The A's won the first meeting of 2011 last night and now lead the all-time series, 12-10...are 6-7 in Oakland and 6-3 in Arizona...prior to this series, the two clubs last met in 2009 when the A's lost two of three in Oakland...the A's went 9-3 against Arizona from 1998-2001 but are 3-7 in four series since 2006

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has batted third in each of his last 11 starts and is 13 for 41 (.317) over that span...is tied for second in the American League in stolen bases (24).

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 79-game, 77.1-inning, 314batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes has 199 career saves, which are the most among active left-handers...needs one more to become the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 159-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in by ... is 165 by 25, Oakland historv outfielder...the record is 16 Jermaine Dye from Sept. 2002-Aug. 6, 2004

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last nine games but are 9-6 over the last 15 contests...are 37-46 (.446) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 15-26 (.366) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 13-28)...are seven games behind Texas, which is one short of the season high of eight (last on June 14)...have spent each of the last 33 days and 40 of the last 41 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 44 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.84 ERA (28 er in 136.1 ip) and .199 (99 for 497) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...now has a 3.12 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under 3.18 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (15)...A's starting pitchers are 8-4 with a 1.77 ERA (19 er in 96.2 ip), .194 (68 for 350) opponents batting average, 27 walks, 80 strikeouts and five home runs over the last 15 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.13 ERA (179 er in 514.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.99).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-9 (.438) in interleague play (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. New York, 1-2 vs. Philadelphia, 1-2 vs. Florida, 1-0 vs. Arizona), which concludes tomorrow...need to win each of the remaining two games to avoid finishing with a losing record against the National League for the third consecutive season...have posted a losing interleague mark in just four of the previous 14 seasons...are 20-32 (.385) over the last three years, which is tied for the second worst mark in the majors, but are 143-121 (.542) all-time, which is the seventh best record...have a 1.97 ERA (32 er in 146.0 ip) this year, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Seattle, 1.77), but are batting .214 (112 for 524), which is the third lowest mark...the Oakland record for lowest interleague ERA is 2.28 in 2001 and the lowest batting average is .213 in 2006.

THE LONG BALL: The A's rank last in the majors with 43 home runs and are on pace to finish the season with 84...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...hit two home runs Thursday, their first multi-homer game since May 24 at Los Angeles when they also hit two...that snapped an Oakland record streak of 32 consecutive games with one home run or fewer...have gone 54 games since their last three-homer game (May 2 vs. Texas)...the pitching staff has allowed four home runs in the last three games after allowing two home runs over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 52 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...are on pace to allow 101 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored nine runs in the last two games after tallying nine runs over the previous seven contests...have 290 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Seattle, 283) and third fewest in the majors (San Diego, 285)...are on pace to score 566 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second in the AL...have the second lowest batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.341) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.304)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 66 errors, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 67) and third most in the majors (Chicago, 68)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 45 unearned runs...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (87).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (1-0) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Wednesday night...are 21-18 at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is the second worst record in the American League (Kansas City, 10-25)...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .248 (319 for 1284) with 149 runs scored in 39 home games (3.82 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have a 2.87 ERA (114 er in 358.0 ip) at home, which is the lowest mark in the AL,

CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last four games have been decided by one run and they have won two of those contests...however, are 12-18 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the AL...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...it marks the third consecutive season the A's finished June with a losing record...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85)...the batting average and on-base percentage were second worst by an A's team since 1983 (.220 and .285 in August, 2008)...the pitching staff ranked fifth in the AL in ERA (3.38).

LAST THREE, FIRST FOUR: Is 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA over his first four starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .171 (6 for 35) batting average against left-handed hitters and .270 (31 for 115) against right-handers...his career splits are .157 (18 for 115) against lefties and .272 (106 for 389) against righties...issued his first walk of the season to a left-handed hitter in his last start...has one walk against lefties for a .189 on-base percentage...has yielded one extra base hit (double) to a lefty for a .200 slugging percentage...opponents are 6 for 39 (.154) with two walks when leading off an inning (.195 on-base percentage).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 8 so) in two interleague starts this year and is now 2-2 with a 3.29 ERA (10 er in 27.1 ip) in five career interleague appearances, all starts.

COMEBACK: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 23 and started that night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles May 23...walked Izturis to start the game and, after an Aybar sacrifice, Abreu had a RBI single...that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was relieved by Fuentes to start the eighth inning with the score tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Baltimore May 28 in Oakland...it was his first Major League win since June 8, 2009 against Minnesota...issued a career-high tying five walks in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Jones in the third...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the third but he allowed a RBI single to Tatum in the fourth...Oakland then scored once in the sixth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Boston June 3...tossed just 2.2 innings but matched his career highs in runs (5) and earned runs (4)...the A's scored four times in the top of the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a ground out and an Ortiz RBI single...also allowed an Ellsbury sacrifice fly in the second and two more runs in the third on a Ortiz RBI double and a Lowrie RBI single...was relieved by Moscoso with two outs in the third and the A's trailing 5-4...Oakland scored singles runs in the fourth and fifth to get him off the hook.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 3-2 loss at Baltimore June 8...faced the minimum over the first four innings as the only base runner (Lee single in 2nd) was erased on a double play...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Hardy RBI single and a Reynolds two-run home run...the A's scored a run in the sixth and he was relieved by Devine to start the seventh trailing 3-1.

FIFTH START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City June 15 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, his longest career outing without allowing a run...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first six innings thanks to a pickoff and two double plays...allowed only one base runner into scoring position and that was in the seventh inning when Hosmer singled and went to third on an error on a pickoff attempt.

SIXTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win at New York June 21...blanked the Mets on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the fourth inning on a Tejada sacrifice fly...the A's were ahead 7-1 when he allowed a two-out solo home run to Bay in the sixth...was relieved by Breslow after six innings with a 7-2 lead.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Philadelphia last Sunday...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Victorino RBI single and a Howard grounded into double play...blanked the Phillies on two hits over the next three inning and the A's made the score 2-1 before he allowed a RBI single to Francisco in the fifth inning...Halladay tossed a complete game eight-hitter for Philadelphia.

OUTMAN vs. ARIZONA: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 6-2 win in Oakland on May 24, 2009...tossed a career high 7.2 innings and 106 pitches and also issued a career high five walks without striking out a batter...allowed a run in the first inning as Parra walked, went to third on an Upton double and scored on a Drew groundout...blanked the Diamondbacks on two hits and four walks over innings two through seven before a Cabrera error led to an unearned run in the eighth inning.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .264 opponents batting average in eight games, all starts...was tied for fourth in the Pacific Coast League the in wins at time of his promotion...issued 27 walks in 37.2 innings (6.45 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...also allowed six home runs...the River Cats 6-3 (.667) in his starting were assignments...tossed six or more innings in two of his eight starts (his last two), allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (7-5, 2.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA and .139 opponents batting average over his last three starts...has walked just six and struck out 27...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA, opponents slugging percentage (.305), strikeouts per nine innings (8.74) and most walks (46), sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.53) and eighth in opponents batting average (.216)...is 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in nine starts at home...ranks fourth in the AL in home ERA, fifth in opponents batting and tied for fifth in wins...combined with Bailey on a one-hit shutout in his last start, a 1-0 A's win over Florida last Tuesday (8.0 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 9 so)...has never faced Arizona in his career...is 1-0 with a 0.83 ERA in three interleague starts this year and 2-3 with a 2.70 ERA in nine career interleague starts.

scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA (41.2 ip, 45 h, 23 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 23 so) opponents batting average over his last six starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 63.2 innings and it came April 21 at Seattle, a solo shot by Kennedy...the one home run is the fewest among all Major League pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (15 for 72) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .317 (53 for 167) after that...opponents are batting .390 (16 for 41) with runners in scoring position.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers (Garza, CHI-NL; Verlander, DET)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
