 3-3 against San Francisco and 1-2 against New York...return home following this three-game series with Philadelphia to conclude interleague play with a pair of three-game series against Florida and Arizona...are batting .207 (62 for 300), which is second lowest in the majors (Toronto, .205), but have a 1.92 ERA (18 er in 84.1 ip), which is third lowest...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 17-28 (.378) over the last three years, which is tied for the third worst mark in the majors...however, are 140-117 (.545) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 11 with three strikeouts and two sacrifice hits this year and now have a .088 (23 for 260) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 114 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span (Toronto, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-1 with a 1.40 ERA (8 er in 51.1 ip), .198 (37 for 187) opponents batting average, 13 walks, 39 strikeouts and two home runs over the last eight games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...are 26-27 with a 3.23 ERA (168 er in 468.2 ip) for the season...the ERA is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.18) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.1)...have allowed 34 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.356) but have issued the third most walks (164).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.69 ERA (14 er in 74.2 ip) over the last eight games after posting 5.70 ERA over the previous 13 contests...**lead the American League** and rank third in the majors with a 3.22 ERA for the season...have allowed two home runs over the last nine games and 48 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors (.352)...have a Major League leading 15 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 54 of 83 (65.1%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and second lowest in the majors...the 29 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 27 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 31 games from July 21-August 19, 1978...have 40 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 85 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 275 runs, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.343) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.306).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one or more errors in 12 of their past 13 games (16 errors total) and have a Major League leading 61 errors for the season...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank second in the American League in double plays (83).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (three games)...went 1-9 on the last road trip, matching the worst record on a trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...have now lost 17 of the last 21 on the road and are 15-26 (.366) for the season, which is second worst in the American League (Kansas City, 10-21)...return home following the game Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Florida (three games), Arizona (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...have won five straight home games and are 19-16 at home for the season...are batting .250 (289 for 1156) with 139 runs scored in 35 home games (3.97 per game) and .227 (320 for 1410) with 136 runs scored in 41 games on the road (3.32 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-16 (.385) in one-run games, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Atlanta, 16)...they are also the most extra inning games by the A's since they played extra frames 15 times in 2008...since 1997, the only time the A's had more than nine extra inning losses was in 2009 when they went 3-10...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-17 in games decided in the seventh inning or later this year, including 7-14 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 10 times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 97 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings twice, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 3.33 ERA (10 er in 27.0 ip) in five starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 and won each of his first two starts...had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2 and pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...matched his career high with three strikeouts in 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th...is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (6 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .273 (15 for 55) with the bases empty and .186 (11 for 59) with runners on base...including .130 (3 for 23) with runners in scoring position...has held the opposition to a .185 (10 for 54) batting average the first time through the lineup and .267 (16 for 60) after that.

INTERLEAGUE: Made his first interleague start of the season last Saturday against San Francisco, a no decision (4.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 3 bb, 1 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 5.2 ip) in two career interleague appearances, including one start.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just one run over the first three innings of a game for a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) and .148 (8 for 54) opponents batting average...has a 6.14 ERA (10 er in 14.2 ip) and .300 (18 for 60) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

FIRST START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and matched his career high with three strikeouts...did not allow a run and just three runners advanced into scoring position.

SECOND START: Won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...allowed four runs on five hits in 5.0 innings...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero...the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

THIRD START: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore June 7...allowed a lead-off home runs to Hardy in the bottom of the first and Scott in the bottom of the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.0 innings...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

FOURTH START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago last Sunday...had career highs in innings pitched (6.1), hits (6), runs (5) and walks (4)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the White Sox on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a three-run home run to Dunn in the fourth...the A's tied the game with single runs in the sixth and seventh and he put runners on first and second with a pair of walks in the seventh...was relieved by Balfour who allowed both of the inherited runners to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Giants on two hits over the first four innings and the scored was tied at 0-0 entering the fifth...allowed a single and a walk to start the inning and his own error allowed one of those runs to score...also yielded a sacrifice fly to Huff and was relieved by Ziegler with two outs and the A's trailing 2-0...Oakland then scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

MOSCOSO vs. PHILADELPHIA: Is making his first career appearance.

VENEZUELA: Is the first Venezuelan-born pitcher to start a game for the A's since Pablo Torrealba on September 30, 1977...Torrealba made 10 starts and 31 relief appearances for the A's that year but was 0-5 in his starting assignments...prior to Moscoso, the only Venezuelan to start and win a game for the Athletics was Roberto Rodriguez on August 27, 1967 against Detroit...Moscoso is the fourth Venezuelan to pitch for the A's (also Henry Rodriguez)...is one of 18 overall, a list which includes Tony Armas, Ramon Hernandez and Marco Scutaro...the first was Chico Carrasquel in 1958.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in five games, including two starts...opponents hit .283 (13 for 46)...both of his losses came in his two starting assignments on March 7 and 12 (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...had a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in his three relief appearances...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in four starts at home and 2-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in four games, three starts, on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: Was 2-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in five starts at night and 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in three games, two starts, during the day.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (7-5, 3.24 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...snapped his career-high five-game losing streak with a win in his last start, a 2-1 victory over San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is now 1-5 with a 4.91 ERA and .282 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...has allowed a .192 batting average with runners in scoring position, which is seventh lowest in the American League...is scheduled to pitch on five days rest tomorrow...is 4-4 with a 4.14 ERA in 11 starts on four days rest and 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA in two interleague starts this year and now has a four-game winning streak in interleague play (2.03 ERA, .171 opponents batting average)...is 6-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 10 career interleague starts...has never faced the Phillies in his career.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.19 ERA (9 er in 37.0 ip) over the last 12 games and has not allowed a home run...now has a 3.20 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.311) and slugging percentage (.346) and the fourth fewest home runs (14)...has the second most losses (15) and is tied for the second fewest wins (8)...has a league-leading 52 first batter strikeouts...has allowed 32 of 91 (35.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Pitched a scoreless ninth inning last Saturday night against San Francisco for his fourth save of the season...has converted his past four save chances after being charged with a blown save in his first opportunity this season.
- Has not allowed a run in seven of eight appearances (1 er in 8.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has never faced the Phillies in his career.
- Has not allowed a run in two interleague appearances (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so) and has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in 18 career outings against the National League.
- Made four rehab appearances with Triple-A Sacramento and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Is tied for first among American League relievers in wins (4), tied for sixth in appearances (33) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (35) and grounded into double plays (5).
- Has a 0.98 ERA (2 er in 18.1 ip) in 17 appearances at home compared to a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) in 16 appearances on the road
- Faced the Phillies once in his career June 25, 2009 (1.2 ip, 1 h, 2 so).
- Has a 3.38 ERA (2 er in 5.1 ip) in five interleague outings this year and has a 0.95 ERA (4 er in 38.0 ip) in 32 career appearances.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...the A's are 7-9 (.438) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-35 (.551) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 16 starts, allowed one run or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his career-high five-game losing streak with a win in his last start...posted a 5.67 ERA and .302 opponents batting average during the losing streak...is now 1-5 with a 4.91 ERA (26 er in 47.2 ip) and .282 (50 for 177) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in most stolen bases allowed (16) and ranks **third** in walks (42) and wild pitches (9)...the nine wild pitches are already the most by an Athletic since Dan Haren had 10 in 2007.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
