#### A's vs. MARLINS

The all-time series is even at three games each...the A's lost two of three in Florida in 2003 and won two of three in Oakland in 2008.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has not committed an error in 58 games in the outfield and now has a 299-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 78-game, 76.2-inning, 312-batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes has 199 career saves, which are the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500...has started 15 of the A's 16 games since June 9 and is 13 for 48 (.271) with 13 walks (3 sf. .406 on-base percentage over that span.

**Scott Sizemore** is batting .327 (17 for 52) in 16 games since he was recalled June 6.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 156-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

**Jemile Weeks** has recorded 21 hits after the first 18 games of his career, which is fourth most in Oakland history.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1994 Bobby Witt pitches a twohit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games after winning a season-high six consecutive games from June 15-21...are 35-44 (.443) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...the A's had their last day off prior to the All-Star Break yesterday as they will play on each of the next 13 days...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 13-24 (.351) since then, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 13-24)...are now six games behind Texas...have spent each of the last 29 days and 36 of the last 37 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 40 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-7 (.417) in interleague play (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. New York, 1-2 vs. Philadelphia)...conclude play against the National League with a pair of three-game series against Florida and Arizona...are batting .207 (82 for 396), which is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, .204), but have a 1.88 ERA (23 er in 110.0 ip), which is third lowest...went 8-10 (.444) in interleague play last year, their second consecutive season with a losing record...it was just the fourth time in 14 seasons the A's finished with a losing record...are 18-30 (.375) over the last three years, which is the third worst mark in the majors...however, are 141-119 (.542) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 8-15 (.348) in the month of June, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for third worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record in June for the third consecutive season...went 10-17 (.370) last June, which was the A's worst June mark since going 7-22 (.241) in 1986...are batting .225 (172 for 765) in June, which is the third lowest mark in the American League...have the fewest home runs (10) and lowest slugging percentage (.314)...have slugged under .318 in a month of 20 or more games just once in Oakland history (.299 in April, 1979)...have not hit fewer than 12 home runs in a month of 20 or more game since April, 1983 when they hit nine in 20 games.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 1.50 ERA (12 er in 72.0 ip), .192 (50 for 261) opponents batting average, 21 walks, 51 strikeouts and two home runs over the last 11 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...are 27-28 with a 3.16 ERA (172 er in 489.1 ip) for the season...the ERA is second lowest in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors...own the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.350) but have issued the third most walks (172).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 1.70 ERA (19 er in 100.1 ip) over the last 11 games after posting a 5.70 ERA over the previous 13 contests...**lead the American League** and rank third in the majors with a 3.17 ERA for the season...have allowed two home runs over the last 12 games and 48 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL and third lowest in the majors (.348)...have a Major League-leading 15 pickoffs and the opponents 29 caught stealings are also the most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 30 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it is one short of the record of 31 from July 21-August 19, 1978...have 41 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 84 home runs...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have scored just eight runs in the last five games and have 280 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.341) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.305).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone three consecutive games without an error for the first time since May 3-7 (five games)...have 61 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston and Texas for the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL and majors in double plays (85).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a nine-game homestand tonight against Florida (three games), Arizona (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...have won five straight home games and are 19-16 at home for the season...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2)...have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road and are 16-28 (.364) for the season, which is second worst in the American League (Kansas City, 10-22)...are batting .250 (289 for 1156) with 139 runs scored in 35 home games (3.97 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Washington, .220)...lead the AL with a 2.93 ERA (105 er in 322.0 ip) at home.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 10-17 (.370) in one-run games, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the AL and are the most extra inning games by the A's since they played extra frames 15 times in 2008...since 1997, the only time the A's had more than nine extra inning losses was in 2009 when they went 3-10...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later this year, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had last year.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Balfour, Braden, Harden, McCarthy, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 16<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 7-8 (.467) in his starting assignments this year and are 37-35 (.514) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 12 of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.59)...is sixth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.62) but is tied for fourth in most walks (43)...has allowed just six home runs and his average of 0.57 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest...has the seventh lowest opponents slugging percentage (.323)...also ranks tied for fourth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild

pitches (6) and both figures are already career highs.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Is 1-3 with a 3.41 ERA (12 er in 31.2 ip) and .233 (28 for 120) opponents batting average in five starts in June...is 2-7 with a 4.16 ERA (35 er in 75.2 ip) in 13 career starts in the month...went 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...his May ERA was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the American League...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his first five starts in April.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Has two no decisions in two interleague starts despite a 1.32 ERA (13.2 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 16 so)...is now 1-3 with a 3.14 ERA (17 er in 48.2 ip) in eight career interleague starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of two runs or fewer nine of his 16 starts...has just seven runs of support in his five losses this year (29.2 ip, 2.12 RSA) and 25 runs of support in his 25 career losses (123.2 ip, 1.82 RSA)...is 24-1 in 33 career starts with run support of three or more and 4-24 in 39 starts with support of two or fewer.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (8 er in 39.2 ip) in six starts on five or more days rest and 2-4 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-3 with a 2.11 ERA (13 er in 55.1 ip) and .211 (42 for 199) opponents batting average in nine starts at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip) and .250 (37 for 148) average in six starts during the day...has the third lowest night ERA in the American League.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .167 (13 for 78) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .284 (38 for 134) with no outs and .192 (41 for 213) with one or two outs...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .186 (8 for 43) average.

START-BY-START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota April 9...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit *April 14...* did not allow a run for his second consecutive start ...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston *April 20...* gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...was charged with his second loss in a row in the A's 5-0 decision at Los Angeles April 25...surrendered two runs in the second and two more in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory over Texas *May 1* in Oakland...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Young in the sixth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Kansas City May 6...allowed single runs in the first and third and the A's scored three times in the fifth for the win...had his scheduled start May 11 at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...did not allow a runner past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss May 22 at San Francisco...had a 3-2 lead when he was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh...however, Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore May 27 in Oakland...walked in a run in the second inning and allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to New York June 1 in Oakland...had a 2-1 lead when he surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Baltimore June 6...allowed a RBI single to Guerrero in the first inning and three more runs in the second...Wieters and Markakis had RBI singles and Reimold added a sacrifice fly...then shutout the Orioles on three hits over his final five innings but the A's were held to just two runs by Matusz and he left after seven innings trailing 4-2...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago *June* 11...issued a career-high seven walks in 5.1 innings...also had an intentional walk, a home run, two wild pitches, a hit batter and a balk and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to have at least one of each of those in one game...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he issued a one-out walk to Lillibridge in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler, who allowed the run to score...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win over Kansas City *June 16* in Oakland...struck out 10 batters in just 6.0 innings, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...shutout the Royals on one hit and two walks over the first four innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed two runs on a Cabrera RBI single and a Francouer RBI double but then struck out three of the final four batters he faced.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning loss at New York last Wednesday...allowed a RBI single to Duda in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...blanked the Mets on one hit and one walk over his final five innings and left after the seventh inning with the scored tied at 1-1.

GONZALEZ vs. FLORIDA: Is making his first career appearance.

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (2-3, 2.68 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and seventh start of the season...is 2-2 with a 2.65 ERA in five starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two relief appearances...opponents are batting .243 with the bases empty and .164 with runners on base...including .130 with runners in scoring position...has no decisions and has not allowed an earned run in two interleague starts this year (11.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 6 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 12.2 ip) in three career interleague appearances, including two starts...has never faced the Marlins in his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 1-0 loss at Philadelphia last Friday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 2 so)...was recalled from Sacramento May 24 after gonig 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts, with the River Cats...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...allowed just one home run.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.14 ERA (10 er in 42.0 ip) over the last 15 games and has not allowed a home run over that span...now has a 3.17 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...is tied for the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.314) and slugging percentage (.345)...has allowed 14 home runs, which ranks third fewest...is tied for the most losses (16) and has the second fewest wins (8)...rank second with 52 first batter strikeouts...has allowed 32 of 93 (34.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL

- Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings Saturday for his fifth save of the season...has now converted his past five save chances after being charged with a blown save in his first opportunity this season.
- Has not allowed a run in eight of nine appearances since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29 (1 er in 9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has never faced the Marlins in his career.
- Has not allowed a run in three interleague appearances (3.1 ip, 2 h, 1 so, 1 bb) this year and has a 0.84 ERA (2 er in 21.1 ip) in 19 career outings against the National League.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list today retroactive to June 22 with a strained right oblique...it is his sixth career appearance on the DL.
- Was tied for second among American League relievers in wins (4) at the time of his injury.
- Has held opponents to a .198 (23 for 116) batting average, including .136 (3 for 22) with runners in scoring position.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has allowed a .315 opponents batting average, which ranks fifth highest among American League relievers...has held right-handed hitters to a .238 (15 for 63) mark while lefties are hitting .417 (20 for 48).

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
