RHP Josh Collmenter (4-4, 2.71) vs. RHP Rich Harden (0-0, 0.00)

WEDNESDAY: The D-backs lost the series finale, 6-2, vs. Indians...Zach Duke took the loss, allowing 4 runs on 9 hits and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts over 5.0 innings...Alberto Castillo and Yheny Brazoban each allowed a run...Stephen Drew and Justin Upton both his solo homers...Gerardo Parra was 2-for-3 with a double.

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs have selected the contract of infielder Sean Burroughs from Triple-A Reno and reinstated right-handed pitcher Sam Demel from the disabled list and in corresponding moves, released infielder Melvin Mora yesterday and placed right-handed pitcher J.J. Putz on the 15-day disabled list with right elbow tendinitis retroactive to June 29...Burroughs, 30, hit .412 (42-for-102) with 19 runs, 11 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs and 25 RBI over two separate stints with the Aces...this marks his second stint with the big league club, as he hit .250 (6-for-24) with a double in 23 games from May 19-June 19 after having his contract selected on May 18...Demel, 25, was placed on the disabled list on May 24 (retroactive to May 22) with right shoulder tendinitis and missed 36 games...in 2 rehabilitation appearances with Reno, he posted a 9.00 ERA (2 ER in 2.0 IP) with 2 walks and a strikeout...in 21 games for the D-backs, he has a 1-2 record and 1.72 ERA (3 ER in 15.2 IP) with 7 walks and 10 strikeouts...he returns in the midst of a personal 6-game scoreless streak (4.2 IP) and has not allowed an earned run in last 16 outings...Putz, 34, is 1-2 with 21 saves and a 3.12 ERA (12 ER in 34.2 IP) with 9 walks and 33 strikeouts in 34 games for the D-backs...Mora, 39, hit .228 (29-for-127) with 5 runs, 6 doubles and 16 RBI in 42 games with the D-backs.

BACK-TO-BACK WINNING MONTHS: The D-backs went 14-13 (.519) in June after going 19-10 (.655) in May marked their first back-to-back winning months since 2009, when they went 14-12 (.538) in July and 15-14 (.517) in August.

SEEKING 100TH INTERLEAGUE WIN: The D-backs next win will be their 100th in Interleague play since 1998...the are currently one of seven teams shy of the 100-win mark in Interleague action since 1998 along with the Dodgers (99), Cubs (93), Padres (93), Brewers (90), Reds (86) and Pirates (73).

IN THE NL WEST: The D-backs are 44-38 and in second place in the NL West, 2.0 games behind the Giants (46-36)...the D-backs have been in first place 8 days this season (June 22-24, June 4, May 29-June 1), after having not spent a day in first, excluding Opening Day, since spending a franchise-best 136 games atop the division in 2008.

UPTON BROTHERS DO IT AGAIN: On Wednesday, the D-backs' Justin Upton hit a solo homer in the fourth inning today vs. Indians and his older brother, BJ, hit a solo homer in the seventh inning vs. Reds...according to Elias Sports Bureau...it is the eighth time the Upton brothers have homered on the same day, the highest such total by any pair of brothers since Bret & Aaron Boone, who did so an all-time MLB record 19 times.

UPTON WORTHY OF MONTHLY HONORS: Justin Upton should be among the finalists for NL Player of the Month honors for June...among all NL players, he ranked second with 39 hits, tied for second with 9 doubles, third with a .382 batting average and .467 on-base percentage and sixth with a 1.016 OPS.

AMONG THE BEST SINCE MAY 13: The D-backs are 29-17 (.630) since May 13...among all teams during that span, their 29 wins are tied with the Red Sox for the most in the Majors ahead of the 28 wins of the Brewers and Yankees. Their .630 winning percentage is third-best in the Majors behind the Red Sox (.674, 29-14) and Yankees (.636, 28-16) and ahead of the Brewers (.622, 28-17) and Braves (.605, 26-17).

J-UP LOVES INTERLEAGUE: Justin Upton has been one of the best hitters in the NL in Interleague games since the beginning of 2008...among all NL hitters in Interleague action the last 4 seasons, Upton ranks tied for first with 17 doubles, second with a .436 on-base percentage, third with a .343 average, tied for third with 71 hits, fifth with a .977 OPS, tied for eighth with 25 extra-base hits and 12th with a .541 slugging percentage.

ORGANIZATIONAL MONTHLY HONOREES: Single-A South Bend's David Holmberg and Triple-A Reno's Collin Cowgill were named the organization's Player and Pitcher of the Month for May...Holmberg went 4-0 with a 0.00 (0 ER in 29.0 IP) and 0.74 opponents average (7-for-95) with 0 walks and 26 strikeouts in 4 starts...Cowgill hit .423 (47-for-111) with 31 runs, 7 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers, 20 RBI and a 1.118 OPS in 27 games...the monthly winners by team:

VS. ATHLETICS--Tonight is first game of a 3-gamer @ Athletics...the two teams last faced each other May 22-24 @ Oakland when the D-backs took the first 2 games of a 3-gamer...this is the D-backs fifth visit to Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...the D-backs trail 10-11 all-time, going 3-6 at home and 7-5 on the road.

ALL-STAR WORTHY: The D-backs have a handful of players worthy of being named All-Stars...among NL starters, Ian Kennedy ranks tied for third with 116.2 innings, tied for ninth with 8 wins and 97 strikeouts, tied for 11th with a .227 opponents average and 13th with a 3.01 ERA and 1.089 WHIP while Daniel Hudson ranks tied for fourth with 9 wins, tied for fifth with 116.0 innings and tied for 13th with 92 strikeouts...among NL relievers, J.J. Putz ranks seventh with 21 saves...among NL outfielders, Justin Upton ranks tied for second with 94 hits, third with 37 extra-base hits, tied for third with 21 doubles, fifth with a .903 OPS, tied for sixth with a .385 on-base percentage, seventh with a .304 batting average, eighth with 13 home runs and a .518 slugging percentage and 10th with 43 RBI while Chris Young ranks tied for first with 22 doubles and 39 extra-base hits, tied for fifth with 15 home runs and 11th with 42 RBI...among NL catchers, Miguel Montero ranks first with 21 doubles and 30 extra-base hits, second with 38 RBI and a .465 slugging percentage, third with 66 hits, 9 home runs and an .807 OPS, fourth with a .269 batting average, fifth with a .342 on-base percentage...among NL shortstops, Stephen Drew ranks second with 42 RBI, third with 5 triples, fourth with 17 doubles, 27 extra-base hits, a .418 slugging percentage, fifth with a .751 OPS, sixth with a .264 batting average and .333 on-base percentage.

OVER THE .500 MARK: The D-backs' 44-38 record puts them 67 games over .500...they've been .500 or better the last 35 games...their win on June 24 @ Tigers put them at 43-34, a season-high 9 games over .500 for the first time since a 30-21 mark on May 26, 2008...prior to this season, the last time the D-backs were 10 games over .500 was a 30-20 mark on May 25, 2008.

D-BACKS DIGGING INTERLEAGUE: The D-backs' 9-6 record in Interleague play through the first 15 of 18 games vs. AL foes is tied for their second-best (2002) behind the 11-4 mark in 2003...their best mark through 16 games is 9-7 in 2002...the D-backs have had winning Interleague records in only three (2002-03, '07) of the 13 previous seasons and their overall 99-118 record (.456) is sixth-worst in the Major Leagues since 1998.

EXTRA EFFORT: The D-backs' 269 extra-base hits lead the NL and rank second in the Majors behind the Red Sox's 274 extra-base hits...the D-backs' 269 extra-base hits represent 38.54 percent of their 698 hits, the highest percentage in the Majors ahead of the Yankees (37.16 percent, 256 of 689), Rays (37.01 percent, 245 of 662), Red Sox (35.68 percent, 274 of 768), Blue Jay (35.43, 253 of 714) and Braves (35.01 percent, 230 of 657).

CLOSE CALLS: The D-backs have had 17 of their last 28 games decided by 3 runs or less (10-7)...of their 81 games overall, 65 have been decided by 4 runs or less (36-29) and 56 games by 3 runs or less (32-24), going 18-10 in 1-run decisions, 8-7 in 2-run games and 6-7 in 3-run decisions.

HISTORIC RISE TO FIRST: The D-backs rose to first place in the NL West on May 29 after trailing by 6.5 games through April 30...according to Elias Sports Bureau, the D-backs were the first team in Major League history to gain sole possession of first place in their league (before 1969) or division (since 1969) during May after entering the month with a deficit of at least 6.5 games.

SEASON NO. 14: The D-backs are 1,079-1,109 (.493) in 14 seasons...since 1998, their record is the eighth-best mark in the NL and third-best in the NL West behind the Giants (1,168-1,018; .534) and Dodgers (1,138-1,050; .520) and ahead of the Padres (1,068-1,121; .488) and Rockies (1,040-1,148; .475).

GIBBY AT THE HELM: Kirk Gibson is 44-38 in his first full season as D-backs manager...won his 50th game as manager, 1-0, on May 14 @ Dodgers...named the sixth manager in club history on Oct. 4, 2010, agreeing to a two-year contract through 2012 with a club option for 2013...named interim manager on July 1, 2010 and went 34-49 in that capacity...his overall record is 79-87.

SENIOR GM: This is Kevin Towers' 15th year as a GM, tying him with A's Billy Beane and Giants' Brian Sabeen as the fifth-longest tenured GM in MLB behind Tigers' Dave Dombrowski (23 years), Orioles' Andy MacPhail (17), Reds' Walt Jocketty (16) and Brewers' Doug Melvin (16)...with 1,157 wins, Towers is one of eight current GMs to post at least 1,000 victories in their career.

ALL-STAR STAFF: In addition to Kirk Gibson and Glenn Sherlock, the D-backs coaching staff boasts All-Stars Don Baylor, Charles Nagy, Alan Trammell, Matt Williams and Eric Young...the Dodgers also have five All-Stars (Don Mattingly, Rick Honeycutt, Davey Lopes, Tim Wallach, Manny Mota)...Gibson is the only MVP to have never played in an All-Star Game...the staff has two league MVPs (Baylor '79, Gibson '88), five Silver Sluggers (Gibson, Baylor, Trammell, Williams, Young), two Gold Glovers (Trammell, Williams) and two playoff MVPs (Gibson '84 ALCS, Trammell '84 WS) for 16 All-Stars, 8 Gold Gloves and 12 Silver Sluggers total.

JOSH COLLMENTER--is making his 10th start of the season, 17th career big league appearance and first career start vs. Athletics.

LAST TIME OUT--Suffered his third straight loss on June 25 @ Tigers as the D-backs were shutout, 6-0...allowed 6 runs on 10 hits and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts over 6.0 innings.

TURN THE TIDE--Over his last 3 starts, Collmenter has posted a 0-3 record and 7.00 ERA (14 ER in 18.0 IP) with 6 walks and 13 strikeouts...in his 6 starts prior to that, he posted a 3-1 record and 1.05 ERA (4 ER in 34.1 IP) with 6 walks and 19 strikeouts.

HALF-WAY THERE--With his next win, Collmenter will move into a tie for 10th with Geraldo Guzman (2000) among D-backs rookie pitchers with 5 wins in a single season...the franchise record 10 wins is held by Oscar Villarreal (2003) and Brandon Webb (2003).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY--Collmenter is making his third career Interleague start...is 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (9 ER in 13.0 IP) with 3 walks and 9 strikeouts as opponents have hit .283 (15-for-53) after 1 Interleague start.

FIRST MEETING--His first time facing a team, Collmenter owns a 2.05 ERA (13 ER in 57.0 IP) with 5 walks and 38 strikeouts as opponents have hit .184 (38-for-206).

FIRST INNING--Collmenter has retired the side in order 6 times during the first inning over his 9 starts...he has retired 27 of 33 batters and has allowed just 4 hits (.125, 4-for-32) and 1 run in the first inning.

FANNING THE FIRST--Has allowed just 2 hits (.125, 2-for-16) with 5 strikeouts against his first batter faced...opponents are batting .182 (12-for-66) with a walk and 12 strikeouts when leading off an inning.

JULY--Collmenter is making his first career July appearance.

AMONG NL ROOKIES--Among NL rookie starters (min. 5 starts), ranks second a .218 opponents average (43-for-197) and 2.06 walks-per-9.0 innings (12 walks in 52.1 IP), third with 5 quality starts and 52.1 innings pitched and fourth with a 3.10 ERA and 2.67 strikeout-to-walk ratio (32 strikeouts to 12 walks).

SNAKE BITES--Lefties are batting .244 (29-for-119) with 9 walks and 18 strikeouts, while righties have hit .176 (22-for-125) with 4 walks and 25 strikeouts...opponents are batting to a .190 (8-for-42) with runners in scoring position.

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER--Collmenter's 2.71 ERA (20 ER in 66.1 IP) is the second-lowest among D-backs pitchers at age 25 or younger through at least their first 9 starts, trailing Daniel Hudson's 1.69 ERA (15 ER in 79.2 IP) through 11 starts at age 23 in 2010...among NL pitchers 25 or younger this season, his ERA is the fifth-lowest mark (min. 9 starts), trailing the Reds' Johnny Cueto (1.84 ERA), Braves' Jair Jurrjens (2.07 ERA) and Tommy Hanson (2.62 ERA) and Nationals' Jordan Zimmerman (2.63 ERA).

HIGH 5.0--Collmenter is third among NL rookie pitchers with 8 games of at least 5.0 innings pitched, trailing the Mets' Dillon Gee's 10 such games and the Braves' Brandon Beachy's 9 such games...since 2010, marks the third-highest total for a D-backs rookie pitcher behind the 15 such games for Barry Enright (2010) and 11 such games for Daniel Hudson (2010).

HOME COOKIN'--Among NL rookies (min. 5 games) at home, ranks sixth with a .170 opponents average and seventh with a 3.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio (21 strikeouts-to-6 walks)...among rookie starters at home (min. 3 starts), is first in opponents average, second with a 2.23 ERA and fifth with 21 strikeouts.

COMBINED SHUTOUTS--Collmenter has been a part of 3 combined shutouts as a starter: 1-0 @ Dodgers on May 14, 4-0 vs. Nationals on June 3 and 2-0 @ Pirates on June 9...according to Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher to be part of 3 shutouts in his first 6 career starts since the Giants' Jeff Brantley from 1988-1992 (3-0 vs. Dodgers on Sept. 19, 1992; 4-0 vs. Braves on Sept. 24, 1992 and 1-0 @ Braves on Sept. 30, 1992).

HOW MANY SCORELESS INNINGS?--Collmenter had stretches of 15.0 scoreless innings from May 14-24 and 13.0 scoreless innings from May 29-June 9...according to Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first D-backs rookie with a pair of scoreless streaks of 13.0 or more innings and the second rookie in the Majors this season along with the Rays' Jeremy Hellickson who tossed 17.0 scoreless frames from May 7-18 and 14.1 shutout innings from May 23-June 4...also according to Elias Sports Bureau, Collmenter had a franchise-record 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his career as a starter (6.0 innings on May 14, 6.0 innings on May 19 and 3.0 innings on May 24), surpassing Micah Owings who had 11.0 straight scoreless innings in 2007 (5.0 innings on April 6 @ Nationals and 6.0 innings on April 11 vs. Reds).

DID YOU KNOW?--Collmenter allowed 4 earned runs on 20 hits in his first 6 starts...according to Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only pitcher to do so in his first 6 starts since ER have been recorded starting in 1912 in the NL and 1913 in the AL.

PUTTING UP ZEROES--Collmenter tossed 24.0 consecutive scoreless innings beginning with his final 2.0 innings on April 24 @ Mets through the third inning on May 24 @ Rockies (Game 1), the fifth-longest streak for a D-backs pitcher in club history, according to Elias Sports Bureau.

FIRST IN A HUNDRED YEARS--According to Elias Sports Bureau, Collmenter is the first pitcher in the last 100 seasons to win his first career start with 6.0 shutout innings and 2 hits or less while his own team had 1 hit.

AT THE DISH--Collected his first hit on May 19 vs. Braves.

ROAD TO PHOENIX--Signed by the D-backs as their 15th-round selection in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Michigan University.
