A's vs. PHILLIES

The A's lead the all-time series, 6-5...the A's are 2-3 in Philadelphia following last night's win and are 4-2 in Oakland...the A's spent 54 seasons in Philadelphia from 1901-54 and won five World Series championships...have won four in Oakland and the nine World Championships are surpassed only by the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 58 games in the outfield and now has a 299-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 78-game, 76.2-inning, 312-batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes saved the 199th game of his career last Sunday, which is the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 155-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder.

Jemile Weeks has recorded 21 hits after the first 17 games of his career, which is tied for third most in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958**, Hector Lopez hits three home runs in the A's 8-6, 12-inning win over Washington... in **1997**, Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial.

ABOUT THE A'S

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped a three-game losing streak last night, and have now won seven of their last 10 games...prior to the three losses, had reeled off a season-high six consecutive wins (June 15-21)...that win streak followed a stretch where the A's lost 13 of 14, including 10 straight from May 30-June 9, which matched the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history...are now 8-16 over the last 24 games and 35-43 (.449) overall, which is the third worst record in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 13-23 (.361) since then, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 12-24)...are now six games behind Texas...have spent each of the last 27 days and 34 of the last 35 in sole possession of last place in the AL West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 38 days in fourth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-6 (.455) in interleague play...went 3-3 against San Francisco, 1-2 against New York and are now 1-1 against Philadelphia following last night's win...return home after this three-game series to conclude interleague play with a pair of three-game series against Florida and Arizona...are batting .204 (74 for 363), which is the lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, .191), but have a 1.76 ERA (20 er in 102.0 ip), which is second lowest (Seattle, 1.40)...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 18-29 (.383) over the last three years, which is the third worst mark in the majors...however, are 141-118 (.544) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 16 with seven strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year and now have a .087 (23 for 265) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 118 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an American League team over that span ...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston and Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-1 with a 1.23 ERA (9 er in 66.0 ip), .178 (42 for 236) opponents batting average, 19 walks, 47 strikeouts and two home runs over the last 10 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...are 27-27 with a 3.15 ERA (169 er in 483.1 ip) for the season...the ERA is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.06)...have allowed 34 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...own the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.349) but have issued the third most walks (170).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.56 ERA (16 er in 92.1 ip) over the last 10 games after posting a 5.70 ERA over the previous 13 contests...**lead the American League** and rank third in the majors with a 3.16 ERA for the season...have allowed two home runs over the last 11 games and 48 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and third lowest in the majors (.348)...have a Major League-leading 15 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 54 of 83 (65.1%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the 29 caught stealings are the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 29 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 31 games from July 21-August 19, 1978...have 41 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 85 home runs...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored 279 runs, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.342) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.305).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one or more errors in 12 of their past 15 games (16 errors total) and have 61 errors for the season, tied for the Major League lead (Houston, Texas)...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL and majors in double plays (84).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-1)...went 1-9 on the last road trip, matching the worst record on a trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...have now lost 18 of the last 23 on the road and are 16-27 (.372) for the season, which is second worst in the American League (Kansas City, 10-21)...return home following the game Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Florida (three games), Arizona (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...have won five straight home games and are 19-16 at home for the season...are batting .250 (289 for 1156) with 139 runs scored in 35 home games (3.97 per game) and .225 (332 for 1473) with 140 runs scored in 43 games on the road (3.26 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Washington, .223).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-17 (.370) in one-run games, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is tied for the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Atlanta, 16)...they are also the most extra inning games by the A's since they played extra frames 15 times in 2008...since 1997, the only time the A's had more than nine extra inning losses was in 2009 when they went 3-10...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later this year, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 10 times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 97 times since the start of 2007...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history (25 in 2008).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...the A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 12-10 (.545) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in five of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

TWO STRAIGHT: Is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) and .182 (8 for 44) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA and .259 average over his first four starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 (6 for 30) batting average against left-handed hitters and .242 (23 for 95) against right-handers...has not issued any of his 13 walks to left-handers for a 194 on-base percentage...opponents are 5 for 33 (.152) with two walks when leading off an inning (.200 on-base percentage)...has yielded a .270 (20 for 74) average with the bases empty and .176 (9 for 51) with runners on base.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Won his first interleague start of 2011 last Tuesday (see last start below) and is now 2-1 with a 3.52 ERA (21.1 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 8 so) in four career interleague appearances, all starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 3 with a strikeout last Tuesday at New York and is 0 for 5 with two strikeouts in his career...was a .316 (6 for 19) career hitter in the minor leagues with a double, a home run and five RBI...walked once and struck out six times.

COMEBACK: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles May 23...walked Izturis to start the game and, after an Aybar sacrifice, Abreu had a RBI single...that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was relieved by Fuentes to start the eighth inning with the score tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Baltimore May 28 in Oakland...it was his first Major League win since June 8, 2009 against Minnesota...issued a career-high tying five walks in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Jones in the third...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the third but he allowed a RBI single to Tatum in the fourth...Oakland then scored once in the sixth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Boston June 3...tossed just 2.2 innings but matched his career highs in runs (5) and earned runs (4)...the A's scored four times in the top of the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a ground out and an Ortiz RBI single...also allowed an Ellsbury sacrifice fly in the second and two more runs in the third on a Ortiz RBI double and a Lowrie RBI single...was relieved by Moscoso with two outs in the third and the A's trailing 5-4...Oakland scored singles runs in the fourth and fifth to get him off the hook.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 3-2 loss at Baltimore June 8...faced the minimum over the first four innings as the only base runner (Lee single in 2nd) was erased on a double play...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Hardy RBI single and a Reynolds two-run home run...the A's scored a run in the sixth and he was relieved by Devine to start the seventh trailing 3-1.

FIFTH START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, his longest career outing without allowing a run...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first six innings thanks to a pickoff and two double plays...allowed only one base runner into scoring position and that was in the seventh inning when Hosmer singled and went to third on an error on a pickoff attempt.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win at New York on Tuesday...blanked the Mets on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the fourth inning on a Tejada sacrifice fly...the A's were ahead 7-1 when he allowed a two-out solo home run to Bay in the sixth...was relieved by Breslow after six innings with a 7-2 lead.

OUTMAN vs. PHILADELPHIA: Is making his first career appearance.

THIS SPRING: Began his comeback this spring by going 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in five games, including one start...opponents hit .442 (23 for 52)...tossed a scoreless fifth and sixth inning in his first outing February 27 at Mesa against the Cubs...it was his first appearance against Major League competition since June 19, 2009 at San Diego...then allowed at least two runs in each of his final four outings...including a start March 6 at San Diego (1.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...was optioned to Sacramento March 20.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League in wins at the time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...also allowed six home runs...the River Cats were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in two of his eight starts (his last two), allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .264 opponents batting average broke down to .237 (14 for 59) against left-handed hitters and .282 (24 for 85) against right-handers...yielded five of his six home runs to righties...opponents hit .256 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (6-5, 2.59 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.59)...is seventh in strikeouts per nine innings (8.62) but is tied for fourth in most walks (43)...has two no decisions in two interleague starts despite a 1.32 ERA (13.2 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 16 so)...is now 1-3 with a 3.14 ERA (17 er in 48.2 ip) in eight career interleague starts... has received run support of two runs or fewer nine of his 16 starts...has just seven runs of support in his five losses this year (29.2 ip, 2.12 RSA) and 25 runs of support in his 25 career losses (123.2 ip, 1.82 RSA)...is 24-1 in 33 career starts with run support of three or more and 4-24 in 39 starts with support of two or fewer... had a no decision in his last start (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 8 so), an A's 3-2, 13-inning loss at New York Wednesday...blanked the Mets on one hit and one walk over his final five innings and left with the score tied at 1-1...has never faced Florida in his career.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.25 ERA (10 er in 40.0 ip) over the last 14 games and has not allowed a home run...now has a 3.20 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.346) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...has allowed 14 home runs, which ranks fourth fewest...is tied for the most losses (16) and has the second fewest wins (8)...their 52 first batter strikeouts rank second highest in the American League...has allowed 32 of 93 (34.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Recorded four outs last night for his fifth save of the season...it was his first action in a week, last pitching a scoreless ninth inning June 18 against San Francisco for his fourth save...has converted his past five save chances after being charged with a blown save in his first opportunity this season.
- Has not allowed a run in eight of nine appearances (1 er in 9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA) since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Last night was his first-ever appearance against the Phillies.
- Has not allowed a run in three interleague appearances (3.1 ip, 2 h, 1 so, 1 bb) this year and has a 0.84 ERA (2 er in 21.1 ip) in 19 career outings against the National League.
- Made four rehab appearances with Triple-A Sacramento and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Is tied for first among American League relievers in wins (4), tied for 11th in appearances (33), tied for 10th in grounded into double plays (5) and ranks 10th in strikeouts (35)...**his four wins account for half of the bullpen's eight for the season.**
- Has a 0.98 ERA (2 er in 18.1 ip) in 17 appearances at home compared to a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) in 16 appearances on the road
