A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS

The A's lead the all-time series, 11-10...are 5-7 in Oakland and 6-3 in Arizona...the two clubs last met in 2009 when the A's lost two of three in Oakland...the A's went 9-3 against Arizona from 1998-2001 but are 2-7 in three series since 2006.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has batted third in each of his last 10 starts and is 12 for 37 (.324) over that span.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 78-game, 76.2-inning, 312batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes has 199 career saves, which are the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth lefthander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 158-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1902** Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches...he turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore, his first victory as an Athletic...in **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Essian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief...in **2007** Dan Haren extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 11-5 win at New York.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two of three games in each of the last three series but are 8-6 over the last 14 games...are 36-46 (.439) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 14-26 (.350) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 13-27)...are seven games behind Texas, which is one short of the season high of eight (last on June 14)...have spent each of the last 32 days and 39 of the last 40 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 43 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...it marks the third consecutive season the A's finished June with a losing record...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85)...the batting average and on-base percentage were second worst by an A's team since 1983 (.220 and .285 in August, 2008)...the pitching staff ranked fifth in the AL in ERA (3.38).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs yesterday, their first multi-homer game since May 24 at Los Angeles when they also hit two...that snapped an Oakland record streak of 32 consecutive games with one home run or fewer...have gone 53 games since their last three-homer game (May 2 vs. Texas)...have 43 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the Major Leagues**...are on pace to hit 85 home runs and the fewest home runs in Oakland history is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has allowed just four home runs over the last 15 games and 50 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to allow 99 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

OFFENSE: Coco Crisp's eighth inning home run yesterday snapped a streak of 29 consecutive innings where the A's did not score an earned run...have scored just 13 runs in the last eight games, which are the A's fewest runs over an eight-game span since June 23-July 1, 1980 when they tallied 12...have 285 runs for the season, which is tied with San Diego for second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 277)...are on pace to score 563 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for the American League lead...have the second lowest batting average (.235) and slugging percentage (.340) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.302)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.70 ERA (24 er in 127.1 ip) and .200 (93 for 465) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...now has a 3.11 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under .318 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (15)...A's starting pitchers are 7-4 with a 1.69 ERA (17 er in 90.2 ip), .195 (64 for 329) opponents batting average, 27 walks, 74 strikeouts and four home runs over the last 14 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.14 ERA (177 er in 508.0 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.93).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last two games and now have 66 for the season, which is second most in the majors behind the Cubs (68)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 45 unearned runs...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (87).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-9 (.400) in interleague play (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. New York, 1-2 vs. Philadelphia, 1-2 vs. Florida), which concludes with this three-game series with Arizona...need to win each of the remaining three games to avoid finishing with a losing record against the National League for the third consecutive season...have posted a losing interleague mark in just four of the previous 14 seasons...are 19-32 (.373) over the last three years, which is tied for the second worst mark in the majors, but are 142-121 (.540) all-time, which is the seventh best record...have a 1.84 ERA (28 er in 137.0 ip) this year, which is the lowest mark in the majors (Philadelphia, 1.87), but are batting .206 (101 for 491), which is the second lowest mark (Philadelphia, .204)...the Oakland record for lowest interleague ERA is 2.28 in 2001 and the lowest batting average is .213 in 2006.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Wednesday night...are 20-18 at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is second worst in the AL (Kansas City, 10-24)...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .246 (308 for 1251) with 144 runs scored in 38 home games (3.79 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 11-18 (.379) in one-run games with the loss yesterday and that is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the American League...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his first appearance and start of the 2011 season...it is the 146th start of his career, his 90th as an Athletic...his teams are 91-54 (.628) in his starting assignments, including 58-31 (.652) with the A's.

THE DISABLED LIST: Did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

WITH THE A'S: Is making his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...his last win in an Oakland uniform was on June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia, a 5-0 A's victory (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and compiled a 36-19 record and a 3.42 ERA (206 er in 541.2 ip) in 97 games, 89 starts, over 5½ seasons...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

SINCE 2003: Has 858 strikeouts in 845.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.13 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.02)...has a .224 (694 for 3102) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221 and Jason Schmidt, .223).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Made one interleague start last year with Texas and took the loss in the Rangers 6-2 decision at Milwaukee June 11 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 4 hr)...is 5-4 with a 3.16 ERA (77.0 ip, 50 h, 32 r, 27 er, 29 bb, 77 so) in 14 career interleague appearances, including 13 starts.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: Had a no decision for Texas in the Rangers 6-5 win over Seattle September 29, 2010...tossed just 4.0 innings and allowed four runs...surrendered a two-run home run to Smoak in the first inning and a two-run double to Gutierrez in the fifth.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: Tossed 6.2 scoreless and hitless innings in a 4-0 win over Minnesota August 23, 2010...it was the longest hitless outing ever by a Texas starter who did not finish the game...combined with three Rangers relievers on a one-hit shutout.

HARDEN vs. ARIZONA: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in a 2-0 Cubs loss on July 21, 2008 at Arizona...pitched seven innings and allowed just one hit, a leadoff home run by Romero in the sixth inning...Chicago was shutout on two hits by Johnson, Owings and Qualls.

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for 10th in the American League in hit batters (9)...tied for fourth on the club in strikeouts (75), was fifth in starts and pitched the sixth most innings (92.0)...was also second on the team in hit batters and third in walks.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .238 (40-for-168) against right-handed hitters and .273 (51-for-187) against left-handers...yielded a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 the second time and .372 after that...his career numbers are .197 (237 for 1205), .223 (245 for 1100) and .266 (212 for 797).

THIS AND THAT: Posted a 4.40 ERA at home and 6.70 on the road...was 2-3 with a 4.41 ERA in nine starts on four days rest and 3-2 with a 6.47 ERA in his other nine starts...compiled a 0-3 record and a 7.43 ERA in six outings during the day and was 5-2 with a 4.96 ERA in 14 night games...went 5-5 with a 5.34 ERA in 18 starts and 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA in two relief appearances...his longest outing was 7.0 innings twice and he tossed six or more innings in six of his 18 starts...the Rangers were 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments...went 2-0 in four starts with run support of four or more and is 41-0 in 55 such starts in his career.

2010 HIGHLIGHTS: Opened the season as Texas' number two starter, going 0-1 with a 4.58 ERA in his first four outings...recorded his first win as a Ranger April 28 against Chicago (AL)...two of his five wins came against the White Sox...worked 7.0 shutout innings and struck out a season-high nine to win at Oakland in next start May 3...went 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA over a three-start stretch from April 28 to May 8...then went 1-2 with an 8.28 ERA over his next six starts before going on the disabled list June 12 with a left gluteal muscle strain...surrendered a career high four home runs in his final start before the injury, June 11 at Milwaukee...went 0-2 with a 5.19 ERA in four starts at Triple-A Oklahoma City on a rehab assignment...was reinstated July 31 and allowed one earned run in 7.0 innings in a win at Los Angeles (AL) that night...lasted just 2.1 innings in his next outing Aug. 7 at Oakland and returned to the DL Aug. 15, retroactive to Aug. 8 with right shoulder tendinitis...made another rehab start Aug. 18 against Reno, allowing one unearned run in 6.0 innings...was reinstated Aug. 23, working 6.2 no-hit innings that day against Minnesota before leaving the game with five walks and 111 pitches...Matt Harrison recorded the final out in the seventh and Darren O'Day worked a hitless eighth before Joe Mauer singled off Neftali Feliz with one out in ninth for the Twins' only hit in a 4-0 Rangers win...it was the longest hitless outing ever by a Texas starter who did not finish the game and second longest in majors in 2010 to the Twins' Kevin Slowey who tossed 7.0 hitless innings against Oakland Aug. 15...prior to that pair, no pitcher had posted at least 6.2 hitless innings in a non-complete game since Braves' Damian Moss (7.0 ip) May 3, 2002 at St. Louis...was 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA in two starts following his return from the DL before going to the bullpen at the start of September...pitched twice in relief (4 er in 2.2 ip) before completing the season with a no decision in a spot start Sept. 29 vs. Seattle...

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Josh Outman (3-2, 3.10 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA over his first four starts...has allowed a .171 batting average against left-handed hitters with one walk (.189 on-base percentage) and one double (.200 slugging percentage)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Philadelphia last Sunday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Arizona, a start in the A's 6-2 win in Oakland on May 24, 2009 (7.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 0 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two interleague starts this year and is now 2-2 with a 3.29 ERA in five career interleague appearances, all starts.

- Has not allowed a run in nine of 10 appearances since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29 (1 er in 10.1 ip, 0.87 ERA)...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.



Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
