A's vs. PHILLIES

The all-time series is tied at five wins each...the A's are 1-3 in Philadelphia following last night's loss and are 4-2 in Oakland...the A's spent 54 seasons in Philadelphia from 1901-54 and won five World Series championships...have won four in Oakland and the nine World Championships are surpassed only by the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 58 games in the outfield and now has a 299-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 78-game, 76.2-inning, 312-batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes saved the 199th game of his career Sunday, which is the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 155-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

Jemile Weeks has recorded 18 hits after the first 16 games of his career, which is tied for fifth most in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1996 Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add No. 301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning a season-high six consecutive games (June 15-21)...that follows a stretch where the A's lost 13 of 14, including 10 straight from May 30-June 9, which matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history...are now 7-16 over the last 23 games and 34-43 (.442) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 12-23 (.343) since then, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 11-24)...are now seven games behind Texas...have spent each of the last 26 days and 33 of the last 34 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 37 days in fourth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-6 (.400) in interleague play...went 3-3 against San Francisco, 1-2 against New York and are now 0-1 against Philadelphia following last night's loss...return home following this three-game series to conclude interleague play with a pair of three-game series against Florida and Arizona...are batting .195 (64 for 328), which is the lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, .199), but have a 1.84 ERA (19 er in 93.0 ip), which is third lowest...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 17-29 (.370) over the last three years, which is tied for the second worst mark in the majors...however, are 140-118 (.543) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 13 with five strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year and now have a .088 (23 for 262) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 116 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span (Toronto, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-1 with a 1.23 ERA (8 er in 58.1 ip), .186 (39 for 210) opponents batting average, 16 walks, 41 strikeouts and two home runs over the last nine games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...are 26-27 with a 3.18 ERA (168 er in 468.2 ip) for the season...the ERA is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.15) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.07)...have allowed 34 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are tied for the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.352) but have issued the third most walks (167).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.62 ERA (15 er in 83.1 ip) over the last nine games after posting 5.70 ERA over the previous 13 contests...**lead the American League** and rank third in the majors with a 3.19 ERA for the season...have allowed two home runs over the last 10 games and 48 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors (.350)...have a Major League leading 15 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 54 of 83 (65.1%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the lowest percentage in the AL and tied for second lowest in the majors...the 29 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 28 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 31 games from July 21-August 19, 1978...have 40 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 84 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 275 runs, which is second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.341) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.305).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one or more errors in 12 of their past 14 games (16 errors total) and have a Major League leading 61 errors for the season...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...are tied for second in the American League in double plays (83).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (0-1)...went 1-9 on the last road trip, matching the worst record on a trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...have now lost 18 of the last 22 on the road and are 15-27 (.357) for the season, which is second worst in the American League (Kansas City, 10-21)...return home following the game Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Florida (three games), Arizona (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...have won five straight home games and are 19-16 at home for the season...are batting .250 (289 for 1156) with 139 runs scored in 35 home games (3.97 per game) and .224 (322 for 1438) with 136 runs scored in 42 games on the road (3.24 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-17 (.370) in one-run games, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is tied for the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Atlanta, 16)...they are also the most extra inning games by the A's since they played extra frames 15 times in 2008...since 1997, the only time the A's had more than nine extra inning losses was in 2009 when they went 3-10...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later this year, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7)...last year, the A's had just two wins when trailing after seven innings the entire season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 10 times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 97 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...the A's are 7-9 (.438) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-35 (.551) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 16 starts, allowed one run or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his career-high five-game losing streak with a win in his last start...posted a 5.67 ERA and .302 opponents batting average during the losing streak...is now 1-5 with a 4.91 ERA (26 er in 47.2 ip) and .282 (50 for 177) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in most stolen bases allowed (16), ranks third in wild pitches (9) and is tied for fourth in walks (42)...nine wild pitches are already the most by an Athletic since Dan Haren had 10 in 2007.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .192 (15 for 78) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth lowest in the American League...opponents hit .114 with RISP over his first eight starts but are 11 for 43 (.256) over his last eight...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .165 (13 for 79) average...has allowed nine home runs and six have been solo shots.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 13 so) in two interleague starts this year...now has a four-game winning streak in interleague play and has a 2.03 ERA (9 er in 40.0 ip) and .171 (24 for 140) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans six starts and dates back to May 21, 2010...is 6-2 with a 2.70 ERA (19 er in 63.1 ip) in 10 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 2 against San Francisco earlier this year and is now 1 for 7 (.143) with a strikeout, a run scored and two sacrifice hits in his career...the hit came on June 17, 2009 at Los Angeles, a single off Hiroki Kuroda in the third inning.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.14 ERA (31 er in 67.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest and 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (5 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 2.39 ERA (14 er in 52.2 ip) in eight starts at home and 3-2 with a 4.18 ERA (22 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on the road...is now 22-13 with a 3.09 ERA (90 er in 262.1 ip) in 41 career starts in Oakland and 13-13 with a 4.35 ERA (103 er in 213.0 ip) in 37 starts on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed four runs in the first inning over his last five starts after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...allowed just five runs in the first inning all last year for a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip).

WINS: Is 25-12 with a 2.93 ERA (95 er in 291.2 ip) and .227 (239 for 1055) opponents batting average in 45 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fifth most in the majors over that span...the A's are 28-17 (.622) in games started by Trevor Cahill since May 1 of last year and 75-95 (.441) with all other pitchers...is 35-26 (.574) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9**...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...that snapped his season-opening winning streak at six games...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...allowed four runs to snap a streak of five consecutive starts with one run or fewer, which fell one short of the Oakland record of six...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...allowed three runs in the second and three more in the third...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout...the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle...allowed single runs in the second and fourth inning on ground outs and then yielded a two-run double to Butler in the fifth inning

LAST START: He snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 2-1 win over San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 118 pitches...allowed a RBI double to Rowand in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in eight innings...retired 16 of the final 17 hitters he faced, allowing just a leadoff infield single to Ross in the seventh inning...the A's scored once in the sixth and once in the eighth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Josh Outman (3-1, 2.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) and .182 (8 for 44) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA and .259 average over his first four starts...has allowed a .200 (6 for 30) batting average against left-handed hitters and .242 (23 for 95) against right-handers...has not issued any of his 13 walks to left-handers for a .194 on-base percentage...won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win at New York on Tuesday...blanked the Mets on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...will be making his first career appearance against Philadelphia...is 2-1 with a 3.52 ERA (21.1 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 8 so) in four career interleague appearances, all starts.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.33 ERA (10 er in 38.2 ip) over the last 13 games and has not allowed a home run...now has a 3.22 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.345) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.313)...has allowed 14 home runs, which ranks fourth fewest...is tied for the most losses (16) and is tied for the second fewest wins (8)...has a league-leading 52 first batter strikeouts...has allowed 32 of 91 (35.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Pitched a scoreless ninth inning a week ago tonight against San Francisco for his fourth save of the season...has converted his past four save chances after being charged with a blown save in his first opportunity this season.
- Has not allowed a run in seven of eight appearances (1 er in 8.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has never faced the Phillies in his career.
- Has not allowed a run in two interleague appearances (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so) and has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in 18 career outings against the National League.
