A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS

The A's have split the first two meetings of 2011 and now lead the all-time series, 12-11...are 6-8 in Oakland and 6-3 in Arizona...prior to this series, the two clubs last met in 2009 when the A's lost two of three in Oakland...the A's went 9-3 against Arizona from 1998-2001 but are 3-8 in four series since 2006.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 79-game, 77.1-inning, 314batter homerless streak.

Brian Fuentes has 199 career saves, which are the most among e left-handers...needs one to become the sixth leftactive one hander in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Sweeney Ryan has not committed an error this year and now has a 160-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1983 Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers to lexas 16-4 when the rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits three home runs but its Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in **1994** Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston...the streak starts with a one-hitter against Kansas City followed by a two-hitter against California

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven of the last 10 games since winning a season high six in a row...are 37-47 .440) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 15-27 (.357) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 13-29)...are seven games behind Texas, which is one short of the season high of eight (last on June 14)...have spent each of the last 34 days and 41 of the last 42 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 45 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's will finish interleague play with a losing record for the third consecutive season as they are 7-10 (.412) entering the final game today (3-3 vs. San Francisco, 1-2 vs. New York, 1-2 vs. Philadelphia, 1-2 vs. Florida, 1-1 vs. Arizona)...a loss today would give the A's their second worst interleague record (5-13 in 2009) and a win would make it tied for third worst...this marks just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's have finished with a losing interleague record...are 20-33 (.377) over the last three years, which is tied with Kansas City for the second worst mark in the majors (Houston, 13-31), but are 143-122 (.540) all-time, which is the seventh best record...have a 2.09 ERA (36 er in 155.0 ip) this year, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Seattle, 1.72), but are batting .218 (122 for 559), which is also the second lowest mark (Philadelphia, .217)...the Oakland record for lowest interleague ERA is 2.28 in 2001 and the lowest batting average is .213 in 2006.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored just 20 runs over the last 10 games and 292 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Seattle, 283) and third fewest in the majors (San Diego, 286)...are on pace to score 563 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second most in the AL...have the second lowest batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.341) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.304)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979.

THE LONG BALL: The A's rank last in the majors with 43 home runs and are on pace to finish the season with 83...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...hit two home runs Thursday, their first multi-homer game since May 24 at Los Angeles when they also hit two...that snapped an Oakland record streak of 32 consecutive games with one home run or fewer...have gone 55 games since their last three-homer game (May 2 vs. Texas)...the pitching staff has allowed five home runs in the last four games after allowing two home runs over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 53 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the American League ... are on pace to allow 102 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.98 ERA (32 er in 145.1 ip) and .202 (107 for 530) opponents batting average over the last 16 games...now has a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the** American League and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under 3.18 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 8-5 with a 2.02 ERA (23 er in 102.2 ip), .201 (75 for 374) opponents batting average, 30 walks, 83 strikeouts and six home runs over the last 16 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.17 ERA (183 er in 520.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.14) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.99).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 66 errors, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 69) and third most in the majors (Chicago, 68)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 45 unearned runs...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (88).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and San Francisco (3-0), which was their best homestand since 2006 when they went 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from Aug. 7-16...had their season-high six-game home winning streak snapped Wednesday night...are 21-19 at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .249 (329 for 1319) with 151 runs scored in 40 home games (3.78 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have a 2.89 ERA (118 er in 367.0 ip) at home, which is the lowest mark in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-18 (.400) in one-run games, which is the worst mark in the majors... are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the AL...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last vear.

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...it marks the third consecutive season the A's finished June with a losing record...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85)...the batting average and on-base percentage were second worst by an A's team since 1983 (.220 and .285 in August, 2008)...the pitching staff ranked fifth in the AL in ERA (3.38).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...the A's are 8-8 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 38-35 (.521) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 13 of his 16 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

ALL-STAR: Was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team today...it is his first All-Star selection.

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) and .139 (10 for 72) opponents batting average over his last three starts...has walked just six and struck out 27...went 0-3 with a 4.34 ERA, a .264 batting average, 12 walks and nine strikeouts over his previous three starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.38)...also ranks fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.74) and most walks (46)...has allowed just six home runs and his average of 0.53 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest...has the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.305) and the eighth lowest batting average (.216)...also ranks tied for sixth in hit batters (6) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6) and both figures are already career highs.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (13 for 78) average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for fourth lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .273 (39 for 143) with no outs and .180 (41 for 228) with one or two outs...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .174 (8 for 46) average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA (14 er in 58.0 ip) and .188 (38 for 202) opponents batting average in nine starts at home and 2-3 with a 2.66 ERA (13 er in 44.0 ip) and .249 (42 for 169) opponents average in seven starts on the road...ranks fifth in the American League in home ERA and opponents batting average and tied for fifth in wins...over the last two years, he is 13-5 with a 2.42 ERA (43 in 160.0 ip) and .195 (111 for 568) opponents average in 25 starts at home and 9-9 with a 3.53 ERA (56 er in 142.2 ip) and .254 (140 for 551) average in 24 starts on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.83 ERA (21.2 ip, 13 h, 3 r, 2 er, 6 bb, 25 so) in three interleague starts...is now 2-3 with a 2.70 ERA (17 er in 56.2 ip) in nine career interleague starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 10 of his 17 starts...has just seven runs of support in his five losses this year (29.2 ip, 2.12 RSA) and 25 runs of support in his 25 career losses (123.2 ip, 1.82 RSA)...is 24-1 in 33 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-24 in 40 starts with support of two or fewer.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-3 with a 1.85 ERA (13 er in 63.1 ip) and .193 (43 for 223) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip) and .250 (37 for 148) average in six starts during the day...has the lowest night ERA in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 2-4 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest and 5-1 with a 1.51 ERA (8 er in 47.2 ip) in seven starts on five or more days rest.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Minnesota April 9...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four of the hits, all singles...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit **April 14**...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start ...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston **April 20**...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second, snapping a career high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...had his scheduled start May 11 at Texas rained out...allowed seven runs on six hits and five walks while striking out one in 2.2 innings, including a grand slam by Moreland...however, the game was halted due to rain with the Rangers leading 7-0 after the top of the fourth inning and was cancelled after a 2 hour and 14 minute delay...combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win over Los Angeles May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...did not allow a runner past first base...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss May 22 at San Francisco...had a 3-2 lead when he was relieved by Wuertz with two outs in the seventh...however, Balfour allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Baltimore May 27 in Oakland...walked in a run in the second inning and allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning...left with the score tied at 2-2 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to New York *June 1* in Oakland...had a 2-1 lead when he surrendered a three-run home run to Swisher in the fourth inning...dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Baltimore June 6...allowed a RBI single to Guerrero in the first inning and three more runs in the second...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago June 11 ... issued a career-high seven walks in 5.1 innings... also had an intentional walk, a home run, two wild pitches, a hit batter and a balk and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to have at least one of each of those in one game ... was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-4 win over Kansas City June 16 in Oakland...struck out 10 batters in just 6.0 innings, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 13-inning loss at New York June 22...allowed a RBI single to Duda in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work

LAST START: He combined with Bailey on a one-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Florida last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a single to Bonifacio to start the game but that was the only hit he would allow in 8.0 innings...retired 13 straight following the hit and allowed just three more base runners, all walks...did not allow a runner past first base...it was the second time this year he allowed just one hit in a game.

GONZALEZ vs. ARIZONA: Is making his first career appearance.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-4, 3.39 ERA): Was reinstated from the disabled list today and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...was placed on the DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA opponents batting average over his last six starts...has allowed just one home run in 63.2 innings, which is the fewest among all Major League pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched ...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss in 10 innings to Minnesota May 18 (7.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so)...is 1-3 with a 5.45 ERA in eight career appearances, including six starts, against Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 1-0 A's loss at Seattle April 21...tossed a complete-game four-hitter (1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

 Has not allowed a run over his past eight appearances (8.1 ip) and in 10 of his 11 outings this season (1 er in 11.1 ip, 0.79 ERA).
- Has faced Arizona twice in his career and has one save in two opportunities (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so).

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA (41.2 ip, 45 h, 23 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 23 so) opponents batting average over his last six starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 63.2 innings and it came April 21 at Seattle, a solo shot by Kennedy...the one home run is the fewest among all Major League pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (15 for 72) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .317 (53 for 167) after that...opponents are batting .390 (16 for 41) with runners in scoring position.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers (Garza, CHI-NL; Verlander, DET)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
