In 2001, Luis Gonzalez provided all the offense with a third-inning grand slam and a fifth-inning solo homer in a 6-5 loss @ Astros...in 2007, Yusmeiro Petit earned his first career win, 7-1, @ Cardinals...in 2008, Conor Jackson's 2-run single capped a 6-run ninth inning in a 6-5 win over the Milwaukee Brewers...Chad Tracy cleared the bases with a 3-run double...on this day: lost their first 4 games from 1988-2001... are 0-2 @ Astros, 1-1 @ Cardinals, 0-1 vs. Reds, 2-2 vs. Dodgers, 1-1 @ Rockies, 0-1 vs. Twins and 1-0 vs. Brewers.

**LAST NIGHT:** The D-backs took the middle game, 4-2, @ Athletics...Joe Saunders allowed 2 runs on 8 hits and a walk with 3 strikeouts over 7.0 innings...he turned over a pair of runners to Yhency Brazoban with no outs in the eighth inning and both runners scored...David Hernandez closed out the win with a 1-2-3 ninth inning for his third save...Chris Young went 3-for-4 with a RBI single, RBI double and 2-run homer...Willie Bloomquist went 2-for-5 with a run scored...Kelly Johnson, Xavier Nady and Ryan Roberts each had a hit.

**ELIAS SAYS....:** Joe Saunders' win last night pushed his record to 12-4 in 18 career starts vs. A's since 2006, tying him with the Red Sox's John Lackey for the most wins against the A's for any pitcher during that span, according to Elias Sports Bureau.

**SAUNDERS SETTLING IN:** Joe Saunders is 2-0 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER in 21.0 IP) and .234 opponent average (18-for-77) with 5 walks and 14 strikeouts in his last 3 starts (team is 2-1) with a 5.57 run support average...in his last 9 starts since May 18 (team is 6-3), he is 5-2 with a 2.95 ERA (20 ER in 61.0 IP), .259 opponents average (58-for-224), 16 walks and 38 strikeouts with a 5.75 run support average.

**CY'S BIG NIGHT:** Chris Young had a RBI single, RBI double and 2-run homer last night @ A's en route to his ninth career 4-RBI game...he drove in all 4 runs last night, marking only the fourth time since 2008 one player has driven in all of the D-backs runs (min. 4 RBI) along with a 5-RBI game for Adam LaRoche on June 23, 2010 vs. Yankees and 4-RBI games for Chad Tracy on June 24, 2008 @ Red Sox and Justin Upton on Sept. 19, 2009 vs. Rockies.

**CY'S GETTING ON BASE:** Chris Young has reached base via a hit, walk or hit by pitch in 13 straight games since June 18, batting .306 (15-for-49) with 3 doubles, 2 homers, 8 RBI and an .860 OPS...has hit safely in 9 of those games.

**100TH INTERLEAGUE WIN:** The D-backs win last night @ A's was their 100th in Interleague play since 1998, becoming the 24th team to reach the mark...the lone teams left are the Padres (95), Cubs (93), Brewers (91), Reds (87) and Pirates (74).

**INTERLEAGUE CONTESTS TIGHT:** The D-backs recorded a 2-run win last night @ A's...of their 17 Interleague games, 6 have been decided by 1 run with the D-backs going 4-2 in those contests and 11 have been decided by 3 runs or less with the D-backs going 9-2 in those contests.

**PARRA GETTING AFTER AL HURLERS:** Among NL players in Interleague action, Gerardo Parra ranks 10th with a .368 average (14-for-38), 14th with a .953 OPS, 16th with a .553 slugging percentage and tied for 18th with a .400 on-base percentage.

**UPTON WORTHY OF MONTHLY HONORS:** Justin Upton should be among the finalists for NL Player of the Month honors for June...among all NL players in June, he ranked second with 39 hits, tied for second with 9 doubles, third with a .382 batting average and .467 on-base percentage and sixth with a 1.016 OPS.

**J-UP LOVES INTERLEAGUE:** Justin Upton has been one of the best hitters in the NL in Interleague games since the beginning of 2008...among all NL hitters in Interleague action the last 4 seasons, Upton ranks tied for first with 17 doubles, second with a .426 on-base percentage, sixth with a .332 average, fourth with 71 hits, seventh with a .950 OPS, tied for 10th with 25 extra-base hits and 17th with a .523 slugging percentage.

**OVER THE LAST 7 GAMES:** The D-backs are 3-5 in their last 8 games since June 24 as they've been outscored 42-30 and out-hit 84-61 by the opposition...the offense is batting .231 (61-for-264) with 9 doubles, 3 triples, 8 homers, 2 RBI and .287 on-base and .379 slugging percentages...the pitching staff has a 5.35 ERA (41 ER in 69.0 IP) and .304 opponents average (84-for-276) with 24 walks and 58 strikeouts...the starters are 1-3 with a 5.44 ERA (30 ER in 49.2 IP) and .301 opponents average (59-for-196) with 13 walks and 40 strikeouts...the bullpen is 2-2 with 2 saves (4 opportunities), a 5.12 ERA (11 ER in 19.1 IP) and .313 opponents average (25-for-80) with 11 walks and 18 strikeouts.

**IN THE NL WEST:** The D-backs are 45-39 and in second place in the NL West, 3.0 games behind the Giants (48-36)...the D-backs have been in first place 8 days this season (June 22-24, June 4, May 29-June 1), after having not spent a day in first, excluding Opening Day, since spending a franchise-best 136 games atop the division in 2008.

**OVER THE .500 MARK:** The D-backs' 45-39 record puts them 6 games over .500...they've been .500 or better the last 36 games...their win on June 24 @ Tigers put them at 43-34, a season-high 9 games over .500 for the first time since a 30-21 mark on May 26, 2008...prior to this season, the last time the D-backs were 10 games over .500 was a 30-20 mark on May 25, 2008.

**VS. ATHLETICS--**Tonight is final game of a 3-gamer @ Athletics...the D-backs won, 4-2, last night after dropping the series opener, 5-4, on Friday @ Athletics...the two teams have played 8 1-run decisions as the A's hold the advantage, 5-3...the teams have split the 16 games, 8-8, decided by 3 runs or less...the two teams last faced each other May 22-24 @ Oakland when the D-backs took the first 2 games of a 3-gamer...this is the D-backs fifth visit to Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...the D-backs trail 11-12 all-time, going 3-6 at home and 8-6 on the road.

**AMONG THE BEST SINCE MAY 13:** The D-backs are 30-18 (.625) since May 13...among all teams during that span, their 30 wins are tied with the Yankees for the second-most in the Majors behind the Red Sox's 30 wins and ahead of the Brewers' and Phillies' 29 wins...their .625 winning percentage is third-best in the Majors behind the Red Sox (.689, 31-14) and Yankees (.652, 30-16) and ahead of the Braves (.622, 28-17) and Brewers (.617, 29-18).

**D-BACKS IN INTERLEAGUE:** The D-backs' 10-7 record in Interleague play through the first 17 of 18 games vs. AL foes is tied for their best mark with the 10-7 record in 2002...a win today would tie for their best 18-game mark in Interleague action since going 11-7 in 2002...this is only the fourth time the D-backs have played 18 Interleague contests in a season along with 2002 (11-7), 2004 (6-12) and 2005 (8-10)...the D-backs have had winning Interleague records in only three (2002-03, '07) of the 13 previous seasons and their overall 100-119 record (.457) is sixth-worst in the Major Leagues since 1998.

**EXTRA EFFORT:** The D-backs' 274 extra-base hits lead the NL and rank second in the Majors behind the Red Sox's 282 extra-base hits...the D-backs' 274 extra-base hits represent 38.48 percent of their 712 hits, the highest percentage in the Majors ahead of the Yankees (37.43 percent, 265 of 708), Rays (36.78 percent, 249 of 677), Red Sox (35.74 percent, 282 of 789), Blue Jays (35.34 percent, 258 of 730) and Rangers (35.03 percent, 269 for 768).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The D-backs have had 19 of their last 30 games decided by 3 runs or less (11-8)...of their 84 games overall, 67 have been decided by 4 runs or less (37-30) and 58 games by 3 runs or less (33-25), going 17-11 in 1-run decisions, 10-7 in 2-run games and 6-7 in 3-run decisions.

**BACK-TO-BACK WINNING MONTHS:** The D-backs went 14-13 (.519) in June after going 19-10 (.655) in May marked their first back-to-back winning months since 2009, when they went 14-12 (.538) in July and 15-14 (.517) in August.

**HISTORIC RISE TO FIRST:** The D-backs rose to first place in the NL West on May 29 after trailing by 6.5 games through April 30...according to Elias Sports Bureau, the D-backs were the first team in Major League history to gain sole possession of first place in their league (before 1969) or division (since 1969) during May after entering the month with a deficit of at least 6.5 games.

**SEASON NO. 14:** The D-backs are 1,080-1,110 (.493) in 14 seasons...since 1998, their record is the eighth-best mark in the NL and third-best in the NL West behind the Giants (1,170-1,018; .534) and Dodgers (1,139-1,051; .520) and ahead of the Padres (1,069-1,122; .488) and Rockies (1,042-1,148; .475).

**GIBBY AT THE HELM:** Kirk Gibson is 45-39 in his first full season as D-backs manager...won his 50th game as manager, 1-0, on May 14 @ Dodgers...named the sixth manager in club history on Oct. 4, 2010, agreeing to a two-year contract through 2012 with a club option for 2013...named interim manager on July 1, 2010 and went 34-49 in that capacity...his overall record is 79-88.

**SENIOR GM:** This is Kevin Towers' 15th year as a GM, tying him with A's Billy Beane and Giants' Brian Sabeen as the fifth-longest tenured GM in MLB behind Tigers' Dave Dombrowski (23 years), Orioles' Andy MacPhail (17), Reds' Walt Jocketty (16) and Brewers' Doug Melvin (16)...with 1,158 wins, Towers is one of eight current GMs to post at least 1,000 victories in their career.

**ALL-STAR STAFF:** In addition to Kirk Gibson and Glenn Sherlock, the D-backs coaching staff boasts All-Stars Don Baylor, Charles Nagy, Alan Trammell, Matt Williams and Eric Young...the Dodgers also have five All-Stars (Don Mattingly, Rick Honeycutt, Davey Lopes, Tim Lincecum, Manny Mota)...Gibson is the only MVP to have never played in an All-Star Game...the staff has two league MVPs (Baylor '79, Gibson '88), five Silver Sluggers (Gibson, Baylor, Trammell, Williams, Young), two Gold Glovers (Trammell, Williams) and two playoff MVPs (Gibson '84 ALCS, Trammell '84 WS) for 16 All-Stars, 8 Gold Gloves and 12 Silver Sluggers total.

**IAN KENNEDY**--is making his 18th start of the season, 64th career big league appearance, 62nd career start and first career start vs. Athletics.

**LAST TIME OUT**--Did not factor in the 5-4 loss on June 27 vs. Indians, allowing 4 runs on 8 hits and a walk with 8 strikeouts over 8.0 innings.

**FANTASTIC 14**--In his last 14 starts since April 20, owns a 7-1 record and 2.35 ERA (26 ER in 99.2 IP) with 24 walks and 84 strikeouts as opponents have hit .215 (78-for-362)...among NL pitchers in that time, ranks third in innings pitched, eighth in ERA, tied for eighth in opponents average and 10th in strikeouts.

**ALMOST THERE**--His next win will tie his career-high set in 32 games last season...if it comes before the All-Star break, he would be the 12th pitcher in club history to reach 9 wins before the break, second this season (also: Daniel Hudson).

**MEET ME ON THE ROAD**--Kennedy's 5 road wins are tied for third among NL pitchers...he is the lone starter to have at least 5 road wins without a loss...ranks sixth among NL pitchers on the road in ERA.

**SNAKE BITES**--Has held righties to a .198 average (40-for-202) with 18 walks and 38 strikeouts...has held the middle of the order (4-6) to a .223 average (31-for-139) with 13 walks and 30 strikeouts...his third time through the lineup, opponents have hit .202 (24-for-119) with 6 walks and 21 strikeouts.

**GETTING TO 8.0**--Has tossed 8.0 or more innings a team-leading seven times this season, going 4-0 with a 1.74 ERA (11 ER in 57.0 IP) with 9 walks and 57 strikeouts in those contests...he is one of 5 NL pitchers to have worked 8.0 or more innings and not allow an earned run at least 3 times and is second in the Majors to the Phillies' Cliff Lee's (5 games) and Rays' James Shields (4 games)...his pitching lines:

**1 OR LESS**--Kennedy has allowed 1 run or less nine times this season, the second-highest total behind the Angels' Jered Weaver (10) and A's Trevor Cahill (10) in the Majors...he is 6-0 with a 0.83 ERA (6 ER in 65.1 IP) with 15 walks and 58 strikeouts in those starts.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY**--Is 2-0 with a 3.74 ERA (9 ER in 21.2 IP) with 4 walks and 15 strikeouts in 3 Interleague starts this season...owns a career 2-3 record and 4.99 ERA (19 ER in 39.2 IP) with 14 walks and 33 strikeouts in 6 games.

**AMONG NL STARTERS**--Among NL starters, ranks fourth with 116.2 innings pitched, tied for ninth with 8 wins, 10th with a .198 average vs. righties, tied for 11th with a .227 opponents average and 14th with a .286 opponents on-base pct..

**INNINGS EATER**--Has tossed 6.0 or more innings in 14 of his 17 starts...leads the team with 116.2 innings...his 7 straight games with 6.0 or more innings from April 25-May 25 is the third-longest among D-backs pitchers, trailing Daniel Hudson's 13 straight and Joe Saunders' 11 straight.

**STRIKING THEM OUT**--Kennedy has a career-high 7 games with at least 8 strikeouts, tied for the second-highest total in the NL behind the 8 such games for the Marlins' Anibal Sanchez and Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw...in those games, he has gone 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (11 ER in 55.0 IP).

**PITCH COUNT**--Kennedy has tossed at least 100 pitches in 14 straight starts, the longest streak for a D-backs pitcher and the second-longest active streak among NL pitchers behind the Phillies' Roy Halladay's 15 consecutive such starts...he is second on the team with 1,795 pitches and a 105.6 pitch-per-game average.

**QUALITY OUTINGS**--Kennedy's 11 quality starts are second on the team to Daniel Hudson's 13 such starts and tied for 10th-most among NL starters...has allowed 13 earned runs in 79.2 innings (1.47 ERA) in those games, while allowing 13 earned runs in 13.1 innings (8.78 ERA) when tossing fewer than 6.0 innings.

**RUN SUPPORT**--Received a team-high 13 offensive runs on April 8 vs. Reds, tied with the Rockies' Juan Nicasio (May 28 vs. Cardinals) for the second-highest total among NL pitchers...he is second among D-backs starters (min. 9 starts) with a 4.55 run support average (59 runs in 116.2 IP)...his 4 games with no run support are tops among D-backs starters.

**JULY**--Kennedy is making his sixth career June start...he owns a 3-2 career record and 5.97 ERA (19 ER in 28.2 IP) with 11 walks and 22 strikeouts in 5 games, all of which came last season.

**NL HOLD**--Has a 15-9 record and 3.29 ERA (99 ER in 271.0 IP) with 86 walks and 232 strikeouts in 43 starts vs. NL opponents...in contrast, owns a 3-7 record and 5.62 ERA (62 ER in 99.1 IP) with 51 walks and 76 strikeouts in 20 games (18 starts) vs. AL teams.

**COMPLETE FACTS**--Kennedy tossed his first career complete-game shutout, 4-0, on April 25 vs. Phillies...according to Elias Sports Bureau, Kennedy (3 hits, 10 strikeouts) became the third pitcher in D-backs history to toss a shutout while allowing 3 or fewer hits and no walks with at least 10 strikeouts, joining Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 vs. Dodgers (2 hits, 10 strikeouts) and Randy Johnson on May 18, 2004 @ Braves (perfect game, 0 hits, 13 strikeouts).

**AT THE DISH**--Collected his first career extra-base hit (double) on Sept. 6, 2010 vs. Giants...had a career-high with 3 hits on Sept. 12, 2010 @ Rockies.

**ROAD TO PHOENIX**--Kennedy was acquired from the Yankees in a three-team trade on Dec. 9, 2009, which also brought Edwin Jackson to the D-backs from the Tigers...signed Aug. 17, 2006, as the Yankees first-round selection (21st overall) in the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.
